Significant Weather Features

Weather Warning and Forecast

Northwest India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad during 15th-17th September; Uttarakhand during 12th-14th September.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi and Punjab during 16th-17th September; East Rajasthan during 13th-14th September.

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 15th-18th September; East Madhya Pradesh and Vidarbha during 14th-18th September; Chhattisgarh during 16th-18th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over West Madhya Pradesh on 12th September and on 14th September; Chhattisgarh and East Madhya Pradesh on 12th September; Vidarbha on 13th September with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over West Madhya Pradesh on 13th September; Vidarbha on 12th September.

East India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 12th-18th September; Gangetic West Bengal during 12th-13th September and during 16th-18th September; Bihar during 16th-17th September; Odisha on 12th September and during 15th-16th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Gangetic West Bengal during 14th-15th September; Jharkhand during 12th-18th September; Bihar during 12th-15th September and on 18th September; Odisha during 13th-14th September and during 17th-18th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 12th-17th September; Bihar during 16th-18th September; Odisha on 12th September and during 15th-17th September.

Northeast India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 12th-17th September; Assam & Meghalaya during 12th-13th September and during 15th-16th September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 12th-14th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh on 18th September; Assam & Meghalaya on 14th September and during 17th-18th September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 15th-18th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh and Assam & Meghalaya during 12th-15th September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 12th-14th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 12th-16th September; Assam & Meghalaya during 13th-16th September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 12th-13th September with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Assam & Meghalaya on 12th September.

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West India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Konkan & Goa during 12th-18th September; Gujarat Region and Madhya Maharashtra during 12th-15th September; Marathawada during 12th-13th September; Saurashtra & Kutch during 13th-15th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Gujarat Region and Madhya Maharashtra during 16th-18th September; Marathawada during 14th-18th September; Saurashtra & Kutch on 12th September and during 16th-18th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Konkan & Goa during 12th-13th September; Madhya Maharashtra and Marathawada during 12th-14th September; Gujarat Region and Saurashtra & Kutch during 12th-15th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Konkan & Goa during 12th-13th September; Madhya Maharashtra on 12th September; Gujarat Region and Marathawada on 13th September; Saurashtra & Kutch on 15th September with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Madhya Maharashtra on 13th September; Marathawada on 12th September; Gujarat Region on 12th September and on 14th September; Saurashtra & Kutch during 13th-14th September.
- **Isolated extremely heavy rainfall over Gujarat region on 13th September.**

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 12th-18th September; Kerala & Mahe during 12th-13th September and during 16th-18th September; Coastal Karnataka on 13th September and on 15th September; North Interior Karnataka during 12th-13th September and during 15th-18th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, South Interior Karnataka and Telangana during 13th-18th September.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Kerala & Mahe during 14th-15th September; Lakshadweep during 12th-18th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Telangana on 12th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 12th-16th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam during 14th-16th September; Rayalaseema on 12th September, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Kerala & Mahe during 14th-15th September; Telangana during 12th-14th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 15th-16th September; Kerala & Mahe during 14th-17th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam during 12th-13th September; Telangana on 13th September with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Telangana on 12th September.
- **Thundersquall (wind speed reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph)** likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam during 12th-13th September.

Hot & Humid weather warning:

Hot and humid weather conditions likely to prevail over Kerala & Mahe during 12th-13th September.

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today): **at most places** over Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Uttarakhand, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh; **at many places** over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Telangana; **at a few places** over East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, East Rajasthan and Lakshadweep; **at isolated places** over Punjab, West Rajasthan, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Kerala & Mahe; **Dry** over rest of the country.

❖ **Heavy Rainfall observed** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today): **Heavy to very heavy rain** at isolated places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura and Chhattisgarh. **Heavy rain** at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Himachal Pradesh and West Madhya Pradesh.

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 12-09-2026): markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at most places over Himachal Pradesh; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh and Madhya Maharashtra. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at many places over Rayalaseema; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, West Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over West Rajasthan, Gujarat Region, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Lakshadweep; at few places over West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, East Madhya Pradesh, Marathwada, Coastal Karnataka and North Interior Karnataka; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Vidarbha, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana, Rayalaseema, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Vidarbha, Telangana, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Jharkhand, Konkan & Goa, Chhattisgarh and Kerala & Mahe; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, West Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal; at isolated places over Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan and Rayalaseema. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 16.6°C was reported at YEOTMAL (MAHARASHTRA) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 11-09-2026): markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at many places over Assam & Meghalaya; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh and Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad; at few places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at most places over Himachal Pradesh; at few places over West Rajasthan; at isolated places over Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at few places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura and East Rajasthan; at isolated places over Uttarakhand, Saurashtra & Kutch and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Konkan & Goa and Kerala

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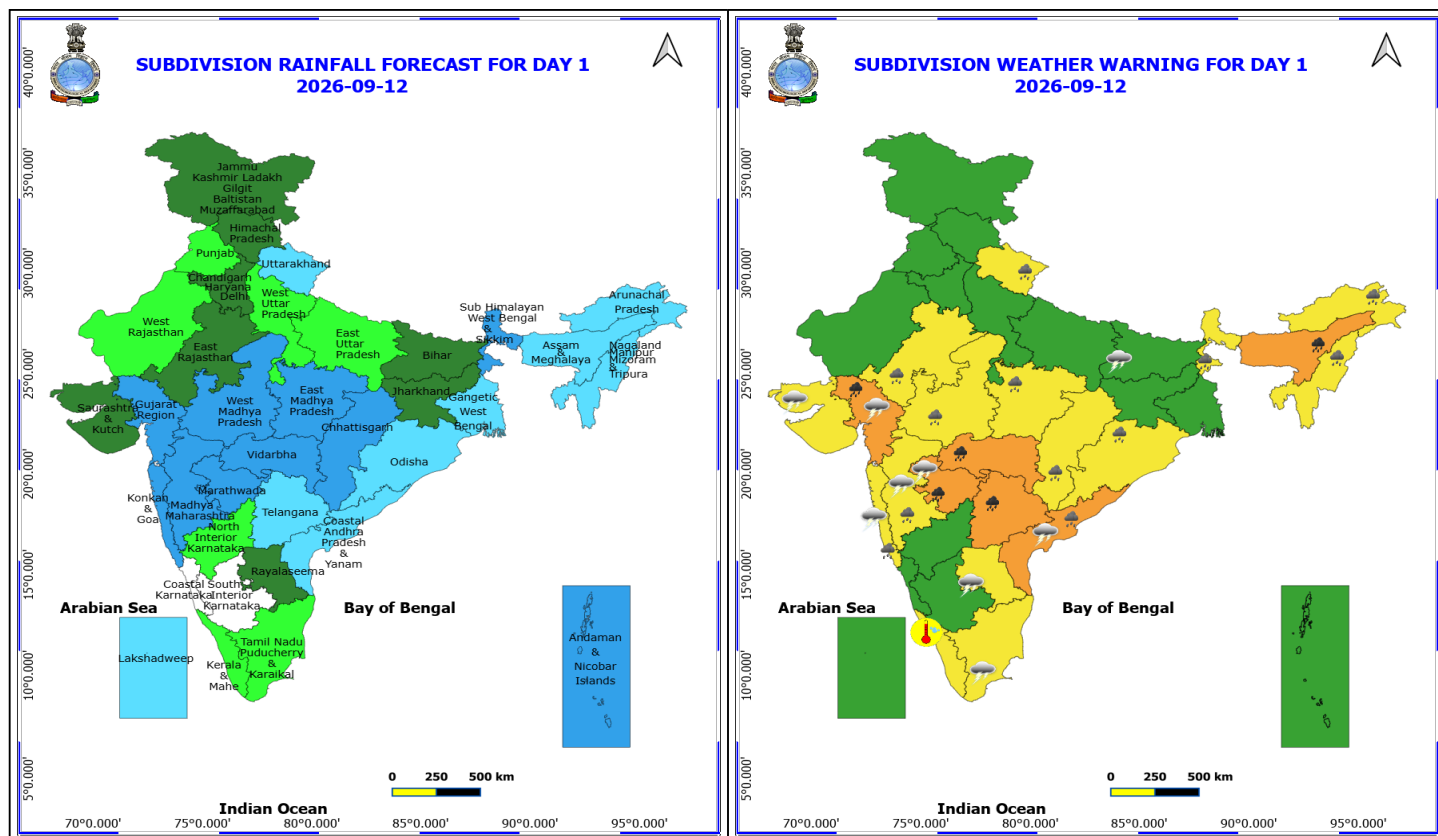
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& Mahe; at most places over Lakshadweep; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh and Rayalaseema; at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha and South Interior Karnataka. **The highest maximum temperature** of 40.0°C was reported at PILANI (RAJASTHAN).

Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0830 hours IST)

- The **Low Pressure Area** over South Chhattisgarh & neighbourhood persisted over the same region at 0830 hrs IST of today, the 12th September 2026. The associated **cyclonic circulation** extends upto 7.6 km above mean sea level tilting southwestwards with height. It is likely to move west-northwestwards across south Chhattisgarh & Vidarbha during next 24 hours.
- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now passes through Jaisalmer, Rajgarh, Betul, centre of **Low Pressure Area** over south Chhattisgarh & neighbourhood, Gopalpur and thence east southeastwards to Eastcentral Bay of Bengal and extends upto 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- The **trough** from South Interior Karnataka to Gulf of Mannar across Tamil Nadu persists and now extends upto 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over south Konkan adjoining Eastcentral Arabian sea between 3.1 & 7.6 km above mean sea level tilting southwestwards with height persists.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a cyclonic circulation over north Pakistan & adjoining Jammu between 3.1 & 4.5 km above mean sea level with a trough aloft in middle tropospheric westerlies level with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level runs roughly along Long. 70°E to the north of Lat. 30°N persists.
- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over central Assam & neighbourhood and extends upto 1.5 km above mean sea level.

- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Chhattisgarh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura and Uttarakhand.
- ❖ **Hot and Humid weather** very likely at isolated places over Kerala & Mahe.

- ❖ **Heavy Rainfall** likely at isolated places over Bihar, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Kerala & Mahe, Odisha, Punjab and Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(40-50kmph)** likely at isolated places over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Bihar.

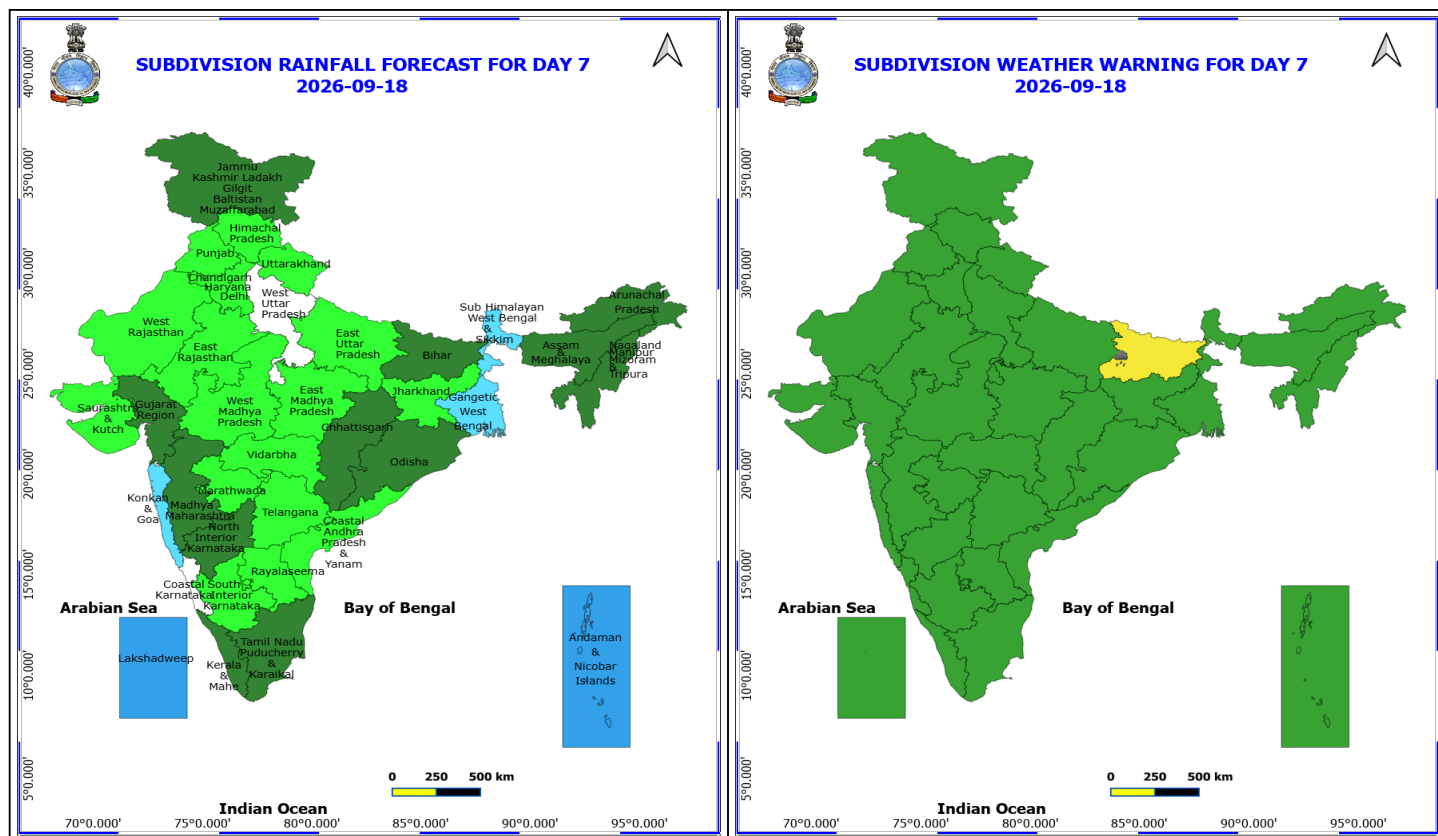

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-11

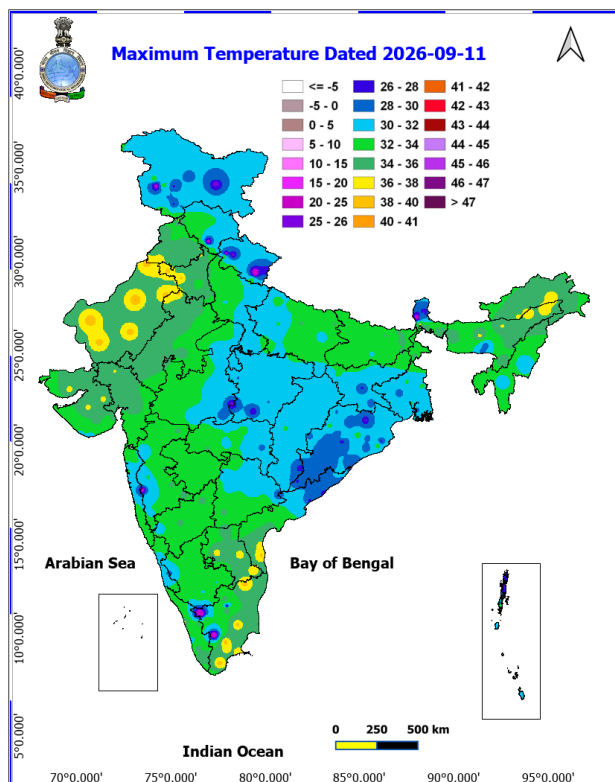


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-09-11

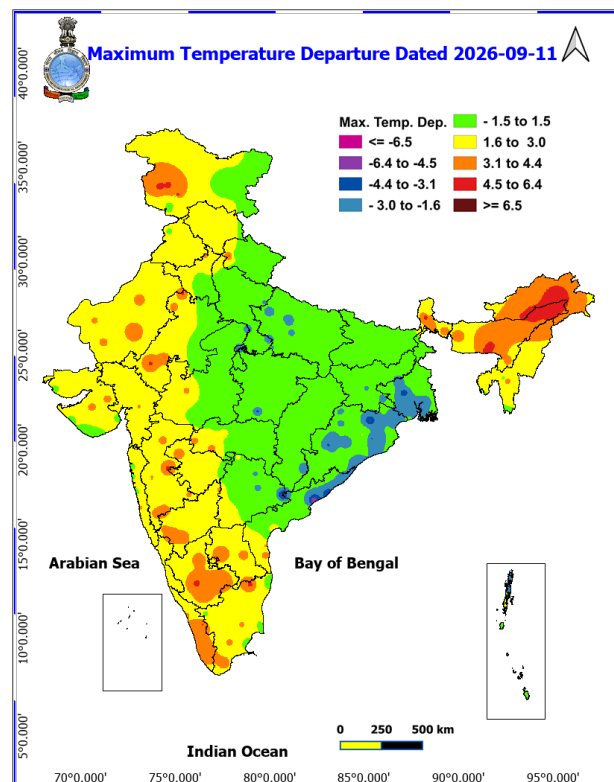


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-12

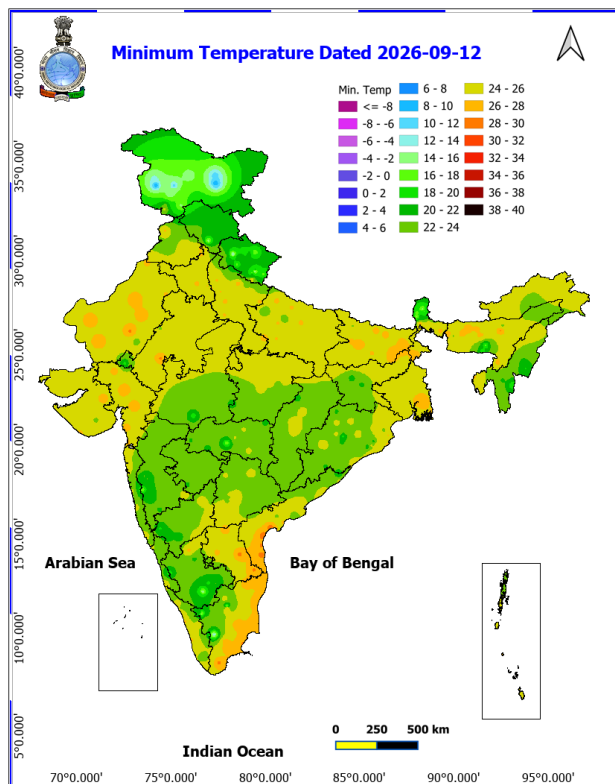
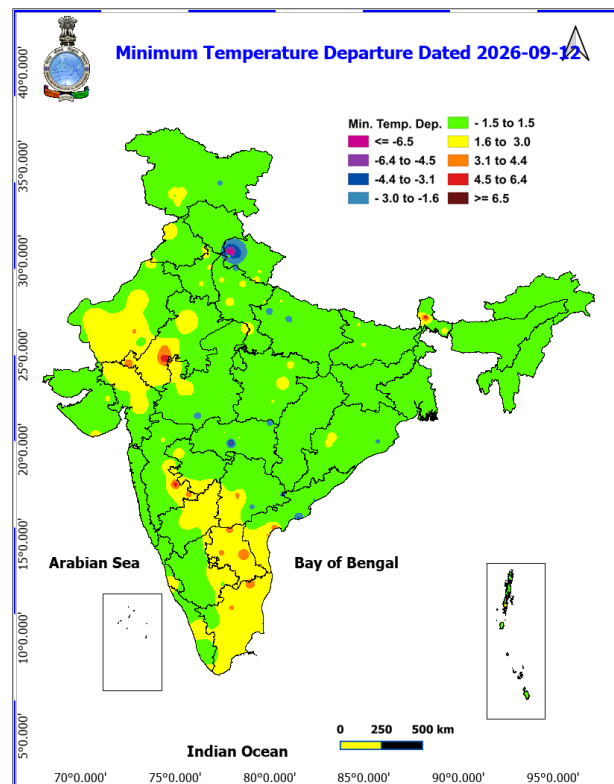
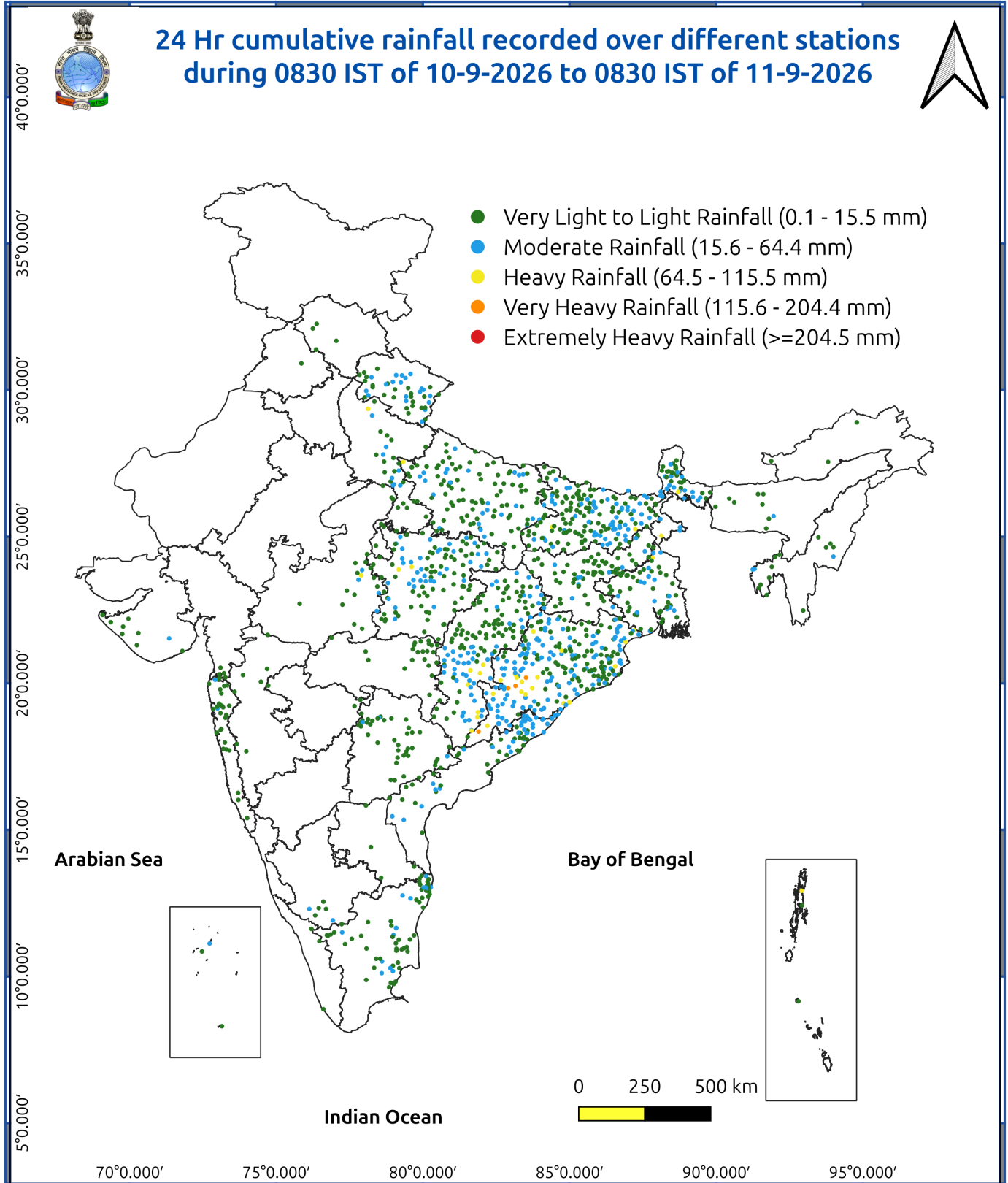


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-09-12





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to very heavy rainfall:

- Isolated heavy rainfall very likely over Odisha, Chhattisgarh, East Madhya Pradesh on 12th; Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Vidarbha, Marathwada, Telanagana, Madhya Maharashtra and Konkan on 12th & 13th; West Madhya Pradesh during 12th-14th with isolated very heavy rainfall over Vidarbha, Marathwada and Telangana on 12th; West Madhya Pradesh on 13th September.
- Isolated heavy to very heavy rainfall also likely over Gujarat Region during 12th-14th; Saurashtra & Kutch on 13th & 14th with the possibility of isolated extremely heavy rainfall over Gujarat region on 13th September 2026.
- Isolated Very Heavy rainfall over Assam & Meghalaya on 12th September 2026.

Impact expected:

- Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of small trees like banana, papaya, drum sticks. Strong wind and rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds and rain.
- Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to heavy rain.
- Loose objects may fly.
- Small ships, trawlers and boats may be affected.
- Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain and squally winds.
- There could be localised landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Helicopter services may get affected.

Action suggested:

- People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- Onshore and offshore activities to be judiciously regulated.
- Helicopter services to be regulated.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In **Odisha**, drain out excess rain water immediately in rice, maize, millets, groundnut, ginger, turmeric, vegetables, pulses and orchards and keep drainage channels clear. Do not allow water to stagnate in ginger beds and provide mechanical support or staking to vulnerable crops to minimise lodging. Continue intercultural operations only after rainfall stops and the soil becomes workable.
- In **Gujarat**, provide continuous and effective drainage to remove excess water from sugarcane, cotton, rice, pigeon pea, castor, sorghum, maize and groundnut. Prevent lodging of sugarcane by tying tall canes with dry leaves or bamboo sticks.
- In **Telangana**, provide adequate drainage in fields to drain excess water in standing crops.
- In **West Madhya Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in soybean, cotton, maize and sugarcane fields to prevent waterlogging. Provide support to vulnerable plants and undertake propping in tall sugarcane to minimize lodging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer application and plant-protection operations in saturated soil.
- In **Konkan**, make arrangement to drain out excess water from finger millet, turmeric, groundnut, sugarcane, vegetables and orchards.

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- In **Madhya Maharashtra**, harvest matured black gram and green gram and keep the harvested produce at safer places. Make arrangement to drain out excess water from finger millet, groundnut, vegetables and orchards.
- In **Marathwada**, harvest matured maize, green gram and black gram. Keep the harvested produce at safer places. Make arrangement to drain out excess water from *kharif* crops, orchard, vegetables and floricultural crops.
- In **Vidarbha**, undertake harvesting matured green gram and black gram as early as possible and keep the harvested produce at safer places. Ensure proper drainage to drain out excess water from *kharif* crops like rice, soybean, cotton, pigeon pea, maize etc. vegetable and orchards. Provide mechanical support to newly planted orchards and vegetables to prevent them from lodging.
- In **Assam**, postpone sowing of maize, black gram, green gram & sesame. Drain out excess water from already sown maize, black gram, green gram & sesame. Maintain water level in rice. Shift the harvested produce of red gram to safe places. Provide support to papaya, banana vegetables and to week stemmed crops.
- In **Meghalaya**, ensure proper drainage in rice, maize, sugarcane, soybean, pigeon pea, jute, sesame and vegetable fields and keep drainage channels clear. Provide staking/support for tall and fragile crops like banana, papaya, cucumber, bottle gourd, pumpkin, etc. to prevent lodging.
- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, maintain proper drainage in rice, maize, finger millet, soybean, cowpea, vegetables and orchards and remove excess water promptly. Provide support to vulnerable standing crops wherever required to minimise lodging.
- In **Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura**, maintain proper drainage in rice, soybean, black gram, ginger, turmeric, cole crops and vegetable fields to prevent water stagnation. Harvest mature maize, colocasia and ginger wherever field conditions permit and keep harvested produce in safe and dry places.
- In **Chhattisgarh**, drain out excess rainwater from rice, maize, groundnut, minor millets, pulses and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Keep drainage channels clear, particularly in low-lying maize, ginger and turmeric fields, and remove excess water promptly.
- In **Sub-Himalayan West Bengal and Sikkim**, maintain proper drainage in rice, vegetable fields and orchards to prevent water stagnation. Keep drainage channels clear and protect standing vegetables and horticultural crops from excess rain wherever required.
- In **Coastal Andhra Pradesh**, ensure effective drainage to drain excess rain water from rice, groundnut, maize, kodo millets, turmeric, coffee plantation, orchards and vegetables.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

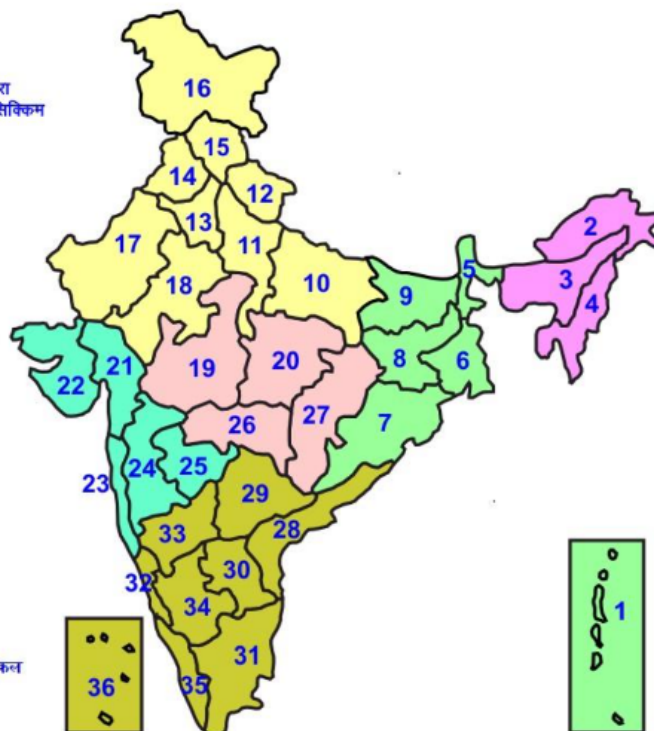
- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall for Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.
