Central India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 17th-20th July; Vidarbha during 19th-23rd July.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 21st-23rd July; Chhattisgarh and East Madhya Pradesh during 17th-23rd July; Vidarbha during 17th-18th July.
- **Isolated thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over East Madhya Pradesh and West Madhya Pradesh during 17th-21st July, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Vidarbha during 17th-18th July.
- **Isolated thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Vidarbha on 19th July; Chhattisgarh during 17th-21st July.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over East Madhya Pradesh during 17th-21st July; Vidarbha on 17th July; Chhattisgarh during 19th-21st July with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Chhattisgarh during 17th-18th July.

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 20th-22nd July; Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 17th-23rd July; Bihar during 18th-21st July; Odisha during 17th-18th July.
- **Isolated thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Gangetic West Bengal on 17th July; Jharkhand during 17th-21st July, **with gusty winds (speed reaching**

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30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph) likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Bihar during 17th-23rd July; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 17th July; Gangetic West Bengal during 18th-23rd July.

- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 18th-23rd July.

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh and Assam & Meghalaya during 21st-23rd July; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura on 23rd July.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 17th-19th July; Assam & Meghalaya during 17th-21st July.

❖ **Heavy Rainfall observed** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today): **Extremely heavy rain** at isolated places over Odisha, Chhattisgarh and Coastal Karnataka. **Heavy to very heavy rain** at a few places over Coastal Karnataka and at isolated places over Odisha, Uttarakhand, Konkan & Goa, Chhattisgarh and Kerala & Mahe. **Heavy rain** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Jharkhand, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Telangana and South Interior Karnataka.

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❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Squally/Gusty winds with speed reaching 40-60 kmph** at isolated places over Gujarat State, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, East Rajasthan, East Uttar Pradesh, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh, Konkan & Goa and Marathwada.

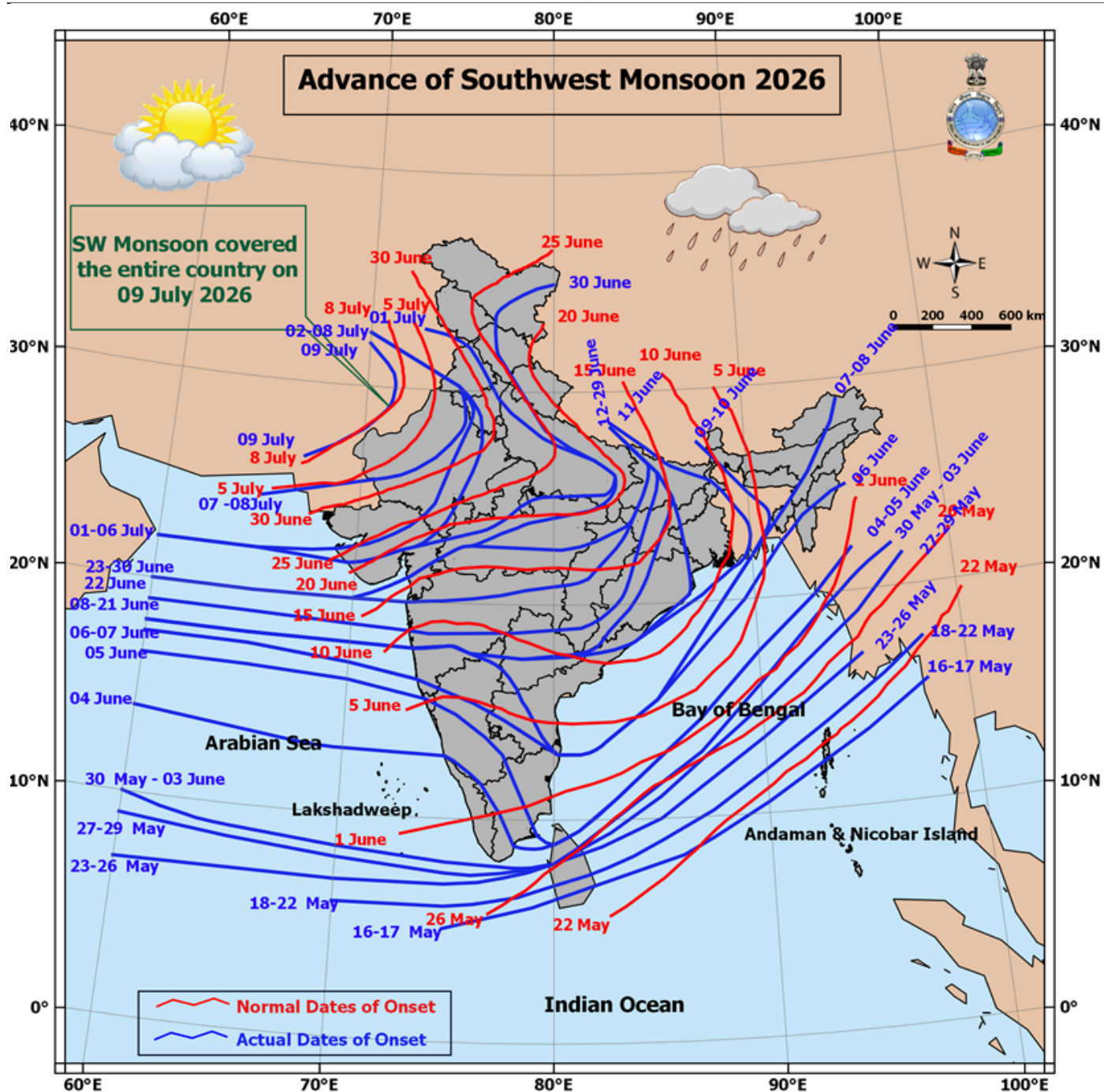
❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 17-07-2026): markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at few places over East Madhya Pradesh; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch and Vidarbha. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi and Punjab; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Odisha, Uttarakhand, Jammu-Kashmir Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, Gujarat Region, Konkan & Goa, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Rayalaseema; at few places over Arunachal Pradesh, Gangetic West Bengal, Marathwada and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Madhya Maharashtra, Telangana, North Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Coastal Karnataka; at most places over Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh and South Interior Karnataka. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 18.0°C was reported at JEUR (MAHARASHTRA) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 16-07-2026): markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at most places over Himachal Pradesh; at isolated places over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam; at most places over West Madhya Pradesh and Konkan & Goa; at few places over East Uttar Pradesh and West Uttar Pradesh. **The highest maximum temperature** of 42.0°C was reported at BHIWANI (HARYANA).



Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0830 hours IST)

- The **Low Pressure area** over North Odisha and adjoining Jharkhand & Gangetic West Bengal now lies over Gangetic West Bengal and adjoining Jharkhand & north Odisha at 0830 hrs IST of today, 17th July, 2026. The associated cyclonic circulation now extends upto 5.8 km above mean sea level tilting southwestwards with height. It is very likely to weaken gradually during next 24 hrs.
- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now passes through Amritsar, Chandigarh, Shahjahanpur, Basti, Patna, centre of Low Pressure area over Gangetic West Bengal and adjoining Jharkhand & north Odisha and thence southeastwards towards Northeast Bay of Bengal and extends upto 0.9 km above mean sea level.
- A fresh **Western Disturbance** seen as cyclonic circulation over north Pakistan & neighbourhood at 5.8 km above mean sea level with a trough aloft with its axis at 7.6 km above mean sea level runs roughly along Long. 67°E to the north of Lat. 30°N.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over north Haryana & neighbourhood persists and now lies at 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over southwest Rajasthan & neighbourhood at 3.1km above mean sea level persists.
- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over Northeast Assam & neighbourhood & extends upto 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- A **trough** runs from North Lakshadweep area to southwest Bay of Bengal across north Kerala, South Interior Karnataka and north Tamilnadu at 7.6 km above mean sea level.
- The **trough** from the cyclonic circulation associated the **Low Pressure area** to Eastcentral Arabian Sea between 5.8 & 7.6 km above mean sea level has become less marked.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a cyclonic circulation over Jammu division & neighbourhood between 4.5 & 5.8 km above mean sea level with the trough aloft has moved away northeastwards.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over East Uttar Pradesh & adjoining Bihar and extending upto 1.5 km above mean sea level has become less marked.

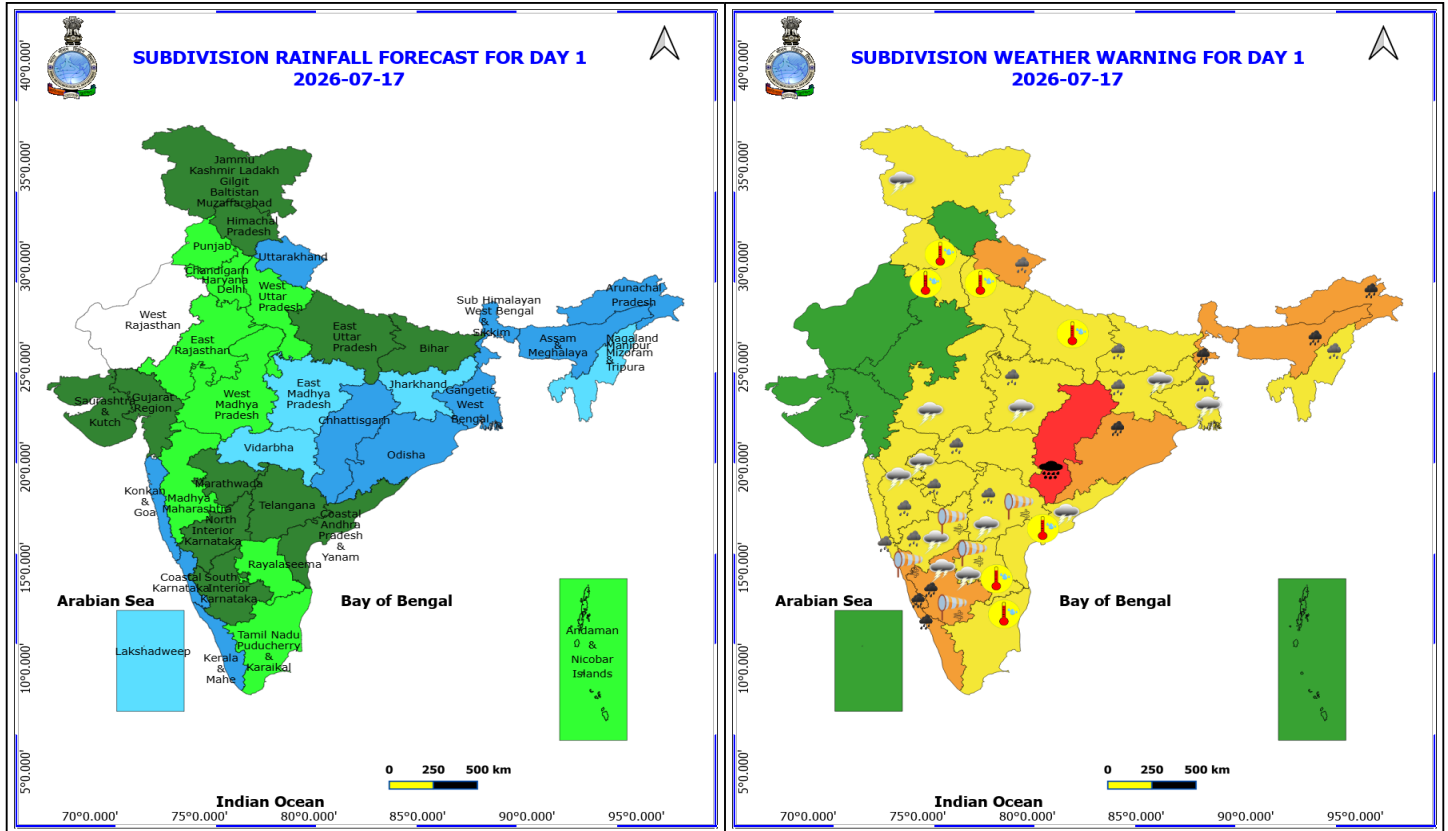


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17 July (Day 1)

- ❖ **Heavy to Very Heavy Rainfall with isolated Extremely Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Chhattisgarh.
- ❖ **Heavy to Very Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Coastal Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe, Odisha, South Interior Karnataka and Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim.
- ❖ **Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Bihar, East Madhya Pradesh, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Konkan & Goa, Maharashtra, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, North Interior Karnataka, Telangana and Uttarakhand.
- ❖ **Thundersquall with wind speed reaching(50-60kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Telangana.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(40-50kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, Gangetic West Bengal, Interior Karnataka, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Jharkhand, Madhya Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh and Marathwada.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Bihar, Coastal Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Tamil Nadu Puducherry & Karaikal and Vidarbha.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Chhattisgarh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Karnataka, Rayalaseema and Telangana.
- ❖ **Hot and Humid weather** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi,

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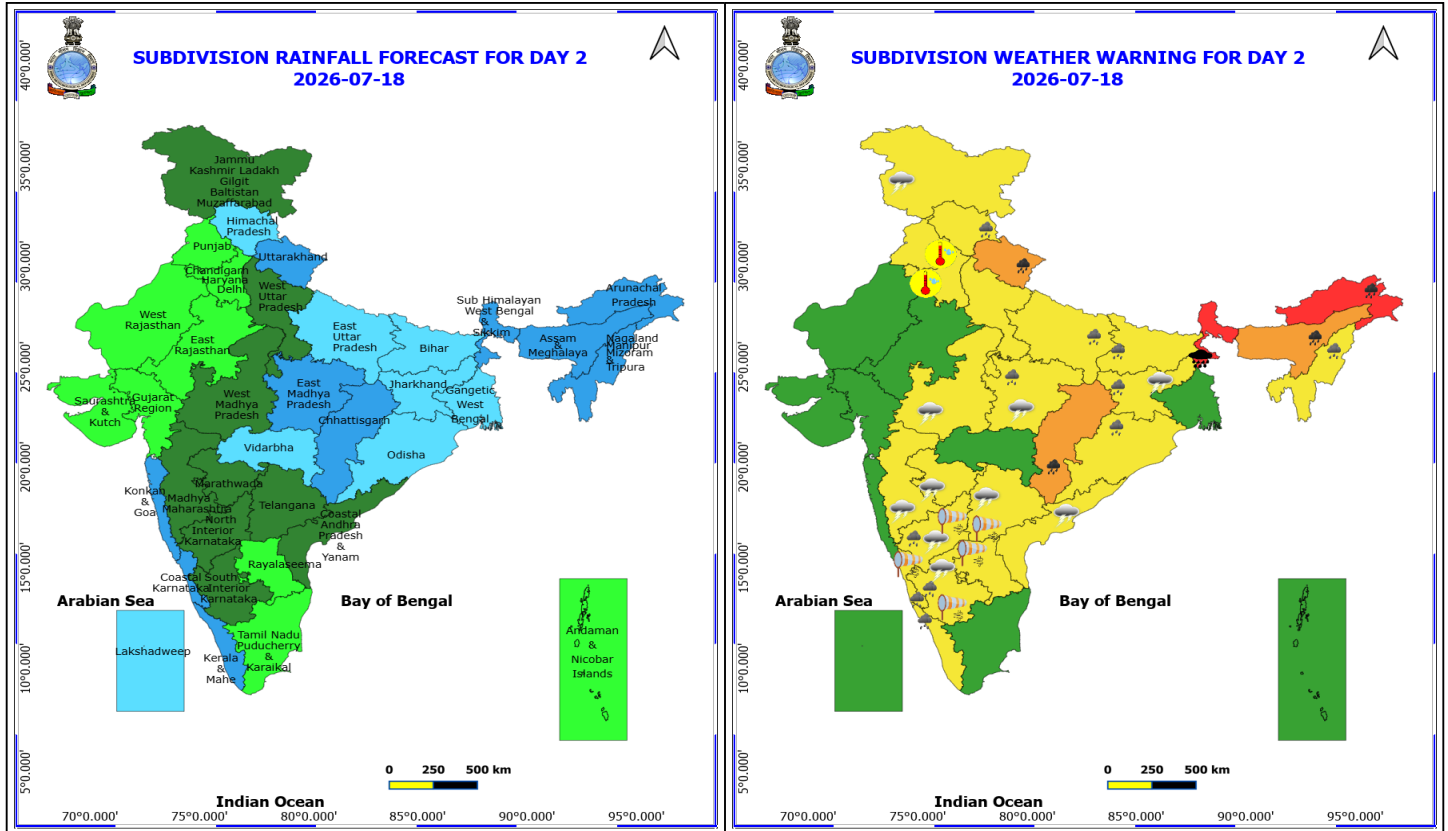
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Punjab, Tamil Nadu Puducherry & Karaikal and Uttar Pradesh.

❖ **Arabian Sea: Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph** is likely to prevail over most parts of west central adjoining few parts of east central, and some parts of south west Arabian Sea, along and off Somalia coast.

❖ **Bay of Bengal: Squally Weather with wind speed 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph** is likely to prevail along and off Odisha, Gangetic West Bengal adjoining many parts of northwest Bay of Bengal, along and off North Tamil Nadu coast adjoining some parts of southwest and few parts of west central Bay of Bengal.

- ❖ **Heavy to Very Heavy Rainfall with isolated Extremely Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim.
- ❖ **Heavy to Very Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Chhattisgarh and Uttarakhand.

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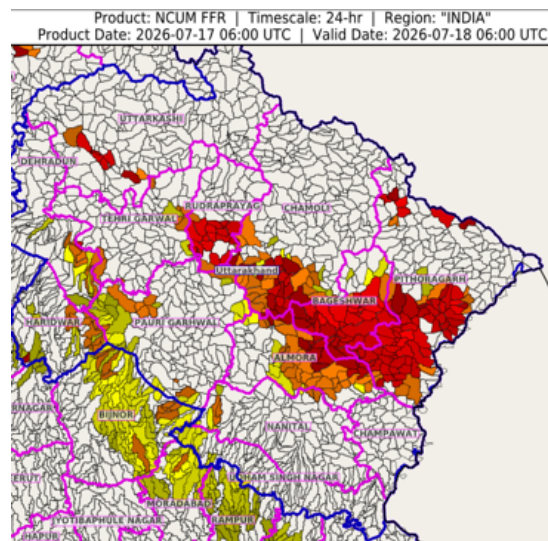

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-07-16

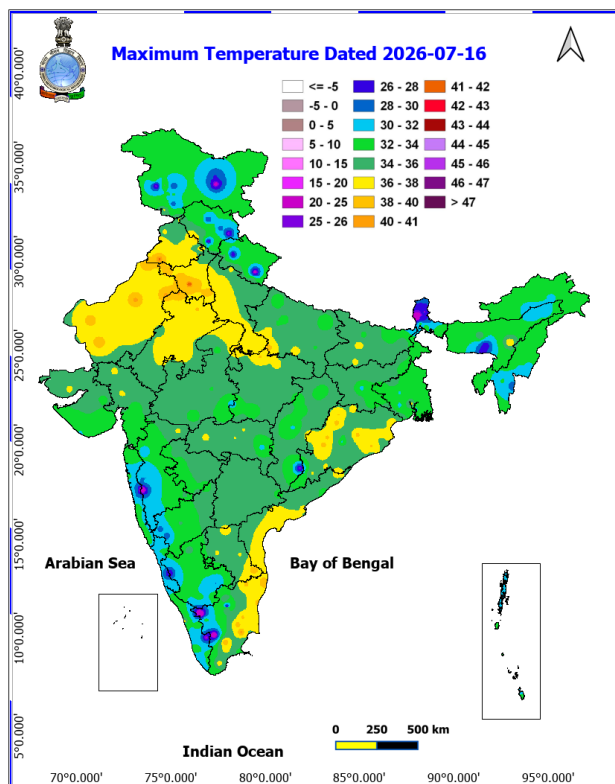


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-07-16

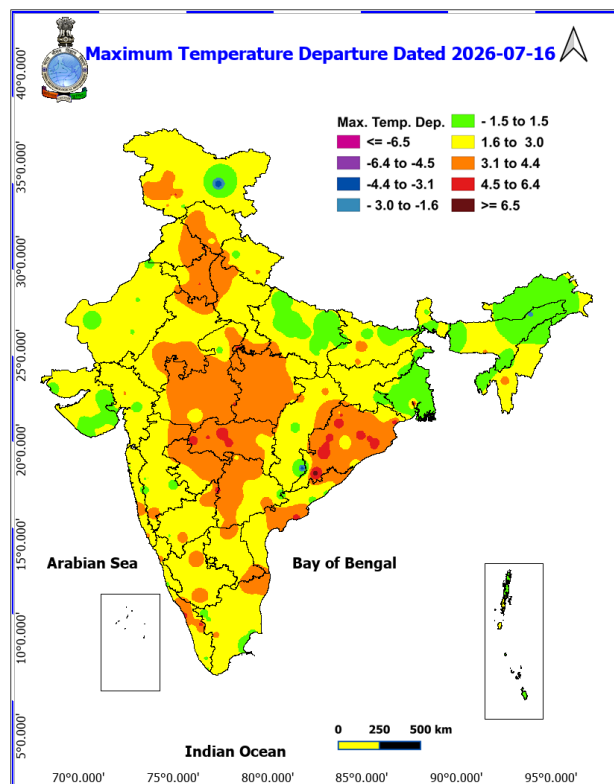


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-07-17

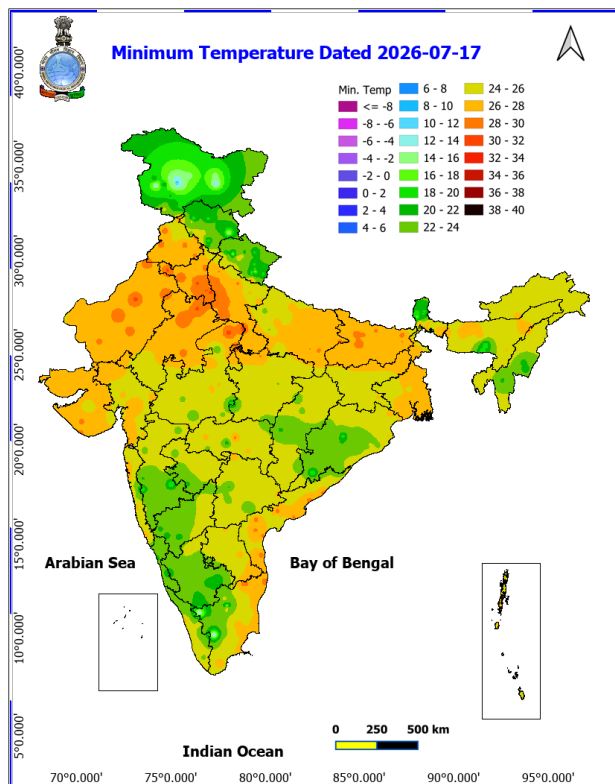
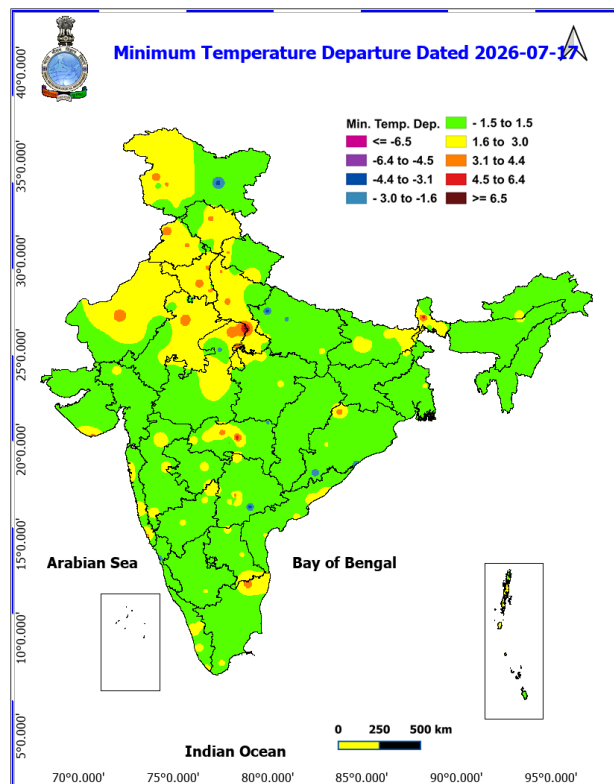
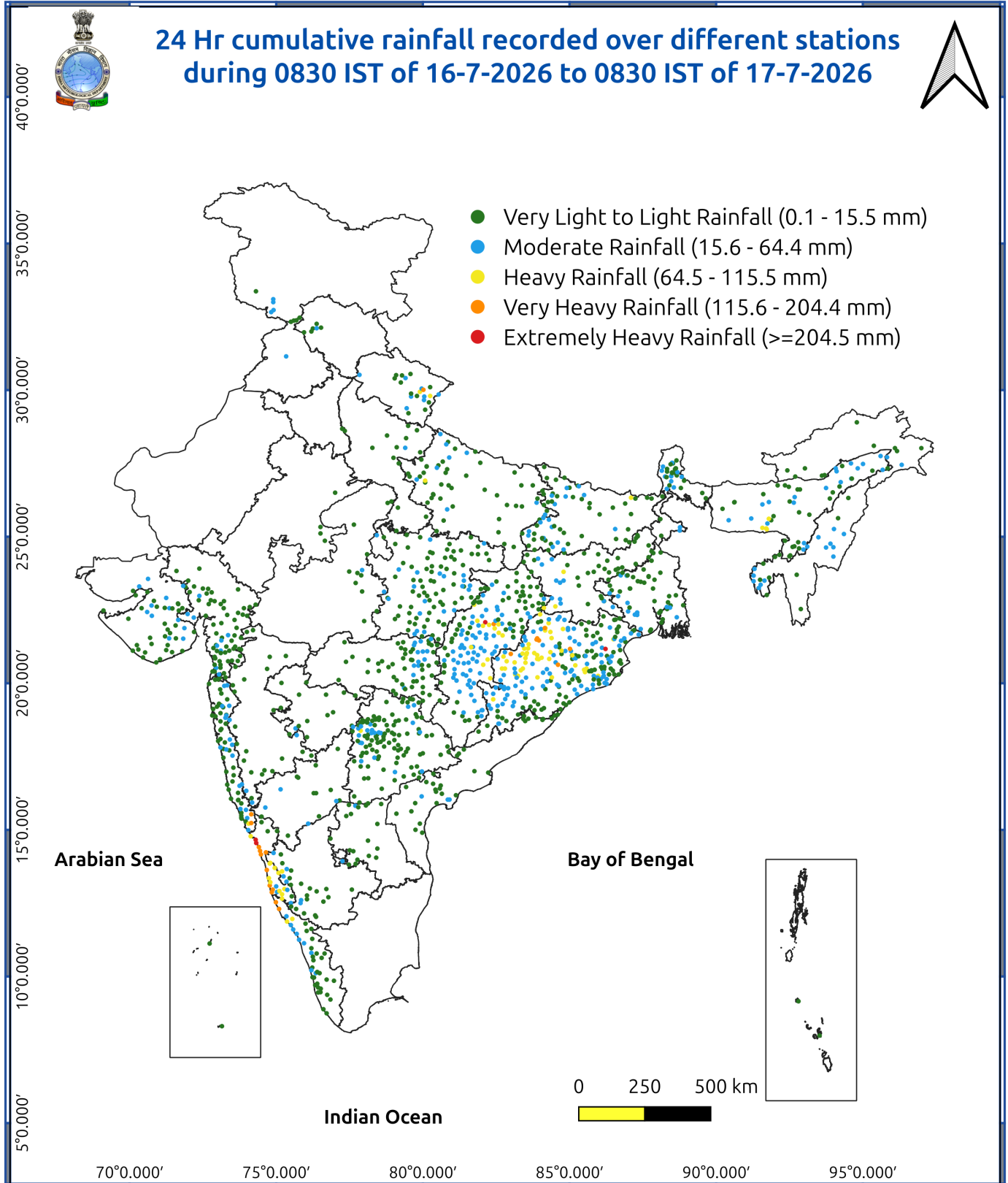


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-07-17





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected & Action Suggested due to heavy/very heavy/extremely heavy rainfall

❖ **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** at few places with extremely heavy rainfall likely at isolated places over Chhattisgarh on 17th; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 18th & 19th July.

Impact Expected

- Localized Flooding of roads, water logging in low lying areas and closure of underpasses mainly in urban areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Disruption of traffic in major cities due to water logging in roads leading to increased travel time.
- Minor damage to kutcha roads.
- Possibilities of damage to vulnerable structure.
- Localized Landslides/Mudslides/landslips/mudslips/landsinks/mudsinks.
- Damage to horticulture and standing crops in some areas due to inundation.
- It may lead to riverine flooding in some river catchments (for riverine flooding please visit Web page of CWC)

Action Suggested

- Check for traffic congestion on your route before leaving for your destination.
- Follow any traffic advisories that are issued in this regard.
- Avoid going to areas that face the water logging problems often.
- Avoid staying in vulnerable structure.

Impact expected and action suggested due to Heat wave conditions:

- **Heat wave** conditions very likely in isolated pockets over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal on 17th July.

Alert Areas

- High temperature & increased likelihood of heat illness symptoms in people who are either exposed to sun for a prolonged period or doing heavy work.
- High health concern for vulnerable people e.g. infants, elderly, people with chronic diseases.
- Avoid heat exposure— keep cool. Avoid dehydration.
- Drink sufficient water- even if not thirsty.
- Use ORS, homemade drinks like lassi, torani (rice water), lemon water, buttermilk, etc. to keep yourself hydrated.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In **Assam**, maintain continuous and effective drainage of excess rainwater from sugarcane, soybean, pigeon pea, jute, sesame fields and fruit orchards to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Harvest mature crops wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Meghalaya**, maintain effective drainage in rice nursery beds and fields of maize, cowpea, okra and ginger. Strengthen nursery bunds and field channels to prevent runoff, seedling washout and waterlogging.
- In **Chhattisgarh**, maintain continuous drainage in rice nurseries and standing fields of maize, soybean, pigeon pea and minor millets to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.
- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, ensure continuous drainage of excess rainwater from rice, maize, soybean and finger

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millet fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging.

- In **Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura** ensure continuous and effective drainage and remove any accumulated rainwater from soybean, black gram, ginger, turmeric, cole crop and vegetable fields to prevent residual waterlogging.
- In **Sikkim**, ensure proper drainage in rice nurseries and standing crop fields to prevent waterlogging.
- In **West Bengal**, ensure continuous and effective drainage in rice nurseries, jute, ginger and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Inspect and strengthen bunds around rice nurseries and harvest mature tea leaves and vegetables wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Jharkhand**, ensure proper drainage in standing crop fields to prevent waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.
- In **Bihar**, ensure continuous drainage in rice, maize, sesame and pigeon pea fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.
- In **Odisha**, maintain continuous drainage and keep field channels clear to prevent prolonged waterlogging in rice, maize, pulses, oilseed and vegetable fields. Strengthen field bunds and postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions become suitable.
- In **Uttarakhand**, postpone sowing of groundnut, soybean and maize. Ensure proper drainage in rice, tomato and chilli fields to prevent waterlogging. Harvest mature tomato only during rain-free periods and continue rice transplanting wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Himachal Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in maize, finger millet, cucurbit, tomato and capsicum fields to prevent waterlogging. Harvest mature crops wherever field conditions permit.
- In **East Uttar Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in rice, maize, sesame and pigeon pea fields to prevent waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.
- In **Keralam**, provide adequate drainage facilities in banana, coconut, cardamom, ginger, black pepper and vegetables. Provide staking support in banana plants and strengthen the pandals of vegetable crops. Avoid transplanting of rice during heavy rain.
- In **Karnataka**, ensure proper drainage in rice seedbeds, rice fields and fruit orchards fields of maize and ginger and plantations of arecanut and coconut to prevent water stagnation.
- In the regions expecting heavy rainfall, including **Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Vidarbha and Telangana** withhold irrigation in standing crops, make necessary arrangements to remove excess rain water from the crop fields.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

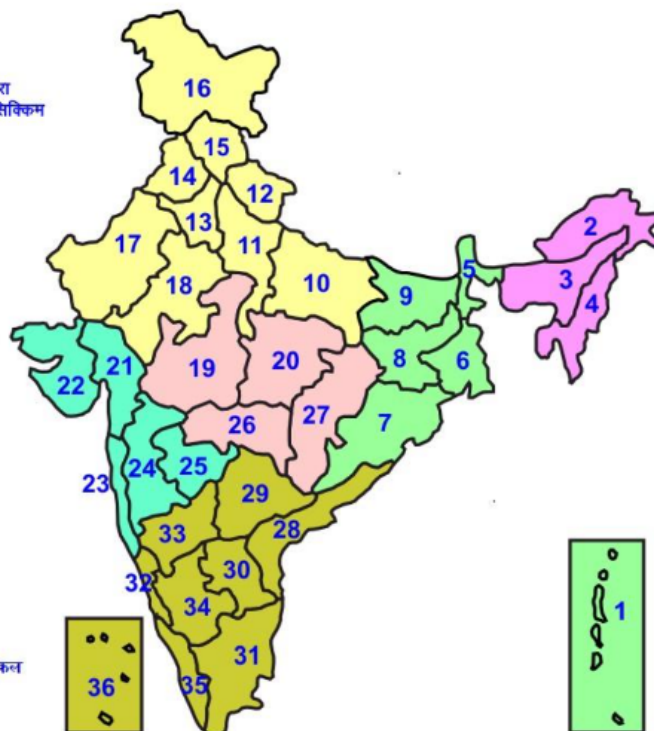
- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- In regions with high temperatures and heat wave conditions, provide clean, cool drinking water to animals, and cover the roofs of poultry sheds with grass to reduce the adverse effects of heat.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.

When maximum temperature of a station reaches $\geq 40^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\geq 30^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions
(a) Based on Departure from normal

Heat Wave: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal 4.5°C to 6.4°C .
Severe Heat Wave: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal $\geq 6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$

(b). Based on Actual maximum temperature

Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature $\geq 45^{\circ}\text{C}$.
Severe Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature $\geq 47^{\circ}\text{C}$

(c). Criteria for heat wave for coastal stations

When maximum temperature departure is $> 4.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ from normal. Heat Wave may be described provided maximum temperature $\geq 37^{\circ}\text{C}$



When maximum temperature remains 40°C

Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure 4.5°C to 6.4°C .
Severe Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure $> 6.4^{\circ}\text{C}$.



When minimum temperature of a station $\leq 10^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\leq 0^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions.

(a). Based on departure

Cold Wave: Minimum Temperature Departure from normal -4.5°C to -6.4°C .
Severe Cold Wave: Minimum Temperature Departure from normal $\leq -6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$

(b) Based on actual Minimum Temperature (for Plains only)

Cold Wave: When Minimum Temperature is $\leq 4.0^{\circ}\text{C}$
Severe Cold Wave: When Minimum Temperature is $\leq 2.0^{\circ}\text{C}$

(c) For Coastal Stations

When Minimum Temperature departure is $\leq -4.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ & actual Minimum Temperature is $\leq 15^{\circ}\text{C}$

Based on departure

Cold Day: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal -4.5°C to -6.4°C .
Severe Cold Day: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal $\leq -6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$



Phenomenon of small droplets suspended in air and the horizontal visibility $< 1\text{km}$

Moderate Fog: When the visibility between 500-200 metres
Dense Fog: when the visibility between 50-200 metres
Very Dense Fog: when the visibility < 50 metres



Sudden electrical discharges manifested by a flash of light (Lightning) and a sharp rumbling sound (thunder)



An ensemble of particles of dust or sand energetically lifted to great heights by a strong and turbulent wind.



Ice deposits on ground

Air temperature $\leq 4^{\circ}\text{C}$ (over Plains)



A strong wind that rises suddenly, lasts for at least 1 minute.

Moderate: Wind speed 52-61 kmph
Severe: Wind speed 62-87 kmph
Very Severe: Wind speed > 87 kmph



Effect of various waves in the sea over specific area

Rough to very rough: Wind speed 41-62 kmph (22-33 knots) & Wave height 2.5-6 metre
High to very high: Wind speed 63-117 kmph (34-63 knots) & Wave height 6-14 metre
Phenomenal: Wind speed > 117 kmph (> 63 knots) & Wave height > 14 metre



Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 62-87 kmph (34-47 knots)

Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 88-117 kmph (48-63 knots)
Very Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 118-165 kmph (64-89 knots)
Extremely Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 166-220 kmph (90-119 knots)
Super Cyclone Storm: Wind speed > 220 kmph (> 119 knots)

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
