Significant Weather Features

WEATHER FORECAST AND WARNING:

Northwest India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** light to moderate rainfall with thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30-50 kmph) likely over East Rajasthan on 01st April.
- Another fresh wet spell with **Scattered to fairly widespread** light to moderate rainfall/snowfall with isolated thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph) likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and Himachal Pradesh on 03rd & 04th April; Uttarakhand during 03rd -06th April; **Isolated to scattered** light to moderate rainfall with isolated thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30-50 kmph reaching 60 kmph) likely over Punjab, Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi, West Uttar Pradesh on 03rd & 04th April; West Rajasthan during 02nd-04th & on 06th April; East Rajasthan on 03rd, 04th & 06th April.
- **Isolated hailstorm activity** also likely over Jammu-Kashmir on 03rd and Himachal Pradesh on 03rd & 04th April.

Northeast India:

- **Fairly widespread to widespread** light to moderate rainfall with **thunderstorm, lightning gusty winds** (speed reaching 30-50 kmph) likely over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya during 01st April-04th April; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura on 01st April.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over Assam & Meghalaya on 01st April; Arunachal Pradesh on 01st, 02nd, 05th & 06th April.

East India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** light to moderate rainfall with **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds** (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph) likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 01st April -02nd April; Bihar on 06th April; Jharkhand on 01st & 04th April; Odisha during 01st April -04th April.

Central India:

- **Isolated to scattered** light to moderate rainfall **with thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds** (speed reaching 30-50 kmph) likely over Central India during next 5 days.
- **Thundersquall (wind speed reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph) with hailstorm activity** likely over Chhattisgarh and Vidarbha on 01st & 02nd April.

West India:

- **Isolated to scattered** light to moderate rainfall **with thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds** (speed reaching 30-50 gusting to 60 kmph) likely over Gujarat Region on 02nd & 03rd April; with **lightning** over Coastal Maharashtra during 01st April – 03rd April.
- **Thundersquall (wind speed reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph)** likely over Madhya Maharashtra and Marathawada during 01st April-04th April.
- **Isolated hailstorm activity** likely over Madhya Maharashtra and Marathawada on 01st April -02nd April.

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated** light to moderate rainfall **with thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds** (speed reaching 30-50 gusting to 60 kmph) likely over Rayalaseema on 04th April; Interior Karnataka and Telangana during 01st April-04th April; Kerala & Mahe on 03rd & 04th April; with **lightning** over Tamil Nadu on 03rd & 04th April; Kerala & Mahe on 01st April-02nd April and Coastal Karnataka during next 5 days.

- **Isolated hailstorm activity** likely over Telangana on 01st April.

Forecast of maximum/day temperatures:

- Gradual rise in maximum temperatures by 2-4°C likely over Northwest India till 03rd April and then, gradual fall by 2-4°C during 04th-06th April. However, it will remain normal to below normal till 06th April, 2026.
- No significant change in maximum temperatures likely over Madhya Pradesh till 01st April and gradual fall by 2-4°C during 02nd -06th April.
- Gradual fall in maximum temperatures by 2-4°C likely over Vidarbha and Chhattisgarh till 02nd April and no significant change during 03rd -06th April.
- Fall in maximum temperatures by 2-4°C likely over East India during next 24 hours and gradual rise by 3-5°C during 01st -06th April.
- No significant change in maximum temperatures likely over Gujarat State till 01st April and gradual fall by 2-3°C during 02nd -06th April.
- Gradual fall in maximum temperatures by 2-4°C likely over Maharashtra till 04th April and no significant change on 05th & 06th April.
- No significant change in maximum temperatures likely over rest parts of the country.

Main Weather Observations:

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at most places** over Assam & Meghalaya, West Uttar Pradesh, Gangetic West Bengal, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi, Punjab and Coastal Karnataka; **at many places** over East Rajasthan, West Rajasthan, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, Jharkhand, Odisha, West Madhya Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, North Interior Karnataka, East Uttar Pradesh and Telangana; **Dry** over rest of the country.

❖ **Significant rainfall recorded(in cm)** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **Assam & Meghalaya:** Dhubri (dist Dhubri) 5, Guwahati (dist Kamrup Metropolitan), Cherrapunji (dist East Khasi Hills) 2 Each; **Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura:** Agartala AP (dist West Tripura) 2; **Andaman & Nicobar Islands:** Port Blair (dist South Andaman) 1; Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi: New Delhi (safdarjung), New Delhi (palam) AP (dist South West Delhi), Hissar (dist Hisar) 1 Each; **North Interior Karnataka:** Gadag (dist Gadag) 1; **East Uttar Pradesh:** Lucknow (amausi) AP (dist Lucknow) 1; **Punjab:** Patiala (dist Patiala) 1.

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 31-03-2026):** were **markedly above normal (5.1? or more)** over East Uttar Pradesh, Bihar and East Madhya Pradesh; **appreciably above normal (3.1? to 5.0?)** over West Uttar Pradesh, Gujarat Region, southwest Madhya Pradesh; **above normal (1.6? to 3.0?)** over Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Rajasthan, Saurashtra & Kutch, Coastal Maharashtra, Madhya Maharashtra, Odisha, Jharkhand, Assam & Meghalaya, Rayalaseema; **below normal (-3.0? to -1.6?)** over Gangetic West Bengal, Marathwada, Vidarbha, Telangana, North Interior Karnataka and near normal over rest parts of the country. **The lowest minimum temperature of 15.0 °C was observed at Amritsar (Punjab) over the Plains of India.**


❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 31-03-2026):** **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Arunachal Pradesh; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand and Punjab. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at few places over Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, East Madhya Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Jharkhand, Bihar, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, Saurashtra & Kutch, Telangana and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, East Rajasthan and Rayalaseema; at most places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, West Madhya Pradesh, Coastal Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka; at few places over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Gujarat Region, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh and North Interior Karnataka; at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, Madhya Maharashtra and Marathwada. **The highest maximum temperature of 40.3°C was reported at HOSHANGABAD (Narmadapuram) (MADHYA PRADESH).**

Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Western Disturbance** as an **upper air cyclonic circulation** over North Pakistan & adjoining Jammu division at 3.1 km above mean sea level has become less marked. However, the trough in middle tropospheric levels with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level now runs roughly along Long. 80°E to the north of Lat. 28°N persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over southwest Rajasthan & neighbourhood now lies over northeast Rajasthan extending upto 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over East Bihar & neighbourhood at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **East-West trough** from **upper air cyclonic circulation** over East Bihar to Manipur across south Sub-Himalayan West Bengal, north Bangladesh, Meghalaya and southeast Assam at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **trough/Wind discontinuity** from **upper air cyclonic circulation** over East Bihar to south Tamil Nadu across east Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha, Marathwada, Interior Karnataka at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & adjoining Telangana at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Southeast Arabian Sea off Kerala coast at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over northeast Assam & neighbourhood persists and now seen upto 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- **Subtropical westerly Jet Stream** with core winds of the order of 100 knots at 12.6 km above mean sea level prevails over Northeast India.
- A fresh **Western Disturbance** is likely to affect Northwest India from 02nd April, 2026.

Weather Outlook for subsequent 3 days


- Widespread rainfall activity likely over Northeast India, Jammu & Kashmir adjoining Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Tamil Nadu and isolated rainfall activity over Uttarakhand & adjoining plains of western himalayan region, Central India, Odisha & adjoining Coastal Andhra Pradesh.

- ❖ **Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh and Assam & Meghalaya.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Hailstorm** very likely at isolated places over Chhattisgarh, Maharashtra and Telangana.
- ❖ **Thundersquall with wind speed reaching(50-60kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Chhattisgarh and Maharashtra.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(40-50kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Odisha and Telangana.

Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-03-31








Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-03-31

Impact and Actions

Impact & Action Suggested due to heavy/very heavy rainfall:

- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over Assam & Meghalaya on 01st April and Arunachal Pradesh on 01st, 02nd, 05th & 06th April.

Impact Expected

- Localized Flooding of roads, water logging in low lying areas and closure of underpasses mainly in urban areas of the above region.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Disruption of traffic in major cities due to water logging in roads leading to increased travel time.
- Minor damage to kutchha roads.
- Possibilities of damage to vulnerable structure.
- Localized Landslides/Mudslides
- Damage to horticulture and standing crops in some areas due to inundation.
- It may lead to riverine flooding in some river catchments (for riverine flooding please visit Web page of CWC).

Action Suggested

- Check for traffic congestion on your route before leaving for your destination.
- Follow any traffic advisories that are issued in this regard.
- Avoid going to areas that face the water logging problems often.
- Avoid staying in vulnerable structure.

Impact expected and action suggested due to

- **Isolated hailstorm activity** likely over Chhattisgarh, Madhya Maharashtra and Marathwada on 01st April -02nd April; Telangana on 01st April; Vidarbha on 01st & 02nd April; Jammu-Kashmir on 03rd; Himachal Pradesh on 03rd & 04th April.
- **Thundersquall (wind speed reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70kmph)** likely over Madhya Maharashtra and Marathwada during 01st April -04th April; Chhattisgarh during 01st March-02nd April and Vidarbha on 01st & 02nd April.

Impact expected:

- Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of large avenue trees. Large dead limbs blown from trees. Damage to Standing crops.
- Minor to Major damage to banana and papaya trees.
- Minor to major damage to power and communication lines due to breaking of branches.
- Strong wind/hail may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- Hail may injure people and cattle at open places.
- Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds.
- Minor damage to kutchha houses/walls and huts.
- Loose objects may fly.

Action suggested:

- People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- Stay indoors, close windows & doors and avoid travel if possible.
- Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees.
- Do not lie on concrete floors and do not lean against concrete walls.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Hailstorms

- Use hail nets or hail caps in fruit orchards and vegetable plants to protect them from mechanical damage in **Many Parts of Northwest Adjoining Central India, Odisha, Jharkhand, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh and Telangana.**
- Undertake harvesting of matured crops and fruits immediately and shift them to safer places.
- In **Jammu & Kashmir**, undertake harvesting of matured mustard during clear weather and keep the harvested produce in safe places.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In **Sub Himalayan West Bengal**, ensure proper drainage channel, and drain out excess water from fields of rice, maize, other standing crops, vegetables and orchard. Shift the harvested produce to safe places. Cover the nursery of cucurbits and Dalle khorsani with polyethylene sheets or agro-nets.
- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, undertake harvesting of cabbage, pea, mustard and late-maturing paddy varieties and digging of potatoes. Shift the harvested produce to safe places. Maintain proper drainage channels in the fields of rice, maize, other standing crops, vegetables and orchards.
- In **Assam**, drain out excess rainwater from the standing crop fields.
- In **Meghalaya**, ensure proper drainage in summer vegetable crops. Carry out staking and propping of plantation crops and protect young seedlings from heavy rainfall. Keep the harvested pods of garden peas in safer place immediately.
- In **Tripura**, make necessary arrangements to drain out excess water from the low-lying areas to prevent water logging.
- In **Kerala**, drain out excess water from the standing crops fields and orchards.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops properly and cover them to minimise the risk of displacement due to strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry

- Keep the animals inside the shed during Heavy Rainfall/Hailstorm period and provide them balanced feed. Store feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.

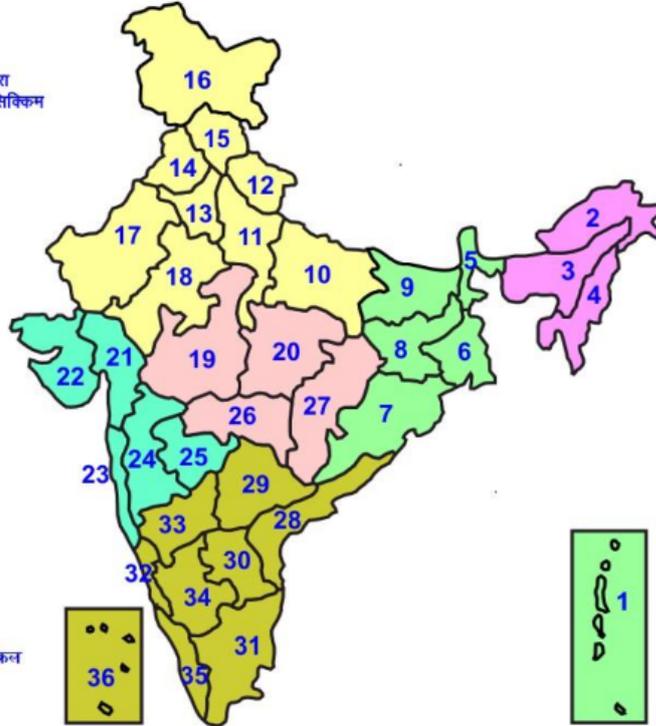
