NATIONAL BULLETIN NO. 8 (BoB/04/2026)

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Subject: Depression over Jharkhand weakened into a Well Marked Low Pressure Area

The Depression over Jharkhand moved west-northwestwards and weakened into a well marked low pressure area over the same region at 1730 hrs IST of today, the 14th August, 2026.

It is very likely to continue to move slowly west-northwestwards over the same region and weaken further into a low pressure area during next 12 hours.

Warnings:

(i) Rainfall Warning:

Odisha: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places is very likely over north interior Odisha on 14th and heavy rainfall at isolated places during 15th -17th August.

Chhattisgarh: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at a few places is very likely over north Chhattisgarh on 14th & 15th August and heavy rainfall at isolated places on 16th & 17th August.

Jharkhand: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places is very likely on 14th and heavy rainfall at isolated places during 15th - 17th August.

Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places is likely on 14th & 15th August; heavy to very heavy rainfall on 16th & 17th August.

Bihaar: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy rainfall at isolated places is likely on 14th and during 16th- 17th August.

East Uttar Pradesh: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall is very likely at isolated places on 14th ; heavy rainfall at isolated places on 15th and heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places during 16th -17th August.

West Uttar Pradesh: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall is very likely at isolated places on 14th ; heavy rainfall at isolated places on 15th and heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places during 16th -17th August.

East Madhya Pradesh: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall is very likely at isolated places during 14th & 15th August and heavy rainfall at isolated places during 16th -17th August.

Uttarakhand: Light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places is very likely on 14th – 17th August.

(ii) Wind Warning:

- ❖ Squally winds with speed reaching 35-45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph are very likely to prevail over Northwest Bay of Bengal & along and off Bangladesh, Odisha-West Bengal coasts during next 12 hours and decrease gradually thereafter.

(iii) Sea Condition:

- ❖ **Sea condition is very likely to be rough** over northwest Bay of Bengal and along & off Bangladesh, West Bengal & Odisha coasts during next 12 hours and improve gradually thereafter.

(iv) Fishermen Warning (Graphics Attached):

- ❖ Fishermen are advised not to venture into north Bay of Bengal, along & off Bangladesh, West Bengal, and Odisha coasts till 15th morning.

(v) Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to heavy rainfall and squally winds

Impact expected:

- ❖ Heavy rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- ❖ Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds and rain.
- ❖ Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to heavy rain.
- ❖ Small ships, trawlers and boats may be affected.
- ❖ Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain.
- ❖ Localised landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation over low lying areas.
- ❖ Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- ❖ Helicopter services may get affected.

Action suggested:

- ❖ People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- ❖ Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- ❖ In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- ❖ Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- ❖ Onshore and offshore activities to be judiciously regulated.
- ❖ Helicopter services to be regulated.

This is the last update in association with this system however regular Bulletins will continue from the National Weather Forecasting Centre and concerned Meteorological and Regional Centres for the Well Marked Low Pressure Area and its remnant.

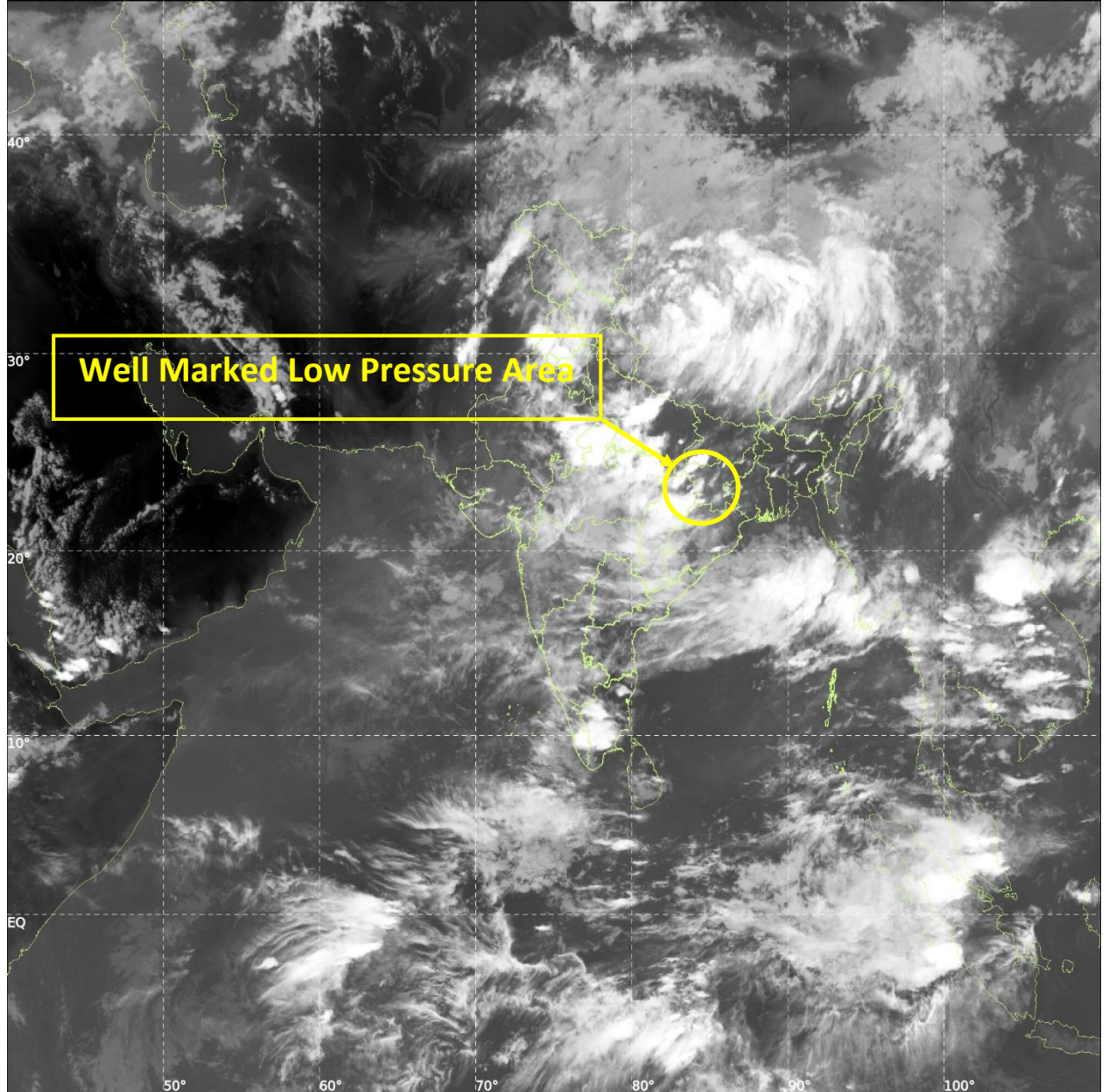

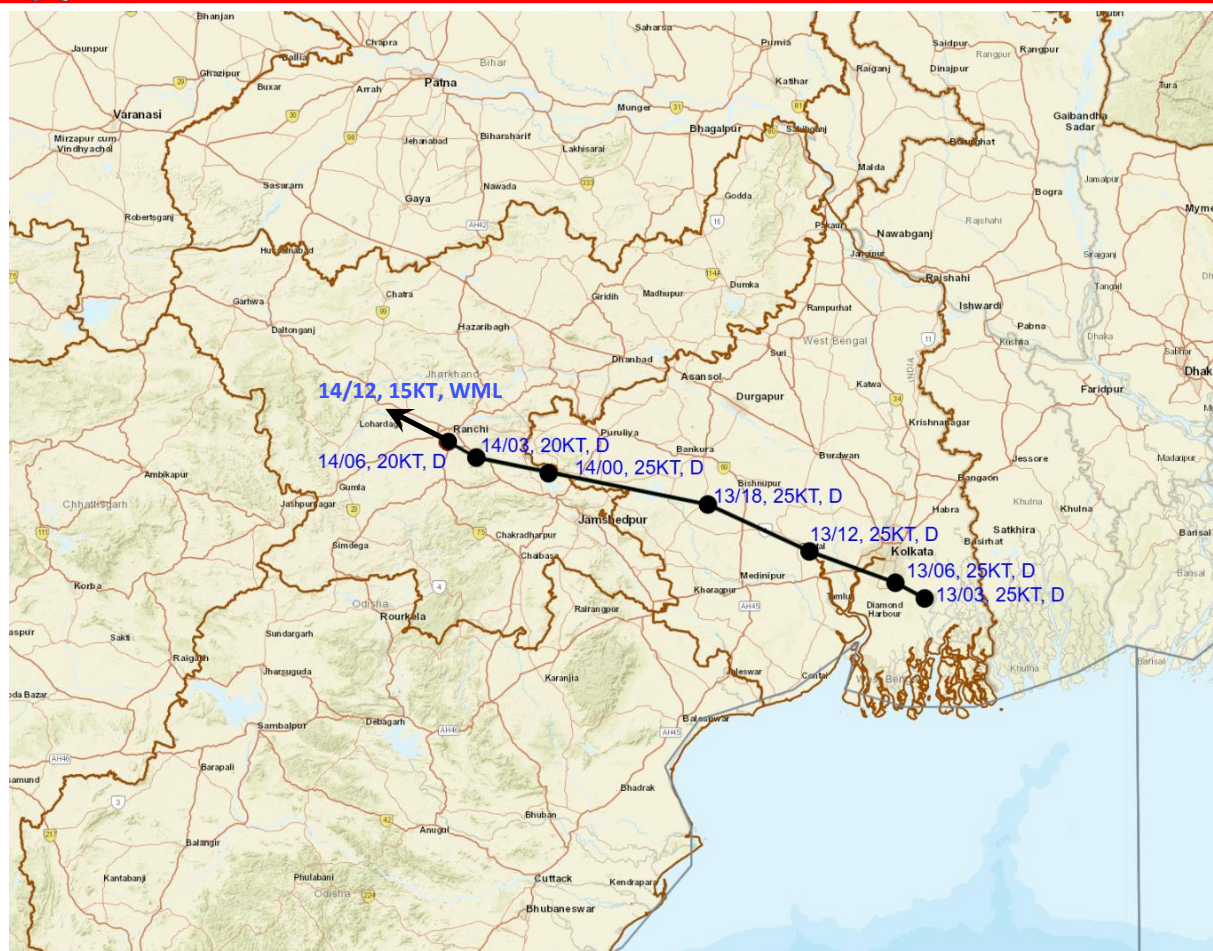

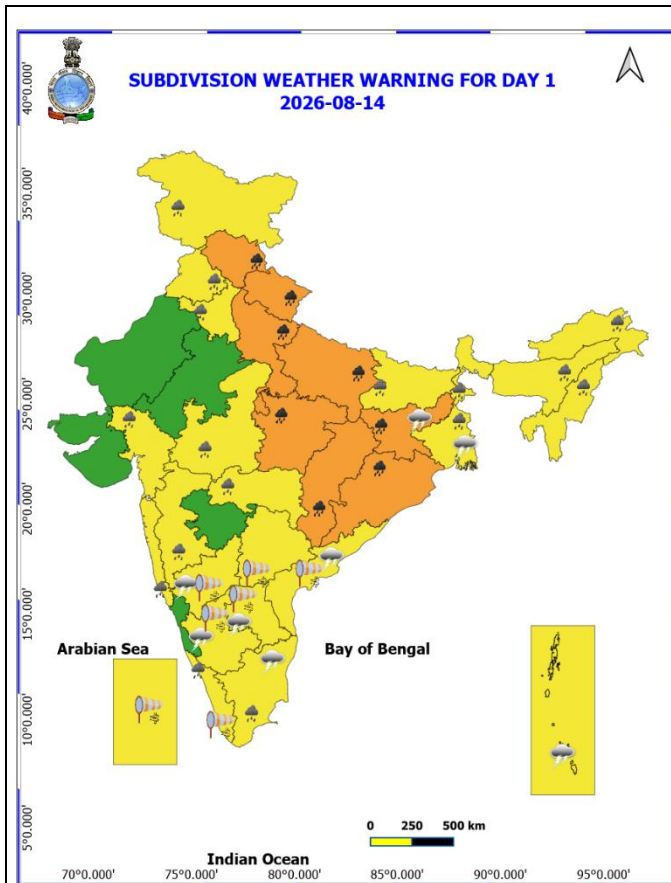

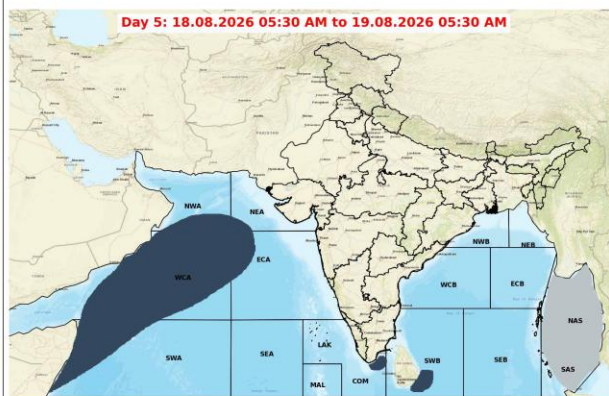
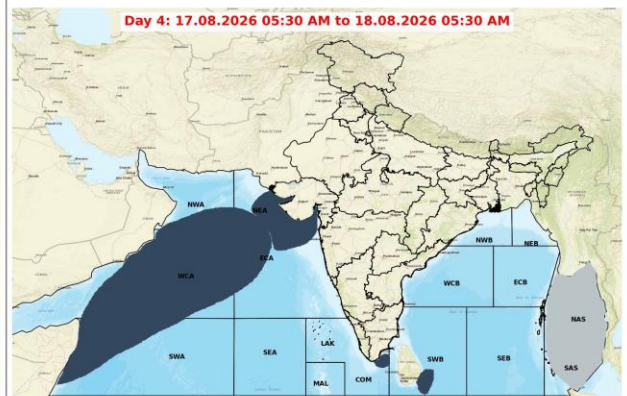
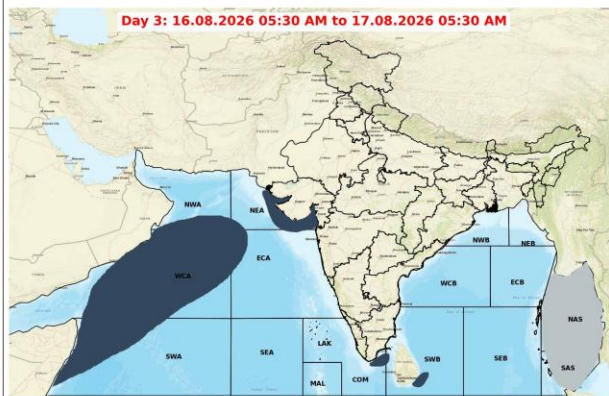
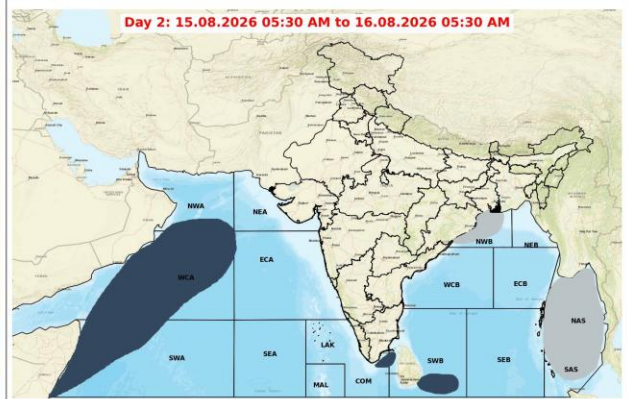
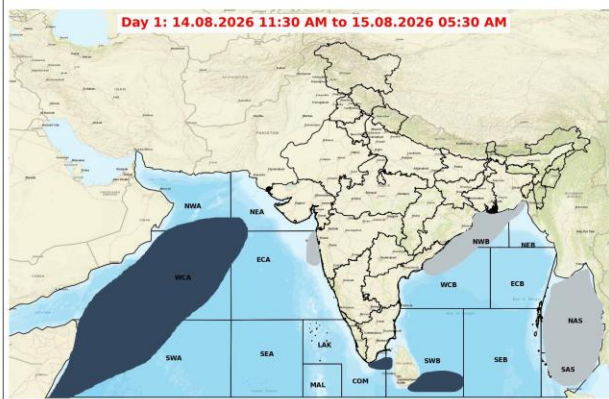




- Action may be taken based on ORANGE AND REDCOLOUR warnings.
