Significant Weather Features

Weather forecast and Warnings

Northwest India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and Uttarakhand during 14th-19th August.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Punjab during 14th-15th August; Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi during 14th-15th August and on 17th August; West Uttar Pradesh during 15th-16th August; East Uttar Pradesh during 14th-18th August.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over rest parts of northwest India.

Central India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over West Madhya Pradesh on 14th August and during 18th-19th August; Vidarbha on 19th August.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 15th-17th August; Chhattisgarh and East Madhya Pradesh during 14th-19th August; Vidarbha during 14th-18th August.
- **Isolated thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Vidarbha during 14th-15th August; Chhattisgarh during 14th-17th August.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 14th-15th August; East Madhya Pradesh on 14th August and on 18th August; Vidarbha during 14th-16th August; Chhattisgarh on 14th August and during 16th-17th August with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 16th-17th August; East Madhya Pradesh during 15th-17th August; Chhattisgarh on 15th August.
- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall with extremely heavy rainfall likely at isolated places over Chhattisgarh on 14th August.**

East India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 14th-19th August; Bihar during 17th-18th August; Odisha during 14th-15th August.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Bihar during 14th-16th August and on 19th August; Odisha during 16th-19th August.
- **Isolated thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 14th-19th August; Gangetic West Bengal on 14th August, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 14th-16th August; Gangetic West Bengal during 15th-16th August; Jharkhand and Odisha during 14th-17th August.
- **Isolated thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Bihar during 14th-17th August.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 14th August; Gangetic West Bengal on 15th August; Jharkhand and Odisha during 15th-17th August; Bihar during 17th-18th August with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 15th-16th August; Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand and Odisha on 14th August.

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Northeast India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 14th-19th August.
- **Isolated thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh and Assam & Meghalaya during 14th-17th August; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 14th-16th August.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh on 14th August and during 18th-19th August; Assam & Meghalaya during 14th-19th August; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 14th-16th August and on 19th August with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 15th-17th August.

West India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Konkan & Goa during 14th-19th August; Madhya Maharashtra during 14th-15th August; Gujarat Region on 14th August.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Madhya Maharashtra during 16th-19th August; Marathwada and Saurashtra & Kutch during 14th-19th August; Gujarat Region during 15th-19th August.
- **Isolated thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Gujarat Region and Saurashtra & Kutch on 14th August.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over Konkan & Goa during 14th-15th August; Madhya Maharashtra during 14th-16th August.

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, North Interior Karnataka, Rayalaseema, South Interior Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Telangana during 14th-19th August; Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep during 18th-19th August.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep during 14th-17th August; Coastal Karnataka during 14th-19th August.
- **Isolated thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 14th-15th August; North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka on 14th August; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 14th-17th August, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Coastal Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe on 14th August; Lakshadweep during 14th-15th August; Telangana during 14th-16th August.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over Kerala & Mahe and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal on 14th August.
- **Strong Surface Winds** likely over Coastal Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka on 14th August; Lakshadweep during 14th-15th August; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 14th-17th August; Telangana during 14th-16th August.

Wind Warning:

- Squally winds with speed reaching 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph are likely to prevail over Northwest Bay of Bengal & adjoining Odisha-West Bengal-north Andhra Pradesh coasts till morning of 14th August. It would become 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph from 14th morning till 15th morning and decrease gradually thereafter.
- Squally winds with speed reaching 35-45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph are likely over southeast Jharkhand and adjoining areas of north interior Odisha & north Chhattisgarh from 14th morning till 15th morning.

Sea Condition:

- **Sea condition is very likely to be rough** over northwest Bay of Bengal, along & off West Bengal, Odisha, and north Andhra Pradesh coasts till 15th morning and improve gradually thereafter.

- Fishermen are advised not to venture into northwest Bay of Bengal, along & off West Bengal, Odisha, and north Andhra Pradesh coasts till 15th morning.

Main Weather Observations:

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at most places** over East Uttar Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub-himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Jharkhand, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, Vidarbha, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Chhattisgarh, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Gujarat Region, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Lakshadweep; **at many places** over Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal, East Rajasthan, Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi, West Rajasthan, Bihar, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana, Rayalaseema and Kerala & Mahe; **Dry** over rest of the country.

❖ **Significant rainfall recorded(in cm)** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal**: Nagapattinam (dist Nagapattinam) 12; Jammu & Kashmir And Ladakh: Bhaderwah (dist Doda) 6.

❖ **Heavy Rainfall observed** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **Heavy to very heavy rain** at isolated places over Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 13-08-2026)**: **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh and East Madhya Pradesh. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Bihar, East Madhya Pradesh and Saurashtra & Kutch; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Madhya Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Punjab, Chhattisgarh and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Madhya Pradesh, Rayalaseema and Kerala & Mahe; at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, East Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Vidarbha, Telangana and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, West Rajasthan, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Vidarbha, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Kerala & Mahe; at most places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Jharkhand, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Telangana, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Lakshadweep; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema; at isolated places over Bihar, Uttarakhand, Punjab and Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 16.6°C was reported at KHARGONE-OBS (MADHYA PRADESH) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 13-08-2026)**: **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya and Uttarakhand. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at many places over Punjab; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh; at few places over West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh and Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad; at isolated places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, East Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Vidarbha, Telangana and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Bihar and South Interior Karnataka; at few places over Jharkhand; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Odisha, East Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, North Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch and Rayalaseema; at most places over Marathwada, Chhattisgarh, Coastal Karnataka and Lakshadweep; at few places over Gangetic West Bengal, West Rajasthan and West Madhya Pradesh. **The highest maximum temperature** of 39.5°C was reported at KOVILANGULAM (TAMIL NADU).

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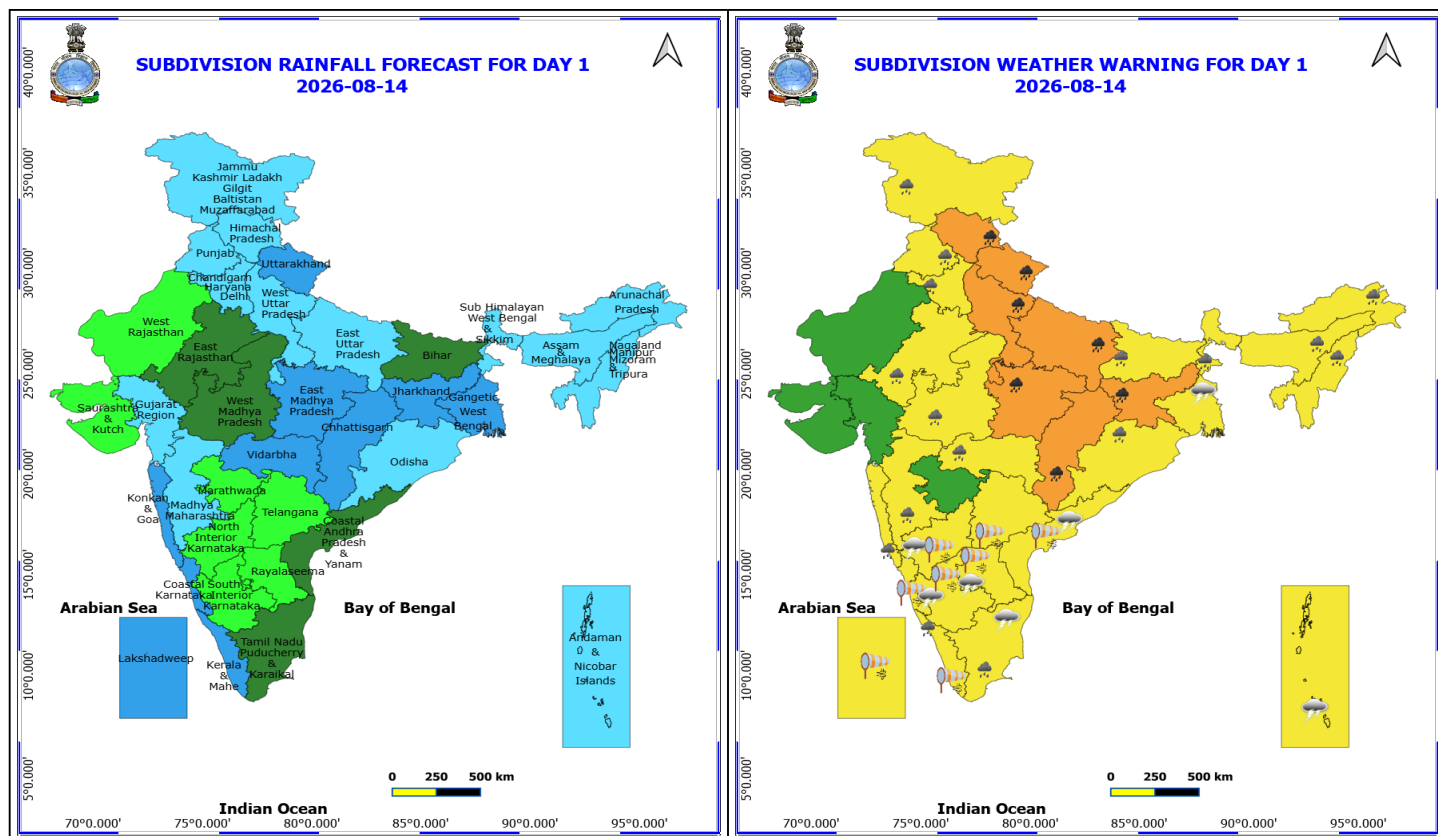
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Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Depression** over Gangetic West Bengal moved west-northwestwards with a speed of 20 kmph during past 6 hours and lay centred at 0530 hrs IST of today, the 14th August, 2026, over Jharkhand and adjoining Gangetic West Bengal, near latitude 23.1°N and longitude 86.0°E, about 40 km north-northwest of Jamshedpur (Jharkhand), 50 km west-southwest of Purulia (West Bengal), 70 km east-southeast of Ranchi (Jharkhand), 120 km south-southwest of Hazaribagh (Jharkhand) and 220 km east-southeast of Daltonganj (Jharkhand). It is very likely to continue to move west-northwestwards across Jharkhand and weaken into well mark low pressure area during next 24 hours.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over northwest Madhya Pradesh & neighbourhood extending upto 5.8 km above mean sea level and tilting southwards with height persists.
- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now passes through Amritsar, Bareilly, Varanasi, Ranchi, centre of **Depression** over Jharkhand and adjoining Gangetic West Bengal and Digha & thence southeastwards to Northwest Bay of Bengal and extends upto 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- The **Shear Zone** roughly along Lat. 22°N across central & adjoining north Peninsular India between 3.1 & 7.6 km above mean sea level tilting southwards with height persists.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a trough in middle and upper tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level roughly along Long. 68°E to the north of Lat. 30°N persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over south Haryana & neighbourhood at 0.9 km above mean sea level has become less marked



14 August (Day 1)

- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Coastal Karnataka, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Jharkhand, Kerala & Mahe, Lakshadweep, Madhya Pradesh, Odisha, Rajasthan, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim and Telangana.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat State, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand and Vidarbha.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe, Lakshadweep and Telangana.
- ❖ **Arabian Sea: Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph** is likely to prevail along and off Somalia and Oman coast, most parts of westcentral adjoining some parts of southwest and few parts of north & eastcentral Arabian Sea

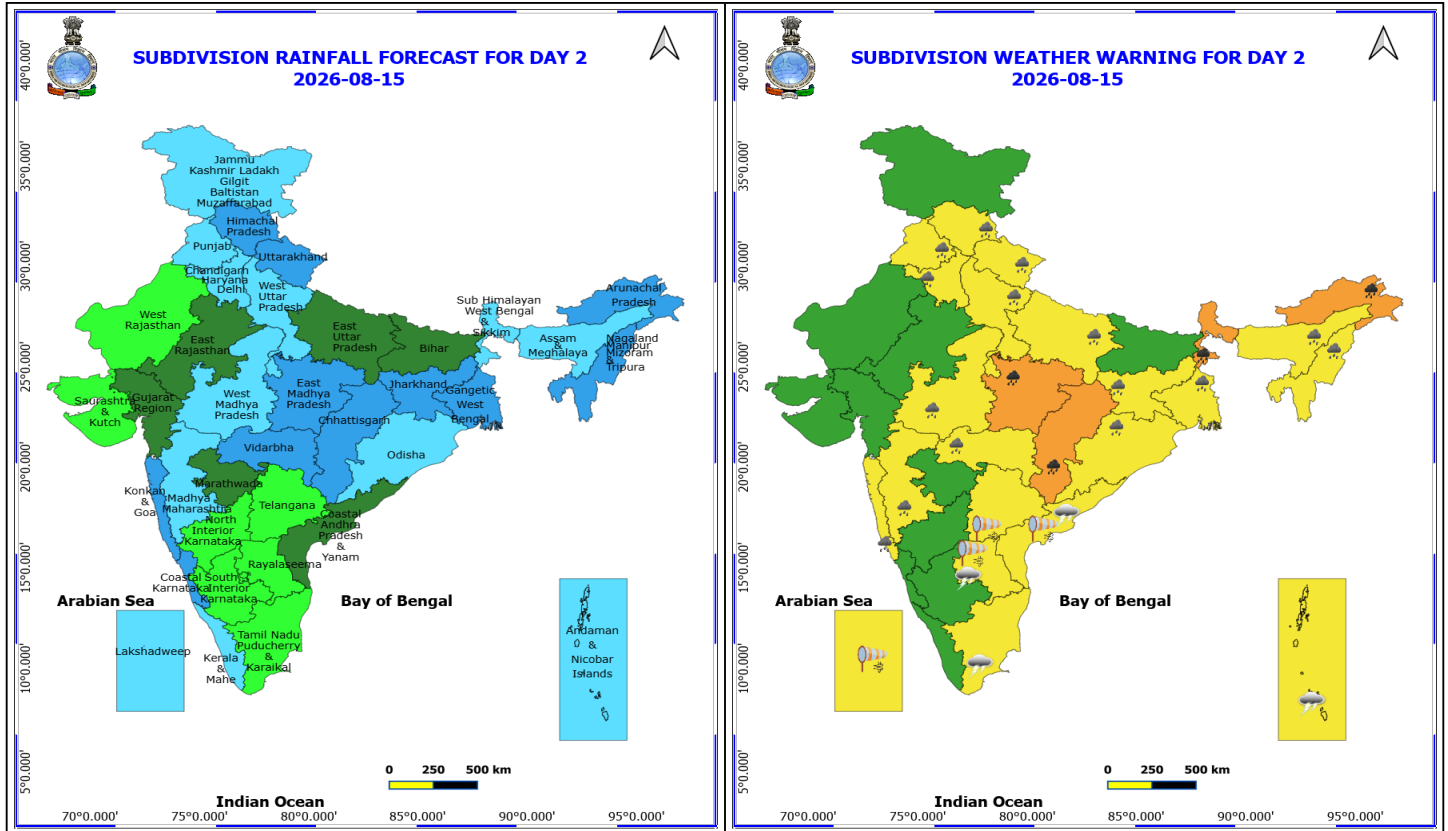
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- ❖ **Squally Weather with wind speed 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph** is likely to prevail along and off north Maharashtra coast adjoining eastcentral Arabian Sea.
- ❖ **Bay of Bengal: Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph** is likely to prevail over few parts of southwest Bay of Bengal adjoining south Sri Lanka coast, few parts of Comorin area.
- ❖ **Squally Weather with wind speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph** is likely to prevail along and off West Bengal, Odisha and Bangladesh coasts adjoining many parts of northwest and few parts of northeast Bay of Bengal.
- ❖ **Squally Weather with wind speed 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph** is likely to prevail along and off north Andhra Pradesh adjoining south Andhra Pradesh coast, Bangladesh coast, some parts of northeast & westcentral and few parts eastcentral Bay of Bengal and over Andaman Sea.

- ❖ **Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Gangetic West Bengal, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, Jharkhand, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Odisha, Punjab, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Vidarbha and West Madhya Pradesh.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(40-50kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu Puducherry & Karaikal.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Jharkhand, Lakshadweep, Madhya Pradesh, Odisha, Rajasthan, Telangana and West Bengal & Sikkim.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand and Vidarbha.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, Lakshadweep and Telangana.
- ❖ **Arabian Sea: Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph** is likely to prevail along and off Somalia and Oman coast, most parts of westcentral Arabian Sea and some parts of southwest Arabian sea adjoining few parts of north & eastcentral Arabian Sea
- ❖ **Bay of Bengal: Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph** is likely to prevail over few parts of southwest Bay of Bengal adjoining south Sri Lanka coast, few parts of Comorin area.

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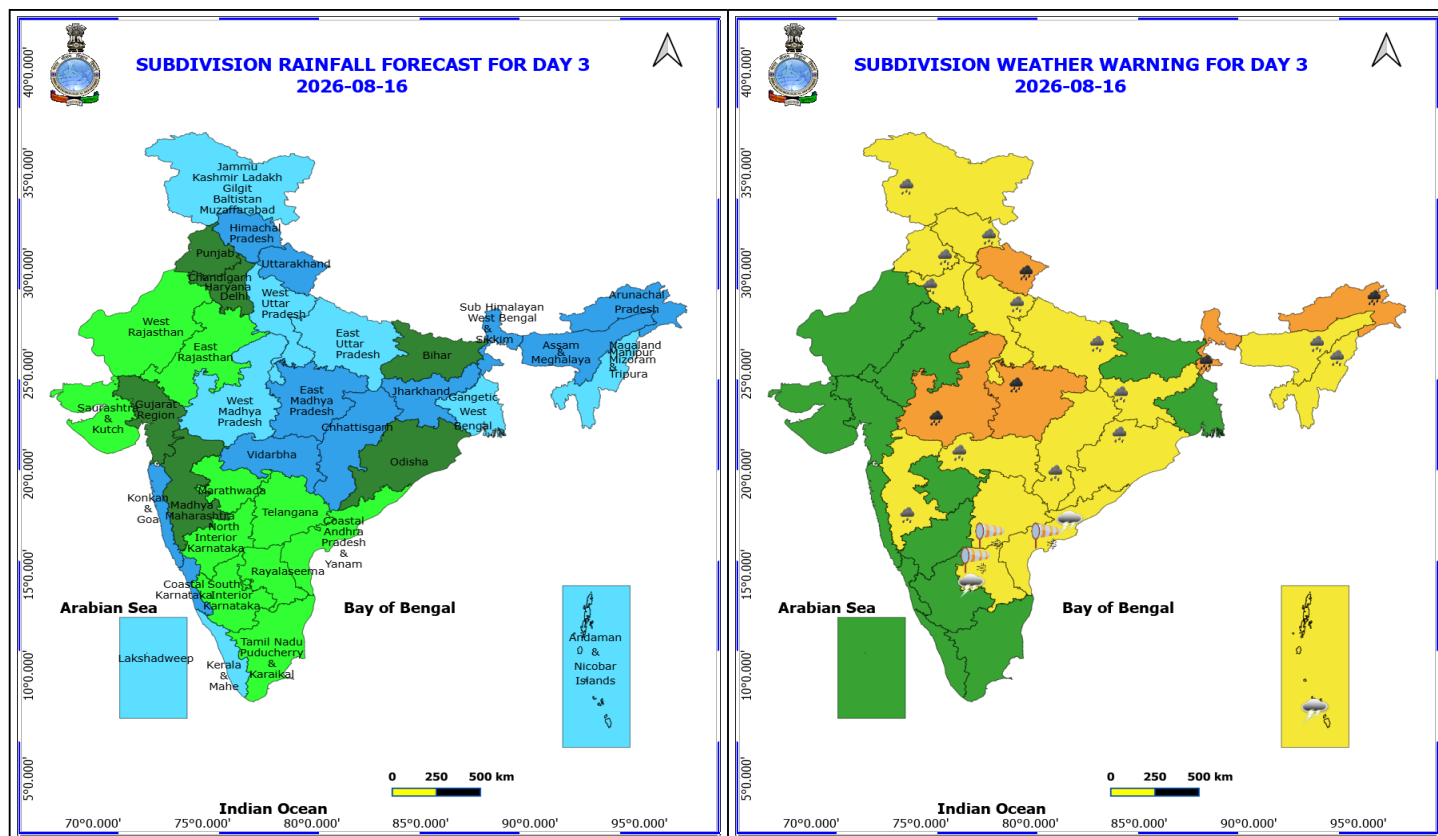

- ❖ **Bay of Bengal: Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph** is likely to prevail over few parts of southwest Bay of Bengal adjoining south Sri Lanka coast, few parts of Comorin area.

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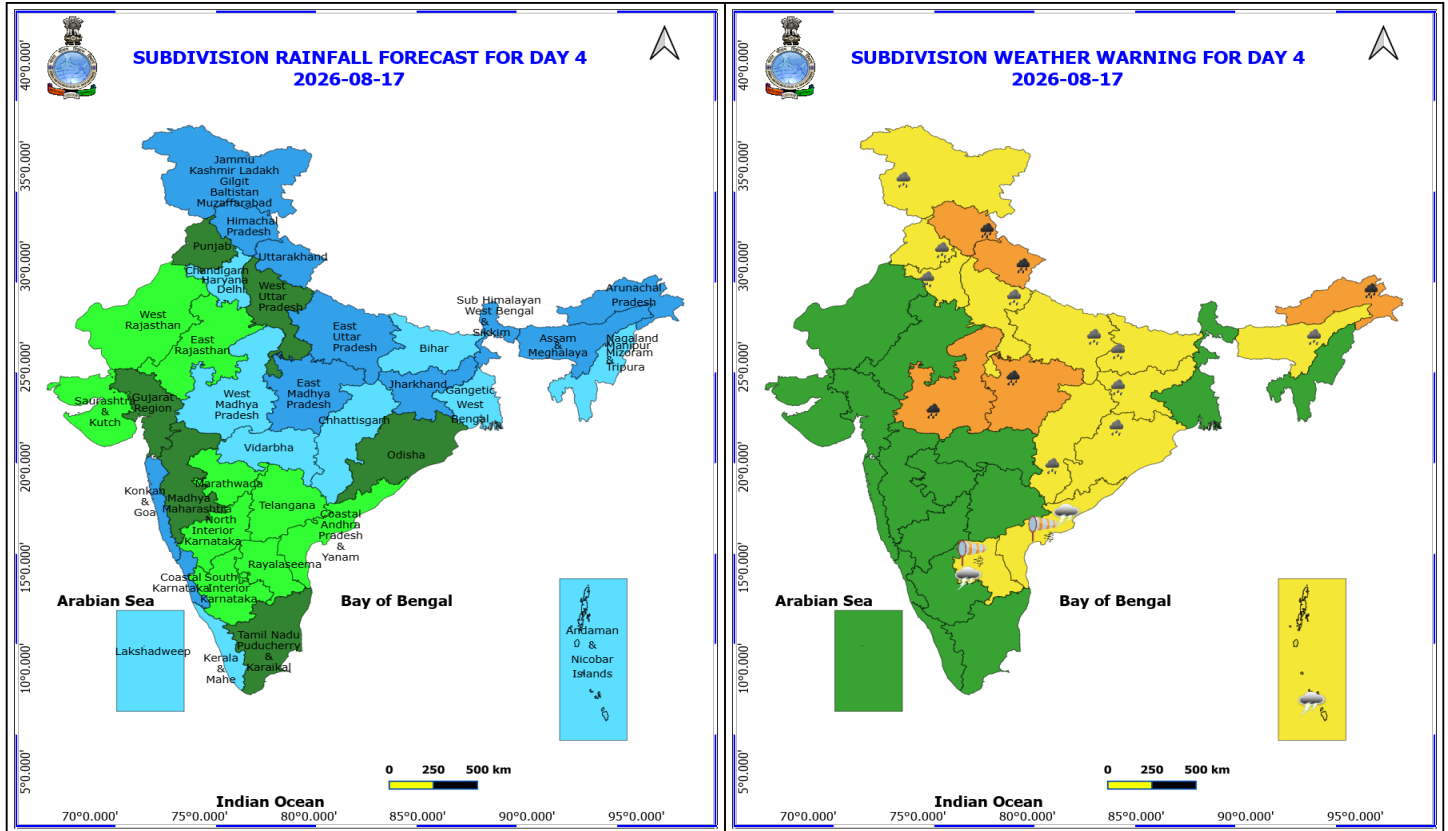

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-08-13

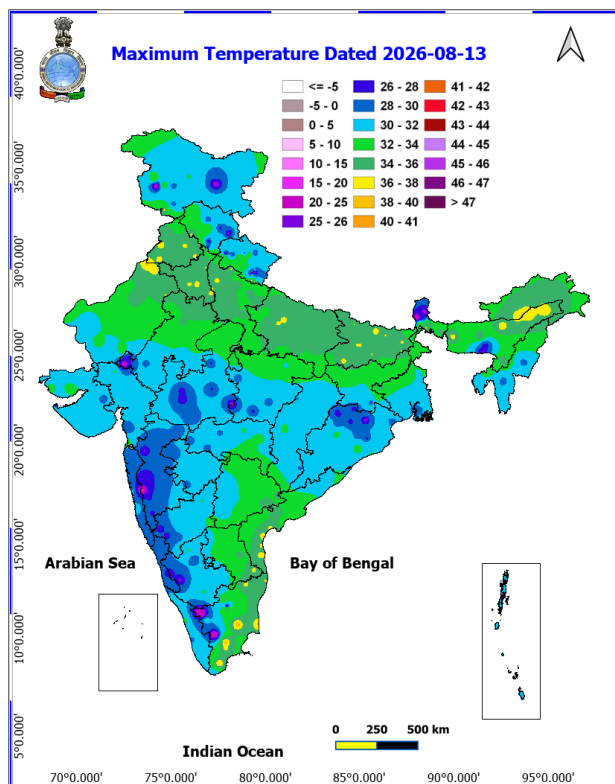


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-08-13

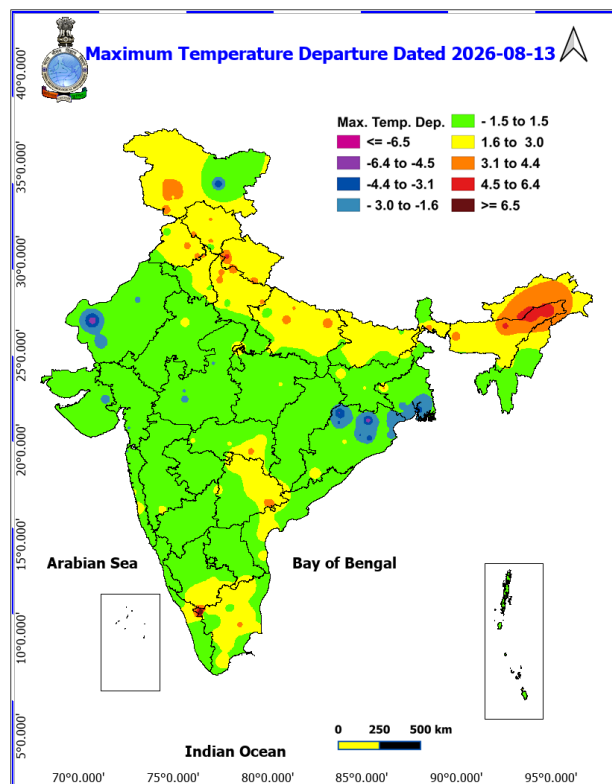


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-08-13

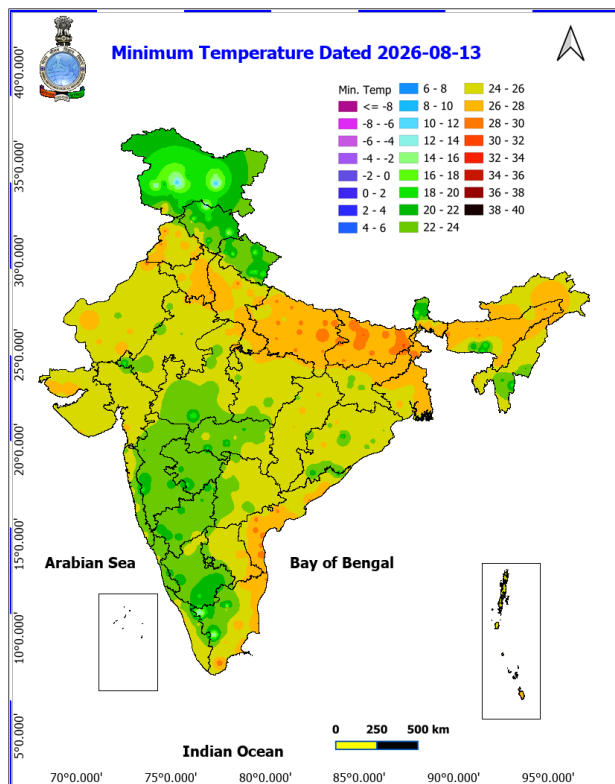
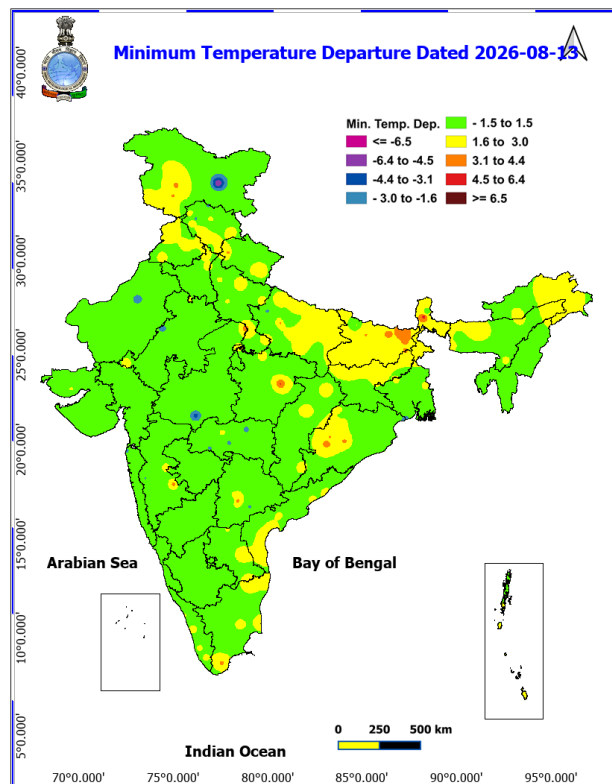
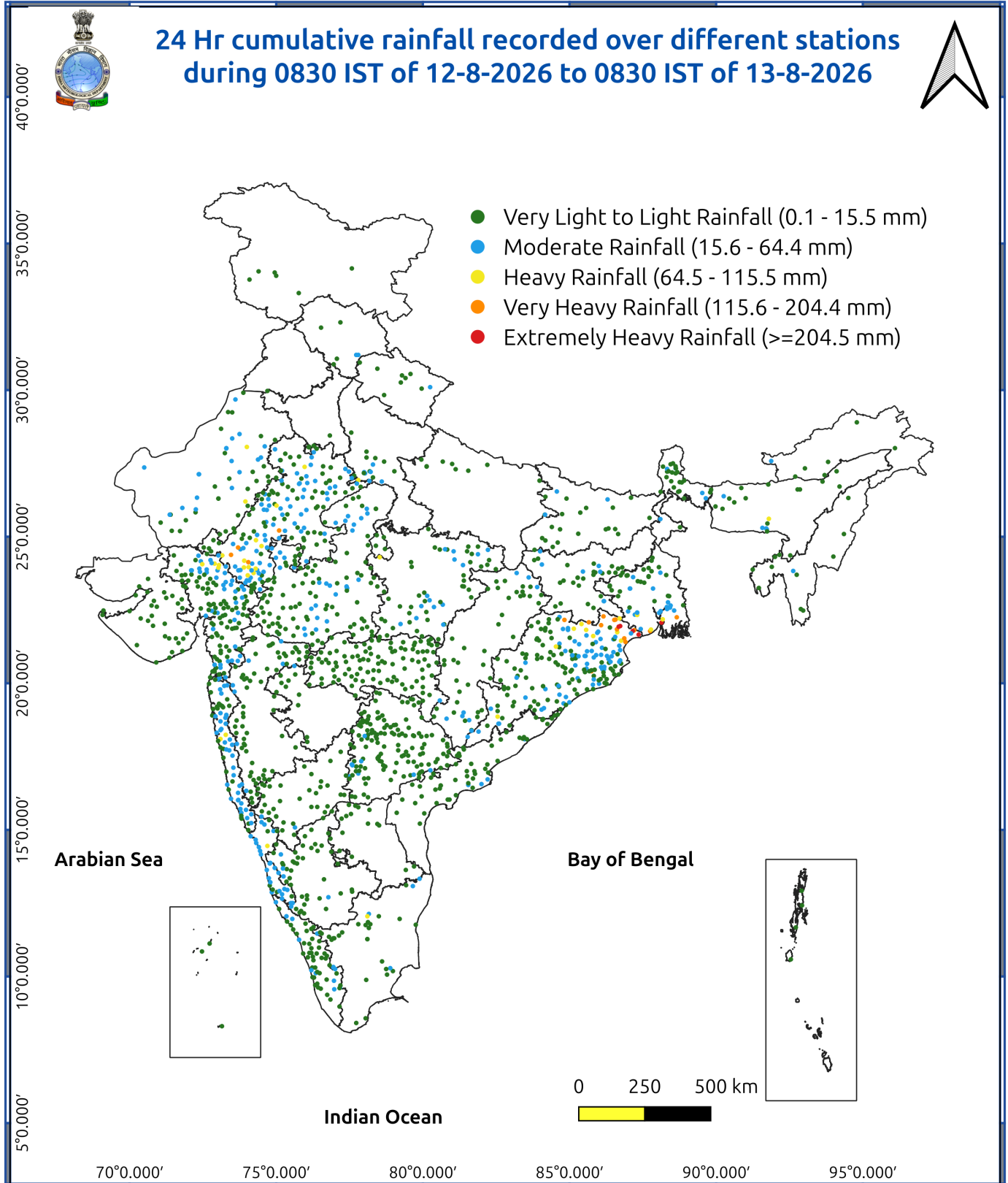


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-08-13





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to very heavy rainfall:

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall with extremely heavy rainfall** likely at isolated places over Chhattisgarh on 14th August.

Impact Expected

- ❖ Localized Flooding of roads, water logging in low lying areas and closure of underpasses mainly in urban areas of the above region.
- ❖ Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- ❖ Disruption of traffic in major cities due to water logging in roads leading to increased travel time.
- ❖ Minor damage to kutcha roads.
- ❖ Possibilities of damage to vulnerable structure.
- ❖ Localized Landslides/Mudslides.
- ❖ Damage to horticulture and standing crops in some areas due to inundation.
- ❖ It may lead to riverine flooding in some river catchments (for riverine flooding please visit Web page of CWC).

Action Suggested

- ❖ Check for traffic congestion on your route before leaving for your destination.
- ❖ Follow any traffic advisories that are issued in this regard.
- ❖ Avoid going to areas that face the water logging problems often.
- ❖ Avoid staying in vulnerable structure.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In Odisha, ensure continuous and effective drainage of excess water from kharif rice, maize, pulses, cotton, red gram, banana, vegetable fields and nursery beds. Keep field drains, outlets and bunds clear and functional. In waterlogged areas, postpone sowing/re-sowing of maize and green gram and prevent water stagnation in pearl millet. Protect vegetable nurseries with polythene sheets and Provide staking to vegetables, propping to banana, papaya and young horticultural plants. Maintain emergency outlets in transplanted rice fields to prevent prolonged submergence of seedlings.
- In West Bengal, maintain continuous and effective drainage in transplanted Aman paddy, jute, rice nurseries and vegetable fields and promptly remove excess water from low-lying areas. Keep drainage channels clear and strengthen bunds around rice nurseries to prevent flooding. Postpone fertilizer and pesticide application until field conditions improve. Harvest mature crops, tea leaves and vegetables wherever field conditions permit and keep the produce in a safe, dry place.
- In Chhattisgarh, maintain continuous and effective drainage in rice, soybean, maize, pigeon pea, black gram, green gram, minor millets and vegetable fields, particularly in low-lying areas. Strengthen field bunds and drainage channels and postpone fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve. Continue rice transplanting and sowing of kharif crops only where field conditions permit, avoid transplanting in waterlogged areas, and provide staking/support to tomato, chilli, cucurbit and other vegetable crops.
- In Uttarakhand, maintain proper and effective drainage in rice, soybean, maize, red gram, ginger, garlic, barnyard millet, finger millet, tomato and other standing crop fields. Continue rice transplanting only where field conditions permit and delay sowing of groundnut, soybean and maize until conditions become suitable. Harvest mature tomato, French bean and potato and keep the produce in a safe, dry place.
- In Arunachal Pradesh, maintain continuous drainage and remove excess water from rice, maize, soybean and finger millet fields. Clear mud and debris from affected crops and maintain drainage in vegetable fields and orchards. Harvest mature cucumbers, bottle gourds and other cucurbits wherever possible and provide firm support to vines and banana plants to prevent lodging.
- In Assam, maintain continuous drainage and keep field channels clear in rice, sugarcane, soybean, pigeon pea, jute, sesame and vegetable fields and orchards. Remove excess water promptly from low-lying fields and prevent water stagnation in sugarcane. Complete rice transplanting only where field conditions permit and

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postpone sowing of sesame, green gram and black gram in waterlogged fields.

- In Meghalaya, maintain continuous drainage in rice nursery beds and fields of maize, cowpea, okra and ginger and keep drainage channels free from obstruction. Strengthen nursery bunds to prevent runoff and seedling washout and avoid standing water around the crop root zone. Provide staking or trellising to cowpea and support other vulnerable horticultural crops to prevent lodging.
- In South Interior Karnataka, maintain continuous drainage in paddy, maize, finger millet, cowpea, green gram, black gram and vegetable fields to prevent waterlogging. Delay rice transplanting in waterlogged fields and undertake sowing or transplanting of kharif crops only where field conditions are suitable. Provide support to banana, tomato and other vulnerable crops to prevent lodging.
- In Gujarat, drain excess rainwater promptly from rice, cotton, pearl millet, groundnut, sesame, maize, pulses, soybean and vegetable fields.
- In Madhya Maharashtra, in Ghat areas, drain out excess rainwater from rice, finger millet and vegetable fields. Postpone intercultural operations, fertilizer application and plant protection measures until field conditions become suitable.
- In Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, maintain proper drainage in standing crop fields and prevent water stagnation in rice, soybean, black gram, ginger, turmeric, cole crops and vegetables.
- In Jharkhand, ensure proper drainage of excess water from crop fields and postpone fertilizer and pesticide application during wet conditions.
- In Konkan and Goa, drain out excess rainwater from rice, finger millet, turmeric, groundnut, vegetable fields and orchards to prevent water stagnation.
- In Vidarbha, drain out excess water from already sown soybean, cotton, pigeon pea, sorghum, maize, rice and vegetable nurseries and orchards.
- In Tamil Nadu, maintain proper and effective drainage in rice nurseries and young cotton fields to prevent water stagnation. Undertake rice transplanting and sowing of maize and cucurbits where field conditions permit, and harvest mature paddy wherever ready. Provide firm support to banana plants and other vulnerable crops against lodging.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.

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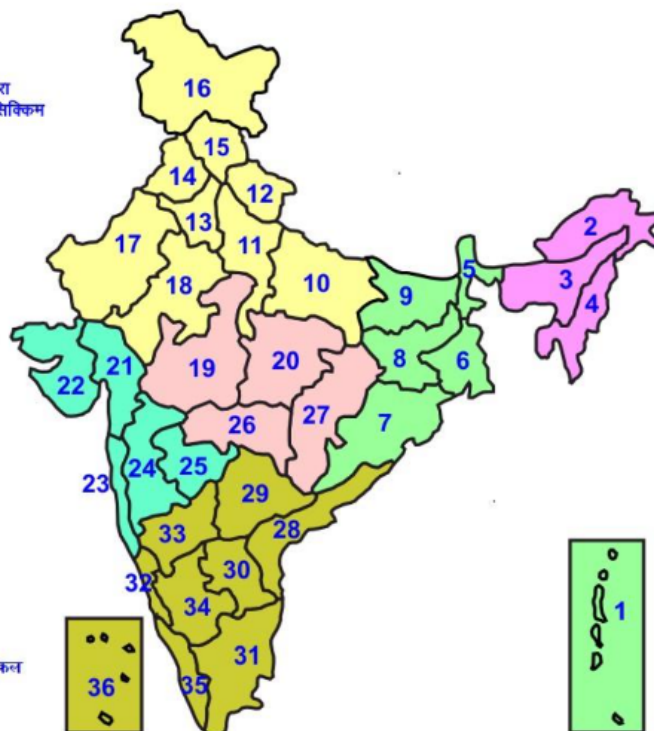
