ALL INDIA WEATHER SUMMARY AND FORECAST BULLETIN

Significant Weather Features

Weather Warning & Forecast:

Northwest India:

- **Isolated to scattered** light rainfall/snowfall with isolated thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds speed reaching (30-50 kmph) likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Himachal Pradesh on 26th; Uttarakhand on 27th March.
- **Isolated** light rainfall with thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds speed reaching (30-40 kmph) likely over Punjab and Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi on 26th; Uttar Pradesh on 27th March.
- Another fresh wet spell with **fairly widespread to widespread** light to moderate rainfall/snowfall with isolated thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds speed reaching (30-50 kmph) likely over Jammu-Kashmir and Himachal Pradesh during 28th-30th; **isolated to scattered** light to moderate rainfall/snowfall over Uttarakhand on 29th & 30th; with **isolated to scattered** light to moderate rainfall likely with isolated thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds speed reaching (30-40 kmph) over Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi on 29th & 30th and Rajasthan during 28th-30th March.

Northeast India:

- **Scattered to fairly widespread** light to moderate rainfall with **thunderstorm, lightninggusty winds speed reaching (30-50 kmph)** likely over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya on 24th, 25th, 27th & 28th; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura on 24th, 25th & 28th March.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over Assam & Meghalaya and Arunachal Pradesh on 24th, 27th & 28th and Nagaland on 28th March.

East India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall with **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds speed reaching (30-50 kmph)** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 24th-29th; Bihar & Odisha on 27th & 28th; Gangetic West Bengal on 24th & during 27th-29th; Jharkhand on 24th, 27th & 28th March.
- **Thundersquall (wind speed reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph) with Hailstorm** at isolated places likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 24th & 27th March.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 24th & 27th March.

Central India:

- **Isolated** light rainfall **with thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds speed reaching (30-50 kmph)** likely over Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh on 26th & 27th; East Madhya Pradesh on 27th & 28th March.

West India:

- **Isolated** light rainfall **with thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Madhya Maharashtra during 24th- 26th and Marathwada on 24th & 25th March.

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated** light rainfall **with thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds speed reaching (30-40 kmph)** likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema, Telangana and Karnataka during next 5 days; with **lightning** over Kerala & Mahe on 27th & 28th March.
- **Isolated hailstorm activity** likely over Interior Karnataka on 24th March.

Hot & Humid weather Warnings:

***Red color warning does not mean "Red Alert" Red color warning means "Take Action"**

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- **Hot & humid conditions** very likely to prevail in isolated pockets over Kerala during 24th-26th; Coastal Maharashtra on 24th & 25th March.

Forecast of maximum/day temperatures:

- Gradual rise in maximum temperatures by 2-4°C likely over Northwest India during next 4 days and no significant change during subsequent 3 days.
- Gradual rise in maximum temperatures by 2-3°C likely over Central India during next 3 days and no significant change during subsequent 4 days.
- Gradual rise in maximum temperatures by 3-5°C likely over East India during next 4 days; gradual fall by 2-4°C during subsequent 3 days.
- Gradual rise in maximum temperatures by 2-3°C likely over West India during next 2 days and no significant change during subsequent 5 days.
- No significant change in maximum temperatures likely over rest parts of the country.

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today): **at many places** over Arunachal Pradesh and Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad; **at a few places** over Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh; **at isolated places** over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Odisha, Jharkhand, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, East Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; **Dry** over rest of the country.

❖ **Heavy Rainfall observed** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today): **Heavy rain** at isolated places over Sikkim.

❖ **Hot & humid weather conditions** prevailed in isolated pockets over Coastal Maharashtra.

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 24-03-2026):** **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Konkan & Goa and Madhya Maharashtra. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over West Rajasthan; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan and Gujarat Region. **above normal (1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at few places over Bihar, Punjab, Saurashtra & Kutch and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, East Madhya Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and North Interior Karnataka. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** over rest parts of the country. **The lowest minimum temperature of 14.0 °C** was observed at **Najibabad (Uttar Pradesh) & Gurdaspur (Punjab)** over the Plains of India.

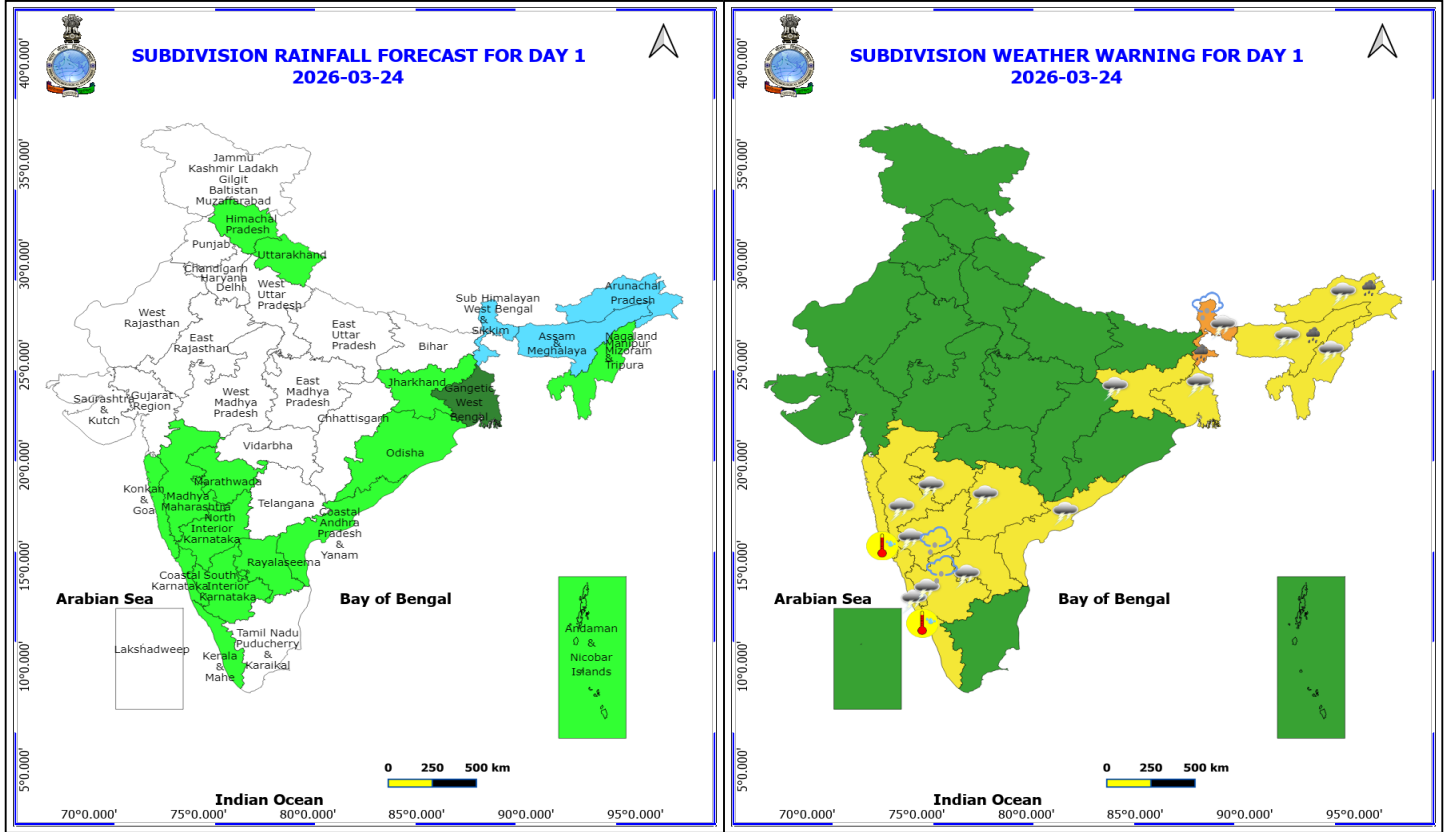
❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 23-03-2026):** **markedly above normal (> 5.1°C)** at few places over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad; at isolated places over West Rajasthan and Konkan & Goa. **appreciably above normal (3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Saurashtra & Kutch; at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, Himachal Pradesh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Kerala & Mahe. **above normal (1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Madhya Maharashtra. Below normal (>3°C) Over Uttarakhand adjoining Himachal Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, North and Southwest Rajasthan, Northwest Madhya Pradesh, North Chhattisgarh, East and North east India, Telangana, adjoining North Interior Karnataka and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and near normal over rest part of the country. **The highest maximum temperature of 39.4°C** was reported at **AKOLA (MAHARASHTRA)**.

Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0830 hours IST)

- The upper **air cyclonic circulation** over central Pakistan & neighbourhood at 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over central parts of Madhya Pradesh at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **trough** from above cyclonic circulation over central parts of Madhya Pradesh to north Madhya Maharashtra across Vidarbha and Marathwada at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **trough** in lower level westerlies with its axis at 3.1 km above mean sea level now runs roughly along Long. 90°E to the north of Lat. 20°N.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over central Assam & neighbourhood at 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over South Interior Karnataka & neighbourhood at 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- The **trough/wind discontinuity** from Gulf of Mannar to North Interior Karnataka across Tamil Nadu and South Interior Karnataka at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.
- **Subtropical westerly Jet Stream** with core winds of the order of 90 knots at 12.6 km above mean sea level continues to prevail over north India.
- Two Western **Disturbances** in quick succession are likely to affect northwest India, 1st from 26th and 2nd from night of 28th March 2026, respectively.

Weather Outlook for subsequent 3 days

- Widespread rainfall activity likely over Northeast India and Isolated to Scattered rainfall activity over remaining parts of the country except Gujarat and South Rajasthan.



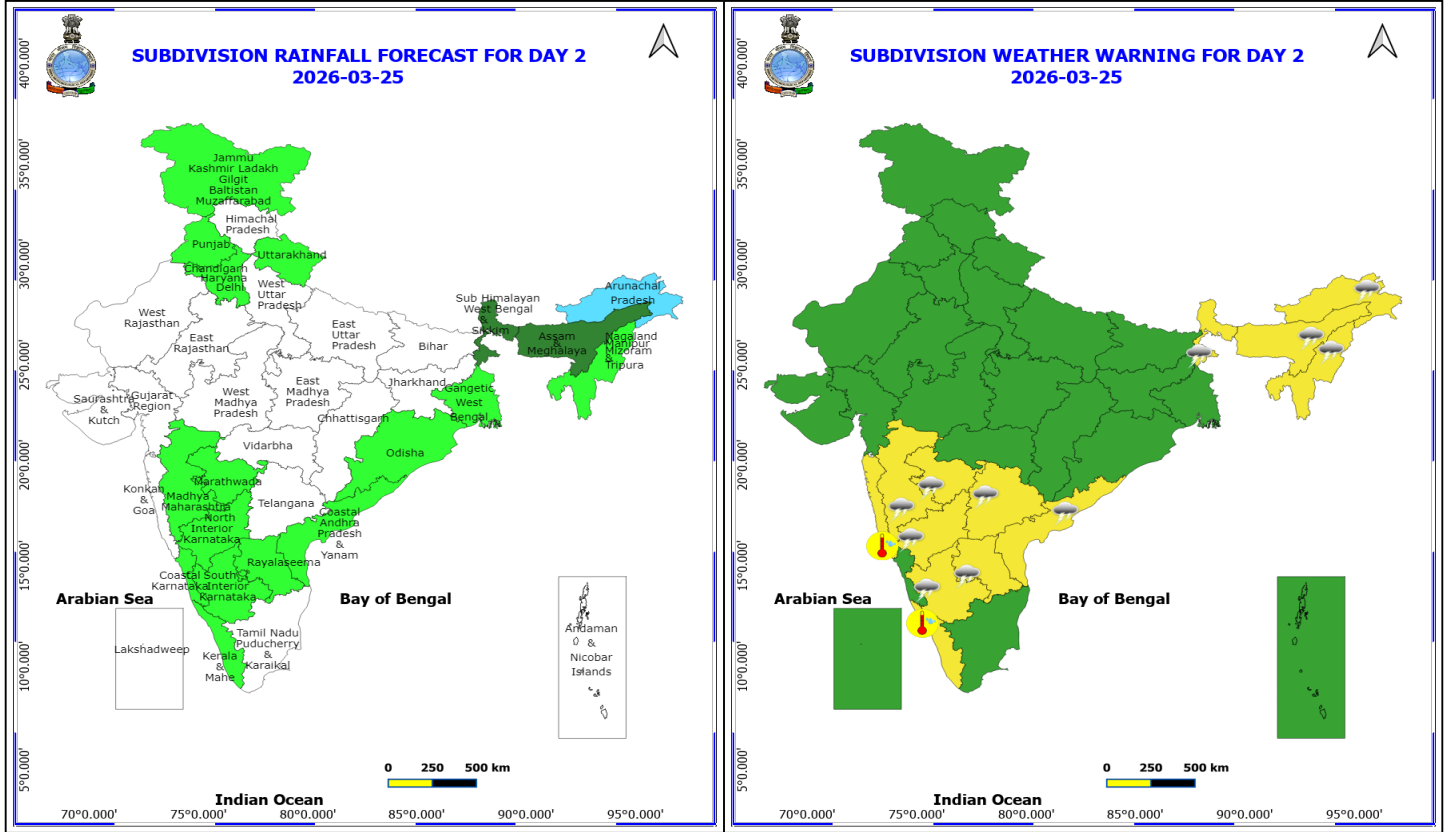

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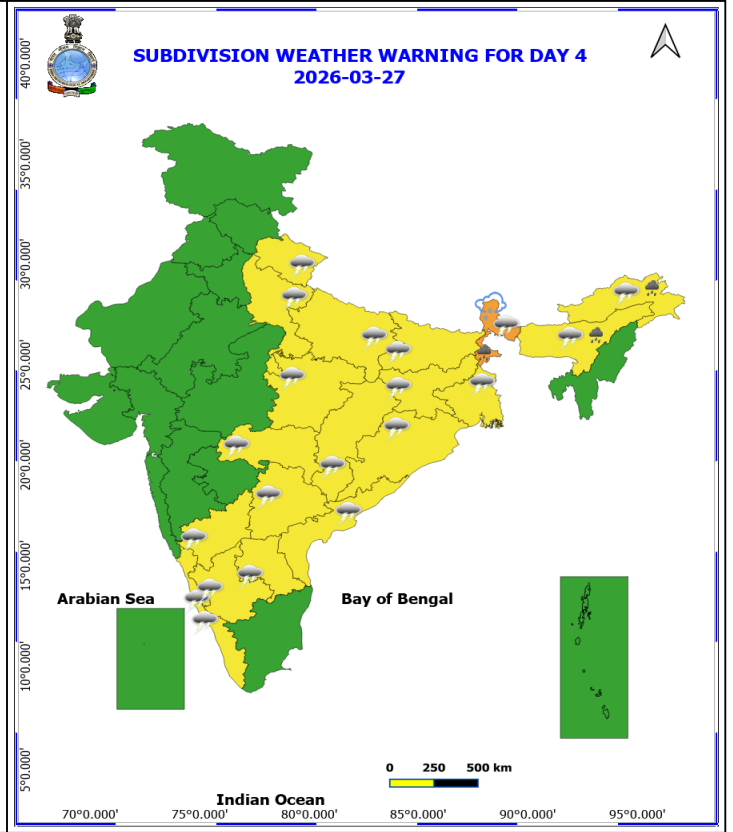
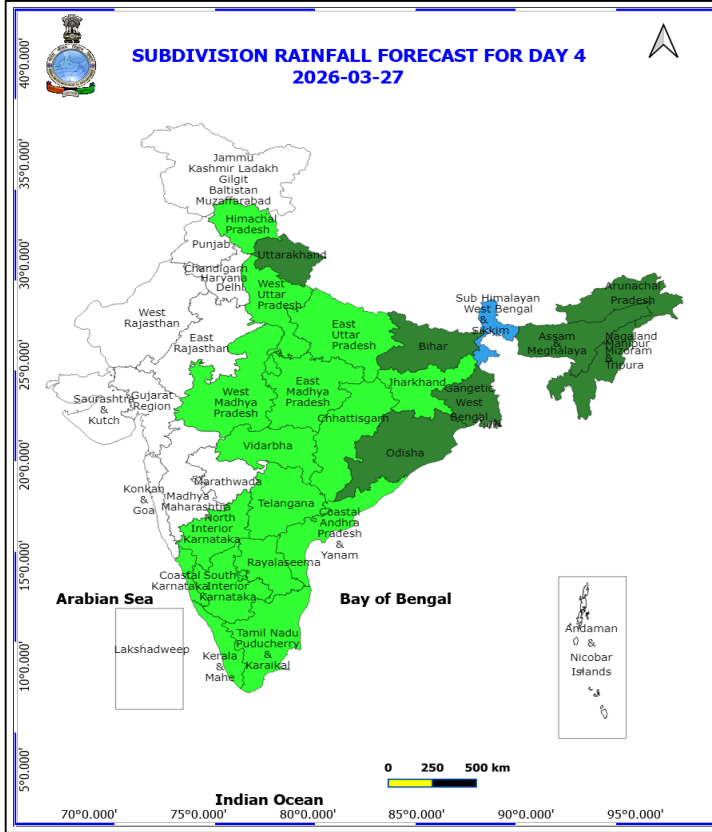

- ❖ **Hot and Humid weather** very likely at isolated places over Kerala & Mahe and Konkan & Goa.

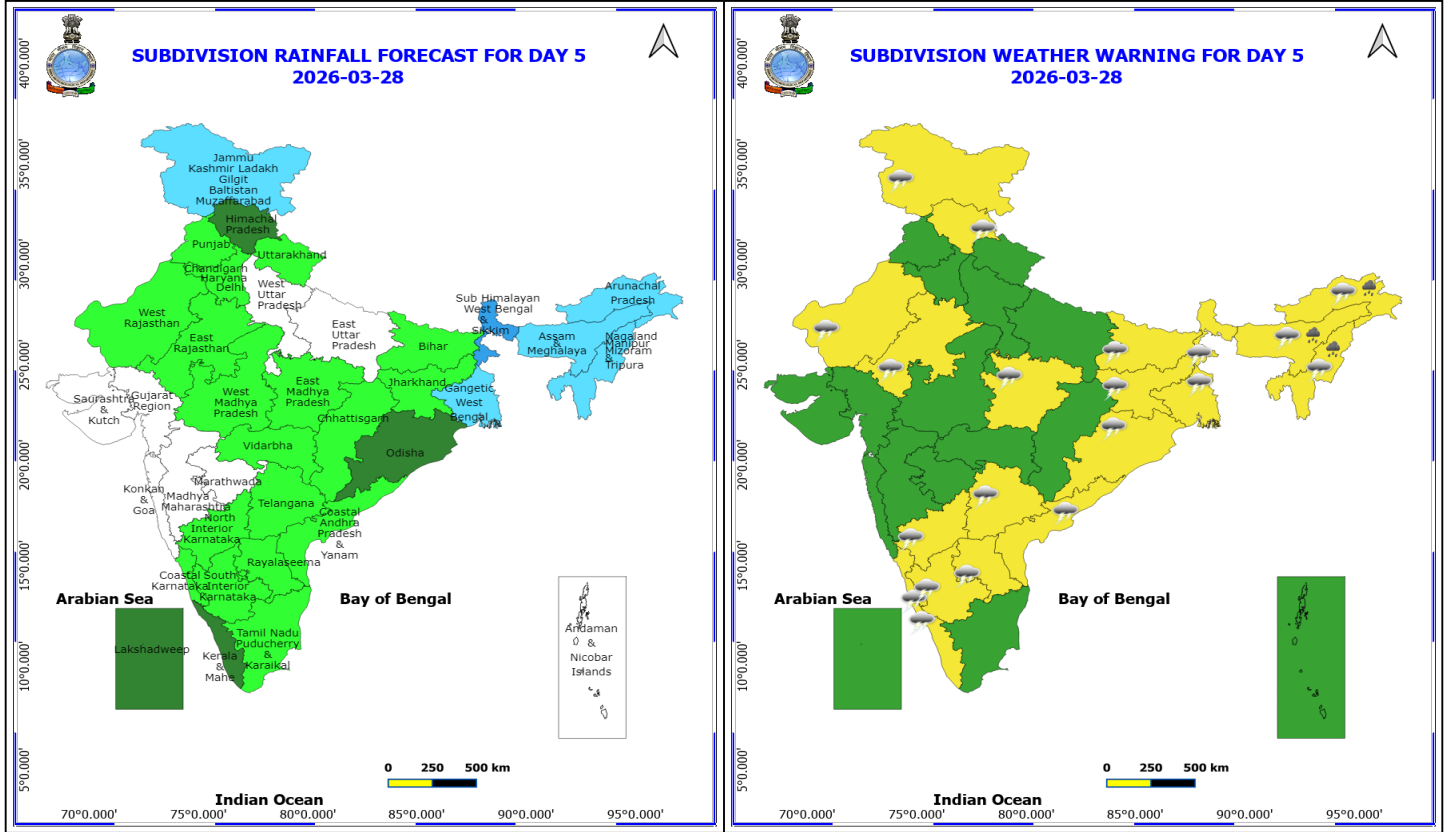

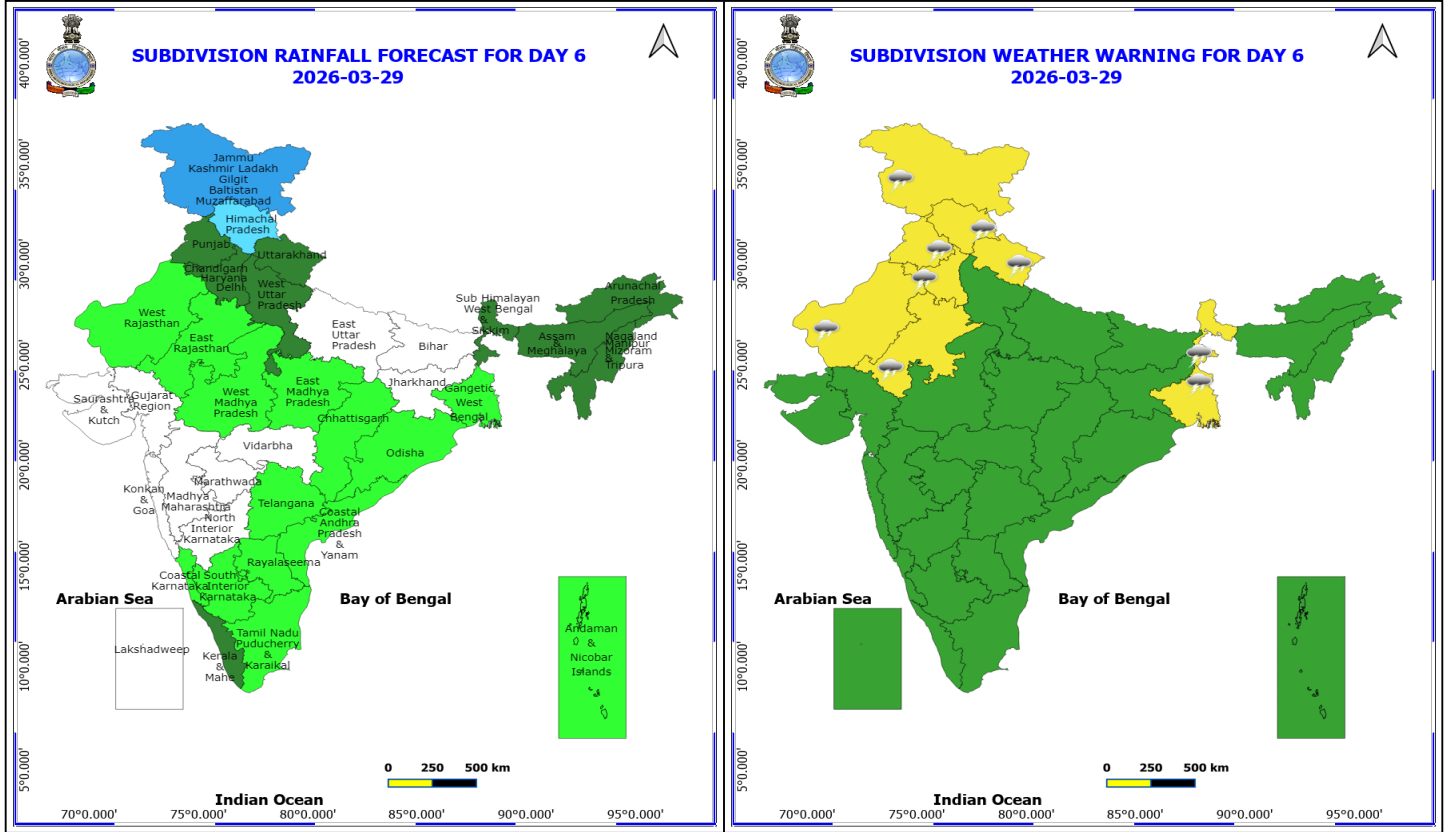

- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** likely at isolated places over Kerala & Mahe and Rajasthan.

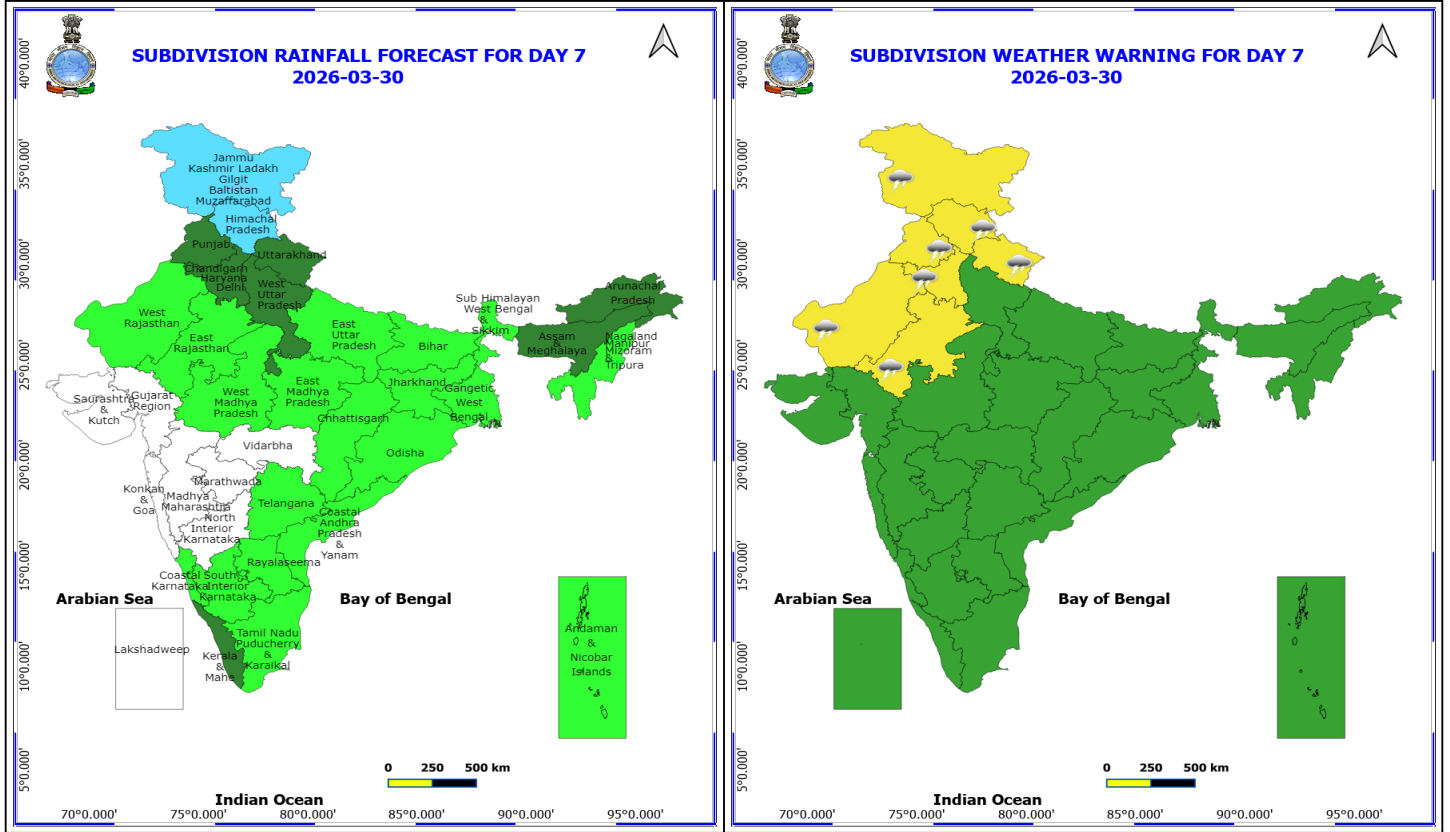

Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-03-23

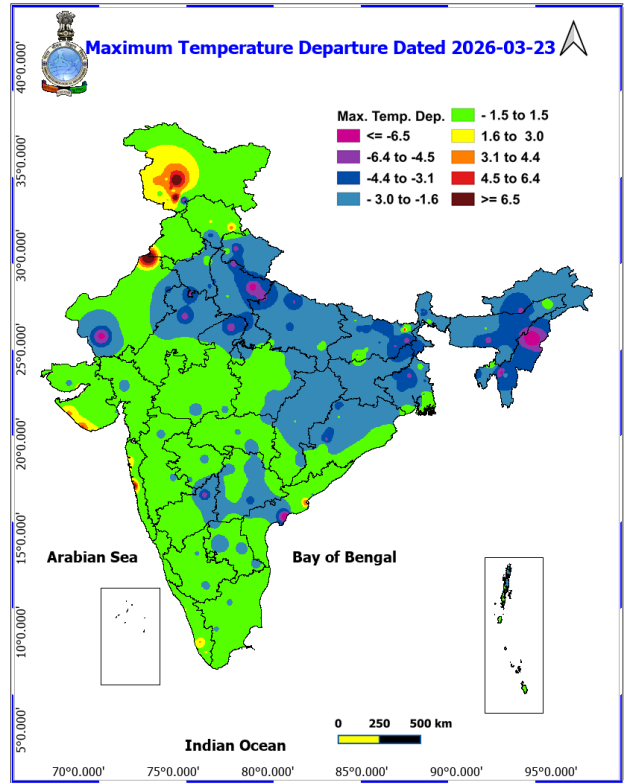
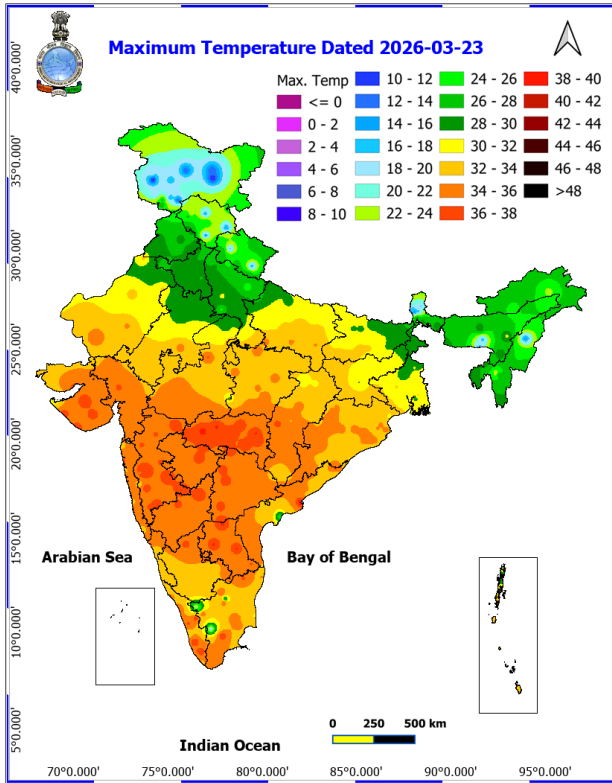
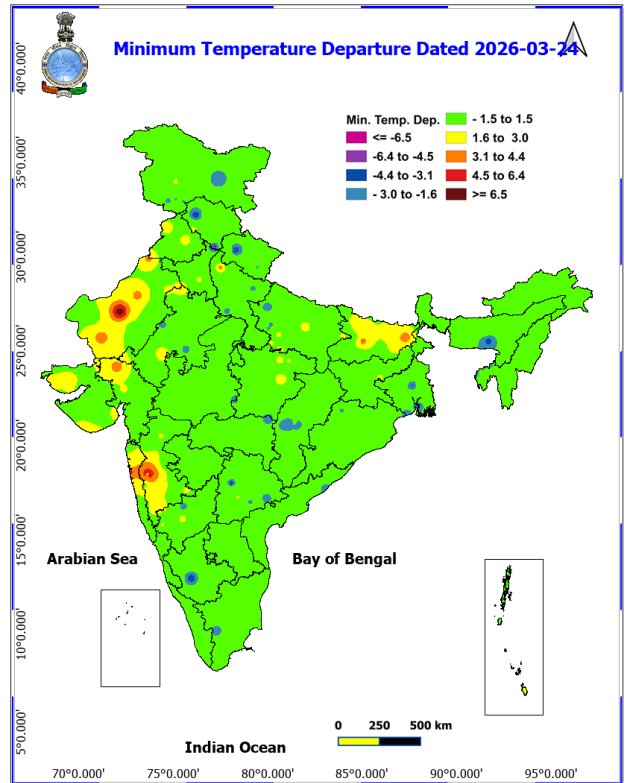
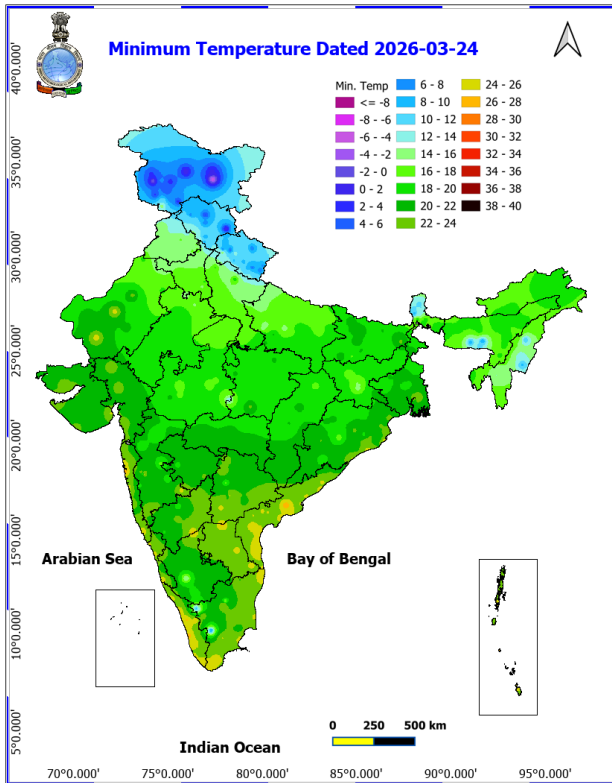


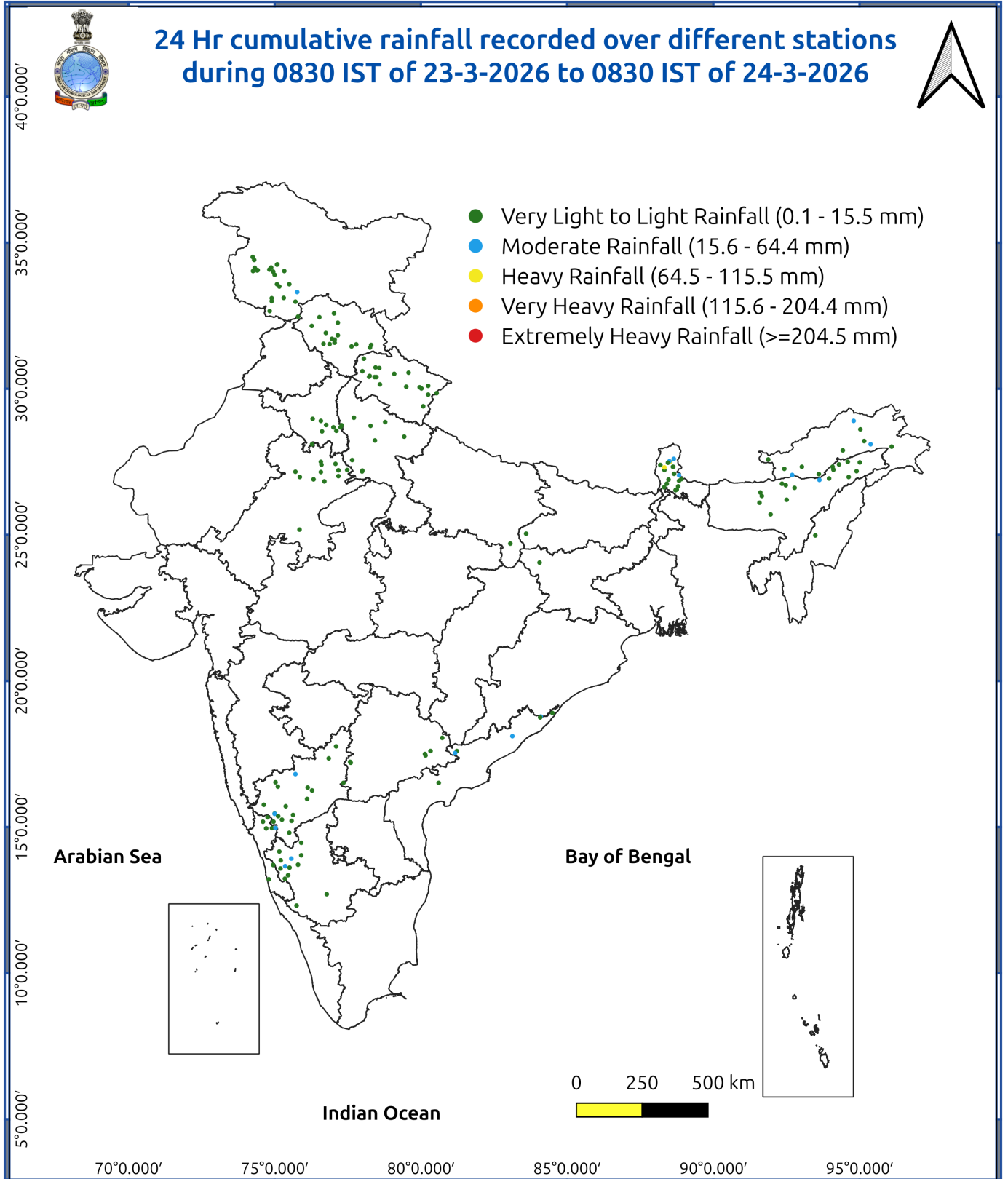
Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-03-24

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Impact and Actions

Impact & Action Suggested due to heavy/very heavy rainfall:

- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 24th & 27th; Assam & Meghalaya and Arunachal Pradesh on 24th, 27th & 28th and Nagaland on 28th March.

Impact Expected

- Localized Flooding of roads, water logging in low lying areas and closure of underpasses mainly in urban areas of the above region.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Disruption of traffic in major cities due to water logging in roads leading to increased travel time.
- Minor damage to kutcha roads.
- Possibilities of damage to vulnerable structure.
- Localized Landslides/Mudslides
- Damage to horticulture and standing crops in some areas due to inundation.
- It may lead to riverine flooding in some river catchments (for riverine flooding please visit Web page of CWC).

Action Suggested

- Check for traffic congestion on your route before leaving for your destination.
- Follow any traffic advisories that are issued in this regard.
- Avoid going to areas that face the water logging problems often.
- Avoid staying in vulnerable structure.

Impact expected and action suggested due to

- **Hailstorm activity** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 24th & 27th and Interior Karnataka on 24th March.
- **Thundersquall (wind speed reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph)** at isolated places likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 24th & 27th March.

Impact expected:

- Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of large avenue trees. Large dead limbs blown from trees. Damage to Standing crops.
- Minor to Major damage to banana and papaya trees.
- Minor to major damage to power and communication lines due to breaking of branches.
- Strong wind/hail may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- Hail may injure people and cattle at open places.
- Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds.
- Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls and huts.
- Loose objects may fly.

Action suggested:

- People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- Stay indoors, close windows & doors and avoid travel if possible.
- Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees.
- Do not lie on concrete floors and do not lean against concrete walls.
- Unplug electrical/ electronic appliances.
- Immediately get out of water bodies.

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- Keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Hailstorms

- Use hail nets or hail caps in fruit orchards and vegetable plants to protect them from mechanical damage in **Sub-Himalayan West Bengal, North Interior Karnataka** and **South Interior Karnataka**.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, undertake harvesting of cabbage, pea, mustard and late-maturing paddy varieties and digging of potatoes. Shift the harvested produce to safe places. Maintain proper drainage channels in the fields of rice, maize, other standing crops, vegetables and orchards.
- In **Assam**, drain out excess rainwater from the standing crop fields.
- In **Meghalaya**, ensure proper drainage in summer vegetable crops. Carry out staking and propping of plantation crops and protect young seedlings from heavy rainfall. Keep the harvested pods of garden peas in safer place immediately.
- In **Sub Himalayan West Bengal**, ensure proper drainage channel, and drain out excess water from fields of rice, maize, other standing crops, vegetables and orchard. Cover the nursery of cucurbits and Dalle khorsani with polyethylene sheets or agro-nets.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops properly and cover them to minimise the risk of displacement due to strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Hot and Humid Weather

- In Konkan Region of **Maharashtra**, provide 100 litre water/tree at weekly or 150 to 200 litre water/ tree at 15 days interval to minimize pre-mature fruit drop and sun scorching in mango and poor fruit set and reduced nut size in cashew orchards. Use straw mulch to prevent moisture loss from the soil. Undertake pre-harvest bagging of fruits with newspaper bags to protect the mango fruits from sunscald.

Livestock / Poultry

- Keep the animals inside the shed during Heavy Rainfall/Hailstorm period and provide them balanced feed. Store feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.

(b). Based on Actual maximum temperature

Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature $\geq 45^{\circ}\text{C}$.
Severe Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature $\geq 47^{\circ}\text{C}$

(c). Criteria for heat wave for coastal stations

When maximum temperature departure is $> 4.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ from normal. Heat Wave may be described provided maximum temperature $\geq 37^{\circ}\text{C}$



When maximum temperature remains 40°C

Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure 4.5°C to 6.4°C .

Phenomenon of small droplets suspended in air and the horizontal visibility $< 1\text{km}$

Moderate Fog: When the visibility between 500-200 metres
Dense Fog: when the visibility between 50- 200 metres
Very Dense Fog: when the visibility < 50 metres



Sudden electrical discharges manifested by a flash of light (Lightning) and a sharp rumbling sound (thunder)



An ensemble of particles of dust or sand energetically lifted to great heights by a strong and turbulent wind.



Ice deposits on ground

Air temperature $\leq 4^{\circ}\text{C}$ (over Plains)



A strong wind that rises suddenly, lasts for atleast 1 minute.

Moderate: Wind speed 52-61 kmph
Severe: Wind speed 62-87 kmph
Very Severe: Wind speed > 87 kmph



Effect of various waves in the sea over specific area

Rough to very rough: Wind speed 41-62 kmph (22-33 knots) & Wave height 2.5-6 metre
High to very high: Wind speed 63-117 kmph (34-63 knots) & Wave height 6-14 metre
Phenomenal: Wind speed > 117 kmph (> 63 knots) & Wave height > 14 metre



Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 62-87 kmph (34-47 knots)
Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 88-117 kmph (48-63 knots)
Very Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 118-165 kmph (64 - 89 knots)
Extremely Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 166-220 kmph (90 -119 knots)
Super Cyclone Storm: Wind speed > 220 kmph (> 119 knots)

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
