- Subject:** (i) **Active Monsoon Conditions likely over northwest, east and northeast India during next 6-7 days.**
(ii) **Isolated heavy to very heavy rainfall at few places with extremely heavy rainfall likely at isolated places over Meghalaya & Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 19th; Uttarakhand on 19th & 20th; Jammu-Kashmir during 20th -22nd and Himachal Pradesh on 20th & 21st July.**
(iii) **Subdued rainfall activity likely to continue over westcentral & south Peninsular India during next 7 days.**

Realised weather during past 24 hours ending at 0830 hours IST of today, the 19th July, 2026:

- ❖ **Extremely heavy rainfall (≥ 21 cm)** has been recorded over Meghalaya.
- ❖ **Very Heavy rainfall (12-20 cm)** has been recorded over Jammu-Kashmir, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal, East Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, East Madhya Pradesh, Madhya Maharashtra, Konkan, Arunachal Pradesh and Nagaland.
- ❖ **Heavy rainfall (7-11 cm)** has been recorded over Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, West Uttar Pradesh, Odisha, Jharkhand, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat Region and Karnataka.
- ❖ **Heat wave conditions** prevailed at isolated places over Jammu-Kashmir.

Weather Systems, Forecast and Warnings (Annexure I & II):

- ❖ The western end of the **Monsoon trough** is north its normal position and its eastern end is near its normal position in lower tropospheric levels.
- ❖ An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over North Punjab & adjoining Pakistan in lower tropospheric level.
- ❖ The **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over North Jharkhand and adjoining Bihar in lower tropospheric level.
- ❖ The **trough** runs from North Bihar to Northwest Bay of Bengal in lower tropospheric level.
- ❖ The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Southwest Madhya Pradesh & neighbourhood in lower tropospheric level.
- ❖ The **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over North Coastal Andhra Pradesh & adjoining South Chhattisgarh in middle tropospheric level.
- ❖ The **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over Central Assam & adjoining Nagaland in lower tropospheric level.

Under the influence of above systems, the following weather is likely:

Northwest India:

- ❖ **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and Uttarakhand during 19th-25th July.
- ❖ **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi and Punjab during 20th-23rd July; East Uttar Pradesh and West Uttar Pradesh during 19th-24th July; East Rajasthan during 23rd-25th July.
- ❖ **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi and Punjab on 19th July and during 24th-25th July; East Uttar Pradesh and West Uttar Pradesh on 25th July; West Rajasthan during 19th-25th July; East Rajasthan during 19th-22nd July.
- ❖ Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad during 19th-23rd July.
- ❖ Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over West Rajasthan during 20th-25th July; East Rajasthan during 19th-25th July.
- ❖ Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Uttarakhand during 19th-25th July; East Uttar Pradesh and West Uttar Pradesh during 19th-22nd July.
- ❖ Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad during 20th-22nd July; Himachal Pradesh during 20th-21st July and on 23rd July; Uttarakhand during 19th-20th July and during 22nd-25th July; Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi and Punjab on 19th July and on 23rd July; East Uttar Pradesh and West Uttar Pradesh during 23rd-25th July; West Rajasthan during 21st-24th July; East Rajasthan during 20th-25th July with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad on 19th July and on 23rd July; Himachal Pradesh on 19th July and on 22nd July; Uttarakhand on 21st July; Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi and Punjab during 20th-22nd July; East Uttar Pradesh and West Uttar Pradesh during 19th-22nd July.

- ❖ **Heavy to very heavy rainfall at few places with extremely heavy rainfall likely at isolated places over Uttarakhand on 19th & 20th; Jammu-Kashmir during 20th -22nd and Himachal Pradesh on 20th & 21st July.**

Central India:

- ❖ **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 19th-21st July; Vidarbha during 20th-21st July and on 25th July.
- ❖ **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 22nd-25th July; Chhattisgarh and East Madhya Pradesh during 19th-25th July; Vidarbha on 19th July and during 22nd-24th July.
- ❖ Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over East Madhya Pradesh and West Madhya Pradesh during 19th-23rd July.
- ❖ Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Chhattisgarh and Vidarbha during 19th-23rd July.
- ❖ Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over West Madhya Pradesh on 20th July and during 22nd-23rd July; East Madhya Pradesh during 19th-23rd July; Vidarbha on 19th July and during 22nd-23rd July; Chhattisgarh during 20th-23rd July with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Chhattisgarh on 19th July.

East India:

- ❖ **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Odisha during 19th-25th July; Bihar during 22nd-25th July.
- ❖ **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 19th-25th July; Bihar during 19th-21st July.
- ❖ Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Odisha during 19th-20th July, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 19th-24th July; Bihar during 19th-25th July.
- ❖ Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 19th-25th July.
- ❖ Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 19th July and during 21st-22nd July; Gangetic West Bengal during 21st-22nd July; Jharkhand during 19th-21st July; Bihar during 21st-24th July; Odisha during 19th-22nd July with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 20th July; Bihar during 19th-20th July.
- ❖ **Heavy to very heavy rainfall at few places with extremely heavy rainfall likely at isolated places over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 19th July.**

Northeast India:

- ❖ **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 19th-25th July.
- ❖ Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 19th-20th July; Assam & Meghalaya during 19th-21st July.
- ❖ Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh on 20th July and during 24th-25th July; Assam & Meghalaya on 19th July and during 21st-25th July; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 20th-25th July with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Arunachal Pradesh and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura on 19th July; Assam & Meghalaya on 20th July.
- ❖ **Heavy to very heavy rainfall at few places with extremely heavy rainfall likely at isolated places over Meghalaya on 19th July.**

West India:

- ❖ **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Konkan & Goa during 19th-25th July; Madhya Maharashtra on 19th July and during 23rd-24th July; Marathawada on 23rd July.
- ❖ **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Madhya Maharashtra during 20th-22nd July and on 25th July; Marathawada during 19th-22nd July and during 24th-25th July; Gujarat Region and Saurashtra & Kutch during 19th-25th July.
- ❖ Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Madhya Maharashtra and Marathawada on 23rd July.
- ❖ Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Madhya Maharashtra and Marathawada on 19th July.
- ❖ Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Konkan & Goa and Madhya Maharashtra during 19th-23rd July; Gujarat Region during 19th-25th July; Saurashtra & Kutch on 19th July with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Madhya Maharashtra on 19th July.

South Peninsular India:

- ❖ **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Telangana during 19th-25th July; Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep during 21st-23rd July; North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka during 20th-25th July.

- ❖ **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep during 19th-20th July and during 24th-25th July; Coastal Karnataka during 19th-25th July; North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka on 19th July.
- ❖ Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over North Interior Karnataka and Rayalaseema during 19th-20th July, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Coastal Karnataka during 19th-20th July; South Interior Karnataka during 19th-23rd July; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam on 19th July; Rayalaseema during 21st-23rd July; Telangana during 19th-25th July.
- ❖ Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Kerala & Mahe during 19th-20th July; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Telangana on 19th July.

Fishermen Warning:

Fishermen are advised not to venture:

- ❖ Arabian Sea: Along and off Somalia, Oman coast over most parts of west central adjoining some parts of eastcentral, southwest & north Arabian Sea during 19th to 24th July, along and off Gujarat coasts adjoining sea Area during 21st to 24th July and north Maharashtra Coast on 19th & during 22nd to 24th July.
- ❖ Bay of Bengal: Over few parts of Gulf of Mannar on 19th & 23rd July and south Sri Lanka coasts adjoining southwest Bay of Bengal on 19th July.

Weather forecast over Delhi/NCR during 19th July to 22nd July 2026**Past Weather:**

There has been fall in maximum temperatures by 1°C and rise in minimum temperatures by 1°C over Delhi during past 24 hours. The maximum temperatures were in the range of 37-38°C and the minimum temperatures are in the range 28-31°C respectively during past 24 hours over Delhi. The minimum temperatures are appreciably above normal (3.1°C to 5.0°C) at a few places, and above normal (1.6°C to 3.0°C) over the remaining parts of Delhi. The maximum temperatures were appreciably above normal (3.1°C to 5.0°C) at isolated places and above normal (1.6°C to 3.0°C) at remaining parts of Delhi. Generally cloudy sky with surface wind speed 20 kmph gusting to 30 kmph from the west direction prevailed over Delhi during past 24 hours. Generally cloudy sky with surface wind speeds up to 20 kmph likely to prevailed from the west direction over the region in the forenoon today.

Weather Forecast:

19.07.2026: Generally cloudy sky. A spell of very light to light rain at few places accompanied with Thunderstorm/Lightning and strong surface winds speed reaching 20-30 gusting to 40 kmph towards evening/night. The maximum temperatures over Delhi are likely to be in the range of 35-37°C. The maximum temperatures will be above normal (1.6°C to 3.0°C) at many places over Delhi. The predominant surface wind is likely to be from the west direction with surface wind speed reaching up to 15 kmph during the afternoon hours. The wind speed will increase up to 20 kmph from the southwest direction during evening and night.

20.07.2026: Generally cloudy sky. A spell of very light to light rain at many places with moderate rain at isolated places accompanied with Thunderstorm/Lightning and strong surface winds speed reaching 20-30 gusting to 40 kmph during morning to forenoon. Another spell of very light to light rain at few places accompanied with Thunderstorm/Lightning and strong surface winds speed reaching 20-30 gusting to 40 kmph towards evening/night. The maximum and minimum temperatures over Delhi are likely to be in the range of 32°C to 34°C and 25°C to 27°C, respectively. The minimum temperature will be near normal (-1.5°C to 1.5°C) at most places, and the maximum temperatures will be below normal (-1.6°C to -3.0°C) at many places with appreciably below normal (-3.1°C to -5.0°C) at isolated places over Delhi. The predominant surface wind is likely to be from west direction with surface wind speed reaching up to 25 kmph during the morning hours. The wind speed will decrease becoming up to 15 kmph from the southwest direction during the afternoon. The wind speed will increase becoming up to 20 kmph from the west direction during evening and night.

21.07.2026: Generally cloudy sky. A few spells of light to moderate rain at most places with a spell of heavy rain accompanied with Thunderstorm/Lightning and strong surface winds speed reaching 20-30 gusting to 40 kmph during early morning to noon. One or two spells of very light to light rain accompanied with Thunderstorm/Lightning and strong surface winds speed reaching 20-30 gusting to 40 kmph during remaining day. The maximum and minimum temperatures over Delhi are likely to be in the range of 31°C to 33°C and 24°C to 26°C, respectively. The minimum temperature will be near normal (-1.5°C to 1.5°C) at most places, and the maximum temperatures will appreciably below normal (-3.1°C to -5.0°C) at most places over Delhi. The predominant surface wind is likely to be from west direction with surface wind speed reaching up to 15 kmph during the morning hours. The wind speed will increase becoming up to 20 kmph from the east direction during the afternoon. The wind speed will decrease becoming up to 15 kmph from the southeast direction during evening and night.

22.07.2026: Generally cloudy sky. One or two spells of light to moderate rain at most places accompanied with Thunderstorm/Lightning and strong surface winds speed reaching 20-30 gusting to 40 kmph during early morning to noon. Another spell of light to moderate rain at few places accompanied with Thunderstorm/Lightning and strong surface winds speed reaching 20-30 gusting to 40 kmph towards afternoon/evening. The maximum and minimum temperatures over Delhi are likely to be in the range of 31°C to 33°C and 22°C to 24°C, respectively. The minimum temperature will be below normal (-1.6°C to -3.0°C) at most places, and the maximum temperatures will be appreciably below normal (-3.1°C to -5.0°C) at most places over Delhi. The predominant surface wind is likely to be from the southeast direction with wind reaching up to 15 kmph during the morning hours. The surface wind speed will increase becoming up to 18 kmph from the southeast direction during the afternoon. The wind speed will increase becoming up to 20 kmph from the southeast direction during evening and night.

Impact Expected & Action Suggested due to heavy/very heavy/extremely heavy rainfall

- ❖ **Heavy to very heavy rainfall at few places with extremely heavy rainfall likely at isolated places over Meghalaya & Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 19th; Uttarakhand on 19th & 20th; Jammu-Kashmir during 20th -22nd and Himachal Pradesh on 20th & 21st July.**

Impact Expected

- Localized Flooding of roads, water logging in low lying areas and closure of underpasses mainly in urban areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Disruption of traffic in major cities due to water logging in roads leading to increased travel time.
- Minor damage to kutcha roads.
- Possibilities of damage to vulnerable structure.
- Localized Landslides/Mudslides/landslips/mudslips/landsinks/mudsinks.
- Damage to horticulture and standing crops in some areas due to inundation.
- It may lead to riverine flooding in some river catchments (for riverine flooding please visit Web page of CWC)

Action Suggested

- Check for traffic congestion on your route before leaving for your destination.
- Follow any traffic advisories that are issued in this regard.
- Avoid going to areas that face the water logging problems often.
- Avoid staying in vulnerable structure.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In **Assam**, maintain continuous and effective drainage of excess rainwater from sugarcane, soybean, pigeon pea, jute, sesame fields and fruit orchards to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Harvest mature crops wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Meghalaya**, maintain effective drainage in rice nursery beds and fields of maize, cowpea, okra and ginger. Strengthen nursery bunds and field channels to prevent runoff, seedling washout and waterlogging.
- In **Sub Himalayan West Bengal**, ensure continuous and effective drainage in rice nurseries, jute, ginger and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Inspect and strengthen bunds around rice nurseries and harvest mature tea leaves and vegetables wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Sikkim**, ensure proper drainage in rice nurseries and standing crop fields to prevent waterlogging.
- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, ensure continuous drainage of excess rainwater from rice, maize, soybean and finger millet fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging.
- In **Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura** ensure continuous and effective drainage and remove any accumulated rainwater from soybean, black gram, ginger, turmeric, cole crop and vegetable fields to prevent residual waterlogging.
- In **Jharkhand**, ensure proper drainage in standing crop fields to prevent waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.
- In **Bihar**, ensure continuous drainage in rice, maize, sesame and pigeon pea fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.
- In **Odisha**, maintain continuous drainage and keep field channels clear to prevent prolonged waterlogging in rice, maize, pulses, oilseed and vegetable fields. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions become suitable.
- In **Uttarakhand**, postpone sowing of groundnut, soybean and maize. Ensure proper drainage in rice, tomato and chilli fields to prevent waterlogging. Harvest mature tomato only during rain-free periods.
- In **Himachal Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in maize, finger millet, cucurbit, tomato and capsicum fields to prevent waterlogging. Harvest mature crops wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Keralam**, provide adequate drainage facilities in banana, coconut, cardamom, ginger, black pepper and vegetables.
- In **Chhattisgarh**, maintain continuous drainage in rice nurseries and standing fields of maize, soybean, pigeon pea and minor millets to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.
- In the regions expecting heavy rainfall, including **Jammu & Kashmir, Punjab, Haryana Konkan & Goa and Madhya Maharashtra** withhold irrigation in standing crops, make necessary arrangements to remove excess rain water from the crop fields.

- In **Uttar Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in rice, maize, sesame and pigeon pea fields to prevent waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.

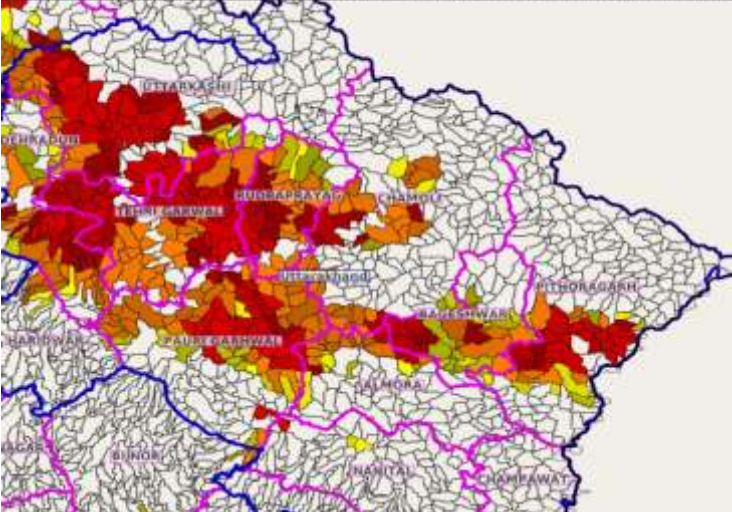
Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- In regions with high temperatures and heat wave conditions, provide clean, cool drinking water to animals, and cover the roofs of poultry sheds with grass to reduce the adverse effects of heat.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.

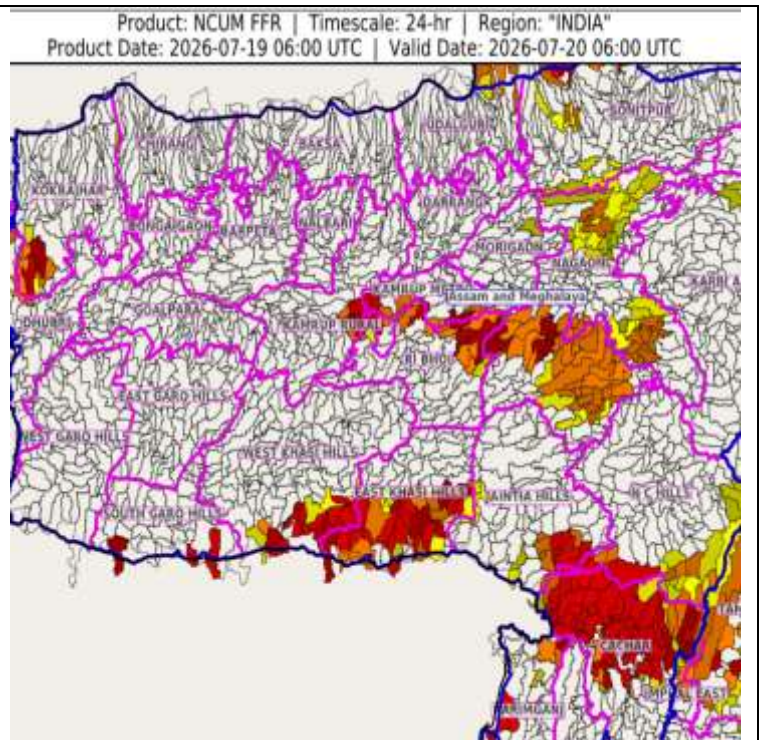

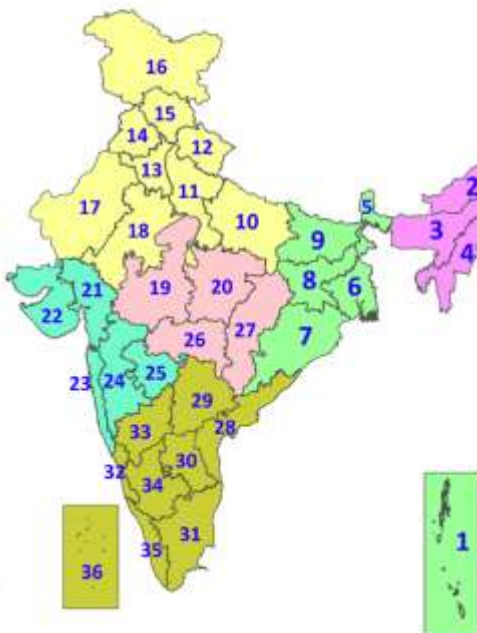
