Significant Weather Features

Weather Warning and Forecast

Northwest India:

Fairly Widespread to Widespread rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad during 15th-17th September.

Fairly Widespread to Widespread rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi and Punjab during 16th-17th September.

Isolated to Scattered rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over rest parts of northwest India.

Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Uttarakhand on 13th September; Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi and Punjab during 13th-17th September; East Rajasthan during 13th-14th September.

Central India:

Fairly Widespread to Widespread rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 13th-14th September; East Madhya Pradesh on 13th September; Vidarbha during 13th-15th September; Chhattisgarh during 13th-16th September.

Isolated to Scattered rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 15th-19th September; East Madhya Pradesh during 14th-19th September; Vidarbha during 16th-19th September; Chhattisgarh during 17th-19th September.

Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 13th-14th September; Vidarbha on 13th September.

East India:

Fairly Widespread to Widespread rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 16th-19th September; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 13th-19th September; Gangetic West Bengal on 13th September and during 16th-19th September; Bihar during 16th-17th September; Odisha during 13th-14th September.

Isolated to Scattered rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm & lightning likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 13th-15th September; Gangetic West Bengal during 14th-15th September; Jharkhand during 13th-19th September; Bihar during 13th-15th September and during 18th-19th September; Odisha during 15th-19th September.

Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 16th-19th September; Bihar during 15th-17th September; Odisha during 14th-17th September.

Northeast India:

Fairly Widespread to Widespread rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 13th-17th September.

Isolated to Scattered rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 18th-19th September.

Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 13th-17th September; Assam & Meghalaya during 13th-16th September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura on 13th September.

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Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 13th-17th September; Assam & Meghalaya during 13th-16th September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura on 13th September.

West India:

Fairly Widespread to Widespread rainfall likely over Gujarat Region, Konkan & Goa and Saurashtra & Kutch during 13th-15th September; Madhya Maharashtra and Marathawada on 13th September.

Isolated to Scattered rainfall likely over Gujarat Region, Konkan & Goa and Saurashtra & Kutch during 16th-19th September; Madhya Maharashtra and Marathawada during 14th-19th September.

Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra and Marathawada on 13th September; Gujarat Region and Saurashtra & Kutch during 13th-15th September.

Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Madhya Maharashtra on 14th September; Gujarat Region and Marathawada on 13th September; Saurashtra & Kutch on 15th September with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Konkan & Goa and Madhya Maharashtra on 13th September; Gujarat Region on 14th September; Saurashtra & Kutch during 13th-14th September.

Isolated extremely heavy rainfall likely over Gujarat Region on 13th September.

South Peninsular India:

Isolated to Scattered rainfall likely over Rayalaseema, South Interior Karnataka and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 13th-19th September; Kerala & Mahe on 13th September and during 16th-19th September; Coastal Karnataka on 13th September and on 15th September; North Interior Karnataka during 13th-14th September and during 17th-19th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Telangana during 14th-19th September.

Fairly Widespread to Widespread rainfall likely over Kerala & Mahe during 14th-15th September; Lakshadweep during 13th-19th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Telangana on 13th September.

Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 13th-17th September; South Interior Karnataka during 14th-16th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 13th-15th September, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Kerala & Mahe during 14th-16th September; Telangana during 13th-15th September.

Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 13th-16th September; Kerala & Mahe during 14th-16th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Telangana on 13th September.

Strong Surface Winds likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 13th-15th September.

Hot & Humid weather warning:

Hot and humid weather conditions likely to prevail over Kerala & Mahe on 13th September.

Fishermen Warning:

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today): **at most places** over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gujarat Region, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh and Telangana; **at many places** over Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam; **at a few places** over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Jharkhand, Uttarakhand, East Rajasthan and Konkan & Goa; **at isolated places** over Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Rajasthan, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, North Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; **Dry** over rest of the country.

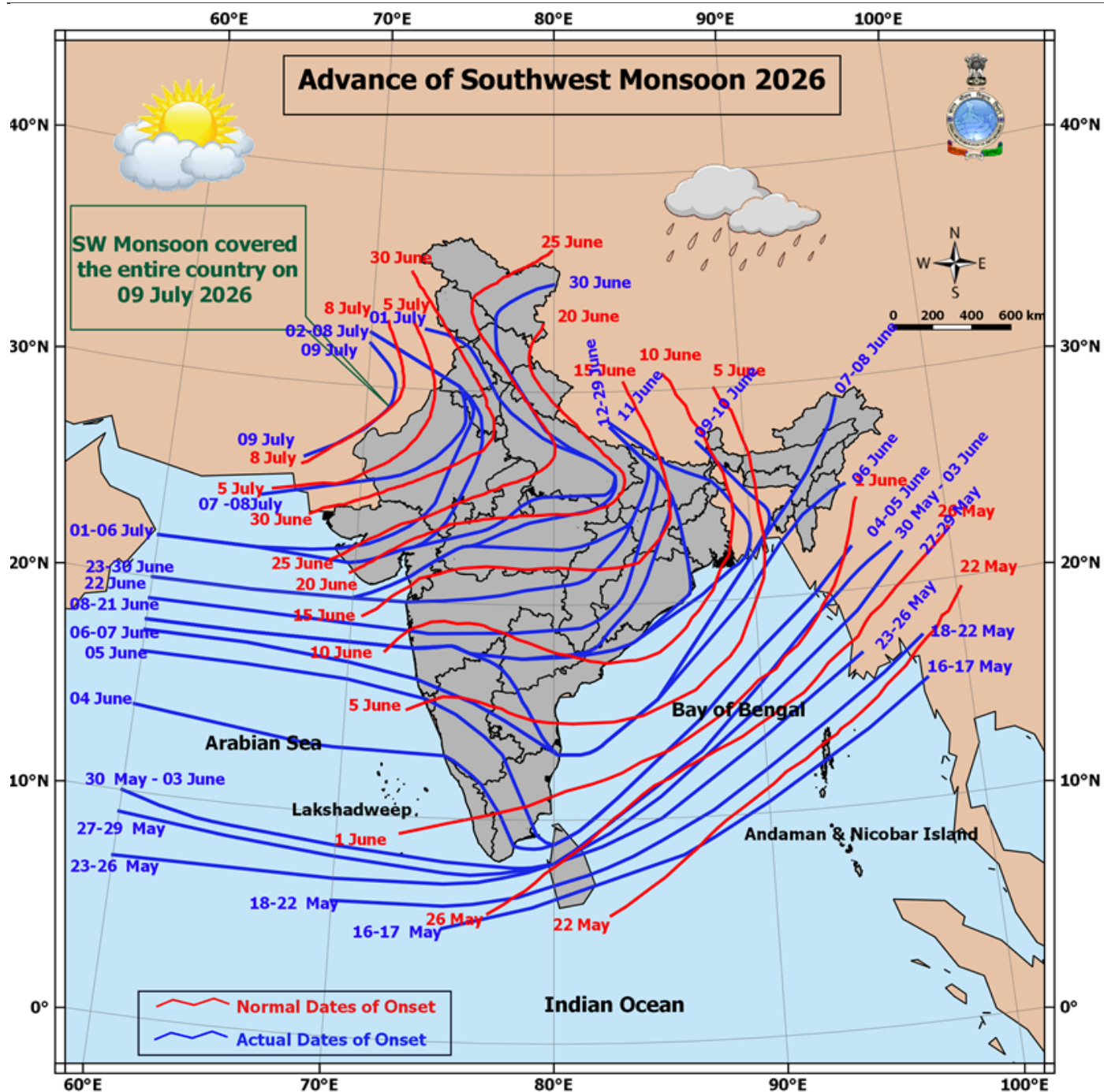
❖ **Heavy Rainfall observed** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today): **Extremely heavy rain** at isolated places over Gujarat Region. **Heavy to very heavy rain** at isolated places over Vidarbha, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal, Assam, Konkan and Telangana. **Heavy rain** at isolated places over West Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Bihar, Madhya Maharashtra, Saurashtra, Coastal Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 13-09-2026):** **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh and Saurashtra & Kutch. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Madhya Maharashtra and Rayalaseema; at isolated places over Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Lakshadweep; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Gujarat Region; at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Vidarbha, Telangana, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at most places over Arunachal Pradesh, Jharkhand, Konkan & Goa, Marathwada, Chhattisgarh, Coastal Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 17.5°C was reported at HALFLONG (ASSAM).

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 12-09-2026):** **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at most places over Himachal Pradesh. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at most places over Konkan & Goa and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal; at isolated places over Kerala & Mahe. **The highest maximum temperature** of 40.1°C was reported at BIKANER (RAJASTHAN).

Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0830 hours IST)

- The **Low Pressure Area** over north Vidarbha and adjoining Madhya Pradesh lay over southwest Madhya Pradesh and adjoining north Vidarbha at 0830 hrs IST of today, the 13th September 2026. The associated **cyclonic circulation** extends upto 7.6 km above mean sea level tilting southwestwards with height. It is likely to move west-northwestwards across southeast Rajasthan and adjoining north Gujarat during next 24 hours.
- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now passes through Jaisalmer, Kota, centre of **Low Pressure Area** over southwest Madhya Pradesh and adjoining north Vidarbha, Rajnandagaon, Bhawanipatna and thence east-southeastwards to Eastcentral Bay of Bengal and extends upto 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- The **trough** now runs from cyclonic circulation associated with **Low Pressure Area** over southwest Madhya Pradesh and adjoining north Vidarbha to gulf of Mannar across Marathwada, North Interior Karnataka, Rayalaseema & Tamil Nadu and extends upto 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over south Konkan adjoining Eastcentral Arabian sea between 3.1 & 7.6 km above mean sea level titling southwestwards with height persists.
- A **trough** runs from southwest Arabian Sea to centre of **Low Pressure Area** over southwest Madhya Pradesh and adjoining north Vidarbha across Eastcentral Arabian Sea, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra at 5.8 km above mean sea level
- The **Western Disturbance** as a cyclonic circulation over Jammu division & neighbourhood now seen as a trough in middle tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level runs roughly along Long. 73°E to the north of Lat. 30°N.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over central Assam & neighbourhood persists and now lies between 1.5 & 3.1 km above mean sea level.

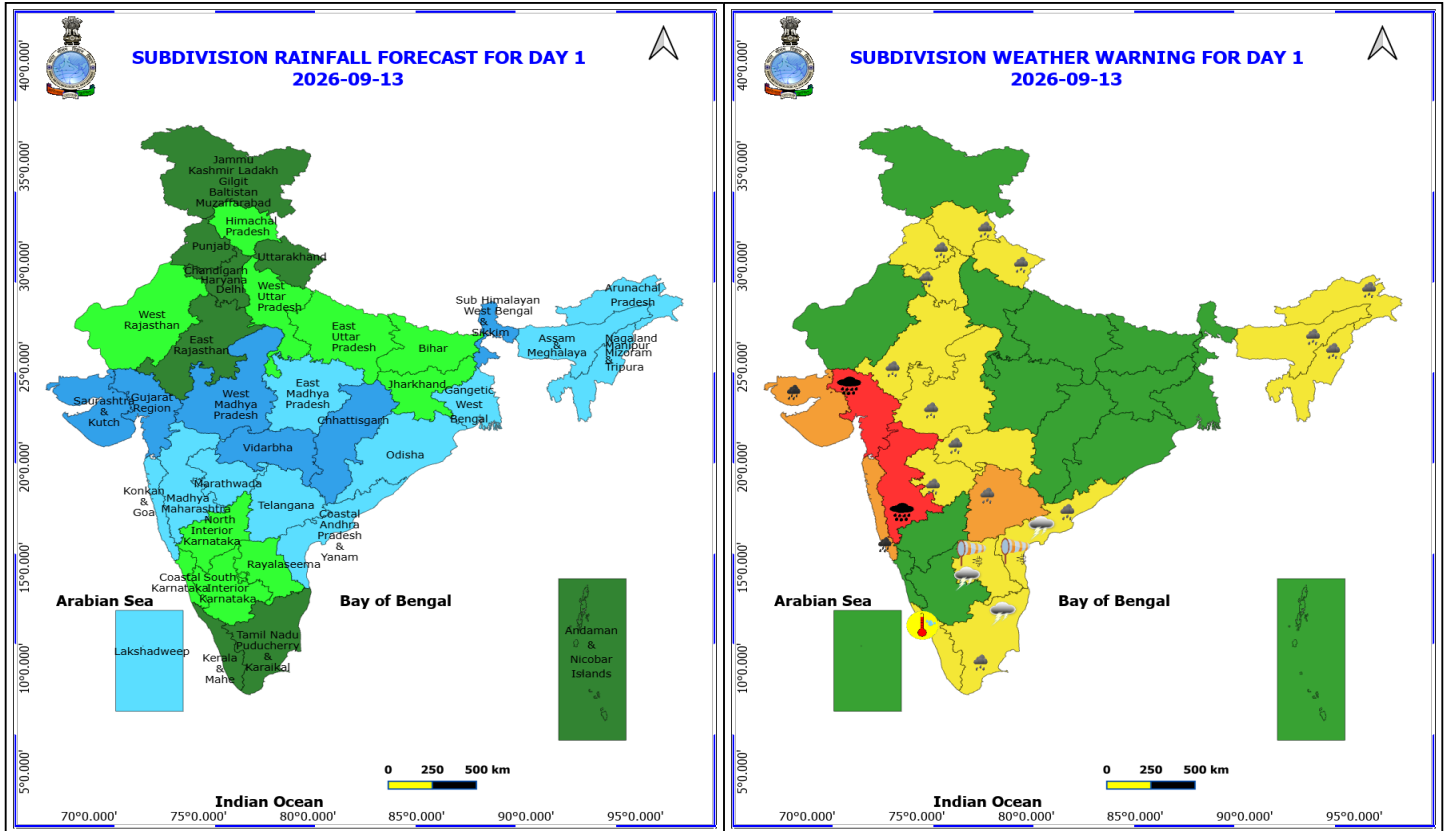

- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat State, Himachal Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, Maharashtra, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Uttarakhand and West Madhya Pradesh.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh.
- ❖ **Hot and Humid weather** very likely at isolated places over Kerala & Mahe.
- ❖ **Arabian Sea:** Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail along and off Somalia

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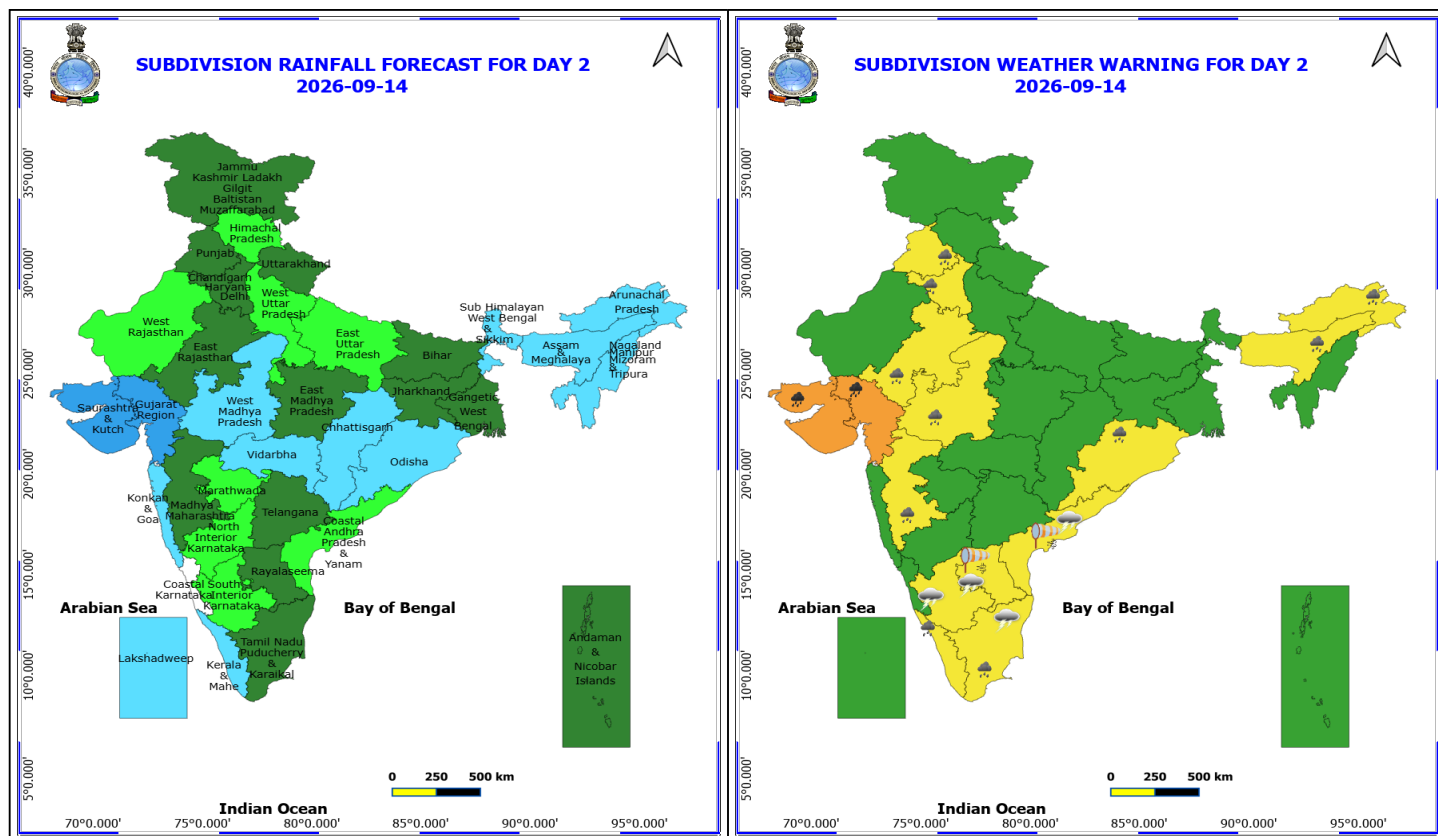

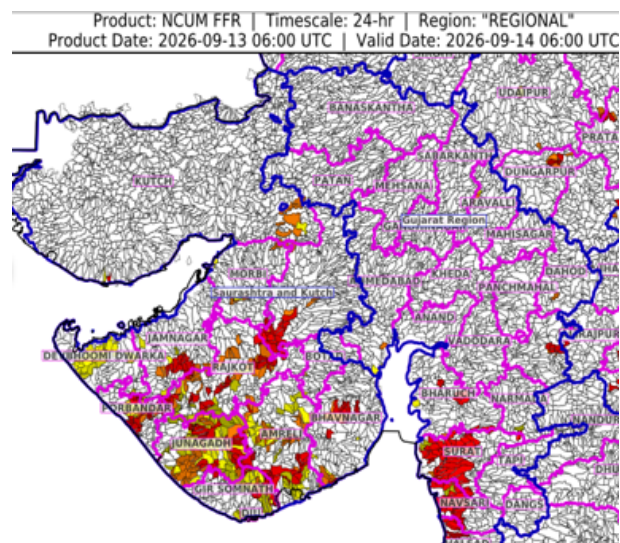

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-12

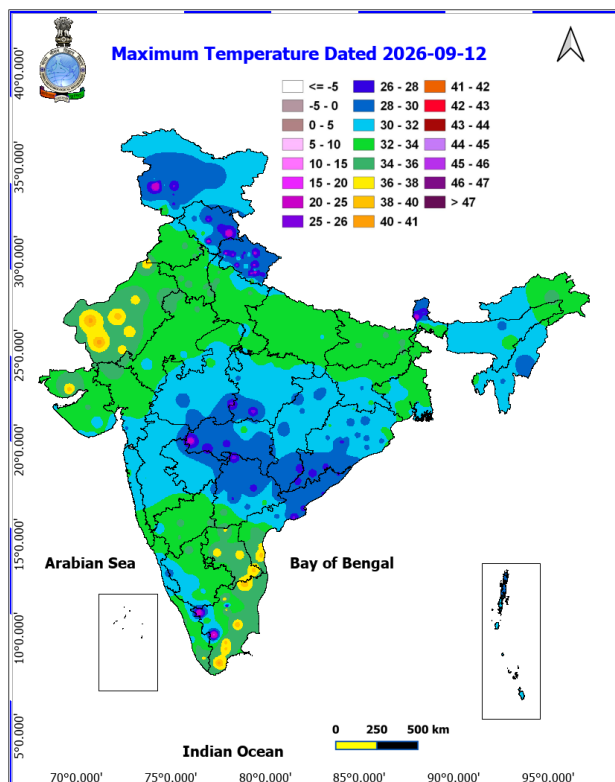


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-09-12

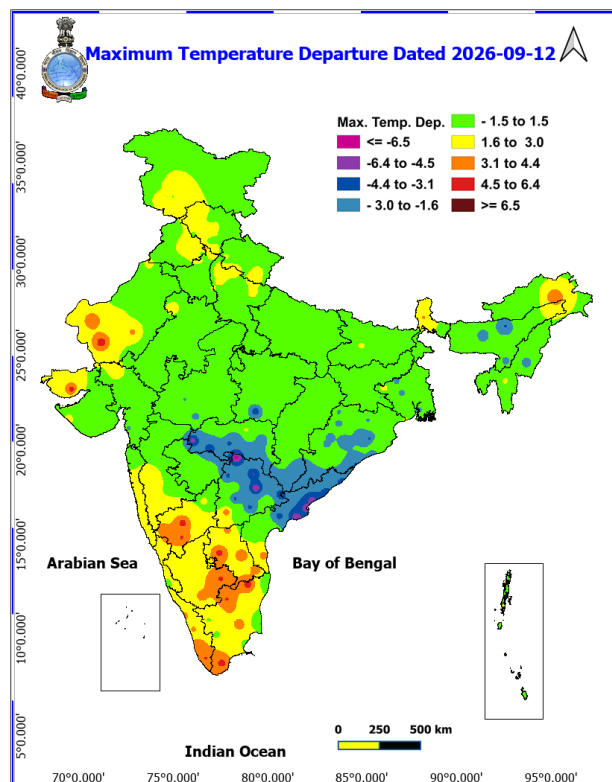


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-13

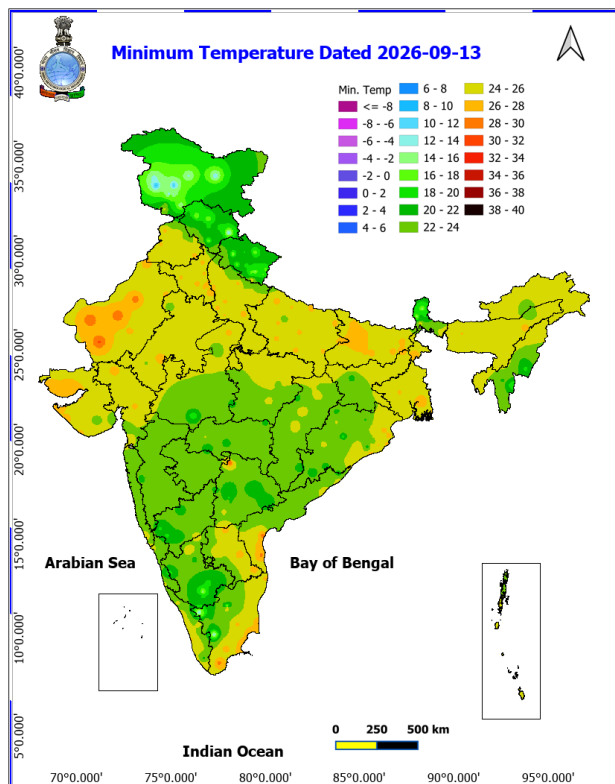
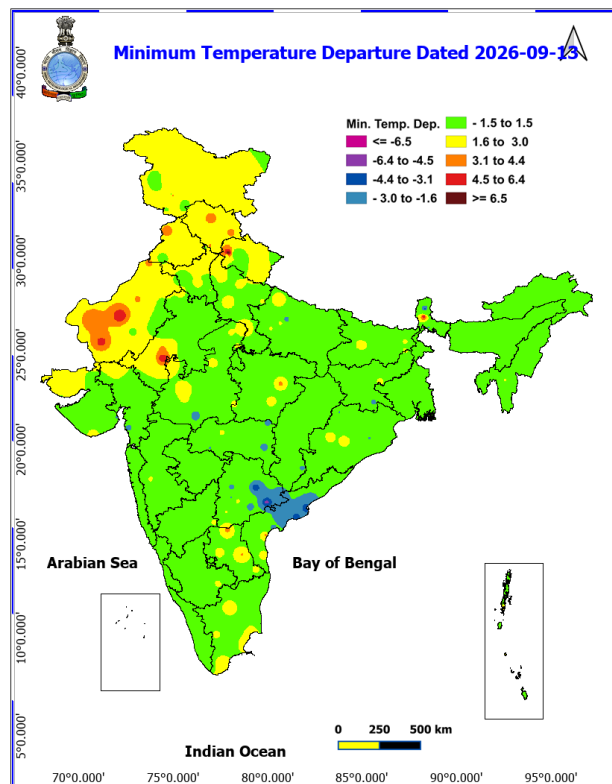
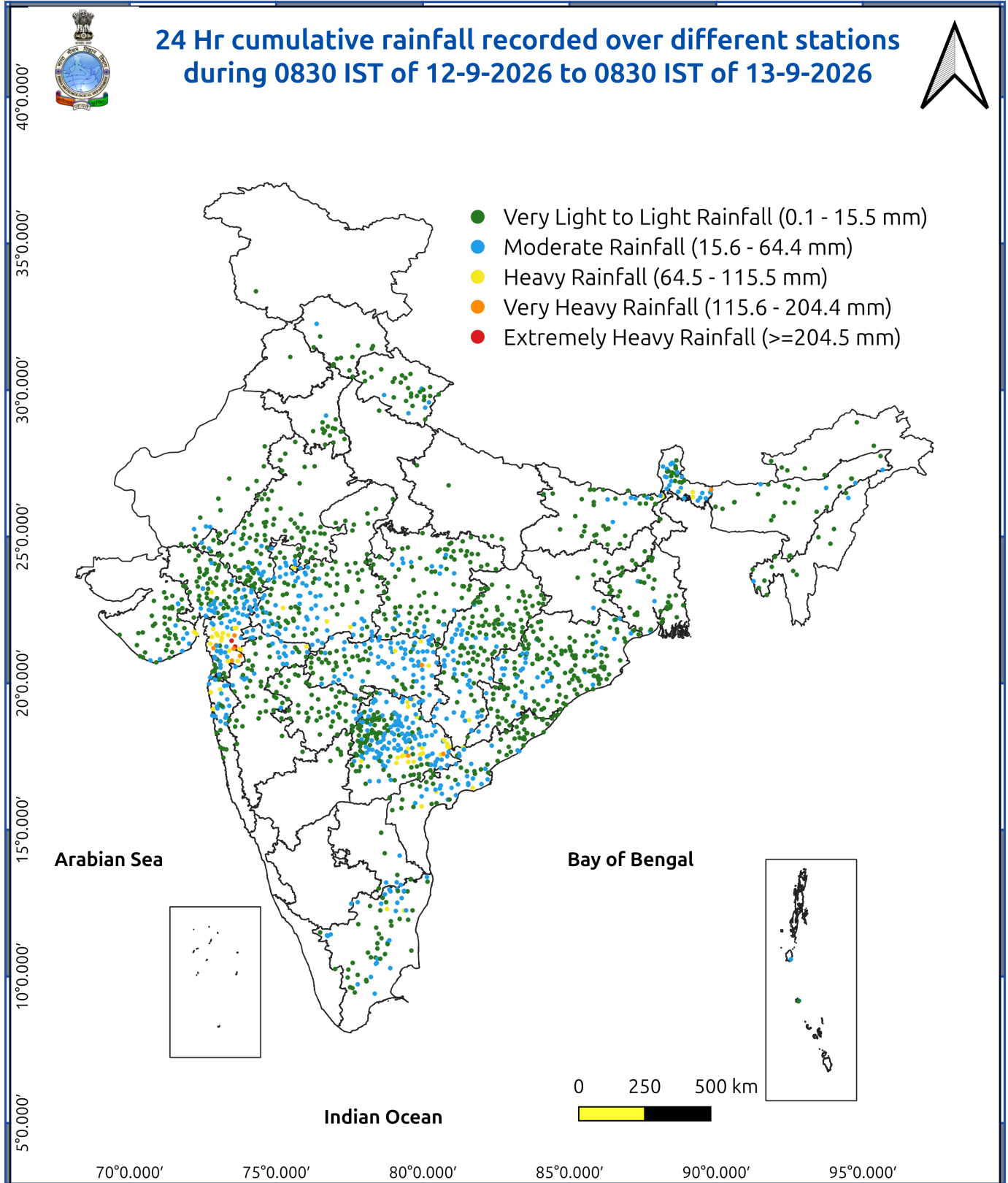


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-09-13





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to very heavy rainfall:

- Isolated very heavy rainfall likely over Konkan & Goa on 13th September; Gujarat Region on 14th September; Saurashtra & Kutch during 13th-14th September.
- Isolated extremely heavy rainfall likely over Gujarat Region and Madhya Maharashtra on 13th September.

Impact expected:

- Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of small trees like banana, papaya, drum sticks. Strong wind and rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds and rain.
- Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to heavy rain.
- Loose objects may fly.
- Small ships, trawlers and boats may be affected.
- Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain and squally winds.
- There could be localised landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Helicopter services may get affected.

Action suggested:

- People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- Onshore and offshore activities to be judiciously regulated.
- Helicopter services to be regulated.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

In **Gujarat**, ensure continuous and effective drainage to remove excess water from sugarcane, cotton, rice, pigeon pea, castor, sorghum, maize and groundnut fields. Prevent lodging of tall sugarcane by tying canes with dry leaves or bamboo sticks, and postpone irrigation, fertilizer application and plant-protection operations during wet conditions.

In **West Madhya Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in soybean, cotton, maize and sugarcane fields to prevent waterlogging.

In **Konkan and Goa**, drain out excess rainwater from rice, finger millet, turmeric, groundnut, vegetables and orchards and keep drainage channels clear. Manage rice at the panicle initiation/flowering stage by preventing prolonged water stagnation and postpone field operations during wet conditions.

In **Madhya Maharashtra**, harvest matured green gram and black gram and keep the produce at safer places. Drain excess water from finger millet, groundnut, vegetables and orchards and postpone irrigation, intercultural operations and fertilizer or plant-protection applications in saturated fields.

In **Saurashtra and Kutch**, ensure adequate drainage in standing kharif crops to prevent waterlogging and avoid irrigation and fertilizer application during wet conditions. Monitor major kharif crops for pest and disease incidence and

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undertake plant-protection measures only during a sufficiently rain-free period.

In **Arunachal Pradesh**, harvest mature upland/Jhum rice, soybean and vegetables and immediately shift the produce to safe, covered shelters. Maintain drainage in millet fields and strengthen trellises and supports for cucumber and other gourds to minimise damage from heavy rain.

In **Assam and Meghalaya**, drain excess water from maize, black gram, green gram and sesame fields and maintain proper water levels in rice. Provide support to papaya, banana and weak-stemmed crops; harvest pumpkins and bottle gourd before rainfall where possible and maintain proper drainage in rice, maize and vegetable fields.

In **Sub-Himalayan West Bengal and Sikkim**, maintain safe water levels in rice and keep drainage channels clear in rice and green gram fields to prevent waterlogging. Protect pointed gourd and other vulnerable vegetables from heavy rain and monitor tomato, chilli, ginger and cucurbits for disease under prolonged humid conditions.

In **Punjab**, maintain proper drainage in standing crop fields and postpone irrigation, intercultural operations and fertilizer or plant-protection applications during wet conditions. Protect cotton during the flowering and fruiting stages from prolonged waterlogging and harvest mature pearl millet wherever field conditions permit.

In **Haryana**, maintain proper drainage in standing crop and vegetable fields to prevent waterlogging and postpone irrigation, intercultural operations and fertilizer or plant-protection applications during wet conditions..

In **East Madhya Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in soybean, maize, pulses and vegetable fields and avoid unnecessary irrigation during wet conditions. In soybean at pod-forming stage and maize at silking/flowering stage, postpone plant-protection and fertilizer operations until clear, dry conditions; undertake earthing-up in maize where field conditions permit.

In **Marathwada**, harvest matured maize, green gram and black gram and keep the produce at safer places. Drain excess water from kharif crops, orchards, vegetables and floricultural crops.

In **Vidarbha**, harvest matured green gram and black gram as early as possible and keep the produce at safer places. Drain excess water from rice, soybean, cotton, pigeon pea, maize, vegetable fields and orchards; protect newly planted orchards and vegetables with mechanical support.

In **Odisha**, drain out excess rainwater immediately from rice, maize, millets, ginger, turmeric, vegetables, pulses and orchards and keep drainage channels clear. Cover vegetable nurseries, undertake earthing-up in newly planted banana and provide staking to vegetables; continue field operations only after rainfall stops and the soil becomes workable.

In **Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura**, maintain proper drainage in rice, soybean, black gram, ginger, turmeric and vegetable fields to prevent water stagnation. Keep rice bunds intact while providing outlets for excess water, support vulnerable crops, and harvest matured Naga chillies and Aus rice wherever field conditions permit.

In **Coastal Andhra Pradesh**, drain excess water from rice, groundnut, maize, kodo millet, turmeric, coffee plantations, orchards and vegetables and avoid field operations when the soil is sticky. Provide bamboo props or ties to banana plants to prevent lodging and pseudostem snapping during strong winds and rain.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds

Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.

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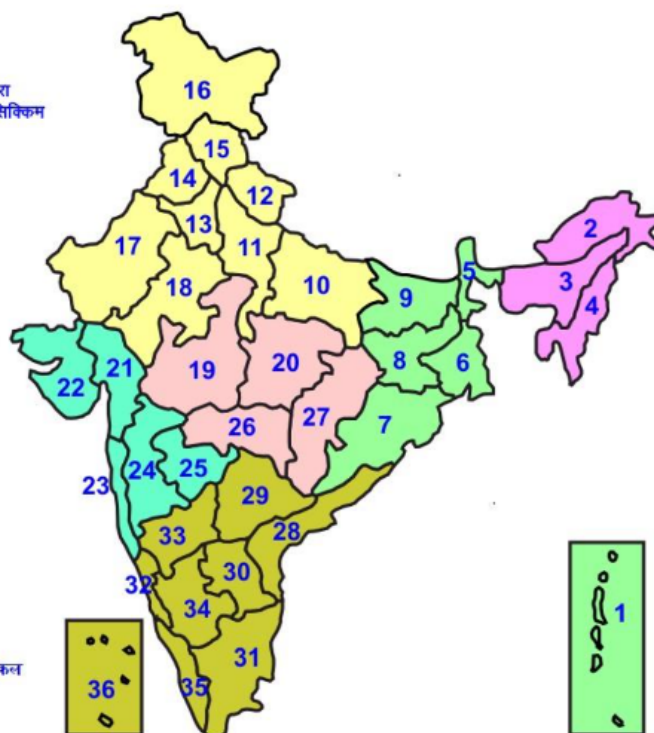


Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.

Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.
