ALL INDIA WEATHER SUMMARY AND FORECAST BULLETIN

Significant Weather Features

Weather Systems, Forecast and Warnings:

Isolated rainfall/snowfall likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad during, 13th, 16th & 17th; Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand on 17th & 18th February

Isolated rainfall with **thunderstorm, lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 13th-15th and over Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh, West Uttar Pradesh and north Rajasthan on 17th and over Andaman & Nicobar Islands on 16th & 17th February.

Forecast of minimum temperatures:

No significant change in minimum temperatures likely over Northwest India for next 2 days, gradual rise by 2-3°C during subsequent 3 days and no significant change thereafter.

No significant change in minimum temperatures likely over Central India for next 2 days and gradual rise by 2-3°C during subsequent 5 days.

No significant change in minimum temperatures likely over Maharashtra for next 4 days and gradual rise by 2-3°C during subsequent 3 days.

No significant change in minimum temperatures likely over rest parts of the country.

Forecast of maximum temperatures:

Gradual rise in maximum temperature over many parts of Maharashtra and Karnataka by 2-3°C during next 4 days and thereafter fall by 2-3°C for subsequent 3 days.

Dense Fog Warnings:

Dense fog conditions likely during morning hours at isolated places over Himachal Pradesh till 15th February.

Hot and Humid Warnings:

Hot and Humid conditions likely over Coastal Karnataka during 13th-15th and over Konkan & Goa on 14th & 15th February.

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Main Weather Observations:

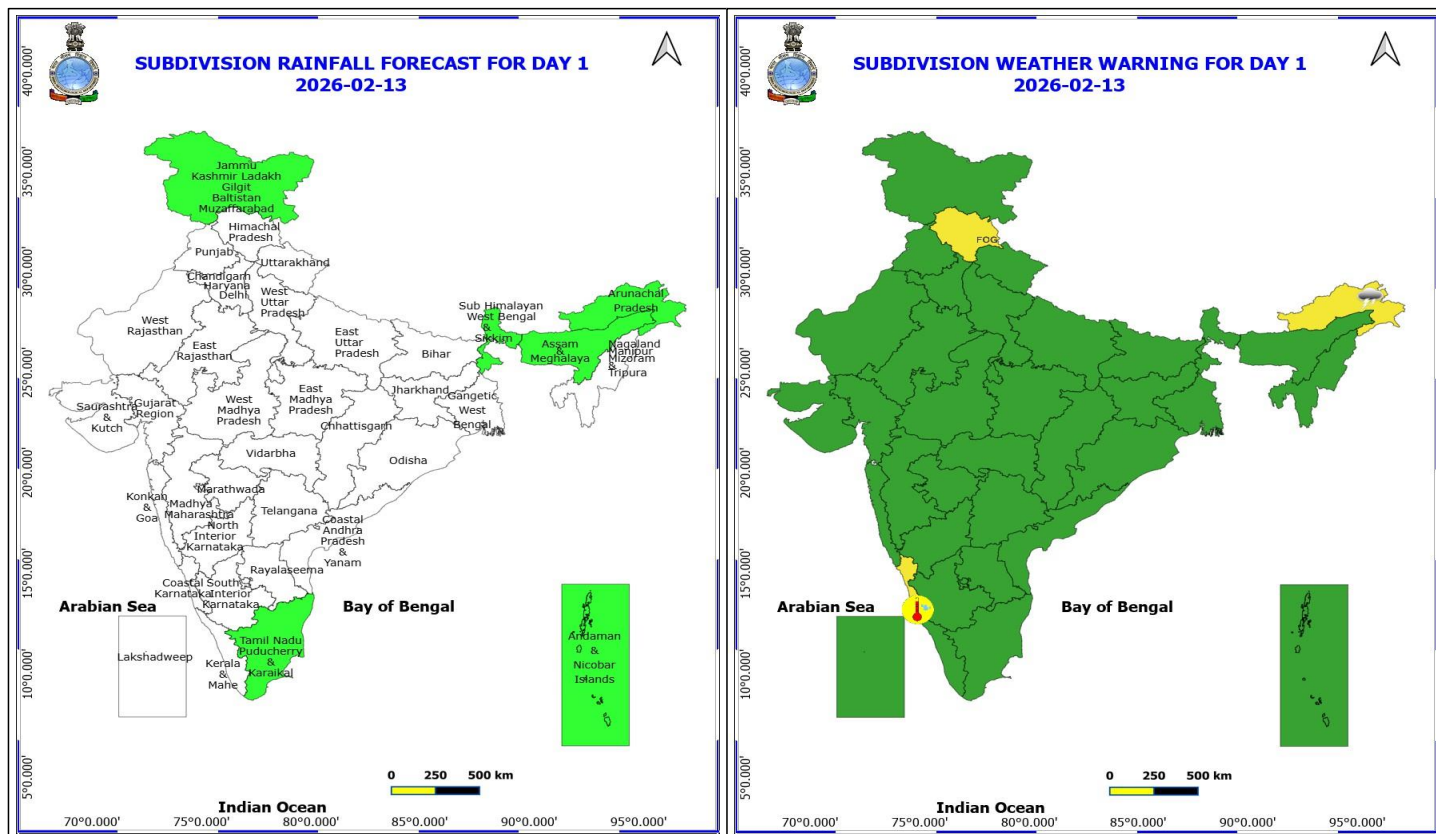
- ❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today): **at isolated places** over Arunachal Pradesh and Jammu-Kashmir Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad; **Dry** over rest of the country.
- ❖ **Dense to very Dense fog (visibility <50 m)** conditions at isolated pockets over Himachal Pradesh; **Dense fog (visibility 50-199 m)** conditions prevailed in isolated pockets over Meghalaya.
- ❖ **Visibility Reported (In Meters <200 m): Himachal Pradesh:** Bilaspur (40); **Meghalaya:** Barapani (50).
- ❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 13-02-2026): below normal (-1.6°C to -3.0°C)** at few places over Jharkhand, south peninsular India and **above normal (1.6°C to 3.1°C)** at many places over western Himalayan Region, Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Rajasthan, Marathwada, Madhya Maharashtra, Assam & Meghalaya and **near normal** over rest parts of the country. The **lowest minimum** temperature of **6.5°C** was observed at **Sikar (East Rajasthan)** over the plains of India.
- ❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 12-02-2026):** The highest maximum temperature of 37.8°C is reported at KARWAR (KARNATAKA).

Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0830 hours IST)

- ♦ The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over east Equatorial Indian Ocean and adjoining southeast Bay of Bengal extending upto 5.8 km above mean sea level persisted over the same region at 0830 hrs IST of today, the 13th February 2026. Under its influence, a low pressure area is likely to form over the same region around 15th February 2026.
- ♦ The **Western Disturbance** as a trough in lower & middle level tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 3.1 km above mean sea level now runs roughly along Long. 70°E to the north of Lat. 32°N.
- ♦ **Subtropical westerly Jet Stream** with core winds of the order of 130 knots at 12.6 km above mean sea level continues to prevail over Northeast India.
- ♦ An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over northeast Assam & neighbourhood at 3.1 km above mean sea level.
- ♦ A **fresh Western Disturbance** is likely to affect Western Himalayan region from 16th February 2026.
- ♦ The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over south Tamil Nadu & neighbourhood at 1.5 km above mean sea level has become less marked.

Weather Outlook for subsequent 3 days

- ♦ Isolated/Scattered rainfall/snowfall activity likely over Western Himalayan Region.
- ♦ Isolated/Scattered rainfall activity likely over Punjab, Haryana-Chandigarh, Rajasthan, West Uttar Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Lakshadweep and Nicobar islands.

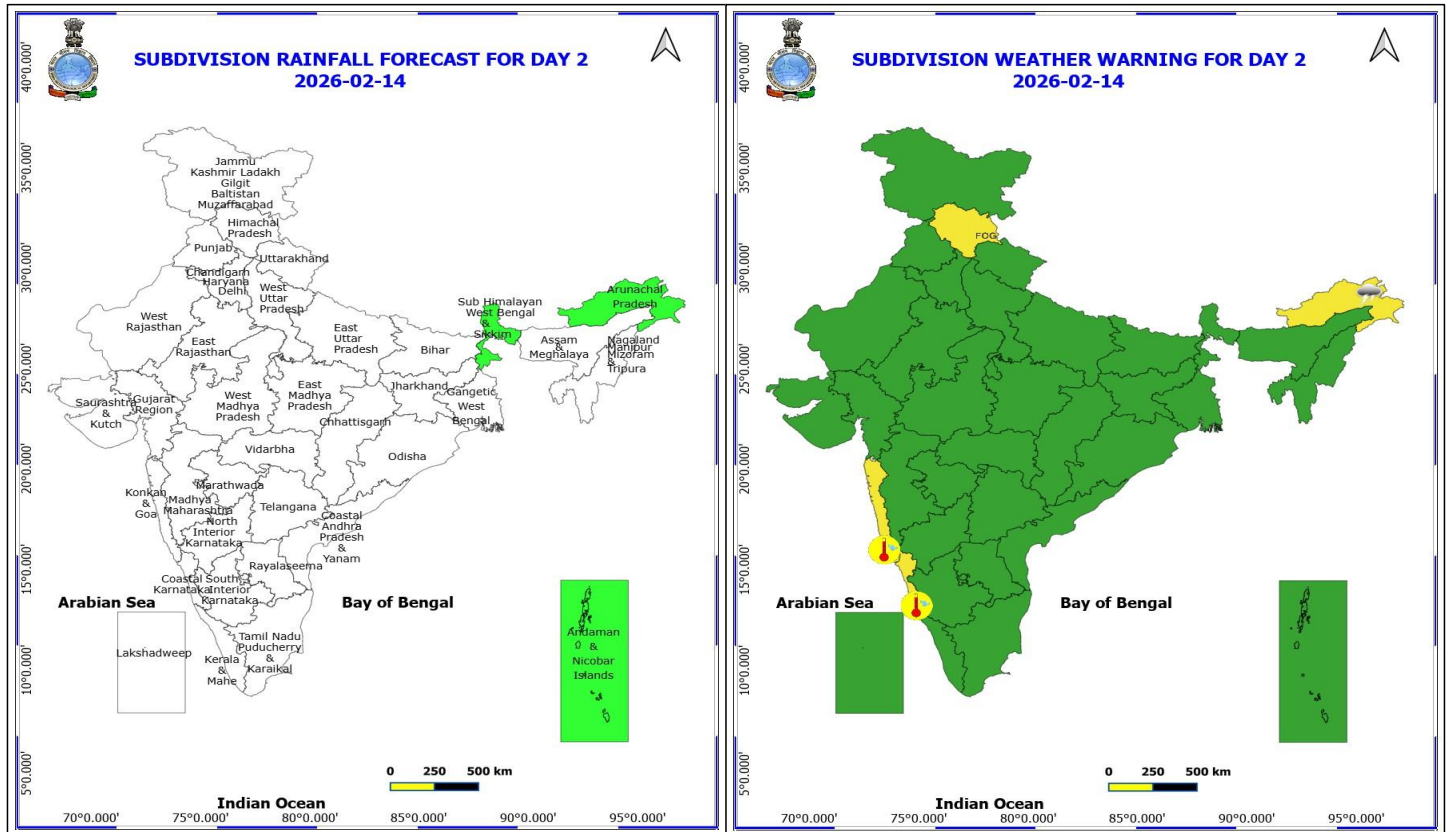
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh.
- ❖ **Hot and Humid weather** very likely at isolated places over Coastal Karnataka.
- ❖ **Dense Fog** very likely at isolated places over Himachal Pradesh.
- ❖ **Squally weather with wind speed 35 to 45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph** likely to prevail over few southern parts of southeast Bay of Bengal adjoining to east Equatorial Indian Ocean.

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14 February (Day 2)

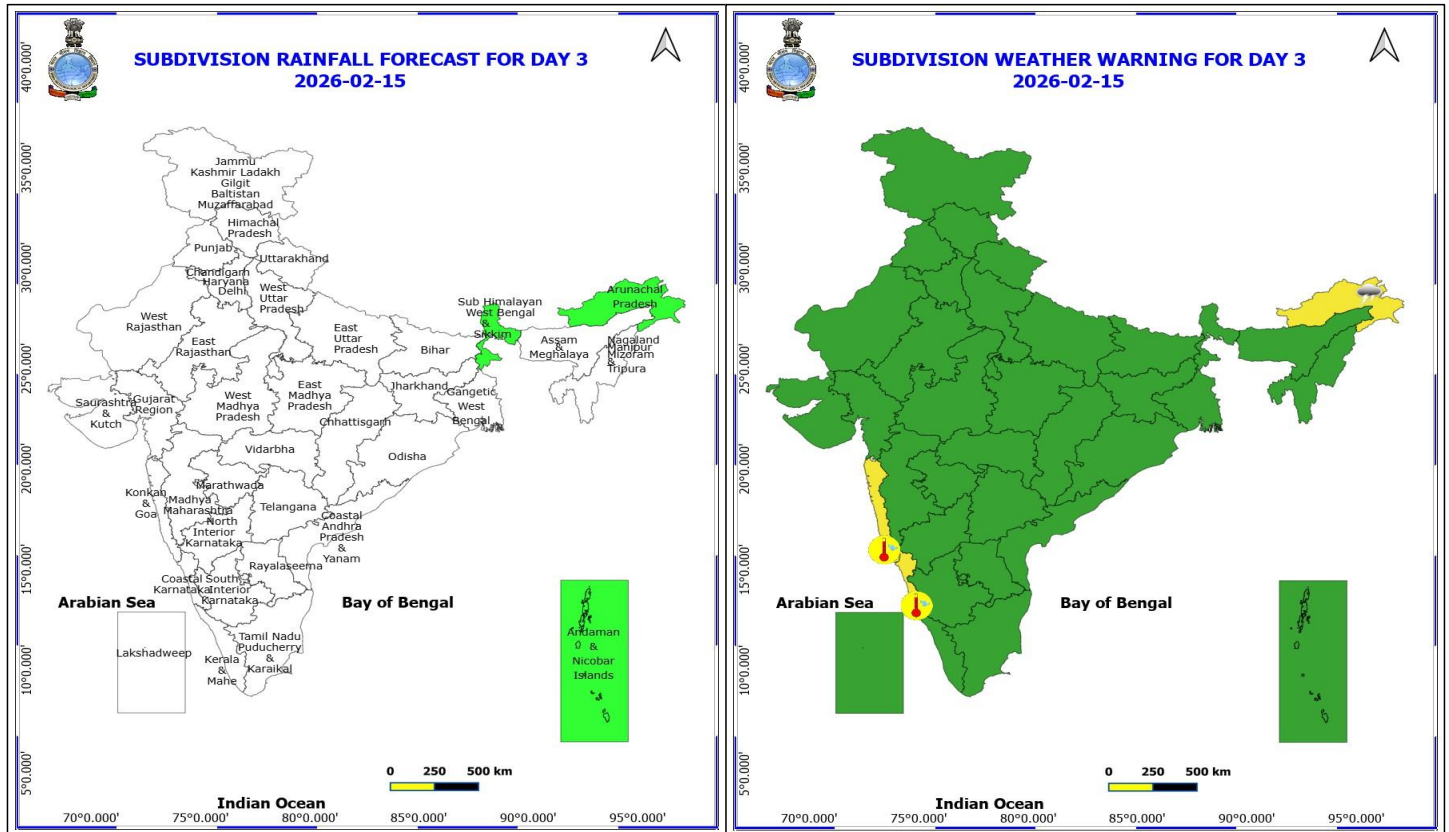
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh.
- ❖ **Hot and Humid weather** very likely at isolated places over Coastal Karnataka and Konkan & Goa.
- ❖ **Dense Fog** very likely at isolated places over Himachal Pradesh.
- ❖ **Squally weather with wind speed 35 to 45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph** likely to prevail over some parts of southeast Bay of Bengal adjoining to east Equatorial Indian Ocean.

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15 February (Day 3)

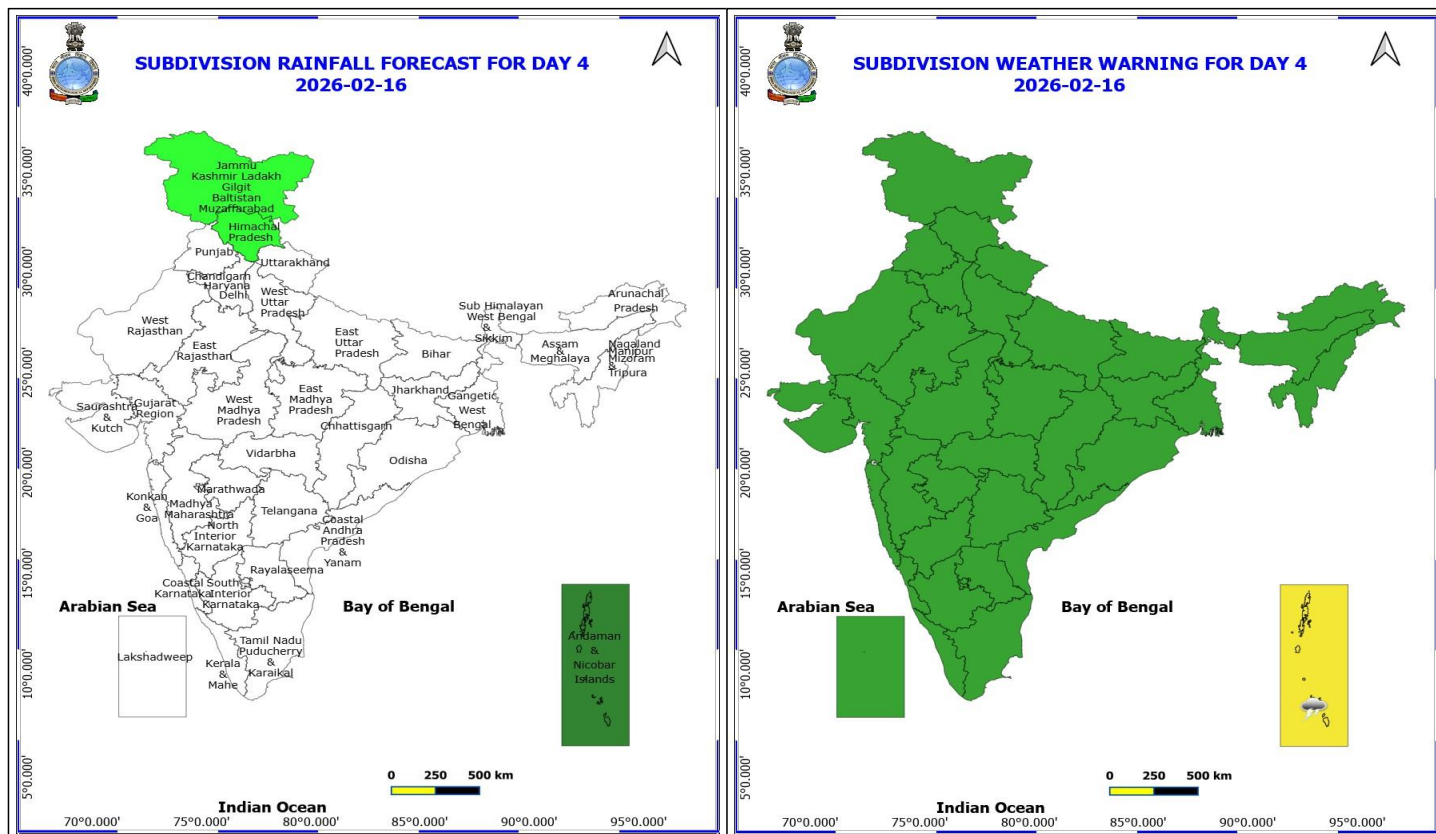
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh.

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16 February (Day 4)

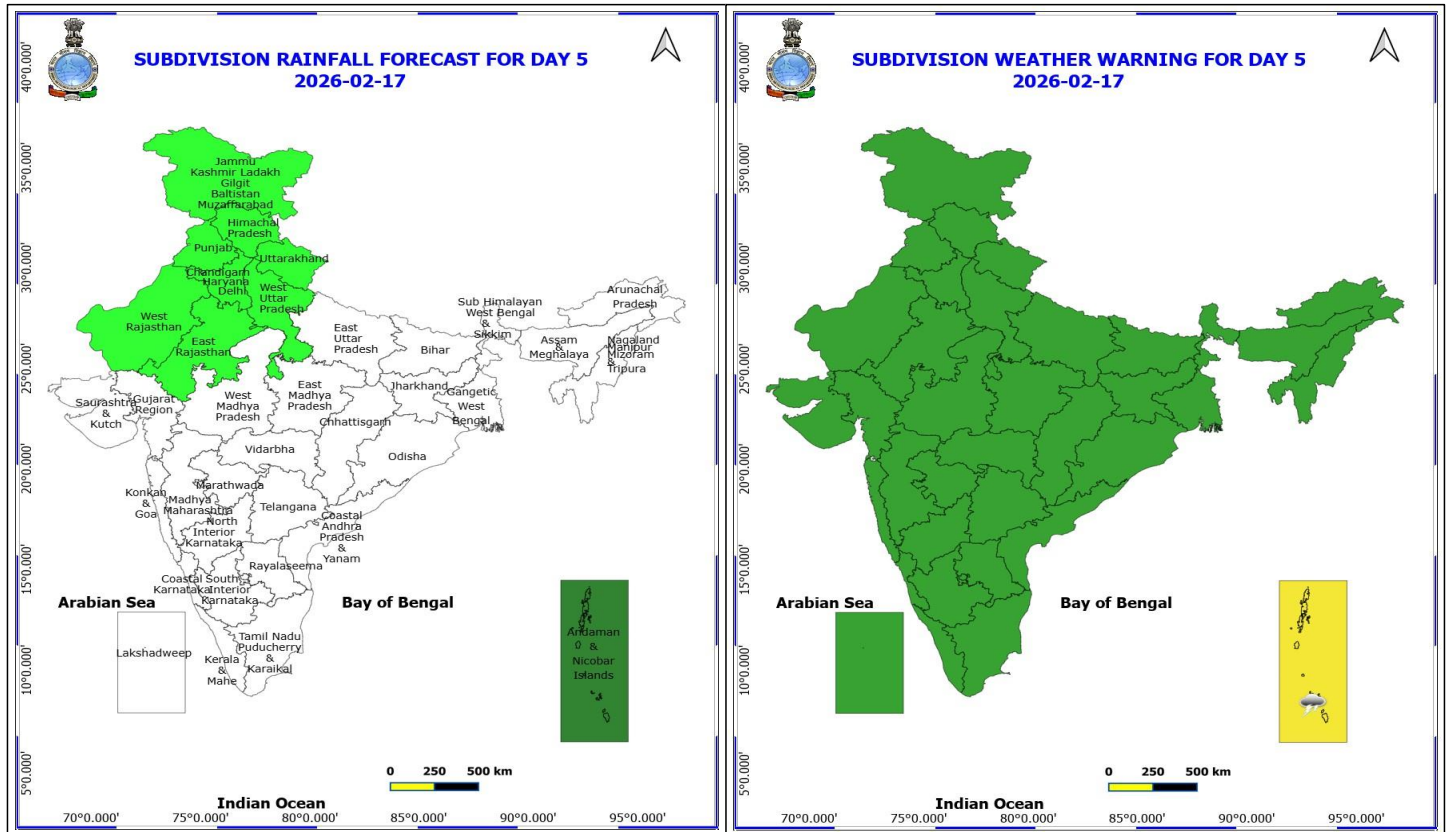
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands.

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17 February (Day 5)

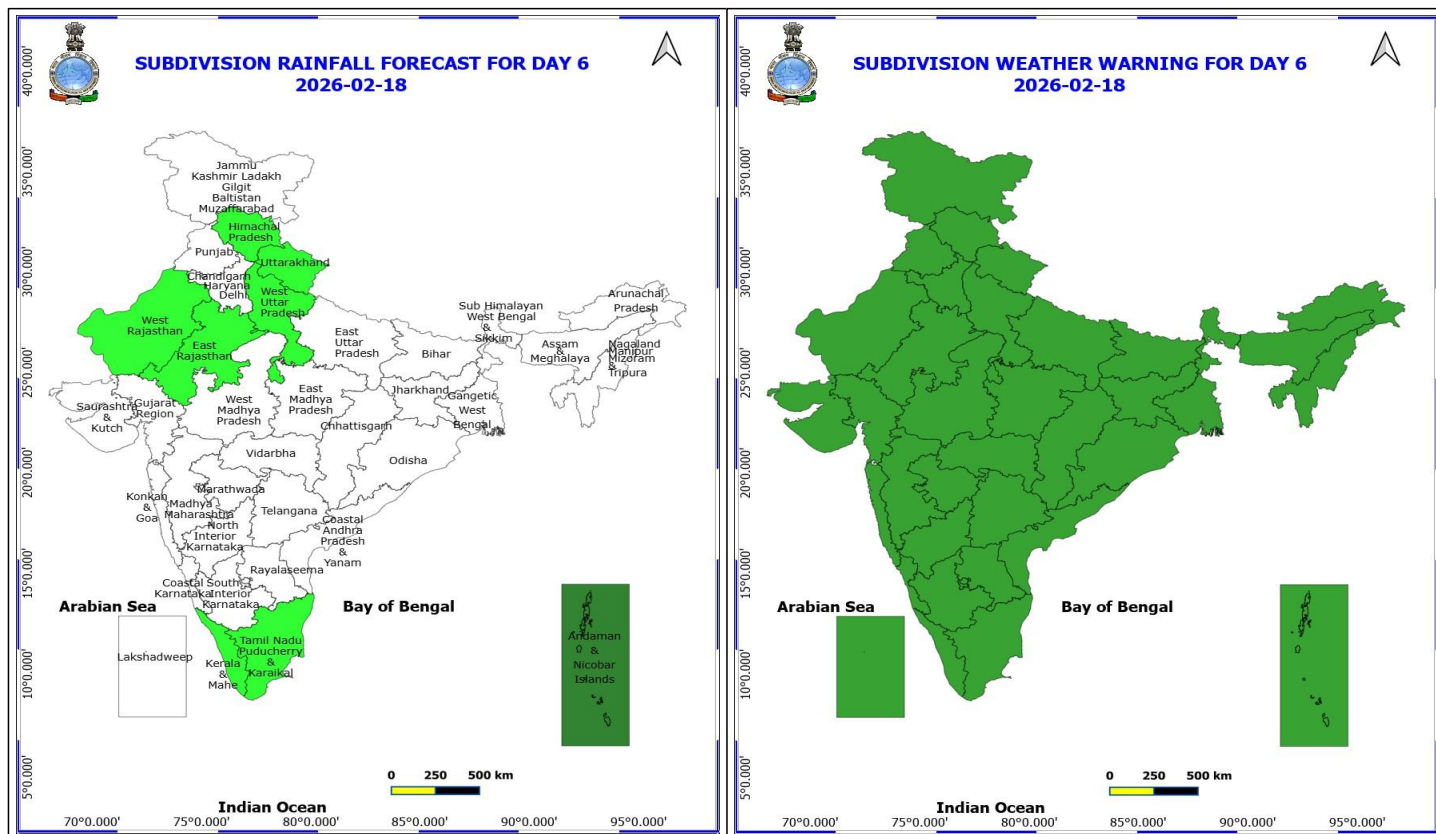

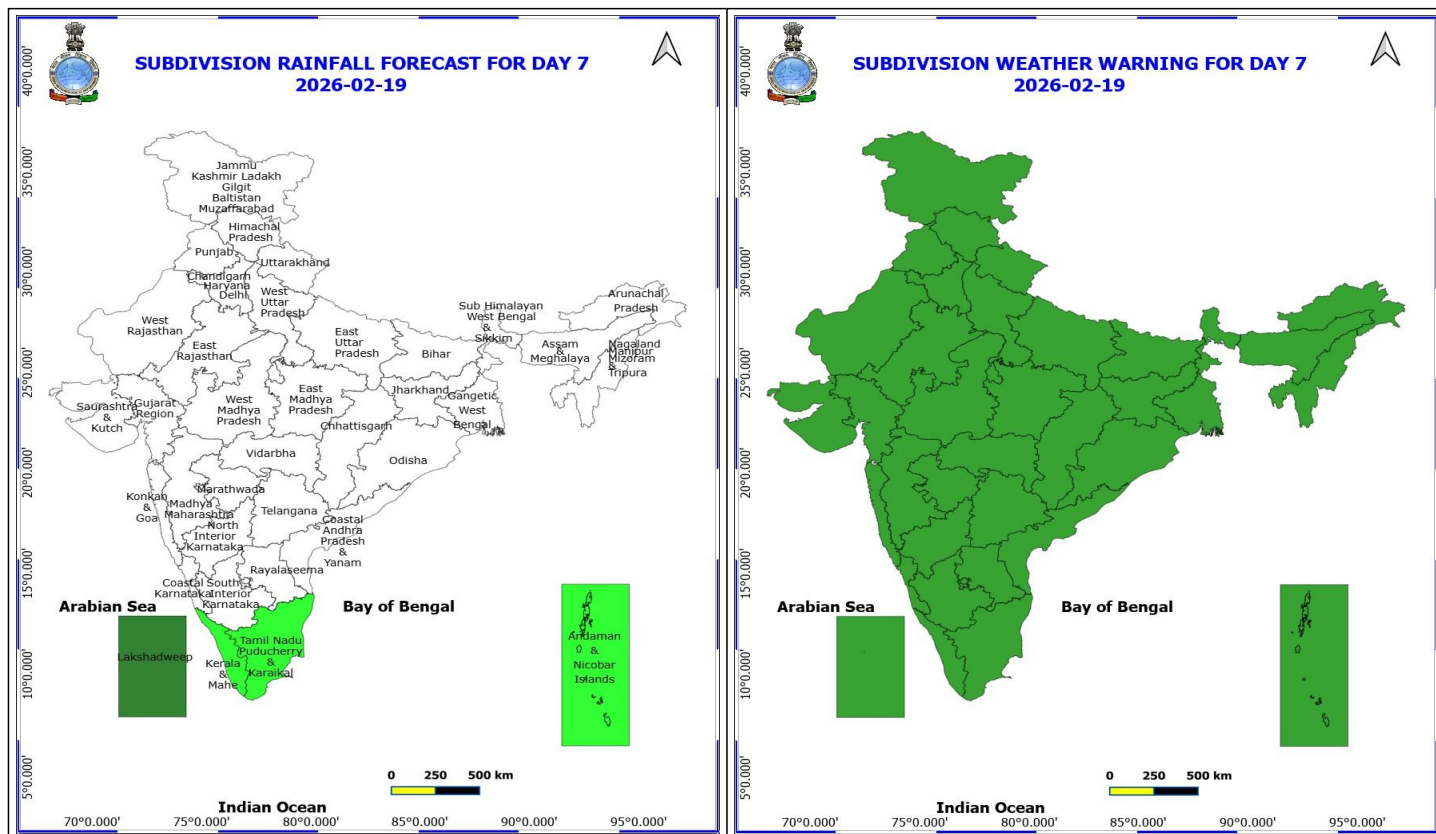

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-02-12

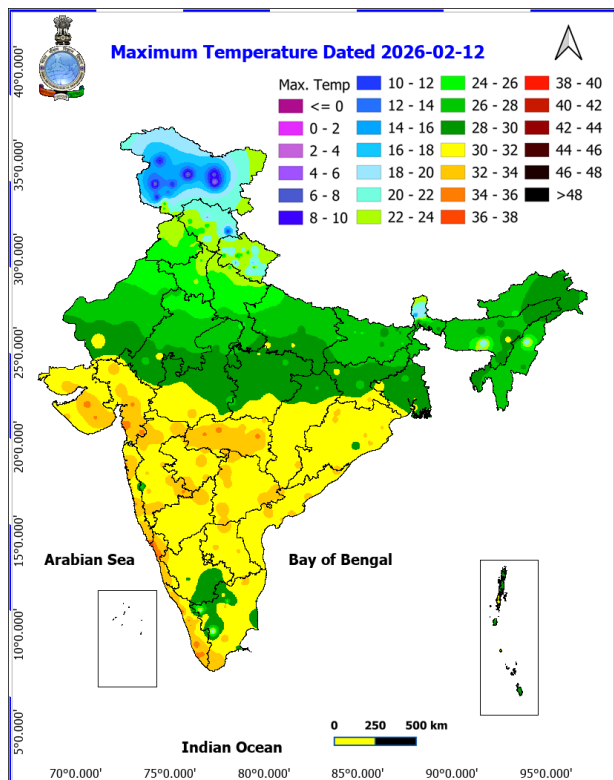


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-02-12

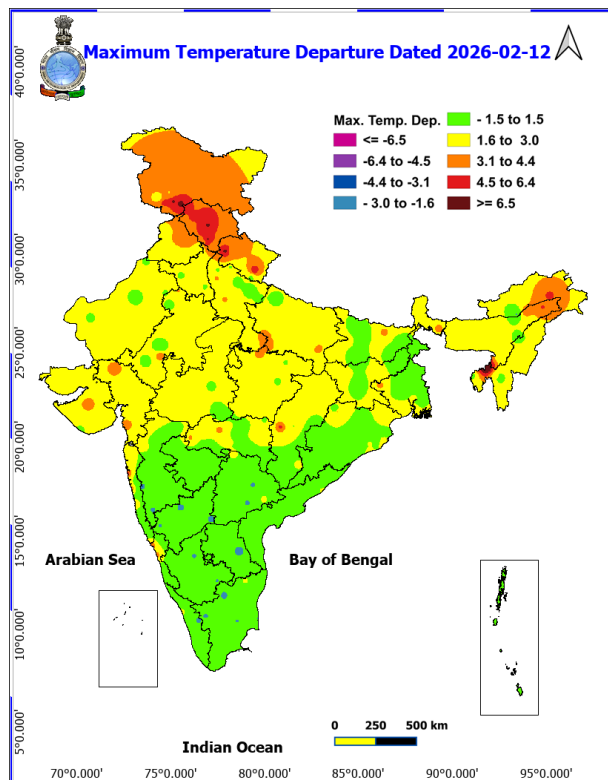


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-02-13

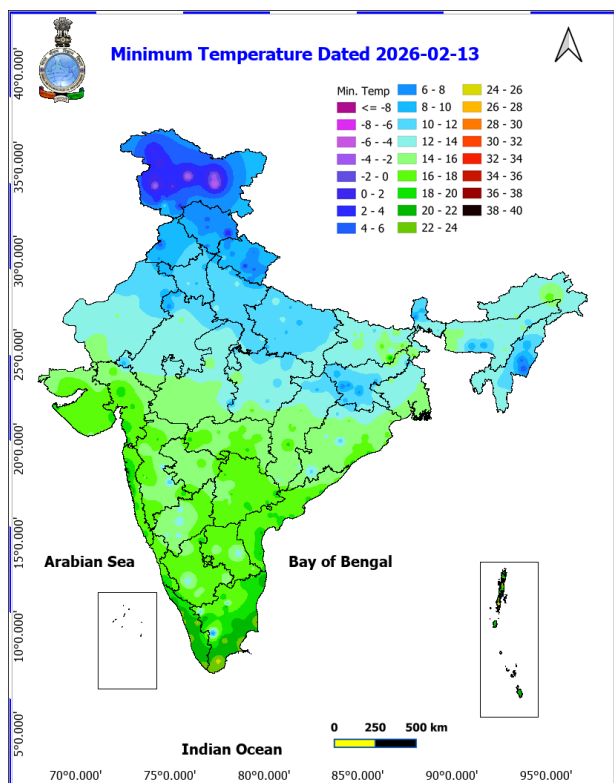
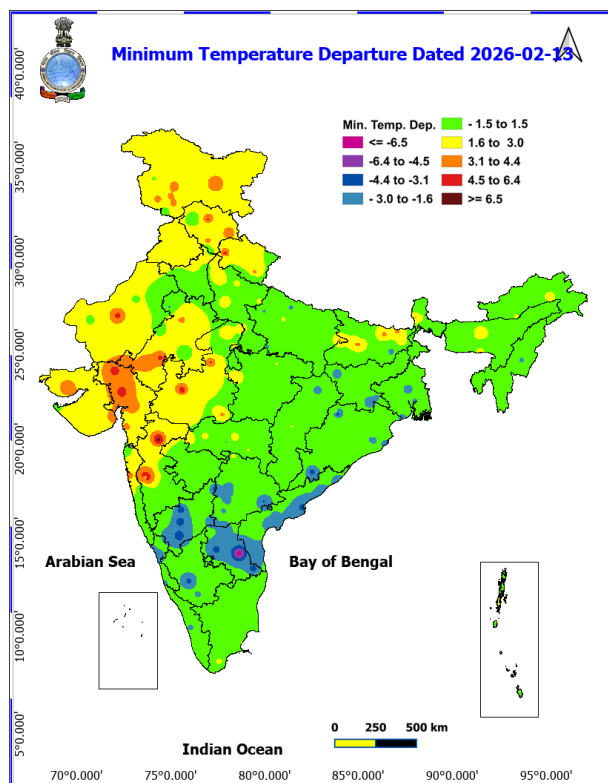
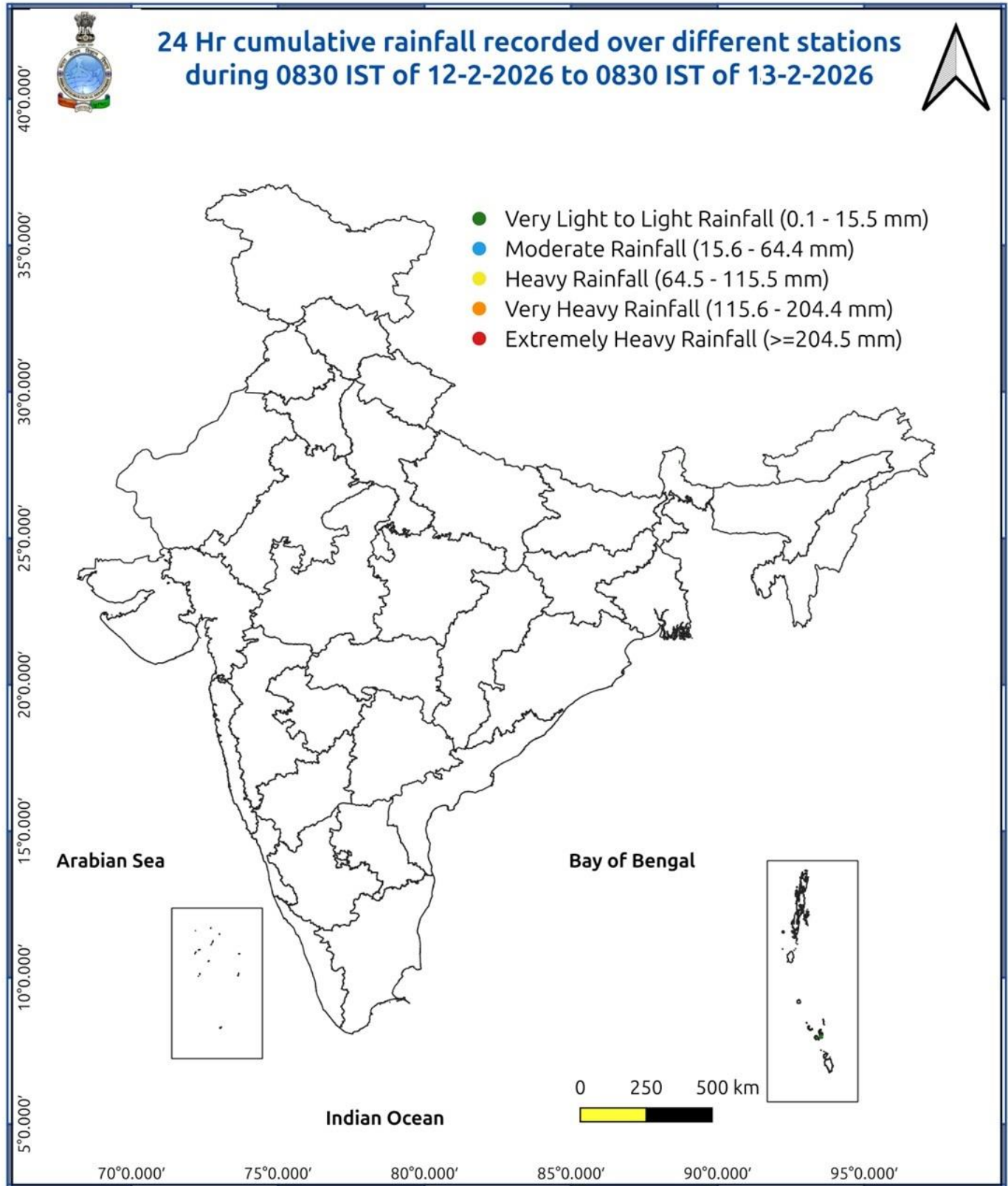


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-02-13





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Impact and Actions

Impact expected due to dense fog in the morning/night hours:

Dense fog conditions likely during morning hours at isolated places over Himachal Pradesh till 15th February.

❖ Transport and Aviation:

- ♦ May affect some airports, highways and railway routes in the areas of met- sub-division.
- ♦ Difficult driving conditions with slower journey times.
- ♦ Unless taken precautionary measures, it may lead to some road traffic collisions.

❖ Power Sector:

- ♦ Chances of Tripping of Power lines in the very dense fog routes.

❖ Human Health:

- ♦ Lung related health impacts: Dense fog contains particulate matter and other pollutants and in case exposed it gets lodged in the lungs, clogging them and decreasing their functional capacity which increases episodes of wheezing, coughing and shortness of breath.
- ♦ Impact on people having asthma bronchitis: Long time exposure to dense fog may cause respiratory problem for people having asthma bronchitis and other lung related health problems.
- ♦ Eye Irritation: Dense fog contains pollutions of various types and these Pollutants in the air if exposed may tend to irritate the membranes of the eye causing various infections leading to redness or swelling of the eye.

- ♦ **West India:** Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra and Marathawada.
- ♦ **South India:** Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana, Rayalaseema, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Lakshadweep.

Heat Wave: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal 4.5°C to 6.4°C .
Severe Heat Wave: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal $\geq 6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$

(b). Based on Actual maximum temperature

Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature $\geq 45^{\circ}\text{C}$.
Severe Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature $\geq 47^{\circ}\text{C}$

(c). Criteria for heat wave for coastal stations

When maximum temperature departure is $> 4.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ from normal. Heat Wave may be described provided maximum temperature $\geq 37^{\circ}\text{C}$



When maximum temperature remains 40°C

Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure 4.5°C to 6.4°C .
Severe Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure $> 6.4^{\circ}\text{C}$.



When minimum temperature of a station $\leq 10^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\leq 0^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions.
(a). Based on departure

Cold Wave: Minimum Temperature Departure from normal -4.5°C to -6.4°C .
Severe Cold Wave: Minimum Temperature Departure from normal $\leq -6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$

(b) Based on actual Minimum Temperature (for Plains only)

Cold Wave: When Minimum Temperature is $\leq 4.0^{\circ}\text{C}$
Severe Cold Wave: When Minimum Temperature is $\leq 2.0^{\circ}\text{C}$

(c) For Coastal Stations

When Minimum Temperature departure is $\leq -4.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ & actual Minimum Temperature is $\leq 15^{\circ}\text{C}$

Cold Day: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal -4.5°C to -6.4°C .

Phenomenon of small droplets suspended in air and the horizontal visibility $< 1\text{km}$

Moderate Fog: When the visibility between 500-200 metres
Dense Fog: when the visibility between 50-200 metres
Very Dense Fog: when the visibility < 50 metres



Sudden electrical discharges manifested by a flash of light (Lightning) and a sharp rumbling sound (thunder)



An ensemble of particles of dust or sand energetically lifted to great heights by a strong and turbulent wind.



Ice deposits on ground

Air temperature $\leq 4^{\circ}\text{C}$ (over Plains)



A strong wind that rises suddenly, lasts for atleast 1 minute.

Moderate: Wind speed 52-61 kmph
Severe: Wind speed 62-87 kmph
Very Severe: Wind speed > 87 kmph



Effect of various waves in the sea over specific area

Rough to very rough: Wind speed 41-62 kmph (22-33 knots) & Wave height 2.5-6 metre
High to very high: Wind speed 63-117 kmph (34-63 knots) & Wave height 6-14 metre
Phenomenal: Wind speed > 117 kmph (> 63 knots) & Wave height > 14 metre



Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 62-87 kmph (34-47 knots)

Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 88-117 kmph (48-63 knots)

Very Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 118-165 kmph (64 - 89 knots)

Extremely Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 166-220 kmph (90 -119 knots)

Super Cyclone Storm: Wind speed > 220 kmph (> 119 knots)
