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Subject: Depression over Jharkhand

The Depression over Jharkhand and adjoining Gangetic West Bengal moved west-northwestwards with a speed of 18 kmph during past 06 hours and lay centred at 1130 hrs IST of today, the 14th August, 2026, over Jharkhand, near latitude 23.3°N and longitude 85.3°E, close to Ranchi (Jharkhand), 80 km south of Hazaribagh (Jharkhand), 130 km east-northeast of Jashpurnagar (Chhattisgarh), 150 km east-southeast of Daltonganj (Jharkhand) and 210 km east of Ambikapur (Chhattisgarh).

It is very likely to continue to move west-northwestwards across Jharkhand & adjoining north Chhattisgarh and weaken into well marked low pressure area during next 06 hours.

Warnings:

(i) Rainfall Warning:

Odisha: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places is very likely over north interior Odisha on 14th and heavy rainfall at isolated places during 15th -17th August.

Chhattisgarh: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at a few places is very likely over north Chhattisgarh on 14th & 15th August and heavy rainfall at isolated places on 16th & 17th August.

Jharkhand: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places is very likely on 14th and heavy rainfall at isolated places during 15th - 17th August.

Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places is likely on 14th & 15th August; heavy to very heavy rainfall on 16th & 17th August.

Bihar: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places is likely on 14th and during 16th- 17th August.

East Uttar Pradesh: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall is very likely at isolated places on 14th ; heavy rainfall at isolated places on 15th and heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places during 16th -17th August.

West Uttar Pradesh: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall is very likely at isolated places on 14th ; heavy rainfall at isolated places on 15th and heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places during 16th -17th August.

East Madhya Pradesh: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall is very likely at isolated places during 14th & 15th August and heavy rainfall at isolated places during 16th -17th August.

Uttarakhand: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places is very likely on 14th – 17th August.

(ii) Wind Warning:

- ❖ Squally winds with speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph are very likely to prevail over Northwest Bay of Bengal & along and off Bangladesh, Odisha-West Bengal coasts during next 12 hours and decrease gradually thereafter.
- ❖ Squally winds with speed reaching 35-45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph are very likely to prevail over south Jharkhand and adjoining north interior Odisha & north Chhattisgarh during next 12 hours and decrease thereafter.

(iii) Sea Condition:

- ❖ **Sea condition is very likely to be rough** over northwest Bay of Bengal and along & off Bangladesh, West Bengal & Odisha coasts during next 12 hours and improve gradually thereafter.

(iv) Fishermen Warning (Graphics Attached):

- ❖ Fishermen are advised not to venture into north Bay of Bengal, along & off Bangladesh, West Bengal, and Odisha coasts till 15th morning.

(v) Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to heavy rainfall and squally winds

Impact expected:

- ❖ Breaking of tree branches, Horticulture crops like banana, papaya, drum sticks may be affected. Strong wind and rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- ❖ Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds and rain.
- ❖ Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to heavy rain.
- ❖ Loose objects may fly.
- ❖ Small ships, trawlers and boats may be affected.
- ❖ Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain and squally winds.
- ❖ Localised landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation over low lying areas.
- ❖ Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- ❖ Helicopter services may get affected.

Action suggested:

- ❖ People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- ❖ Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- ❖ In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- ❖ Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- ❖ Onshore and offshore activities to be judiciously regulated.
- ❖ Helicopter services to be regulated.

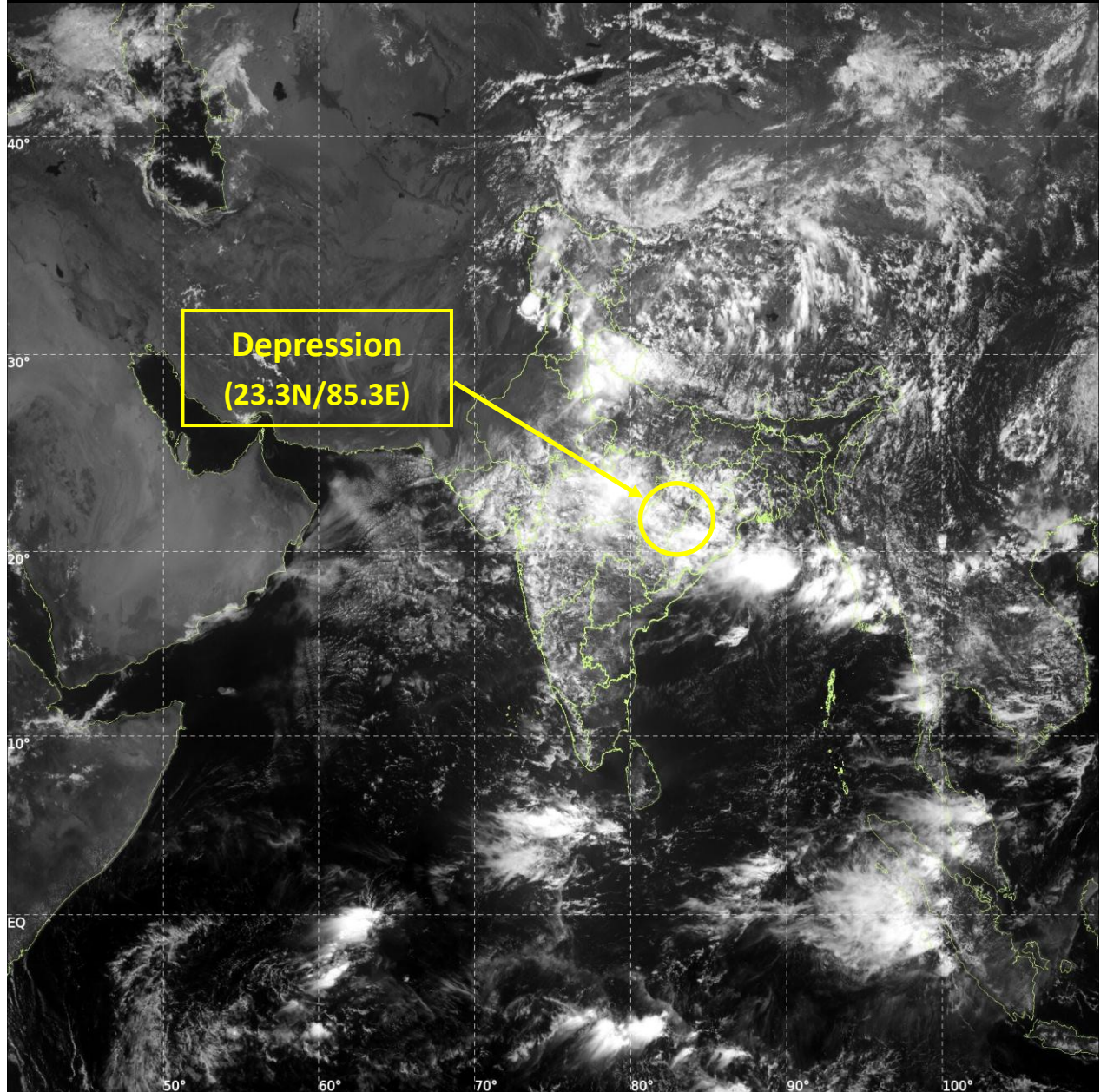

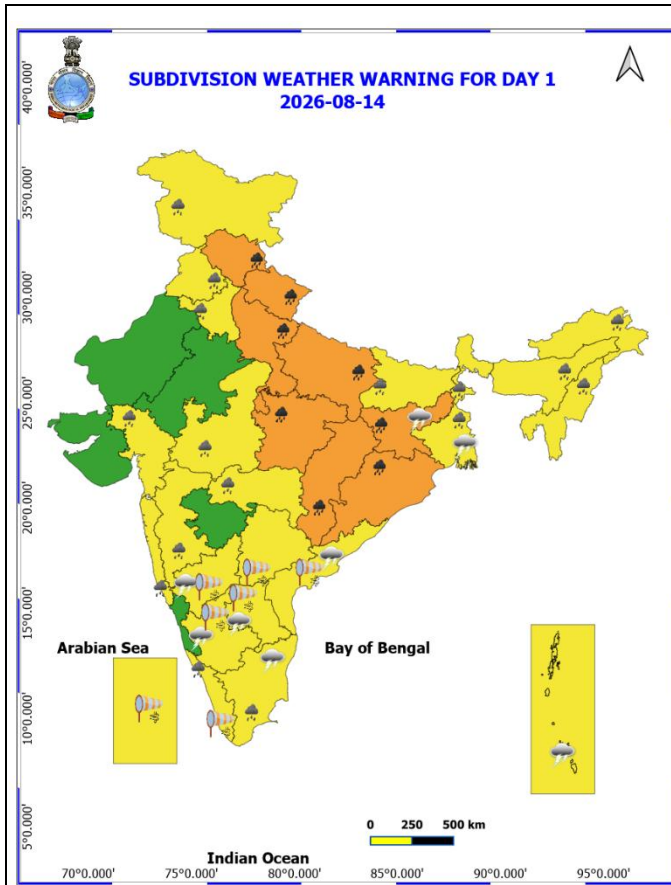

Flash Flood Guidance

Flash Flood Risk (FFR) till 0530 IST of 15-08-2026:

Low to Moderate flash flood risk likely over few watersheds & neighbourhoods of following Met Sub-divisions during next 24 hours.

East Madhya Pradesh: Rewa, Satna, Sidhi, Shahdol, Umaria, Anuppur, Dindori, Katni, Balaghat and Mandla districts

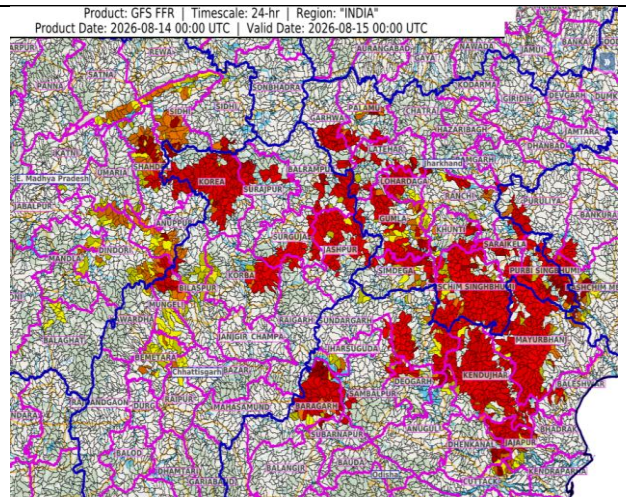
Chhattisgarh: Koriya, Surajpur, Balrampur, Jashpur, Korba, Surguja, Bilaspur, Bemetara, Baloda Bazar, Mungeli and Raipur districts

Jharkhand: Simdega, West Singhbhum, East Singhbhum, Gumla, Khunti, Lohardaga, Seraikela-Kharsawan, Latehar, Ranchi, Palamu and Garhwa districts

Odisha: Bargarh, Jharsuguda, Sambalpur, Sonepur, Sundargarh, Deogarh, Keonjhar, Mayurbhanj, Dhenkanal, Jajpur, Balasore and Bhadrak districts

Gangetic West Bengal: Purulia, West Midnapore and Bankura districts

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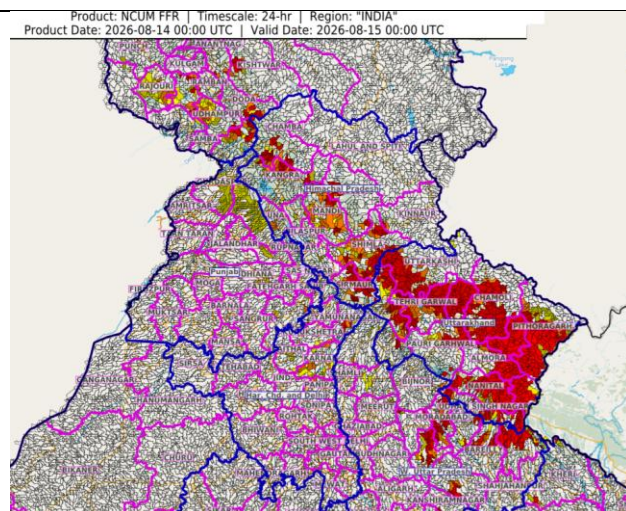
Jammu & Kashmir & Ladakh: Poonch, Rajouri, Reasi, Kulgam, Kistwar, Ramban, Kathua, Jammu, Udhampur, Doda and Anantnag districts

Himachal Pradesh: Chamba, Kangra, Mandi, Kullu, Hamirpur, Una, Sirmaur and Shimla districts

Uttarakhand: Almora, Bageshwar, Chamoli, Champawat, Dehradun, Garhwal Pauri, Garhwal Tehri, Hardwar, Nainital, Pithoragarh, Rudrapur, Udham Singh Nagar and Uttarkashi districts

West Uttar Pradesh: Bareilly, Pilibhit, Rampur, Moradabad, Sambhal, Amroha, Badaun and Muzaffarnagar districts

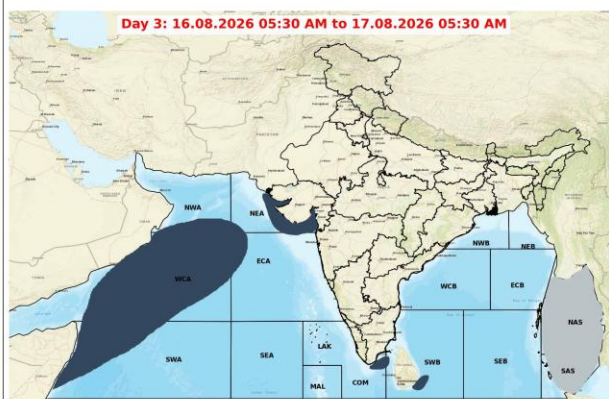
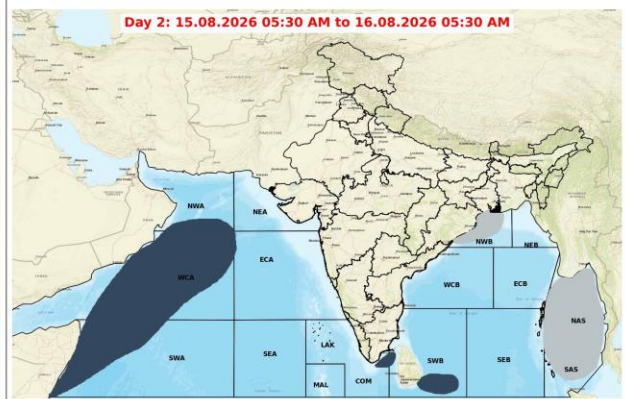
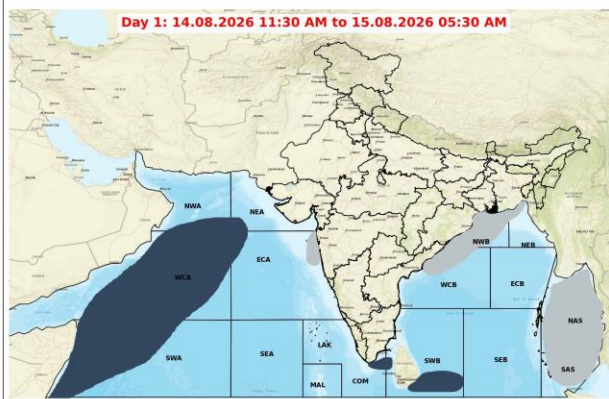
