Significant Weather Features

Weather Systems and Warnings:

Northwest India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad during 28th-30th September; Himachal Pradesh during 27th-28th September; Uttarakhand during 26th-28th September.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over West Uttar Pradesh on 26th September; East Uttar Pradesh during 25th-26th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over rest parts of northwest India.

- Strong Surface Winds likely over Uttar Pradesh during 25th-27th September.

Central India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 25th-25th September and during 27th-30th September; East Madhya Pradesh and Vidarbha during 28th-30th September; Chhattisgarh during 29th-30th September.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over West Madhya Pradesh on 26th September; East Madhya Pradesh and Vidarbha during 25th-27th September; Chhattisgarh during 25th-28th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over West Madhya Pradesh on 25th September and on 27th September; East Madhya Pradesh on 27th September; Chhattisgarh and Vidarbha on 26th September with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over West Madhya Pradesh on 26th September; East Madhya Pradesh during 25th-26th September; Vidarbha during 25th-25th September; Chhattisgarh on 25th September.
- **Thundersquall (wind speed reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph)** likely over Chhattisgarh on 25th September.

East India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 25th-29th September; Bihar, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Odisha and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 25th-26th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands on 30th September; Bihar, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Odisha and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 27th-30th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Odisha and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 26th September; Gangetic West Bengal and Jharkhand on 25th September; Bihar during 25th-26th September with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Odisha on 25th September.

Northeast India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh on 28th September; Assam & Meghalaya during 25th-28th September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura on 27th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 25th-27th September and during 29th-30th September; Assam & Meghalaya during 29th-30th September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during

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25th-26th September and during 28th-30th September.

- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh on 25th September; Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 25th-26th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh on 29th September; Assam & Meghalaya on 25th September and on 28th September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 28th-29th September.

West India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Gujarat Region, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra and Marathawada during 25th-30th September; Saurashtra & Kutch on 25th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Madhya Maharashtra and Marathawada during 25th-26th September.
- Strong Surface Winds likely over Madhya Maharashtra and Marathawada during 25th-26th September.

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 25th-30th September; Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep during 27th-30th September; Coastal Karnataka during 26th-29th September; North Interior Karnataka and Telangana during 25th-30th September; South Interior Karnataka during 25th-28th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam during 26th-30th September.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep during 25th-26th September; Coastal Karnataka on 25th September and on 30th September; South Interior Karnataka during 29th-30th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam on 25th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Kerala & Mahe during 25th-26th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam during 26th-28th September; Rayalaseema during 25th-28th September; Telangana during 25th-26th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Kerala & Mahe on 25th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Telangana on 25th September.
- Strong Surface Winds likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 25th-28th September.

Wind warning:

- Squally wind with speed reaching 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail over Westcentral and adjoining Northwest Bay of Bengal & along and off south Odisha-north Andhra Pradesh & Yanam coasts till morning of 25th September and decrease gradually thereafter.
- Squally wind with speed reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph is prevailing over south Odisha, south Chhattisgarh and coastal districts of north Andhra Pradesh and likely to continue till morning of 25th September. It is likely to become 45-55 kmph gusting to 65kmph by noon of 25th September and decrease gradually thereafter.
- Squally wind speed reaching 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely over the districts of northwest Odisha, north Chhattisgarh and southwest Jharkhand till 25th afternoon and decrease gradually thereafter.

Sea condition:

- Very Rough to rough sea condition is prevailing over westcentral & northwest Bay of Bengal and along & off north Andhra Pradesh-Odisha-West Bengal coasts is likely to prevail till morning of 25th September and improve gradually thereafter.

Fishermen warnings:

- Fishermen are advised not to venture into Westcentral & adjoining northwest & southwest Bay of Bengal and along & off Andhra Pradesh-Odisha-West Bengal coasts till morning of 25th September.

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at most places** over Chhattisgarh, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Uttarakhand, Sub-himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, Jharkhand, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Gangetic West Bengal, Coastal Karnataka, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Telangana, Kerala & Mahe and Vidarbha; **at many places** over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, Punjab, North Interior Karnataka, Konkan & Goa, Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal and South Interior Karnataka; **Dry** over rest of the country.

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 24-09-2026): markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, East Rajasthan and West Madhya Pradesh. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, West Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch and Marathwada; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Konkan & Goa and Madhya Maharashtra. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over West Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, West Rajasthan, Konkan & Goa and Madhya Maharashtra; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh and Lakshadweep; at few places over Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Vidarbha, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Coastal Karnataka; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Assam & Meghalaya, Odisha, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Saurashtra & Kutch, Telangana and North Interior Karnataka. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Marathwada, Vidarbha, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Coastal Karnataka; at most places over Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Jharkhand, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Rayalaseema and North Interior Karnataka; at isolated places over Uttarakhand, Gujarat Region, Konkan & Goa and Madhya Maharashtra. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 17.0°C was reported at HALFLONG (ASSAM).

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 24-09-2026): markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at few places over West Rajasthan; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Arunachal Pradesh, East Rajasthan and Gujarat Region; at isolated places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Vidarbha, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Kerala & Mahe. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at few places over West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, Marathwada and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over West Madhya Pradesh and Rayalaseema. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and

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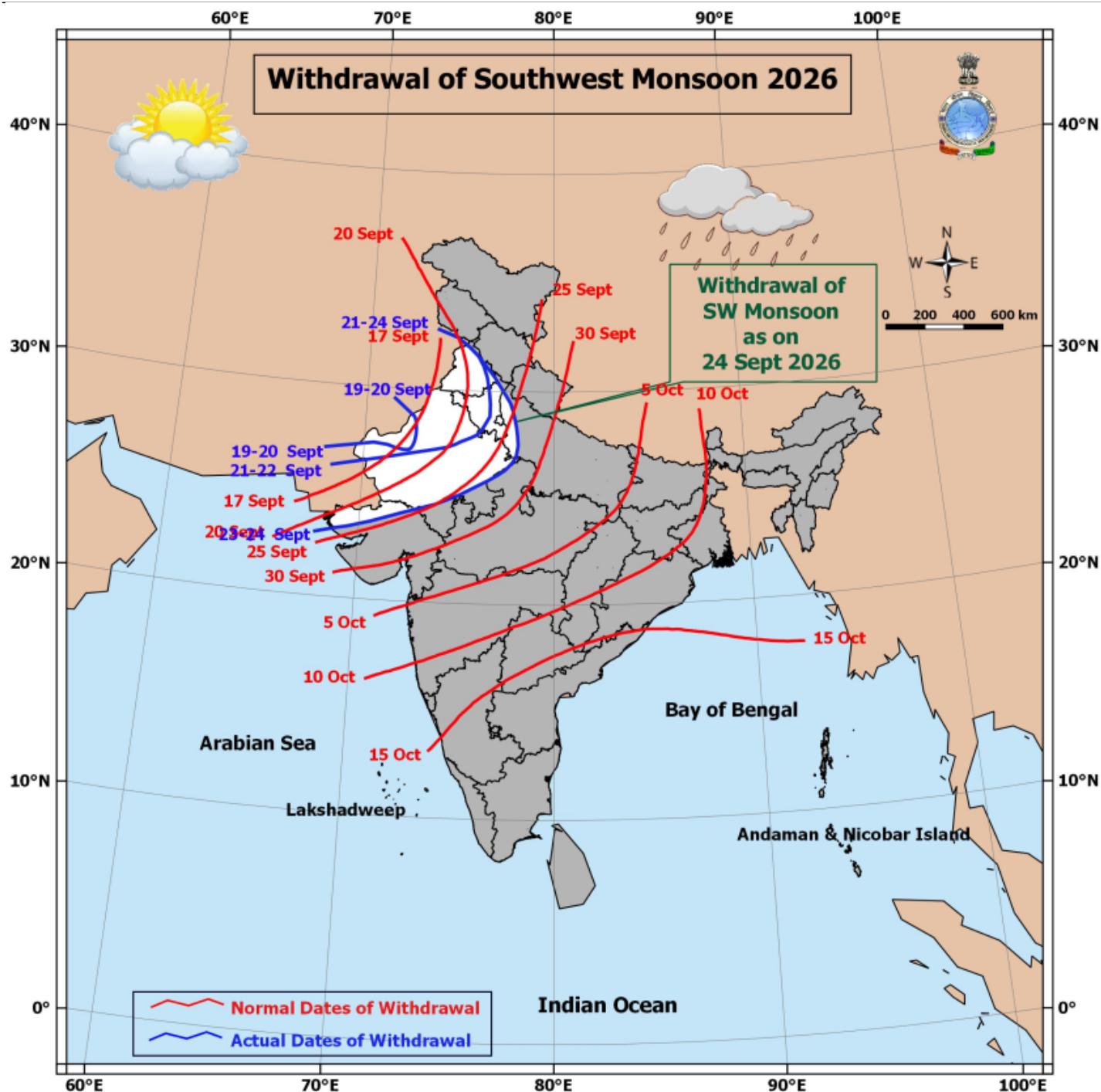
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Coastal Karnataka; at most places over Punjab, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka; at few places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim; at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh and Telangana. **The highest maximum temperature** of 43.6°C was reported at BARMER (RAJASTHAN).

Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- **The line of withdrawal of Southwest Monsoon** continues to pass through 32.5°N/72.5°E, Gurdaspur, Chandigarh, Muzaffarnagar, Aligarh, Dholpur, Udaipur, Deesa, Naliya and 23.0°N/67.8°E.
- The **Deep Depression** over south Odisha & adjoining south Chhattisgarh, moved north-northwestwards with a speed of 15 kmph during past 06 hours, weakened into a Depression and lay centered at 0530 hrs IST of today, 25th September 2026 over the south interior Odisha & adjoining Chhattisgarh, near latitude 20.5°N and longitude 82.5°E, close to Nuapada (Odisha) and about 90 km west-northwest of Titilagarh (Odisha), 100 km northwest of Bhawanipatna (Odisha), 110 km east-northeast of Kanker (Chhattisgarh) and 120 km southeast of Raipur (Chhattisgarh). It is very likely to continue to move north-northwestwards and maintain its intensity of Depression during next 12 hours and weaken into a well-marked low pressure area during subsequent 12 hours.
- A fresh **Western Disturbance** as a trough in middle tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level runs roughly along Long. 72°E to the north of Lat. 28°N.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a trough in middle tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 7.6 km above mean sea level roughly along Long. 80°E to the north of Lat. 27°N has merged with the above system.

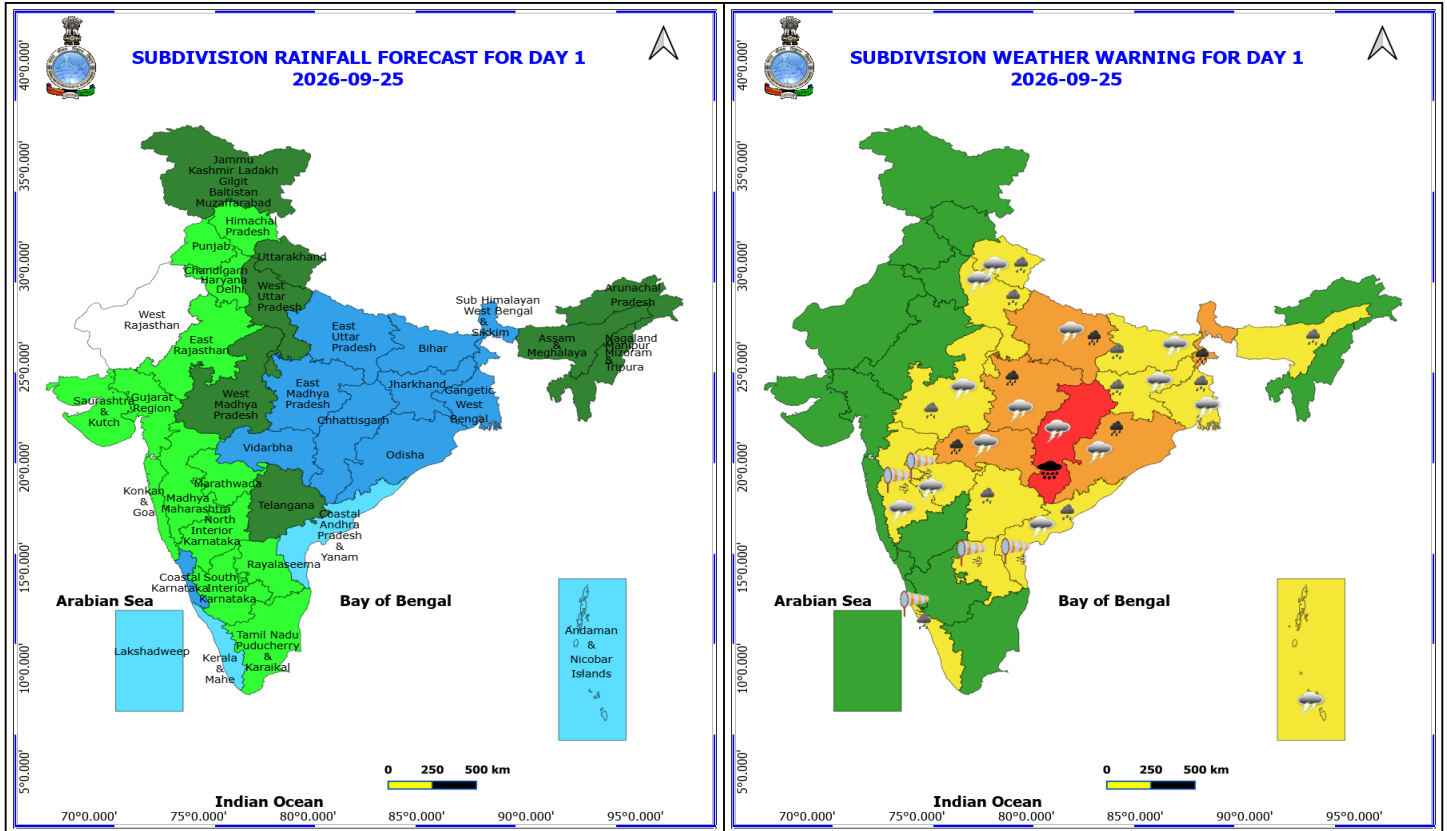

- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Kerala & Mahe, Rayalaseema, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim and Telangana.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, Coastal Karnataka, Madhya Maharashtra and Marathwada.
- ❖ Squally wind with speed reaching 55-65 kmph gusting to 75 kmph is likely to continue to prevail over Westcentral

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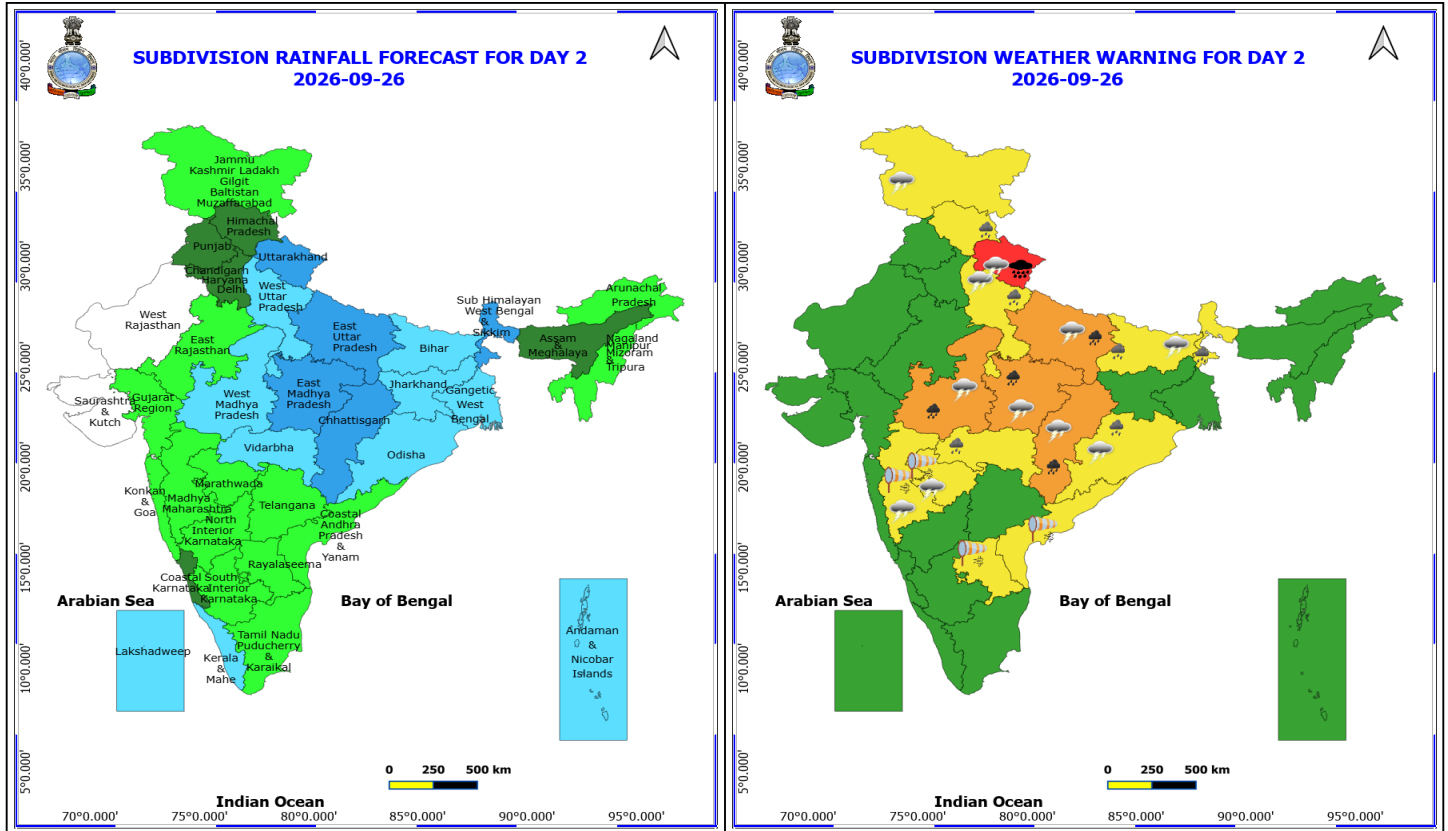
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and adjoining Northwest Bay of Bengal.

- ❖ Squally wind with speed reaching 55-65 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail along and off south Odisha-north Andhra Pradesh & Yanam coasts till evening.
- ❖ Squally wind speed reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph is likely over adjoining areas of North and South Bay of Bengal.
- ❖ Squally wind with speed reaching 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely along & off West Bengal and south Andhra Pradesh & Yanam coasts .

- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura and Vidarbha.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, Madhya Maharashtra and Marathwada.

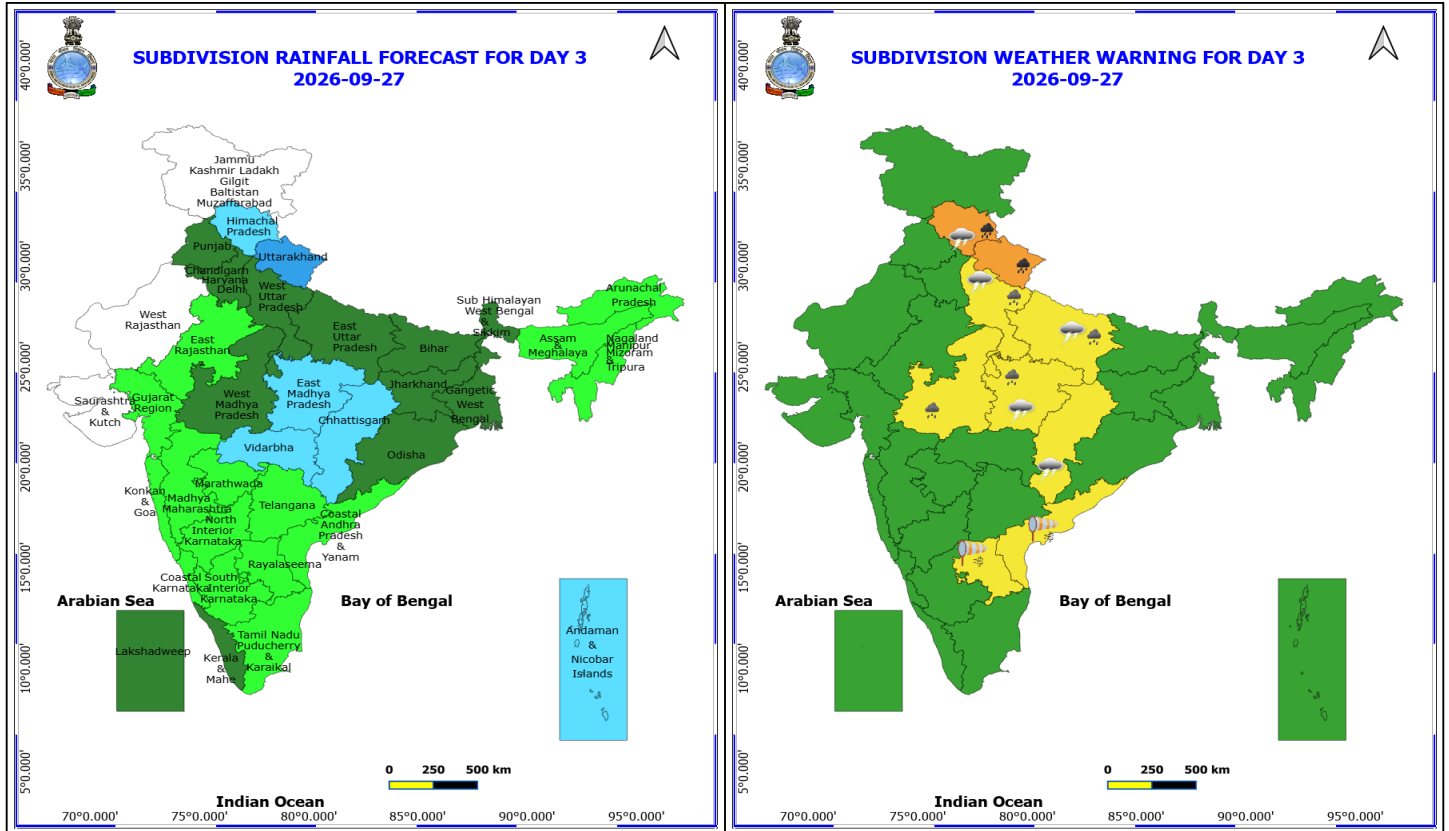

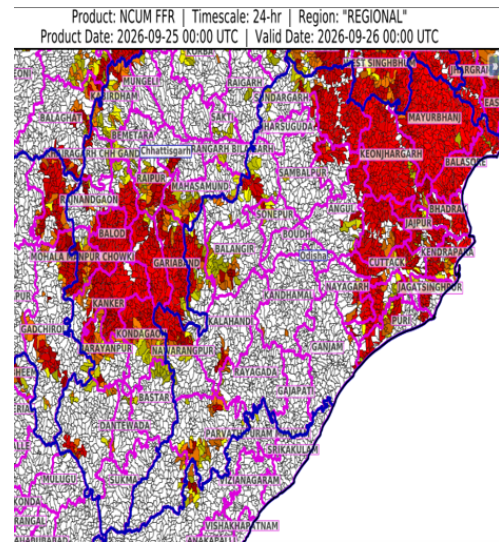

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-24

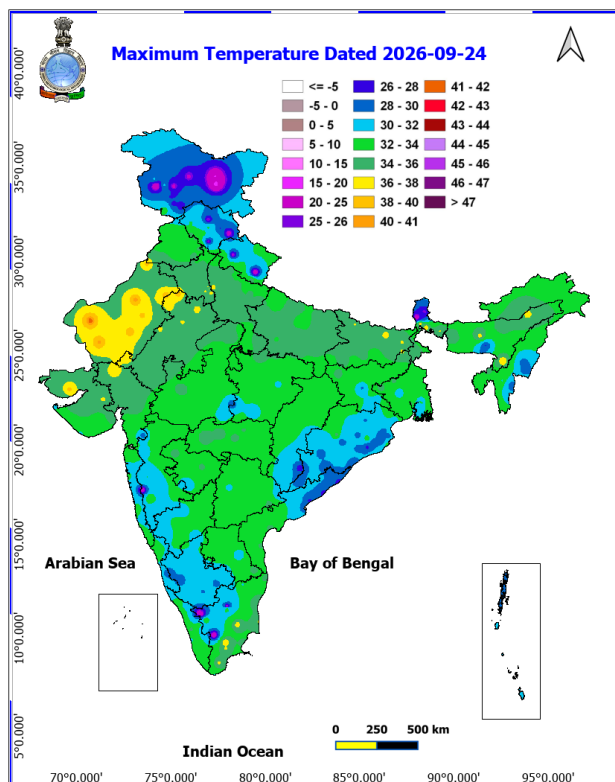


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-09-24

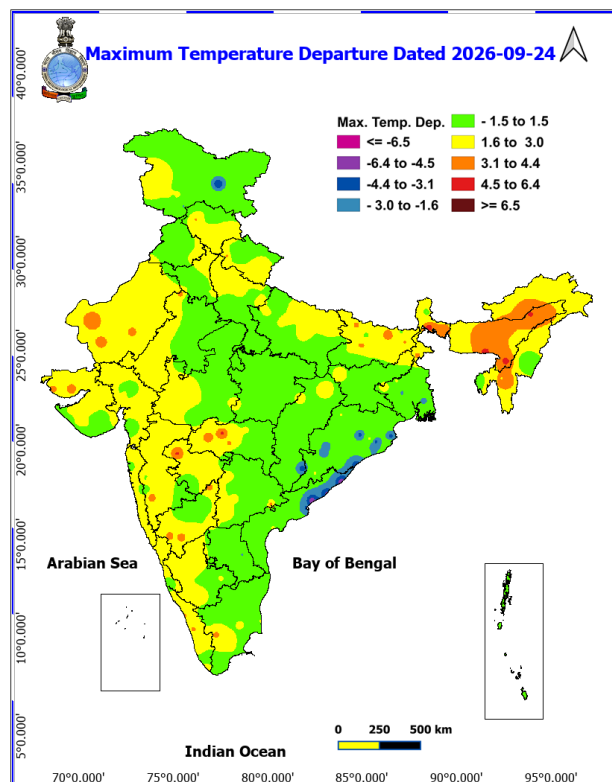


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-24

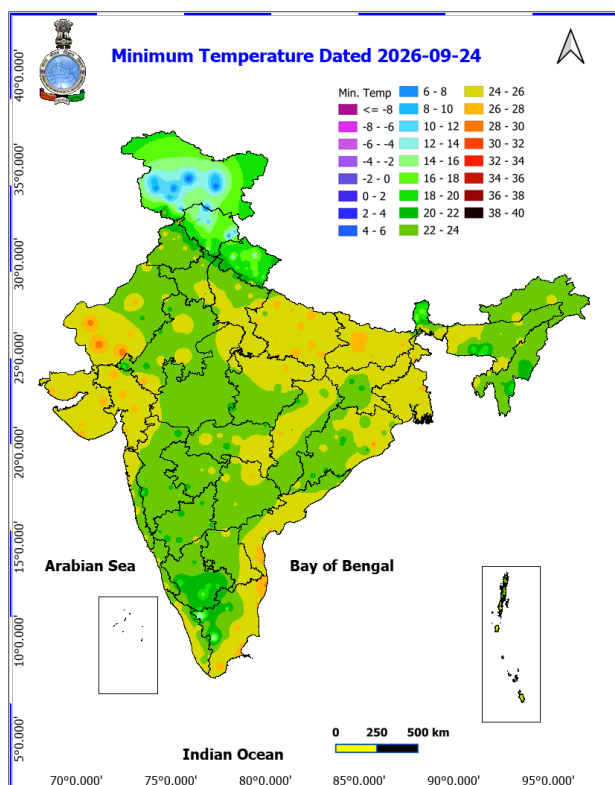
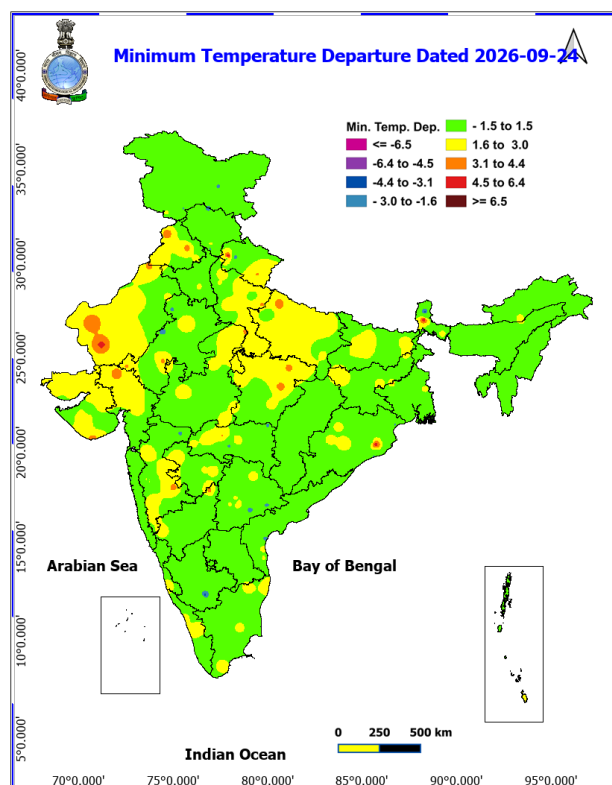
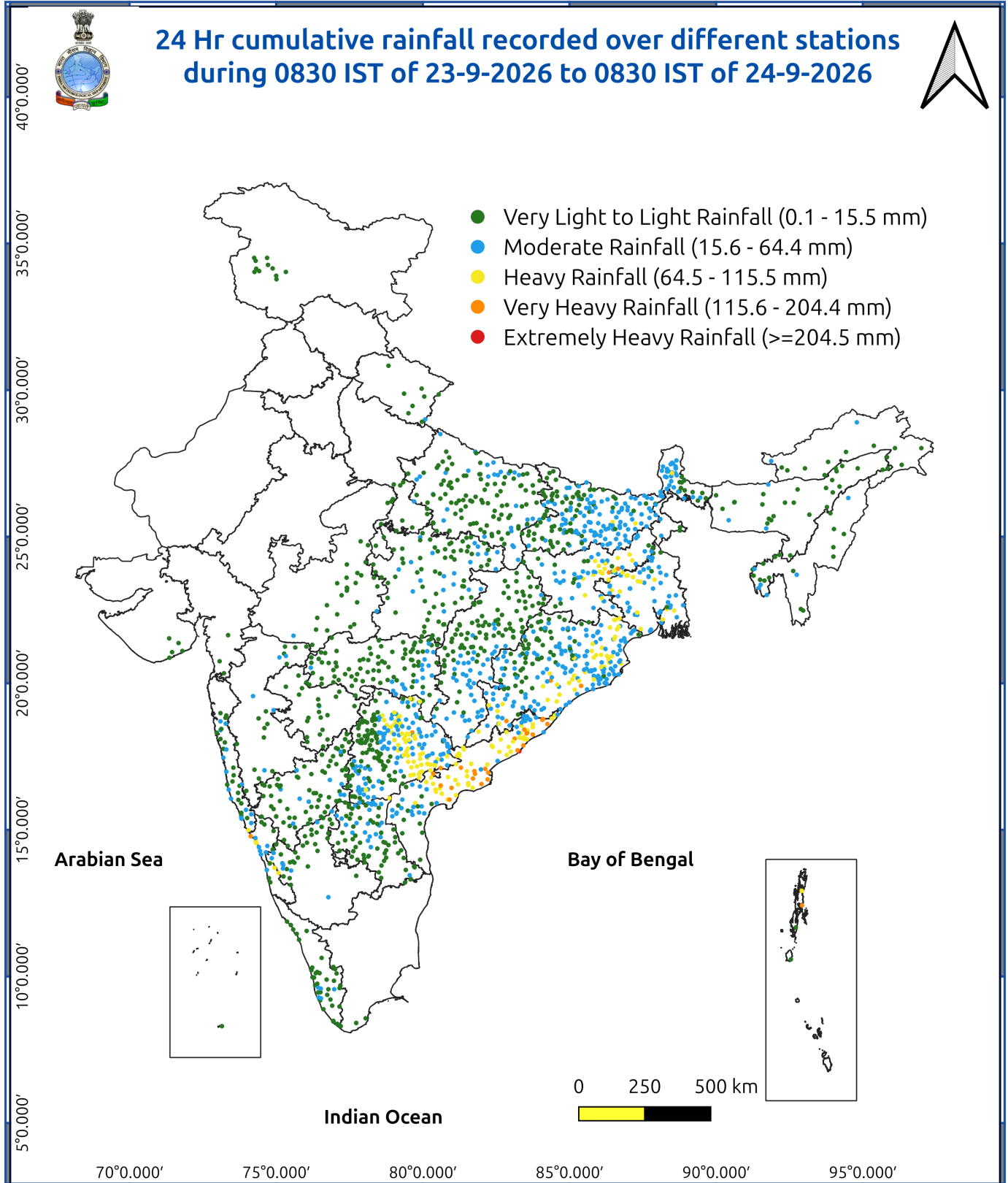


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-09-24





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Impact and Actions

- **Isolated extremely rainfall** likely over chhattisgarh on 25th and over Uttarakhand on 26th September.

Impact expected:

- Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of small trees like banana, papaya, drum sticks. Strong wind and rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds and rain.
- Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to heavy rain.
- Loose objects may fly.
- Small ships, trawlers and boats may be affected.
- Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain and squally winds.
- There could be localised landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Helicopter services may get affected.

Action suggested:

- People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- Onshore and offshore activities to be judiciously regulated.
- Helicopter services to be regulated.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy / Very Heavy / Extremely Heavy Rainfall

- In **Odisha**, drain out excess rain water from rice, maize, millets, ginger, turmeric, vegetables, pulses and orchards. Keep drainage channels clear, protect vegetable nurseries and provide staking to vegetables and newly planted banana to prevent lodging.
- In **Coastal Andhra Pradesh**, drainout excess rain water from rice, maize, ragi, groundnut, red gram, sugarcane, vegetables and orchards. Keep the harvested produce of maize in a safe, dry place. Provide strong support to fruit-bearing banana plants and propping in sugarcane.
- In **Telangana**, ensure adequate drainage in rice, cotton, green gram, black gram, red gram, vegetables and orchards to prevent water stagnation. Provide staking/support to vulnerable crops and postpone fertilizer and plant-protection operations until weather conditions become suitable. Keep harvested produce in a safe dry place.
- In **Chhattisgarh**, maintain effective drainage in rice, maize, groundnut, minor millets, pulses and vegetables. Keep drainage channels clear, particularly in low-lying maize, ginger and turmeric fields, remove stagnant water promptly and provide support to vulnerable vegetable crops.
- In **West Bengal**, maintain proper drainage in rice and other crop fields to prevent water stagnation. Keep field channels clear, strengthen drainage in areas prone to water accumulation and harvest mature crops during suitable dry intervals and shift the harvested produce in a safe, dry place.
- In **Bihar**, maintain proper drainage in rice, maize, pigeon pea, low lying sugarcane fields and other standing crop fields to avoid water stagnation.
- In **Jharkhand**, maintain proper drainage in standing crop fields such as maize, pigeon pea, other standing crops and vegetables.
- In **Vidarbha**, provide mechanical support to newly planted orchards and vegetables to prevent them from lodging. Harvest matured green gram, black gram, vegetables as early as possible and keep the harvested

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produce at safer places. Make arrangement to drain out excess water from *kharif* crops like rice, cotton, pigeon pea, soybean, vegetable and orchards.

- In **Karnataka**, maintain drainage in standing crop fields and postpone intercultural, fertilizer and plant-protection operations during wet conditions. Harvest mature green gram, black gram and soybean wherever conditions permit, secure harvested produce in covered storage and provide staking/propping support to vulnerable crops.
- In **Keralam**, ensure effective drainage in banana, black pepper, coconut, ginger and turmeric fields following the recent rainfall and provide strong support to banana plants and trellis-grown crops. Postpone all field operations until rainfall ceases and soil conditions become suitable.
- In **East Madhya Pradesh**, undertake harvesting of urad and moong crops immediately and store them in a safe place.
- In **Andaman & Nicobar**, ensure proper drainage to avoid waterlogging in banana, particularly in mature and fruit-bearing plants. Provide support to banana and other tall crops.
- In **Assam and Meghalaya**, maintain effective drainage in rice, sesame, ginger, green gram, black gram and other crops, keeping field channels open to prevent waterlogging. Harvest mature jute, banana and bottle gourd during suitable dry intervals and keep harvested produce safe and dry.
- In **Nagaland**, maintain 3-5 cm water level in wet rice fields and harvest mature maize cobs during suitable weather.
- In **Uttarakhand**, avoid irrigation in rice where rainfall is adequate and maintain proper drainage in sugarcane and maize fields. Keep drainage channels clear and provide support to tall crops and vegetables to prevent lodging.
- In **Uttar Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in standing crop fields and postpone irrigation, intercultural operations, fertilizer and plant-protection applications during wet conditions. Provide staking/support to young plants, vegetables and horticultural crops.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

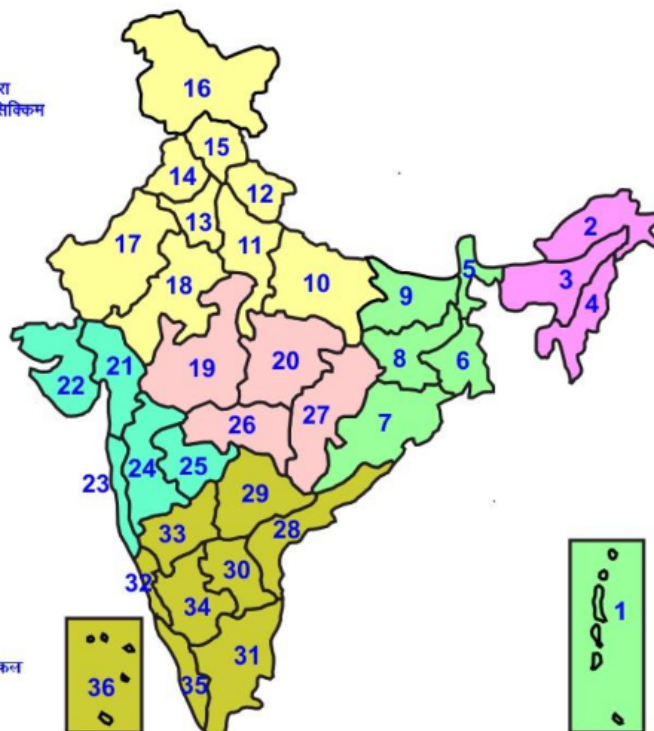
- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Agromet advisory for likely impact of heavy rainfall on Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.
