ALL INDIA WEATHER SUMMARY AND FORECAST BULLETIN

Significant Weather Features

Weather Forecast and warning:

- Fairly widespread to widespread rainfall/snowfall with **lightning & gusty winds speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph** over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh, Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand on 23rd January with **reduction to isolated to scattered light to moderate rainfall/snowfall on 24th & 25th**. **Isolated heavy rainfall/snowfall likely over Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand and isolated heavy to very heavy rainfall over Jammu-Kashmir on 23rd January.**
- Widespread light to moderate scattered rainfall **lightning & gusty winds speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph** over Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh, north Rajasthan, north Uttar Pradesh on 23rd with **isolated heavy rainfall over Punjab and Haryana on 23rd January.**
- Isolated **Hailstorm** activity also likely over Jammu-Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Haryana, Northwest Uttar Pradesh on 23rd January.
- A fresh wet spell with Fairly widespread to widespread rainfall/snowfall over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh, Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand on 27th and scattered rainfall/snowfall on 28th January. **Isolated heavy rainfall/snowfall also likely over Jammu-Kashmir and Himachal Pradesh 27th January and isolated to scattered** light to moderate scattered rainfall over adjoining plains of northwest India during the same period.
- Thunderstorm activity accompanied with lightning** also likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal on 23rd and over Kerala & Mahe on 26th with **isolated heavy rain** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal on 23rd January.

Forecast of minimum temperatures:

- Fall in minimum temperatures by 3-5°C over Northwest India during next 24 hours; no significant change during next 2 days and gradual rise by 2-4°C during subsequent 3 days.
- Gradual fall in minimum temperatures by 2-4°C over Central India during next 3 days and gradual rise by 2-3°C during subsequent 4 days.
- Gradual fall in minimum temperatures by 2-3°C over Maharashtra during next 48 hours; gradual rise by 2-3°C during subsequent 3 days and no significant change thereafter.
- Gradual fall in minimum temperatures by 2-3°C over Gujarat during next 24 hours; gradual rise by 2-4°C during subsequent 3 days and no significant change thereafter.
- No significant change in minimum temperatures likely over rest parts of the country.

Dense Fog & Cold wave Warnings:

- Dense to very dense fog** conditions likely during morning/ night hours in some/isolated pockets over Punjab and Haryana & Chandigarh during 24th-26th and **dense fog conditions** at isolated places on 23rd January.
- Dense fog** conditions also likely during morning/night hours in isolated pockets over Himachal Pradesh during 24th-26th; Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh till 25th; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim till 26th January.
- Cold wave** conditions likely in isolated pockets over Himachal Pradesh on 25th & 26th January.

❖ **Light to moderate rainfall/snowfall occurred at most places** over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh, Himachal Pradesh and at isolated places over Uttarakhand.

❖ **Heavy Rainfall observed** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today): **Heavy rainfall/Snowfall** at isolated places over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad.

❖ Isolated **hailstorm** activity has been recorded over Jammu, Punjab and East Rajasthan.

❖ **Dense fog conditions** prevailed in isolated pockets of Meghalaya.

❖ **Visibility reported** : Meghalaya: Barapani 50.

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 23-01-2026): Minimum Temperatures** were above normal by (2°C to 5°C) over Jammu-Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Central India and adjoining western India, Bihar, Gangetic West Bengal, Assam & Meghalaya, Arunachal Pradesh and below normal by (-2°C to -4°C) over Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh, Telangana, Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe, Tamil Nadu and near normal over rest parts of the country. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 4.4°C is reported at Ludhiana (Punjab) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 22-01-2026): The highest maximum temperature** of 35.2°C is reported at KOTTAYAM (KERALA).




Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0830 hours IST)

- The **well marked low pressure area** over north Pakistan & neighbourhood persisted over the same region. The associated cyclonic circulation extends upto 9.4 km above mean sea level tilting northwestwards with height.
- The **trough** now runs from cyclonic circulation associated with the **well marked low pressure area** over north Pakistan & neighbourhood to northeast Arabian sea between 1.5 & 5.8 km above mean sea level.
- The **Western disturbance** as a trough in upper Tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 7.6 km above mean sea level roughly along Long. 70°E to the north of Lat. 25°N merged with the above **well marked low pressure area**.
- A **trough** in easterlies runs roughly along Long. 85°E to the south of Lat. 10°N at 0.9 km above mean sea level.
- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over South Interior Karnataka & neighbourhood at 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- **Subtropical westerly Jet Stream** with core winds of the order of 135 knots at 12.6 km above mean sea level continues to prevail over North India.
- A fresh **western disturbance** is likely to affect northwest India from 26th January 2026.

Weather Outlook for subsequent 3 days

- Isolated/Scattered rainfall/snowfall activity likely over Western Himalayan Region.
- Isolated/Scattered rainfall activity likely over Punjab, Uttar Pradesh, Tamil Nadu and Madhya Pradesh.

- ❖ **Heavy to Very Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad.

- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(40-50kmph)** very likely at isolated places over East Rajasthan, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Uttarakhand and West Uttar Pradesh.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over East Uttar Pradesh and West Rajasthan.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Tamil Nadu Puducherry & Karaikal.
- ❖ **Dense Fog** very likely at isolated places over Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Madhya Pradesh, Punjab, Rajasthan and Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim.
- ❖ **Squally weather with speeds of 40 to 50 kmph gusting up to 60 kmph** is likely to prevail over many parts of the north; some parts of westcentral Arabian Sea; along and off north Gujarat and Oman coast, some parts of southwest, southeast & adjoining westcentral Bay of Bengal.

Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-01-22








Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-01-23

Impact and Actions

Impact expected due to dense/very dense fog in the morning hours:

- **Dense to very dense fog** conditions likely during morning/ night hours in some/isolated pockets over Punjab and Haryana & Chandigarh during 24th-26th and **dense fog conditions** at isolated places on 23rd January.
- **Dense fog** conditions also likely during morning/night hours in isolated pockets over Himachal Pradesh during 24th-26th; Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh till 25th; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim till 26th January.

Transport and Aviation:

- May affect some airports, highways and railway routes in the areas of met- sub-division.
- Difficult driving conditions with slower journey times.
- Unless taken precautionary measures, it may lead to some road traffic collisions.

Power Sector:

- Chances of Tripping of Power lines in the very dense fog routes.

Human Health:

- Lung related health impacts: Dense fog contains particulate matter and other pollutants and in case exposed it gets lodged in the lungs, clogging them and decreasing their functional capacity which increases episodes of wheezing, coughing and shortness of breath.
- Impact on people having asthma bronchitis: Long time exposure to dense fog may cause respiratory problem for people having asthma bronchitis and other lung related health problems.
- Eye Irritation: Dense fog contains pollutions of various types and these Pollutants in the air if exposed may tend to irritate the membranes of the eye causing various infections leading to redness or swelling of the eye.

Action suggested:

Transport and Aviation:

- Be careful while driving or outing through any transport.
- Use fog lights during driving.
- Be in touch with airlines, railways and state transport for schedule of your journey.
- Power Sector:
 - To keep ready Maintenance Team.
- Human Health: To avoid outing until unless emergency and to cover the face.

Impact expected and action suggested due to isolated thunderstorm with lightning/gusty & Squally winds & Hailstorm over

- **Hailstorm** activity also likely over Jammu-Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Haryana, West Uttar Pradesh on 23rd January.
- **Thunderstorm with lightning & winds speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph** likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand on 23rd & 27th; Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh, West Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan on 23rd January.

Impact expected:

- Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of large avenue trees. Large dead limbs blown from trees. Damage to Standing crops.

- Minor to Major damage to banana and papaya trees.
- Minor to major damage to power and communication lines due to breaking of branches.
- Strong wind/hail may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- Hail may injure people and cattle at open places.
- Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds.
- Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls and huts.
- Loose objects may fly.

Action suggested:

- People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- Stay indoors, close windows & doors and avoid travel if possible.
- Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees.
- Do not lie on concrete floors and do not lean against concrete walls.
- Unplug electrical/ electronic appliances.
- Immediately get out of water bodies.
- Keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.

Impact & Action Suggested due to Isolated very heavy rainfall over Jammu-Kashmir on 23rd January.

Impact Expected

- Localized Flooding of roads, water logging in low lying areas and closure of underpasses mainly in urban areas of the above region.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Disruption of traffic in major cities due to water logging in roads leading to increased travel time.
- Minor damage to kutcha roads.
- Possibilities of damage to vulnerable structure.
- Localized Landslides/Mudslides/landslips/mudslips/landsinks/mudsinks.
- Damage to horticulture and standing crops in some areas due to inundation.
- It may lead to riverine flooding in some river catchments (for riverine flooding please visit Web page of CWC)

Action Suggested

- Check for traffic congestion on your route before leaving for your destination.
- Follow any traffic advisories that are issued in this regard.
- Avoid going to areas that face the water logging problems often.
- Avoid staying in vulnerable structure.

- ❖ In **Jammu & Kashmir**, make necessary arrangement to drain out excess water from wheat, mustard, chickpea, pea and vegetables fields. Gently shake the trees to remove snow immediately from the branches.
- ❖ In **Himachal Pradesh**, make necessary arrangements to drain out excessrainwater from the standing crops, vegetable fields and fruit orchards.

- ❖ In **Uttarakhand**, make necessary arrangements to drain excess water from standing crop fields and vegetables.
- ❖ In **North Punjab**, make necessary arrangements to drain out excess rainwater from the standing crops such as wheat, mustard, sugarcane, orchards and vegetable crops.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Hailstorm

- ❖ Use hail nets to protect orchards and vegetable plants in Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Haryana, West Uttar Pradesh and East Rajasthan.

Livestock

- ❖ Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and hailstorm period and provide them balanced feed. Store feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Cold Waves / Low Temperatures

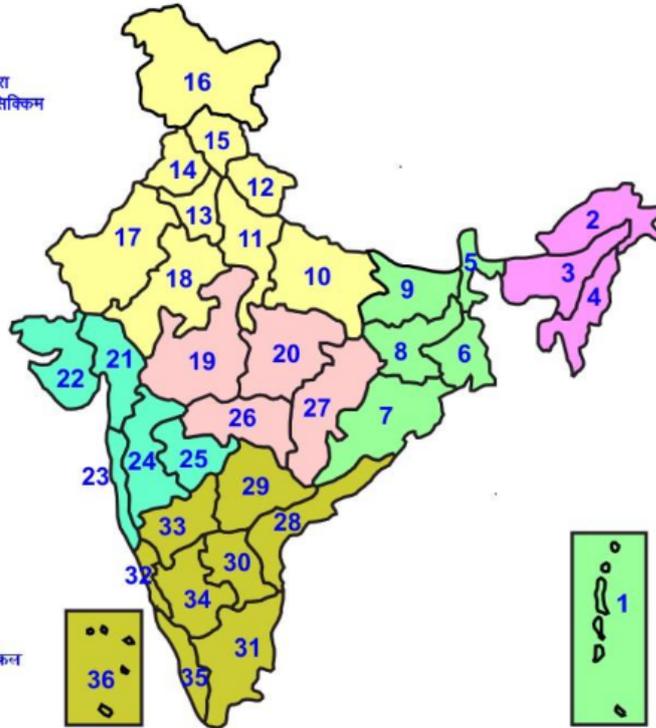
- ❖ In **Himachal Pradesh**, apply light and frequent irrigation to the standing crops in the evening hours to protect crops from low temperature stress or cold injury. Use mulching and cover the vegetable nurseries and young fruit plants with straw / polythene sheets to maintain optimum soil temperature.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

- ❖ Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Phenomenon of small droplets suspended in air and the horizontal visibility $< 1\text{km}$

Moderate Fog: When the visibility between 500-200 metres
Dense Fog: when the visibility between 50- 200 metres
Very Dense Fog: when the visibility < 50 metres



Sudden electrical discharges manifested by a flash of light (Lightning) and a sharp rumbling sound (thunder)



An ensemble of particles of dust or sand energetically lifted to great heights by a strong and turbulent wind.



Ice deposits on ground

Air temperature $\leq 4^{\circ}\text{C}$ (over Plains)



A strong wind that rises suddenly, lasts for atleast 1 minute.

Moderate: Wind speed 52-61 kmph

Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 62-87 kmph (34-47 knots)
Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 88-117 kmph (48-63 knots)
Very Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 118-165 kmph (64 - 89 knots)
Extremely Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 166-220 kmph (90 -119 knots)
Super Cyclone Storm: Wind speed > 220 kmph (> 119 knots)
