Significant Weather Features

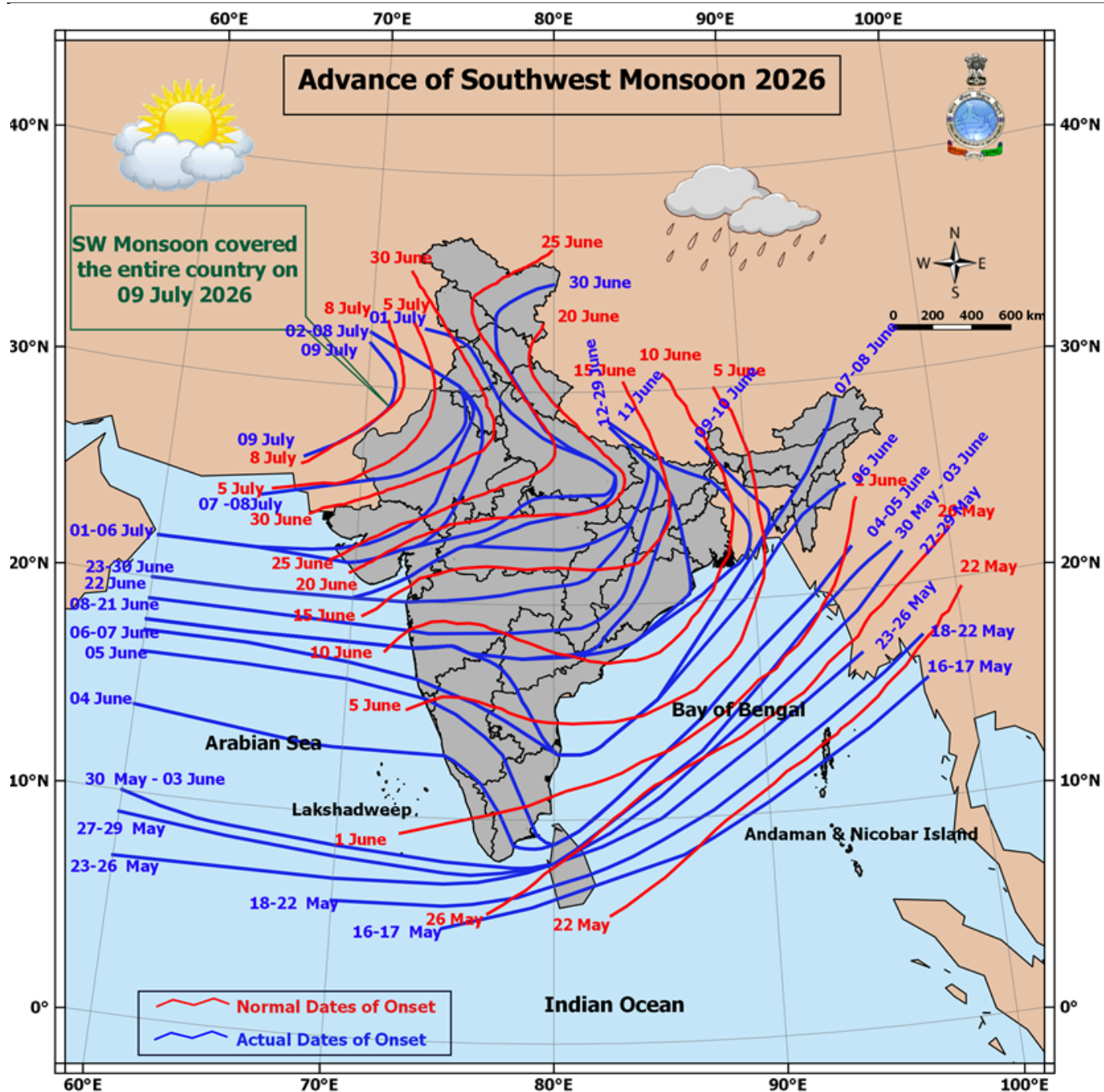
Significant rainfall recorded(in cm) (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today):Extremely heavy rainfall (21 cm or more) has been recorded over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim.Very Heavy rainfall (12-20 cm) has been recorded over East Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Assam & Meghalaya, and Tripura. Heavy rainfall (7-11 cm) has been recorded over Arunachal Pradesh, Gangetic West Bengal, Himachal Pradesh, and Uttarakhand. ❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 13-07-2026): markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at few places over East Rajasthan and East Madhya Pradesh; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Odisha, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim and Rayalaseema; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Gangetic West Bengal, Uttarakhand, Konkan & Goa, Telangana and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Chhattisgarh and Lakshadweep; at most places over Coastal Karnataka; at few places over Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Vidarbha and Kerala & Mahe; at isolated places over Jharkhand and Madhya Maharashtra. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at most places over Arunachal Pradesh, Marathwada, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka; at few places over Punjab. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 20.0°C was reported at KHARGONE (MADHYA PRADESH) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 12-07-2026): appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over West Uttar Pradesh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at most places over Himachal Pradesh; at few places over East Rajasthan. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at most places over Konkan & Goa; at few places over East Uttar Pradesh. **The highest maximum temperature** of 41.0°C was reported at PHALODI-OBS (RAJASTHAN), TIRUPATHI (ANDHRA PRADESH), and MADURAI (A) (TAMIL NADU).

Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0830 hours IST)

- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now passes through Sri Ganganagar, Hissar, Moradabad, Gorakhpur, Muzaffarpur, Balurghat and thence east-southeastwards to Manipur.
- The **Western Disturbance** as cyclonic circulation now lies over central Pakistan & neighbourhood at 3.1 km above mean sea level with a trough aloft in middle tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level runs roughly along Long. 72°E to the north of Lat. 32°N.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over South Bangladesh & neighbourhood now lies over North Bay of Bengal & adjoining South Bangladesh between 4.5 & 5.8 km above mean sea level.
- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over East Bangladesh & neighbourhood and extends upto 3.1 km above mean sea level.
- A **Trough** runs from North west Bihar to Manipur across **upper air cyclonic circulation** over East Bangladesh & Tripura at 0.9 km above mean sea level.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Northeast Bihar & neighbourhood at 3.1 km above mean sea level has become less marked.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Northeast Assam & neighbourhood between 1.5 & 3.1 km above mean sea level has become less marked.
- The **trough** in westerlies roughly along Long. 89°E to the north of Lat. 21°N upto 1.5 km above mean sea level has become less marked.

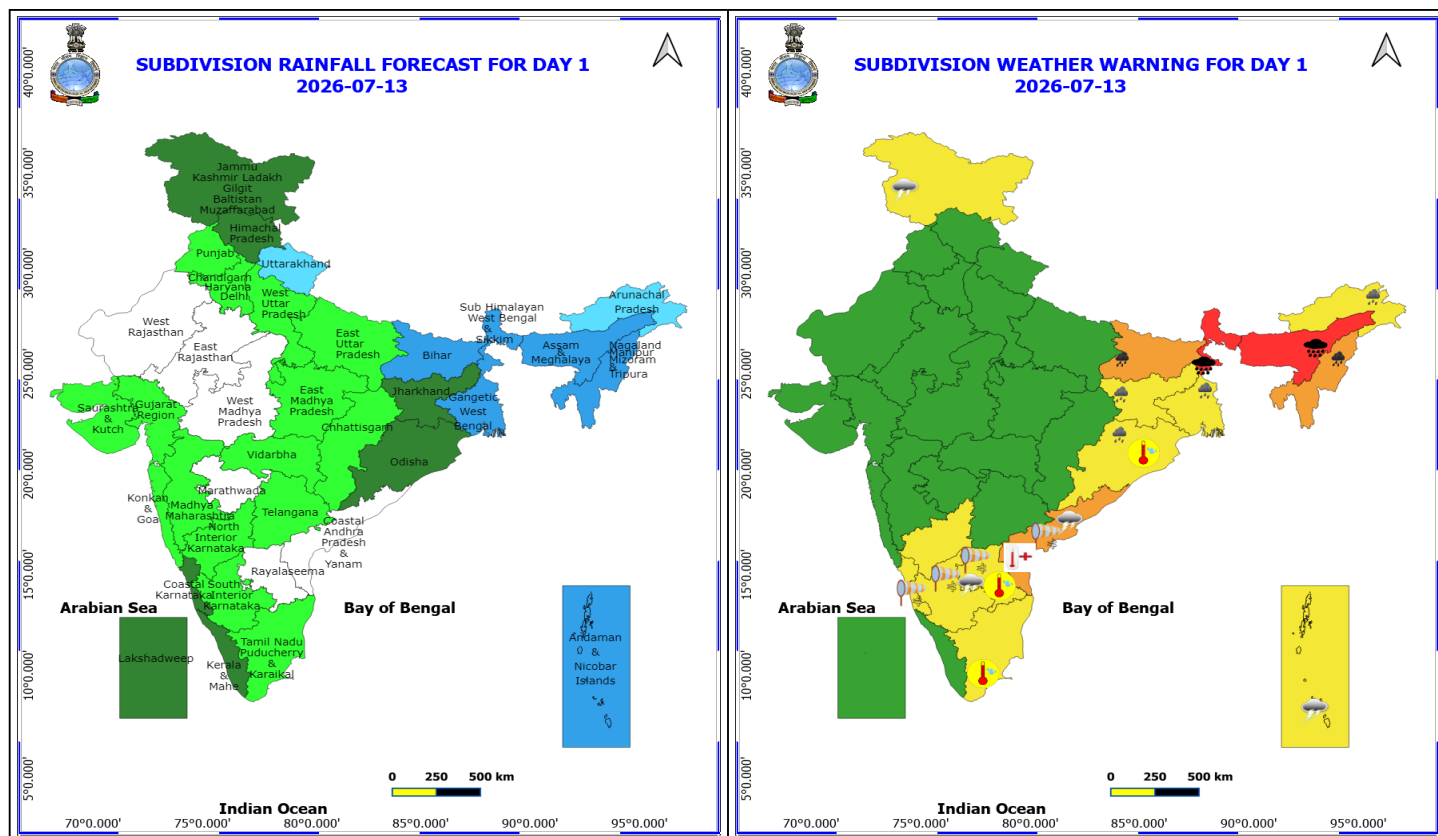

24 hours Outlook for the Flash Flood Risk (FFR) till 1130 IST of 14-07-2026 :

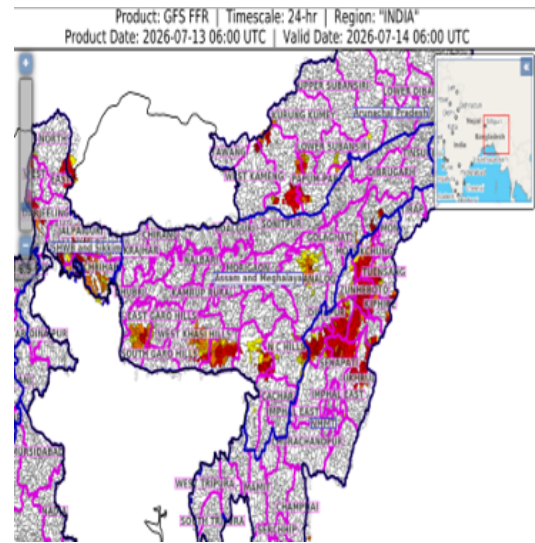
Low to Moderate flash flood risk likely over few watersheds & neighbourhoods of following Met Sub-divisions during next 24 hours.

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-07-12

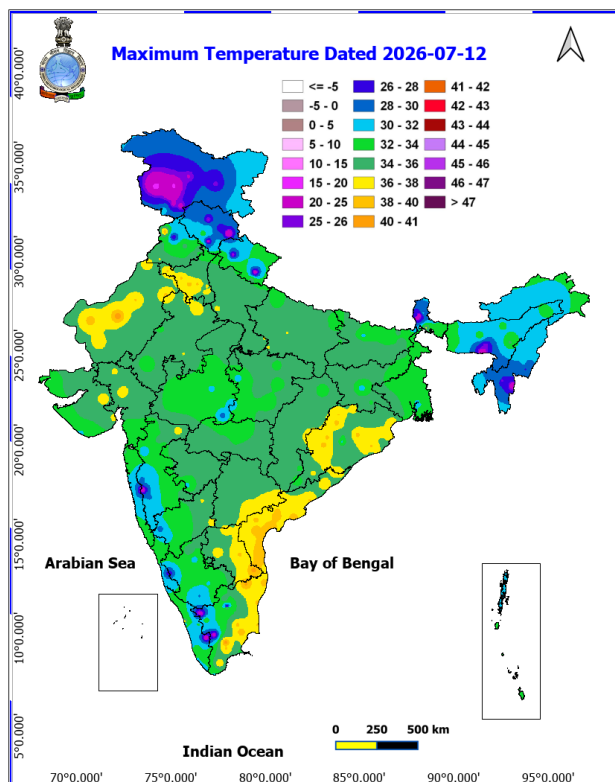


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-07-12

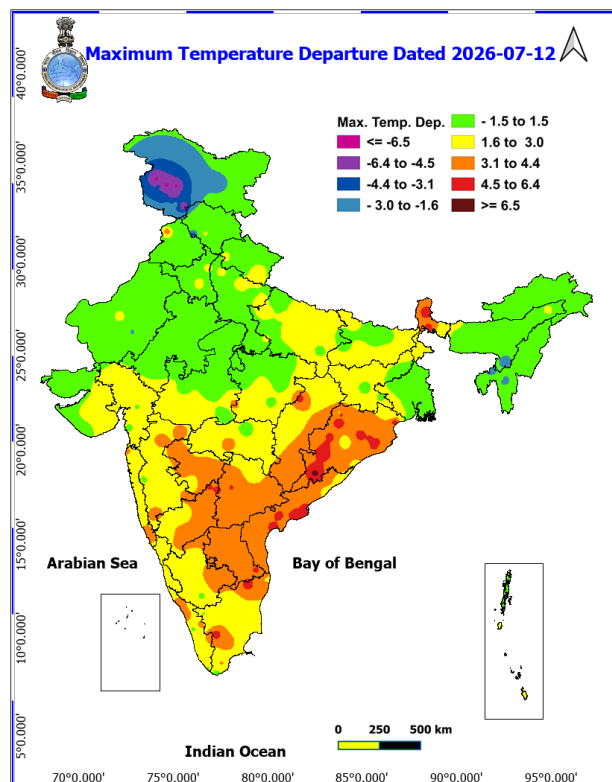


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-07-13

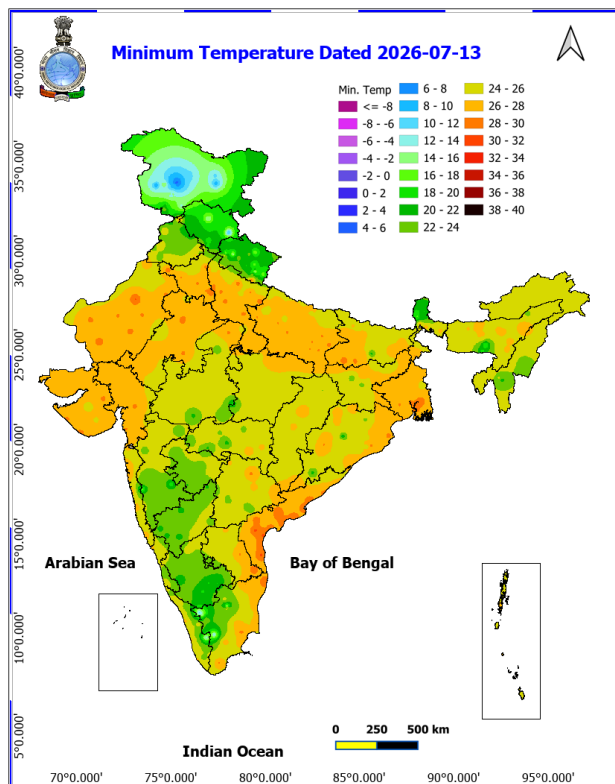
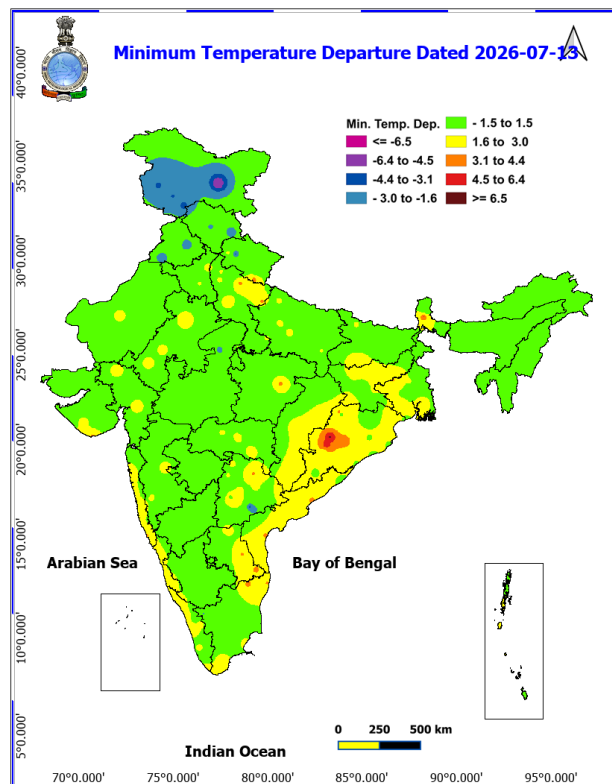
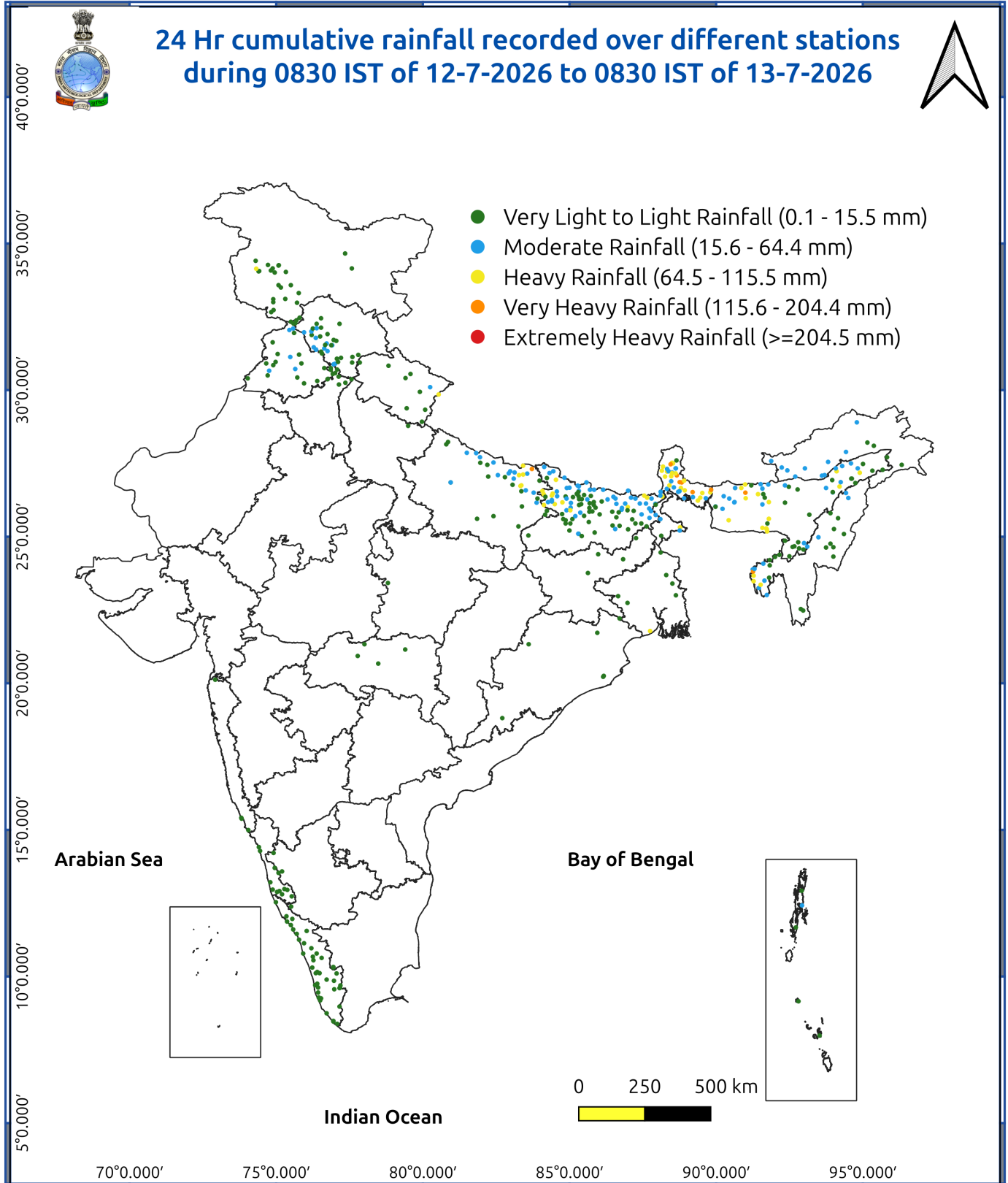


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-07-13





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected & Action Suggested due to heavy/very heavy rainfall over

- Heavy to very heavy rainfall with extremely heavy rainfall likely at isolated places over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim and Meghalaya on 13th July.

Impact Expected

- Localized Flooding of roads, water logging in low lying areas and closure of underpasses mainly in urban areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Disruption of traffic in major cities due to water logging in roads leading to increased travel time.
- Minor damage to kutcha roads.
- Possibilities of damage to vulnerable structure.
- Localized Landslides/Mudslides/landslips/mudslips/landsinks/mudsinks.
- Damage to horticulture and standing crops in some areas due to inundation.
- It may lead to riverine flooding in some river catchments (for riverine flooding please visit Web page of CWC)

Action Suggested

- Check for traffic congestion on your route before leaving for your destination.
- Follow any traffic advisories that are issued in this regard.
- Avoid going to areas that face the water logging problems often.
- Avoid staying in vulnerable structure.

- **Heat wave** conditions very likely in isolated pockets over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam during 13th-15th July.

Alert Areas

- High temperature & increased likelihood of heat illness symptoms in people who are either exposed to sun for a prolonged period or doing heavy work.
- High health concern for vulnerable people e.g. infants, elderly, people with chronic diseases.
- Avoid heat exposure– keep cool. Avoid dehydration.
- Drink sufficient water- even if not thirsty.
- Use ORS, homemade drinks like lassi, torani (rice water), lemon water, buttermilk, etc. to keep yourself hydrated.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

In **Assam**, Ensure proper drainage to drain out excess rain water from the fields of sugarcane, soybean, pigeon pea, jute & sesame and fruit orchards.

In **West Bengal**, maintain proper drainage in rice and finger millet nurseries as well as ginger, tomato, brinjal, Dalley khorsani and other vegetable fields to prevent waterlogging. Drain out excess water from the crop fields. Harvest all the matured crops and vegetables. Harvest mature tea leaves and vegetables during rain. Inspect and strengthen bunds around rice nurseries to prevent flooding and maintain adequate drainage.

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In **Jammu & Kashmir**, make arrangements to drain out excess rainwater from rice nursery and fields of maize and green gram.

In **Punjab**, make arrangements for removal of excess water from cotton and maize fields.

In **Haryana**, drain out the standing water from cotton fields immediate after excess rain.

In **Himachal Pradesh**, prioritize good drainage in crop fields of cucurbits, tomato, capsicum and maize fields to avoid waterlogging.

In **EastUttar Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in fields of rice, maize, sesame and vegetables.

In **Bihar**, postpone irrigation in standing crops and apply fertilizers and pesticides only when the sky is clear. Ensure proper drainage in crop fields prone to waterlogging to prevent crop damage due to excess rainfall.

In **Arunachal Pradesh**, Drain out excess water from crops (rice, maize, soybean, finger millet). Where large gaps have formed due to crop loss, carry out gap filling where feasible.

In **Uttarakhand**, delay sowing of groundnut, soybean and maize till the weather improves. Maintain proper drainage channels in already sown fields of groundnut, soybean, maize, tomato and chilli.

In **Meghalaya**, Ensure proper drainage in rice nursery beds and field of maize, cow pea, okra and ginger crop. Strengthen nursery bunds to prevent runoff and seedling washout.

In the regions expecting heavy rainfall, including **Chattisgarh and Odisha** withhold irrigation in standing crops, make necessary arrangements to remove excess rain water from the crop fields.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

In **Jammu & Kashmir, Ladakh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Telengana, Rayalaseema**, post-pone fertilizer application and other field activities

Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.

In **Keralam, Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Telengana, Rayalaseema, Karnataka and Tamilnadu**.

Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of High temperatures/ Heat Waves

- In **Coastal Andhra Pradesh**, provide light irrigation to maintain adequate moisture in standing crops

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- In regions with high temperatures and heat wave conditions, provide clean, cool drinking water to animals, and cover the roofs of poultry sheds with grass to reduce the adverse effects of heat.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.

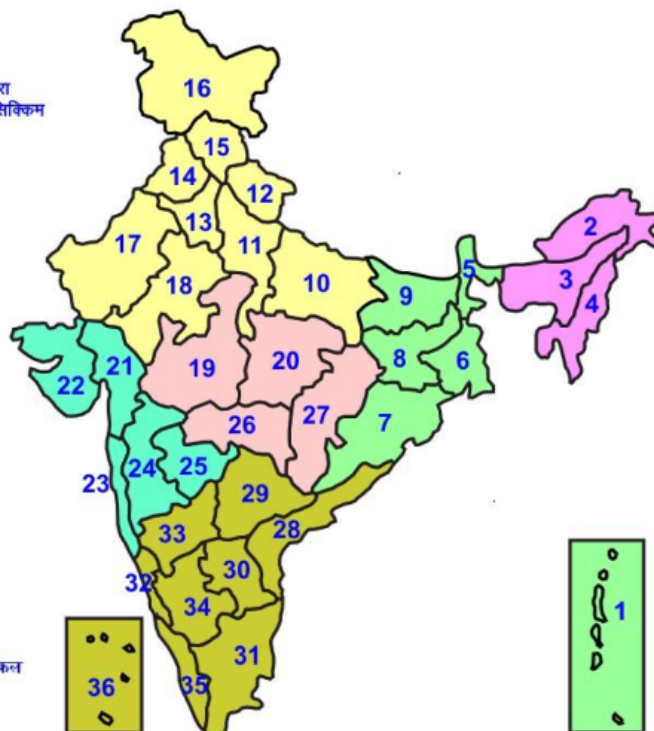
