Significant Weather Features

Weather forecast and Warnings

Northwest India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad during 31st August-1st September; Himachal Pradesh during 30th August-2nd September; Uttarakhand during 27th August-2nd September.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over West Uttar Pradesh on 27th August; East Uttar Pradesh on 2nd September.

Central India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over West Madhya Pradesh on 27th August; East Madhya Pradesh during 27th-29th August and during 1st-2nd September; Vidarbha on 28th August and on 2nd September; Chhattisgarh during 27th August-2nd September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 28th August-2nd September; East Madhya Pradesh during 30th-31st August; Vidarbha on 27th August and during 29th August-1st September.
- **Isolated thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Chhattisgarh, East Madhya Pradesh and West Madhya Pradesh during 27th-31st August.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over West Madhya Pradesh on 27th August; East Madhya Pradesh during 28th-29th August and during 1st-2nd September; Chhattisgarh during 27th August-2nd September with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over East Madhya Pradesh on 27th August.

East India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Odisha and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 27th August-2nd September; Bihar during 28th-29th August.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Bihar on 27th August and during 30th August-2nd September.
- **Isolated thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 29th August-2nd September; Odisha during 28th-31st August, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 27th-29th August; Gangetic West Bengal and Jharkhand during 27th-31st August; Bihar during 27th August-2nd September; Odisha on 27th August.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 27th-28th August; Gangetic West Bengal on 27th August and during 29th-31st August; Jharkhand during 27th-31st August; Bihar during 27th-30th August; Odisha during 1st-2nd September with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Odisha during 27th-31st August.
- **Thundersquall (wind speed reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph)** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 27th-28th August.
- **Moderate to severe lightning activity** likely over Jharkhand on 27th and Bihar on 28th & 29th August.

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Northeast India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 27th August-2nd September; Assam & Meghalaya during 29th-31st August.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Assam & Meghalaya during 27th-28th August and during 1st-2nd September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 27th-31st August.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh and Assam & Meghalaya during 27th-29th August and during 31st August-2nd September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 27th-31st August and on 2nd September with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Arunachal Pradesh and Assam & Meghalaya on 30th August.

West India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Konkan & Goa during 27th August-2nd September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Gujarat Region, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada and Saurashtra & Kutch during 27th August-2nd September.

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, North Interior Karnataka, Rayalaseema, South Interior Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Telangana during 27th August-2nd September; Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep during 31st August-2nd September.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep during 27th-30th August; Coastal Karnataka during 27th August-2nd September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 27th-28th August; North Interior Karnataka during 27th-29th August; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 27th-31st August, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over South Interior Karnataka during 27th-29th August; Telangana on 27th August.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Kerala & Mahe on 27th August.
- Strong Surface Winds likely over North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka during 27th-29th August; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 27th-31st August.

Fishermen Warning:

- **Arabian Sea:** Along and off Somalia and Oman coasts, over many parts of westcentral and some parts of southwest Arabian Sea till 01st September.
- **Bay of Bengal:** Off south Tamil Nadu coast, Gulf of Mannar adjoining Comorin area and some parts of southwest Bay of Bengal adjoining south Sri Lanka coast and over Andaman Sea till 01st September; Along and off West Bengal, North Odisha adjoining northwest Bay of Bengal during 30th August to 01st September; over some parts of central Bay of Bengal on 30th August; and over some parts of central & southeast Bay of Bengal on 31st August.

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today): **at most places** over Konkan & Goa, Vidarbha and Kerala & Mahe; **at many places** over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Gangetic West Bengal, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand and Lakshadweep; **at a few places** over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, Himachal Pradesh, East Rajasthan, Madhya Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam; **at isolated places** over Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Rajasthan, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Marathwada, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal; **Dry** over rest of the country.

❖ **Heavy Rainfall observed** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today): **Heavy to very heavy rain** at isolated places over East Uttar Pradesh and West Uttar Pradesh. **Heavy rain** at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Uttarakhand, Punjab, East Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Kerala & Mahe.

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 27-08-2026): markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at few places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh and Himachal Pradesh. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at many places over Punjab; at few places over East Madhya Pradesh and Saurashtra & Kutch; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Madhya Maharashtra, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Himachal Pradesh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Lakshadweep; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Jharkhand, Punjab, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, Gujarat Region, Konkan & Goa, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Coastal Karnataka; at isolated places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Marathwada, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh, Telangana, North Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Vidarbha, Telangana, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Coastal Karnataka; at most places over Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Chhattisgarh, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Jharkhand, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, West Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Himachal Pradesh. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 18.0°C was reported at HALFLONG (ASSAM) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 26-08-2026): markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at most places over Arunachal Pradesh and Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad; at few places over Assam & Meghalaya and Himachal Pradesh; at isolated places over West Rajasthan. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura; at isolated places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Punjab and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at few places over Uttarakhand; at isolated places over Odisha, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi and Saurashtra & Kutch. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Konkan & Goa and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam; at few places

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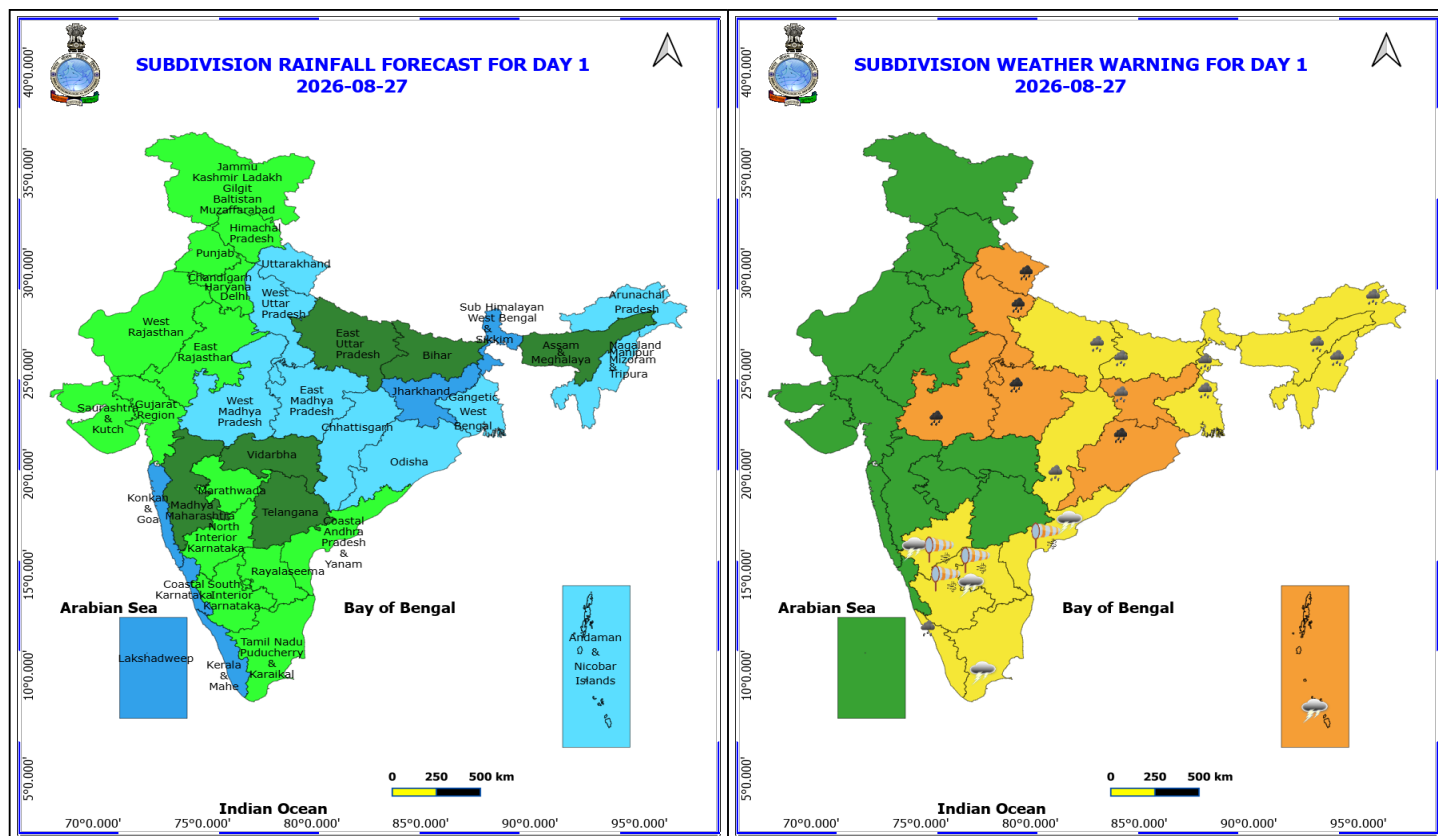
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over Gangetic West Bengal; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands. **The highest maximum temperature** of 41.0°C was reported at SRIGANGANAGAR (RAJASTHAN).

Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0830 hours IST)

- The **Low-Pressure Area** over southeast Uttar Pradesh & neighbourhood persisted over the same region at 0830 Hrs IST of today, the 27th August 2026. The associated cyclonic circulation extending upto 5.8 km above mean sea level tilting southwestwards with height.
- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now passes through Amritsar, Ambala, Muzaffarnagar, centre of **Low Pressure Area** over southeast Uttar Pradesh & neighbourhood, Ranchi, Digha and thence southeastwards to Northeast Bay of Bengal.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over south Bangladesh & adjoining Gangetic West Bengal lay over northwest Bay of Bengal & adjoining West Bengal-north Odisha coasts between 3.1 & 5.8 km above mean sea level titling southwestwards with height. Under its influence, a low pressure area is likely to form over the same region around 29th August, 2026.
- The upper **air cyclonic circulation** over Gujarat & neighbourhood at 3.1 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over northwest Uttar Pradesh & neighbourhood now lies over North Haryana & neighbourhood at 0.9 km above mean sea level.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Northeast Assam & neighbourhood extending upto 3.1 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Telangana & adjoining Rayalaseema now lies over south Telangana & neighbourhood at 5.8 km above mean sea level.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Konkan & adjoining Eastcentral Arabian Sea at 5.8 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **trough** from Northwest bay of Bengal to northeast Rajasthan to across Odisha, north Chhattisgarh and north Madhya Pradesh between 3.1 & 4.5 km above mean sea level has become less marked.

- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Bihar, Jharkhand, Odisha, South Interior Karnataka, Telangana and West Bengal & Sikkim.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh and Interior Karnataka.
- ❖ **Arabian Sea:** Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail along and off Somalia & Oman coasts, over some parts of westcentral adjoining some parts of southwest Arabian Sea.
- ❖ **Bay of Bengal:** Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail off south Tamil Nadu

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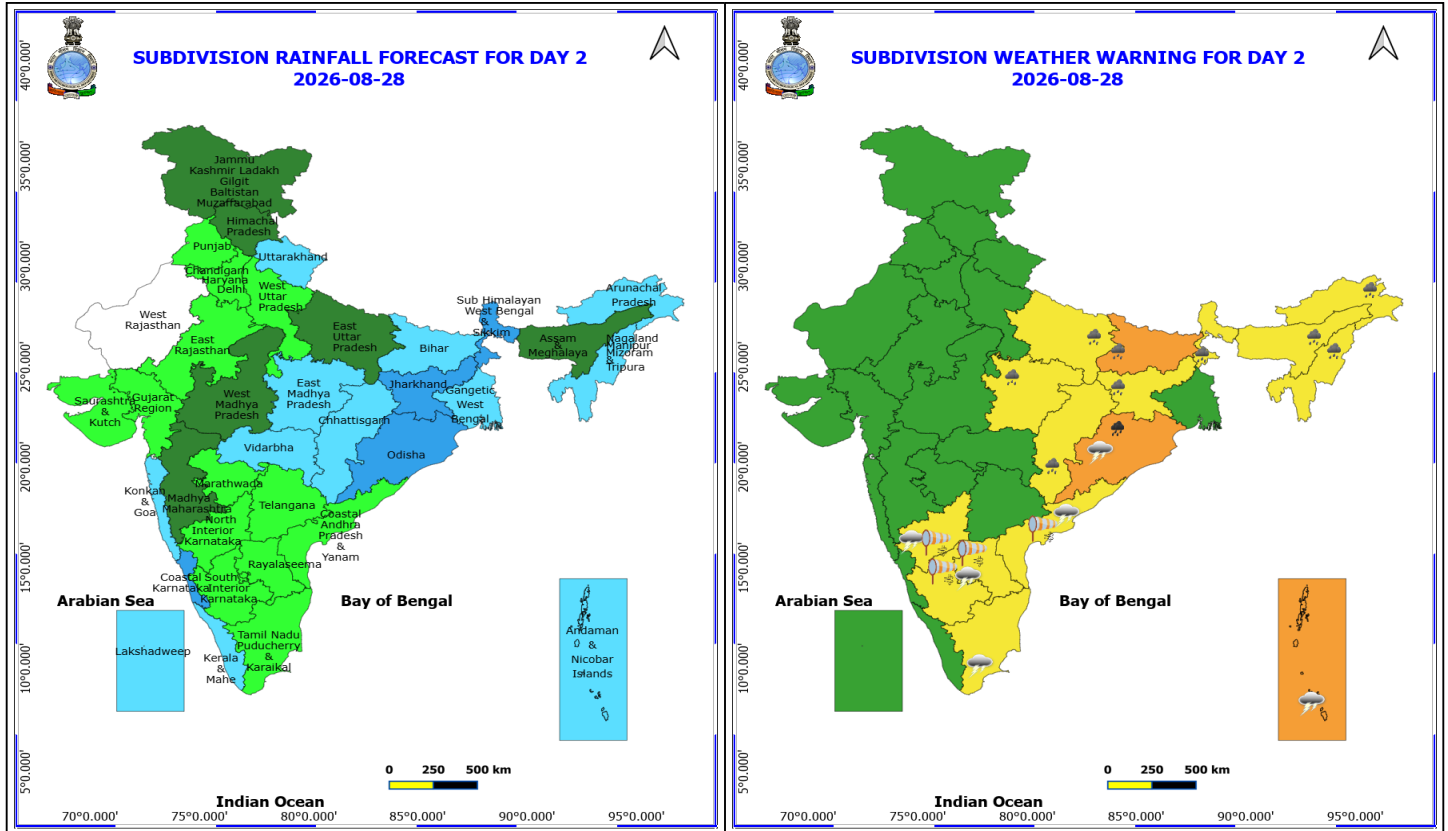

- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh and Interior Karnataka.
- ❖ **Arabian Sea:** Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail along and off Somalia & Oman coasts, over many parts of westcentral adjoining some parts of southwest and few parts of north & eastcentral Arabian Sea.

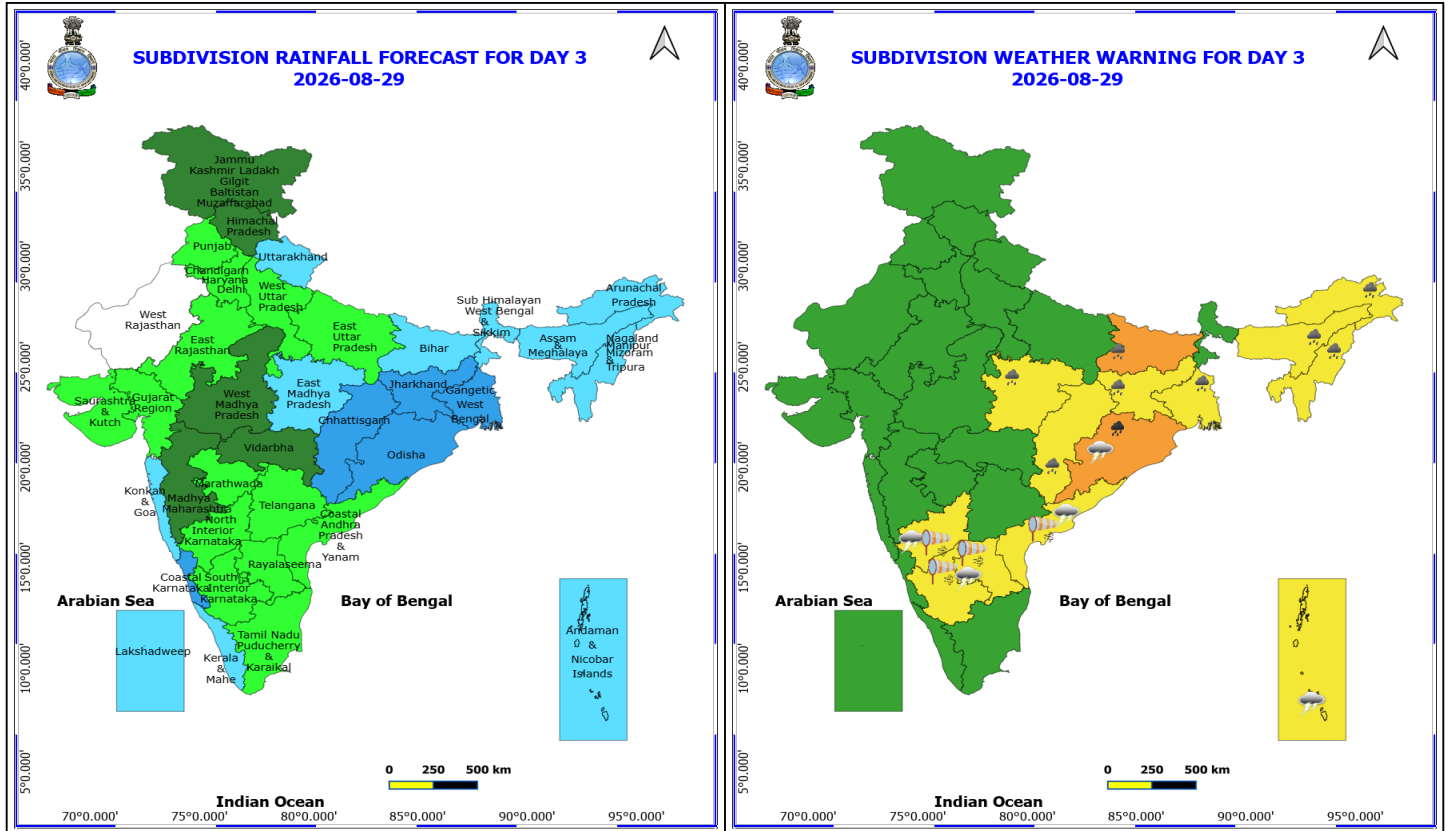

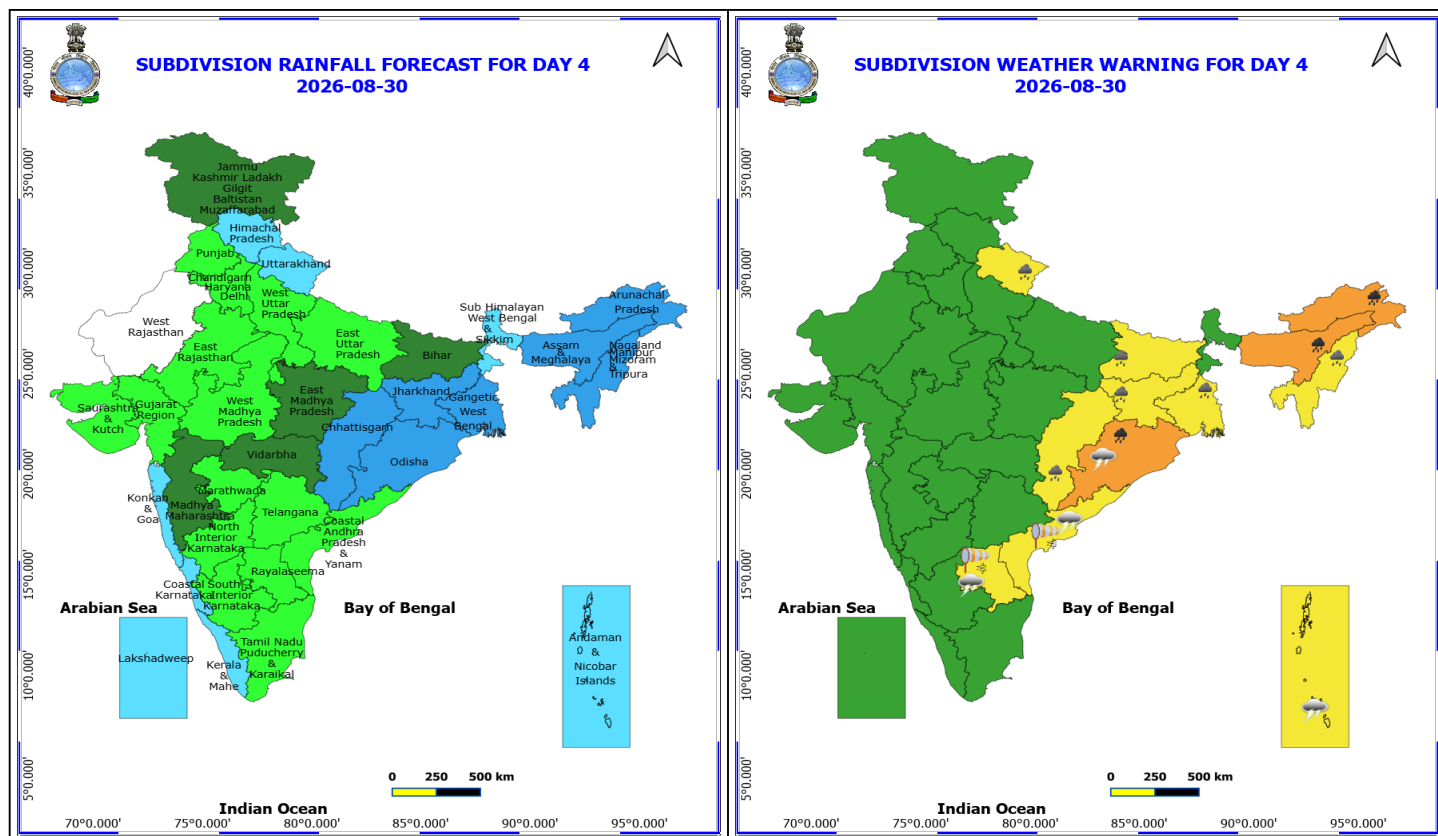

- ❖ Squally Weather with wind speed 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph is likely to prevail along and off West Bengal,

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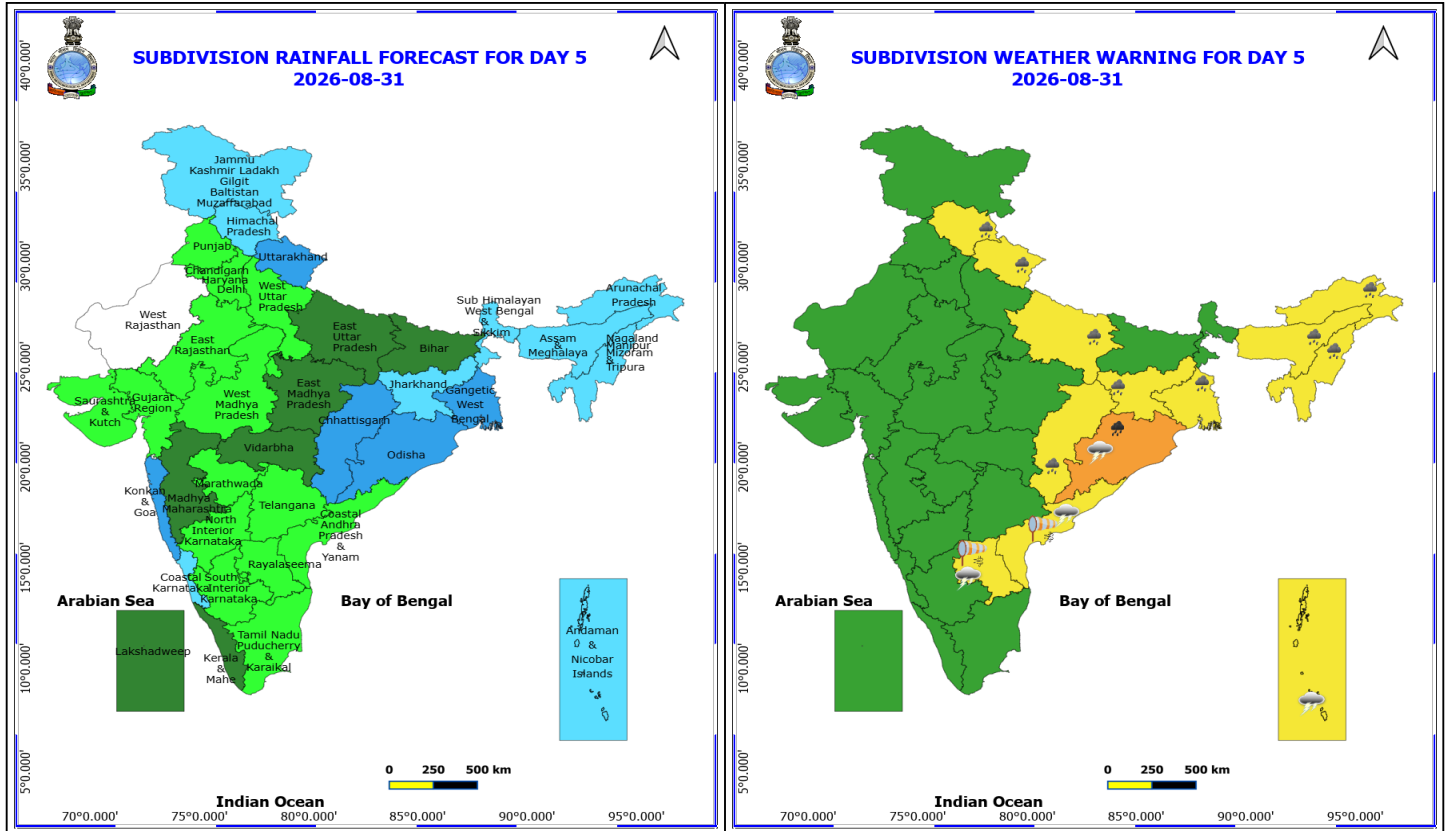

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-08-26

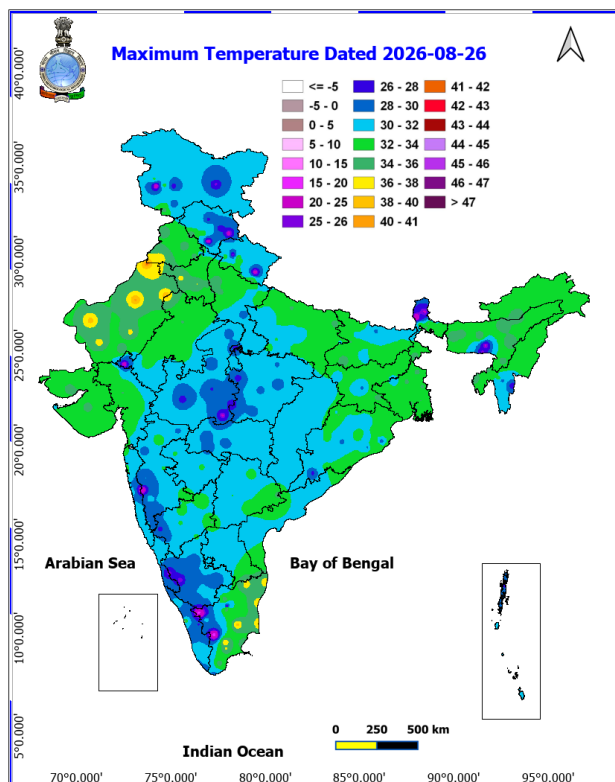


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-08-26

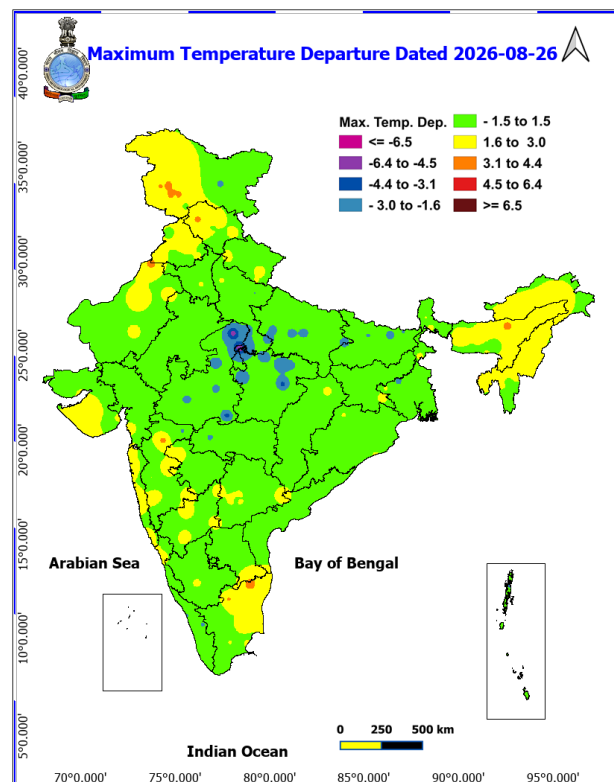


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-08-27

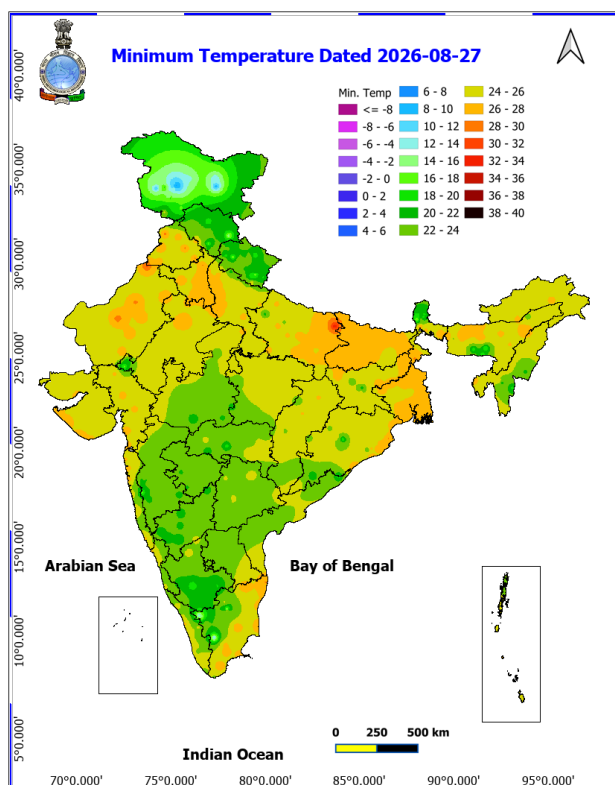
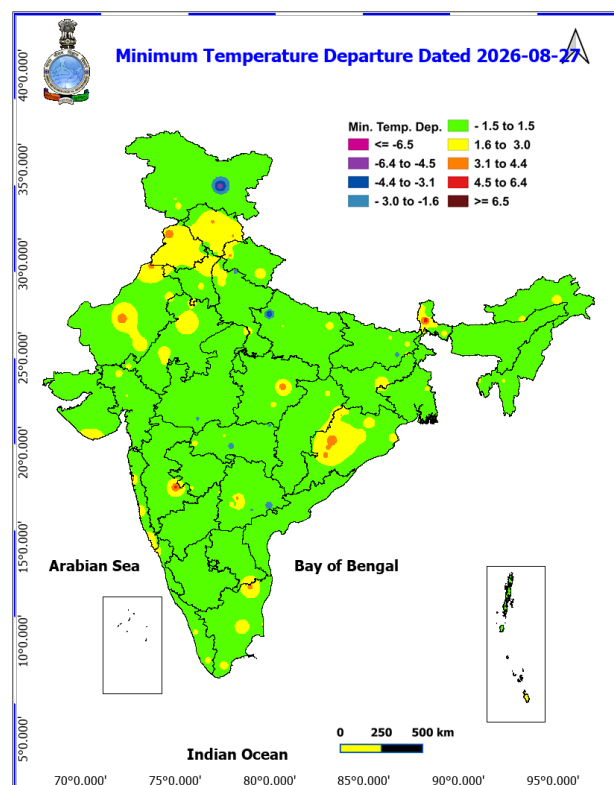
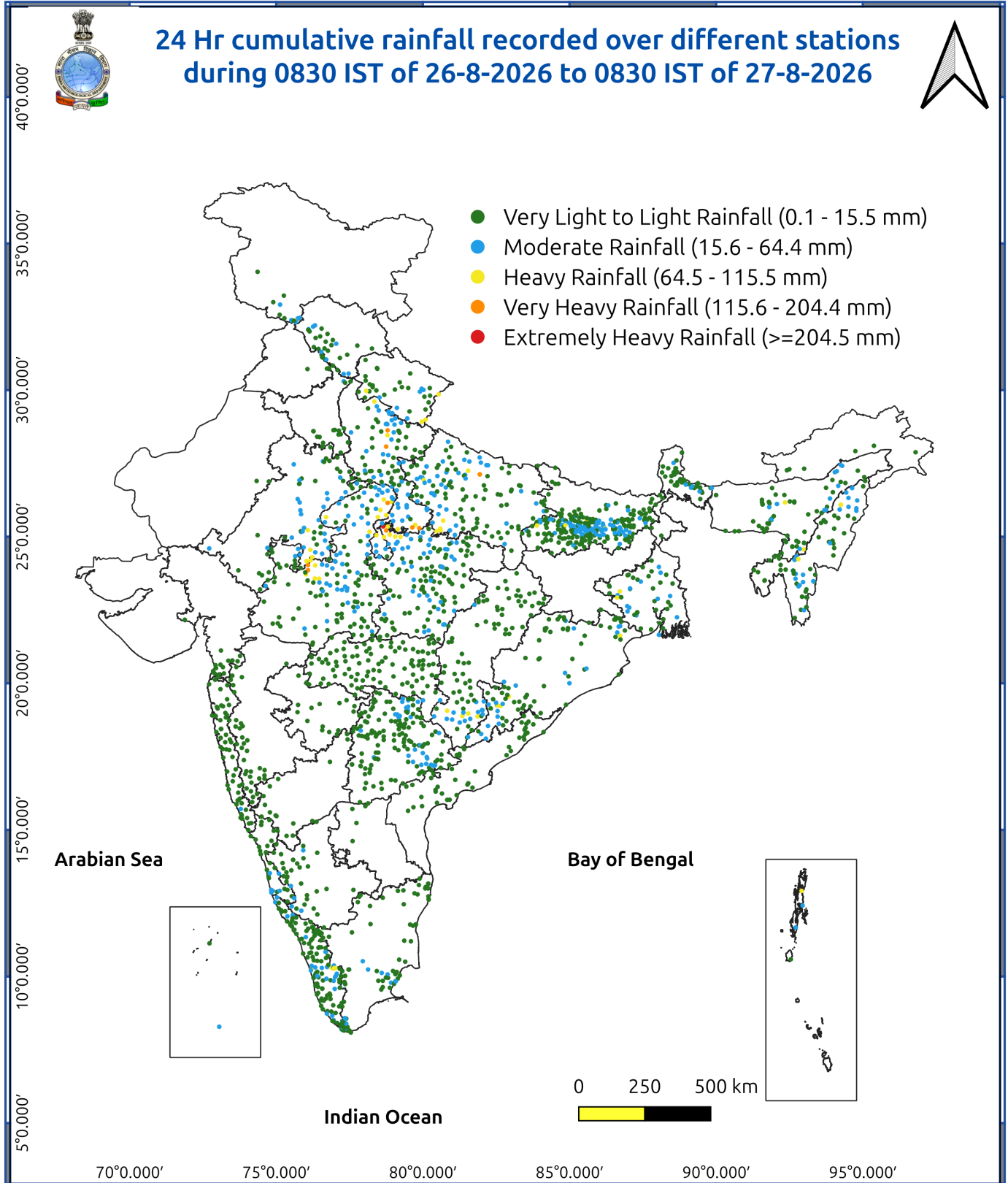


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-08-27





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to very heavy/extremely heavy rainfall:

- Isolated heavy to very heavy rainfall likely over West Uttar Pradesh & East Madhya Pradesh on 27th August.
- Moderate to severe Lightning activity at isolated places over Jharkhand 27th and Bihar on 28th & 29th August.

Impact expected:

Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of small trees like banana, papaya, drum sticks. Strong wind and rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.

Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds and rain.

Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to heavy rain.

Loose objects may fly.

Small ships, trawlers and boats may be affected.

Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain and squally winds.

There could be localised landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.

Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.

Helicopter services may get affected.

Action suggested:

People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.

Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.

In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.

Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.

Onshore and offshore activities to be judiciously regulated.

Helicopter services to be regulated.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In **Odisha**, drain excess water from rice, maize, pulses, cotton, pigeon pea, vegetables and nursery beds; keep drainage channels and outlets clear, and postpone sowing, fertilizer application and intercultural operations in waterlogged fields until the soil becomes workable.
- In **East Madhya Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in soybean, cotton, maize and sugarcane fields to prevent waterlogging; postpone vegetable transplanting and provide support to young fruit plants. Undertake propping

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in sugarcane to minimise lodging.

- In **West Uttar Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in standing crop fields and postpone irrigation, intercultural operations, fertilizer and plant-protection applications during wet conditions. Provide staking/support to young plants, vegetables and horticultural crops.
- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, maintain proper drainage in rice, maize, finger millet, soybean, cowpea, vegetables and orchards to remove excess water. Keep millet fields well drained during panicle initiation and flowering and monitor crops for pest and disease incidence.
- In **Assam and Meghalaya**, maintain proper drainage in crop fields and postpone fertilizer and plant-protection applications during rainfall. Continue sowing of pigeon pea, green gram and sesame only where field conditions are suitable and harvest jute at the small-pod stage.
- In **Nagaland**, maintain 3–5 cm water level in wet rice fields and harvest mature maize cobs during suitable weather.
- In **Manipur**, harvest colocasia and mature ginger during rain-free periods and ensure proper drainage in ginger fields.
- In **Mizoram**, prepare fields for sowing black gram, green gram, soybean, sesame and lentil after maize harvest. Ensure drainage in ginger fields and prevent water stagnation to minimise soft-rot and rhizome-rot incidence.
- In **Tripura**, maintain adequate soil moisture in Aus rice during panicle initiation and booting, while ensuring drainage in low-lying groundnut fields to prevent stagnation.
- In **Sub-Himalayan West Bengal and Sikkim**, keep drainage channels clear in rice, vegetable fields, orchards and nurseries. Protect vegetable seedlings from heavy rain, improve drainage around cucurbits and avoid nitrogen application during wet conditions.
- In **Jharkhand**, maintain proper drainage in all crops and protect vegetable seedlings from heavy rainfall. Keep harvested produce in safe, dry places and monitor rice, maize and red gram for pest and disease incidence.
- In **Bihar**, maintain proper drainage in standing crops and avoid field operations under excessively wet conditions. Maintain appropriate standing water in transplanted rice while avoiding prolonged stagnation.
- In **Uttarakhand**, avoid irrigation in rice where rainfall is adequate and maintain proper drainage in sugarcane and maize fields. Keep drainage channels clear and provide support to tall crops and vegetables to prevent lodging.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

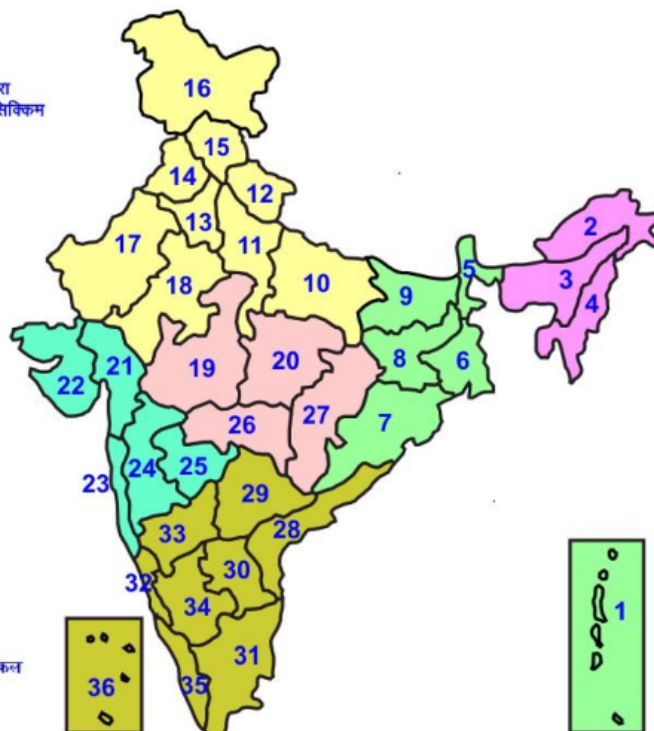
- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.
