ALL INDIA WEATHER SUMMARY AND FORECAST BULLETIN

Significant Weather Features

Weather Forecast and warning:

- Light/moderate isolated to scattered to rainfall/snowfall likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Himachal Pradesh during 17th -22nd; and fairly widespread to widespread rainfall/snowfall with **isolated heavy falls on 23rd** over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Himachal Pradesh.
- Light/moderate isolated to scattered to rainfall/snowfall also likely over Uttarakhand on 17th & 18th and scattered/ fairly widespread during 21st -23rd
- Light/moderate isolated to scattered to rainfall over Punjab, Haryana & Chandigarh and West Uttar Pradesh on 22nd & 23rd and over East Uttar Pradesh and north Rajasthan on 23rd January.

Forecast of minimum temperatures:

- Gradual rise in minimum temperatures by about 2°C likely over northwest & central India during next 2 days, no significant change for next 3 days and rise by 3-5°C during subsequent 2 days.
- No significant change in minimum temperatures likely over East India during next 24 hours; gradual rise by 2-3°C during next 4 days and no significant change for subsequent 2 days.
- No significant change in minimum temperatures likely over rest parts of the country.

Dense Fog, Cold day & Cold wave Warnings:

- **Dense to very dense fog** conditions very likely to prevail in morning/night hours in isolated/some parts over Punjab, Haryana & Chandigarh till 18th and **Dense fog** in isolated pockets of Punjab, Haryana & Chandigarh till 22nd January 2026.
- **Dense to very dense fog** conditions very likely to prevail in morning/night hours in isolated/some parts over Uttar Pradesh till 19th and **Dense fog** in isolated pockets Uttar Pradesh till 20th January 2026.
- **Dense fog** conditions also likely during morning/night hours in isolated/some pockets over Jammu division and Uttarakhand till 19th; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim till 23rd; Gangetic West Bengal till 19th; Bihar till 21st and Assam & Meghalaya till 18th January.
- **Cold day** conditions likely in isolated places over West Uttar Pradesh on 17th; East Uttar Pradesh on 17th & 18th January.
- **Cold wave conditions** very likely in some/many parts of in isolated pockets East Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Odisha on 17th & 18th January.

Fishermen are advised not to venture into the following areas during 17th January to 22nd January, 2026:

- **Bay of Bengal:** No Warning.
- **Arabian Sea:** Over Gulf of Mannar and some parts of Comorin area on 17th January, 2026.

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Main Weather Observations:

- ❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today): **at isolated places** over Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Kerala & Mahe; **Dry** over rest of the country.
- ❖ **Significant rainfall recorded(in cm)** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today): **Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal:** Nalumukku (dist Tirunelveli), Oothu (dist Tirunelveli) 1 Each; **Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad:** Kupwara Kvk AWS (dist Kupwara) 1.
- ❖ **Dense to very Dense fog(visibility <50 m) conditions** prevailed in most parts of Punjab; in many parts of Uttar Pradesh; in some parts of Haryana and **dense fog (visibility 50-199 m)** conditionsprevailed in isolated pockets of Jammu & Kashmir, Uttarakhand.
- ❖**Visibility reported (in meters ?200 m): Uttarakhand:**Kashipur (75); **Punjab:**Amritsar (0), Patiala (20), Bathinda (40), Faridkot (15), Gurdaspur (20)/Ludhiana (50); **Haryana:**Ambala (0), Hisar (40), Karnal (30); **Jammu-Kashmir:** Jammu(200), Srinagar (0); **West Uttar Pradesh:**Agra IAF, AMS Moradabad, AMS Aligarh, Sarsawa(IAF), Hindon(IAF) & Bareilly(IAF)(00) Each, Meerut(10), Bareilly(20), Aligarh(25), Agra Taj(30), Shahjahanpur(40), Etawah, Muzaffarnagar & Hamirpur(50), Moradabad & Najibabad(100); **East Uttar Pradesh:**Prayagraj IAF, Gorakhpur IAF, Fursatganj, Kanpur IAF, Azamgarh, Varanasi AP & Barabanki(00) Each, Prayagraj, Fatehpur, Kanpur City(10), Sultanpur, Bahraich, Ballia(20), Hardoi(30), Fatehgarh(40), Lucknow(50), Ayodhya(75),
- ❖**Cold wave conditions** prevailed in isolated places over East Uttar Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand and Odisha.
- ❖**Cold day conditions** prevailed in isolated places over West Uttar Pradesh.
- ❖**Minimum Temperatures** were below normal (-3°C to -6°C) over Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Odisha, Saurashtra & Kutch, Jharkhand & Bihar and near normal over rest parts of the country. The **lowest minimum temperature** of **3.0°C** was observed at Narnaul (**Haryana**)over the plains of India.
- ❖**Maximum Temperatures** departures are **appreciably above normal (3.1 to 5.0 °C)** at a few places over Rajasthan and Assam & Meghalaya; **above normal (1.6 to 3.0°C)** at a few places over Madhya Pradesh, Lakshadweep, Andaman & Nicobar Islands; **markedly below normal (-5.1°C or less)** at a few places over West Uttar Pradesh; **appreciably below normal (-5.0°C to -3.1°C)** at isolated places over Punjab; **below normal (-3.0°C to -1.6°C)** at isolated places over Odisha. The **highest minimum temperature** of **38.0°C** was observed at **Bhira (Konkan & Goa)**over the plains of India.

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
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Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0830 hours IST)

- Conditions are becoming favourable for cessation of **Northeast monsoon** rains over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, Kerala & Mahe and adjoining areas of Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema and South Interior Karnataka during next 48 hours.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Southeast Arabian sea adjoining Lakshadweep and Kerala coast now lies over Comorin Area between 0.9 km & 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a cyclonic circulation over northeast Iran & neighbourhood now lies over Afghanistan and adjoining Pakistan & neighbourhood at 3.1 km above mean sea level with the trough aloft in middle and upper tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level now runs roughly along Long. 60°E to the north of Lat. 25°N.
- An **induced cyclonic circulation** lies over southwest Rajasthan & adjoining south Pakistan at 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- **Subtropical westerly Jet Stream** with core winds of the order of 145 knots at 12.6 km above mean sea level prevails over Northeast India.
- Two **Western disturbance** in quick succession is likely to affect Northwest India from 19th & 21st January, 2026 night.

Weather Outlook for subsequent 3 days


- Scattered to Fairly widespread activity likely over Western Himalayan Region, Punjab, Haryana, Delhi.
- isolated/scattered rainfall activity is likely over West Uttar Pradesh.



- ❖ **Cold wave conditions** very likely at isolated places over Chhattisgarh, East Madhya Pradesh and Odisha.

Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-01-16








Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-01-17

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Impact and Actions

Impact expected due to dense/very dense fog in the morning hours:

- Dense fog conditions very likely to continue over northwest India and Bihar during next 4-5 days.

Transport and Aviation:

- May affect some airports, highways and railway routes in the areas of met- sub-division.
- Difficult driving conditions with slower journey times.
- Unless taken precautionary measures, it may lead to some road traffic collisions.

Power Sector:

- Chances of Tripping of Power lines in the very dense fog routes.

Human Health:

- Lung related health impacts: Dense fog contains particulate matter and other pollutants and in case exposed it gets lodged in the lungs, clogging them and decreasing their functional capacity which increases episodes of wheezing, coughing and shortness of breath.
- Impact on people having asthma bronchitis: Long time exposure to dense fog may cause respiratory problem for people having asthma bronchitis and other lung related health problems.
- Eye Irritation: Dense fog contains pollutions of various types and these Pollutants in the air if exposed may tend to irritate the membranes of the eye causing various infections leading to redness or swelling of the eye.

Action suggested:

❖ Transport and Aviation:

- Be careful while driving or outing through any transport.
- Use fog lights during driving.
- Be in touch with airlines, railways and state transport for schedule of your journey.

❖ Power Sector:

- To keep ready Maintenance Team.
- Human Health: To avoid outing until unless emergency and to cover the face.

Impact expected due to Cold Wave to Severe Cold wave conditions:

Cold wave conditions very likely to continue over East Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Odisha during next 24 hours and abate thereafter.

- An increased likelihood of various illnesses like flu, running/ stuffy nose or nosebleed, which usually set in or get aggravated due to prolonged exposure to cold.
- Do not ignore shivering. It is the first sign that the body is losing heat. Get Indoors.
- Frostbite can occur due to prolonged exposure to cold. The skin turns pale, hard and numb and eventually black blisters appear on exposed body parts such as fingers, toes, nose and or earlobes. Severe frostbite needs immediate medical attention and treatment.
- Impact on agriculture, crop, livestock, water supply, transport and power sector at some places.

Action suggested:

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- Wear several layers of loose fitting, light weight; warm woollen clothing.
- Cover your head, neck, hands and toes adequately as majority of heat loss occurs through these body parts. Wear several layers of loose fitting, light weight; warm woollen clothing rather than one layer of heavy cloth.
- Eat vitamin-C rich fruits & vegetable and drink sufficient fluids preferably warm fluids to maintain adequate immunity.
- Avoid or limit outdoor activities.
- Keep dry, if wet, change cloths immediately to prevent loss of body heat. Wear insulated/waterproof shoes.
- Warm the affected area of the body slowly with lukewarm water; do not rub the skin vigorously.
- If the affected skin area turns black, immediately consult a doctor.
- Maintain ventilation while using Heaters to avoid inhaling toxic fumes.
- Take safety measures while using electrical and gas heating devices.
- Extreme care needed for vulnerable people.
- Seek medical attention as soon as possible for someone suffering from frostbite/ Hypothermia.
- Protect livestock from cold weather.

Impact expected due to Cold Day conditions:

Cold day conditions very likely in some pockets of Uttar Pradesh during next 2 days.

- An increased likelihood of various illnesses like flu, running/ stuffy nose or nosebleed, which usually set in or get aggravated due to prolonged exposure to cold.
- Do not ignore shivering. It is the first sign that the body is losing heat. Get Indoors.
- Frostbite can occur due to prolonged exposure to cold. The skin turns pale, hard and numb and eventually black blisters appear on exposed body parts such as fingers, toes, nose and or earlobes. Severe frostbite needs immediate medical attention and treatment.
- Impact on agriculture, crop, livestock, water supply, transport and power sector at some places.

Action suggested:

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- If the affected skin area turns black, immediately consult a doctor.
- Maintain ventilation while using Heaters to avoid inhaling toxic fumes.
- Take safety measures while using electrical and gas heating devices.

- Protect livestock from cold weather.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Cold Waves/ Ground Frost/ Low Temperatures

- In **Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Odisha, East Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh**, apply light and frequent irrigation to the standing crops in the evening hours to protect crops from low temperature stress or cold injury. Use mulching and cover the vegetable nurseries and young fruit plants with straw / polythene sheets to maintain optimum soil temperature.

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Livestock / Poultry

- Keep the cattle in the sheds during night and provide dry bedding to protect them from cold.
- Keep the chicks warm by providing artificial light in the poultry sheds.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

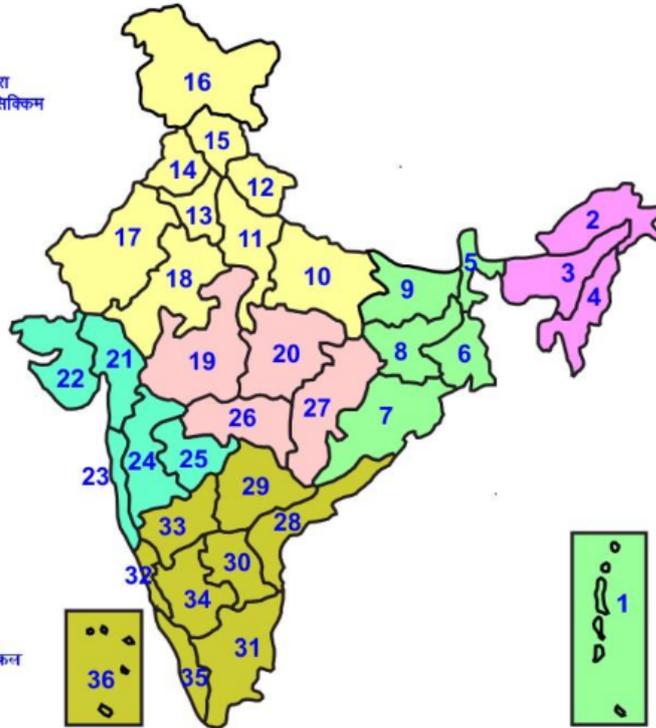

Severe Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure $> 6.4^{\circ}\text{C}$.



When minimum temperature of a station $\leq 10^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\leq 0^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions.

(a). Based on departure

Cold Wave: Minimum Temperature Departure from normal -4.5°C to -6.4°C .
Severe Cold Wave: Minimum Temperature Departure from normal $\leq -6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$

(b) Based on actual Minimum Temperature (for Plains only)

Cold Wave : When Minimum Temperature is $\leq 4.0^{\circ}\text{C}$
Severe Cold Wave: When Minimum Temperature is $\leq 2.0^{\circ}\text{C}$

(c) For Coastal Stations

When Minimum Temperature departure is $\leq -4.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ & actual Minimum Temperature is $\leq 15^{\circ}\text{C}$



When minimum temperature of a station $\leq 10^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\leq 0^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions
Based on departure

Cold Day: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal -4.5°C to -6.4°C .
Severe Cold Day: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal $\leq -6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$



Phenomenon of small droplets suspended in air and the horizontal visibility $< 1\text{km}$

Moderate Fog: When the visibility between 500-200 metres
Dense Fog: when the visibility between 50- 200 metres
Very Dense Fog: when the visibility < 50 metres



Sudden electrical discharges manifested by a flash of light (Lightning) and a sharp rumbling sound (thunder)



An ensemble of particles of dust or sand energetically lifted to great heights by a strong and turbulent wind.



Ice deposits on ground

Air temperature $\leq 4^{\circ}\text{C}$ (over Plains)



A strong wind that rises suddenly, lasts for atleast 1 minute.

Moderate: Wind speed 52-61 kmph
Severe: Wind speed 62-87 kmph
Very Severe: Wind speed > 87 kmph



Effect of various waves in the sea over specific area

Rough to very rough: Wind speed 41-62 kmph (22-33 knots) & Wave height 2.5-6 metre
High to very high: Wind speed 63-117 kmph (34-63 knots) & Wave height 6-14 metre
Phenomenal: Wind speed > 117 kmph (> 63 knots) & Wave height > 14 metre



Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 62-87 kmph (34-47 knots)
Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 88-117 kmph (48-63 knots)
Very Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 118-165 kmph (64 - 89 knots)
Extremely Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 166-220 kmph (90 -119 knots)
Super Cyclone Storm: Wind speed > 220 kmph (> 119 knots)

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
