Significant Weather Features

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 8th-9th September; East Madhya Pradesh on 9th September; Vidarbha during 6th-8th September; Chhattisgarh during 4th-7th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Chhattisgarh, East Madhya Pradesh and West Madhya Pradesh during 04th-7th September; Vidarbha on 4th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over West Madhya Pradesh on 6th September; East Madhya Pradesh during 6th-8th September; isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 04th-5th September; East Madhya Pradesh during 04th-5th September.

East India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 04th-9th September; Gangetic West Bengal during 04th-5th September and during 7th-9th September; Jharkhand during 8th-9th September; Bihar during 4th-5th September and on 9th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Gangetic West Bengal on 6th September; Jharkhand during 04th-7th September; Bihar during 6th-8th September; Odisha during 04th-9th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Bihar and Jharkhand during 04th-9th September; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 04th-5th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Gangetic West Bengal during 04th-5th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 04th-8th September; Gangetic West Bengal during 04th-5th September and during 8th-9th September; Jharkhand on 5th September and during 8th-9th September; Bihar during 04th-6th September and during 8th-9th September; Odisha on 9th September.

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Northeast India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh on 4th September and on 9th September; Assam & Meghalaya on 5th and 9th September.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 5th-8th September; Assam & Meghalaya on 4th September and during 6th-8th September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 04th-9th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 5th-7th September; Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 04th-7th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 4th-9th September; Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 04th-9th September.

West India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Konkan & Goa during 04th-9th September.
- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Gujarat Region, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada and Saurashtra & Kutch during 04th-9th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Madhya Maharashtra on 4th September.

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Kerala & Mahe, North Interior Karnataka, Rayalaseema, South Interior Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Telangana during 04th-9th September; Lakshadweep during 4th-7th September.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Lakshadweep during 8th-9th September; Coastal Karnataka during 04th-9th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over North Interior Karnataka on 4th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema on 04th-5th September, with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph) likely over North Interior Karnataka during 5th-7th September; South Interior Karnataka during 04th-7th September; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 6th-7th September; Telangana on 4th September.
- **Strong Surface Winds** likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Interior Karnataka and Rayalaseema during 04th-06th September.

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at most places** over Assam & Meghalaya, East Madhya Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Sub-himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, West Uttar Pradesh, Coastal Karnataka, West Madhya Pradesh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka, Madhya Maharashtra and Chhattisgarh; **at many places** over Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi, Arunachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, Punjab, Bihar, Jharkhand, Odisha, Gangetic West Bengal, Konkan & Goa, Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal, East Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, Rayalaseema, Telangana, Vidarbha and Lakshadweep; **Dry** over rest of the country.

❖ **Significant rainfall recorded(in cm)** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **Assam & Meghalaya**: Cherrapunji (dist East Khasi Hills) 7; **West Uttar Pradesh**: Jhansi (dist Jhansi) 6; **Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal**: Chennai (minambakkam) AP (dist Chennai) 4, Pondicherry (dist Puducherry) 3; **West Madhya Pradesh**: Gwalior (dist Gwalior) 3; **East Uttar Pradesh**: Sultanpur-obs2 (dist Sultanpur) 3.

❖ **Heavy Rainfall observed** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **Heavy rain** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya.

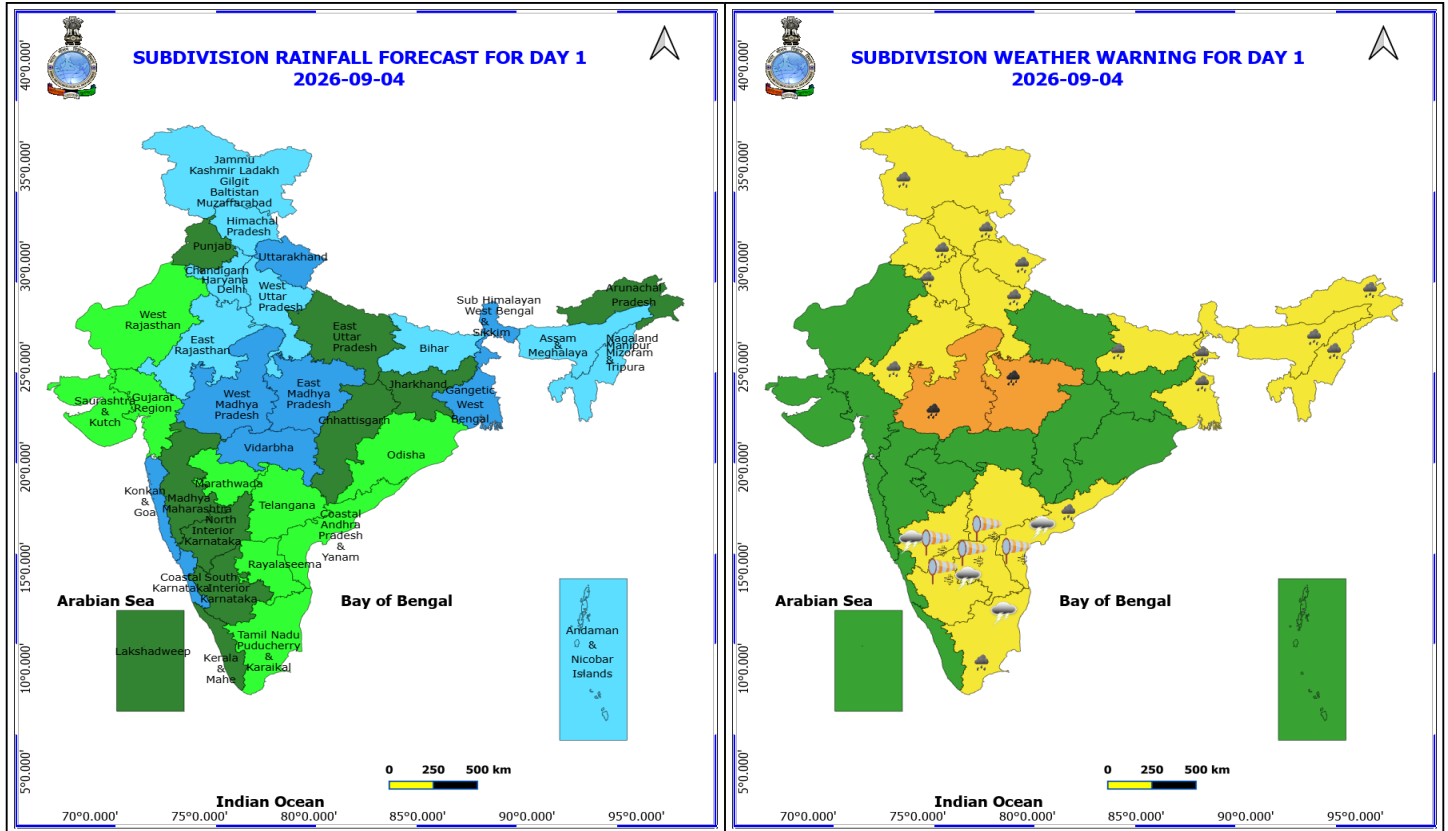
❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 03-09-2026)**: **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh and West Madhya Pradesh. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over West Rajasthan and Saurashtra & Kutch; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gangetic West Bengal, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Madhya Maharashtra, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Himachal Pradesh and Rayalaseema; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Punjab, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, East Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal; at isolated places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Jharkhand, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Marathwada, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Kerala & Mahe. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gangetic West Bengal, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Chhattisgarh and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh, Odisha, Jharkhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Gujarat Region, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Vidarbha, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and East Madhya Pradesh; at isolated places over Himachal Pradesh and Rayalaseema. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 17.0°C was reported at HALFLONG (ASSAM) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 03-09-2026)**: **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at most places over Arunachal Pradesh; at few places over Assam & Meghalaya, Rayalaseema and Kerala & Mahe; at isolated places over Odisha, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Rajasthan, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and North Interior Karnataka. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Konkan & Goa; at few places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Marathwada and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Gangetic West Bengal, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, East Rajasthan, Gujarat Region, Vidarbha and Telangana. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Uttarakhand; at most places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Coastal Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka; at few places over Bihar and West Uttar Pradesh; at isolated places over Jharkhand, East Uttar Pradesh and West Madhya Pradesh. **The highest maximum temperature** of 40.2°C was reported at PALAYAMKOTTAI (TAMIL NADU).



Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Well Marked low pressure area** over northeast Madhya Pradesh & neighbourhood lay over central parts of northern Madhya Pradesh & adjoining south Uttar Pradesh at 0530 IST of today, the 04th September 2026. The associated cyclonic circulation extends upto 7.6 km above mean sea level tilting southwards with height. It is likely to be quasi-stationary during next 2 days.
- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now passes through Bikaner, Sikar, centre of **Well Marked low pressure area** over central parts of northern Madhya Pradesh & adjoining south Uttar Pradesh, Daltonganj, Berhampore and thence eastwards towards Tripura.
- A **trough** runs from the cyclonic circulation associated with **Well Marked low pressure area** over central parts of northern Madhya Pradesh & adjoining south Uttar Pradesh to Nagaland across Bihar, north Jharkhand, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal, south Assam at 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- The **trough** now runs from northeast Arabian Sea to Jharkhand across Gujarat, cyclonic circulation associated with **Well Marked low pressure area** over central parts of northern Madhya Pradesh & adjoining south Uttar Pradesh and north Chhattisgarh between 3.1 & 4.5 Km above mean sea level.
- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over coastal Tamil Nadu & adjoining Southwest Bay of Bengal at 7.6 km above mean sea level.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a trough in middle and upper tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level roughly along Long. 75°E to the north of Lat. 32°N persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over northeast Assam & neighbourhood at 3.1 km above mean sea level has become less marked.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over North Haryana & neighbourhood at 1.5 km above mean sea level has become less marked.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over southwest Bangladesh & neighbourhood extending upto 1.5 km above mean sea level has become less marked.

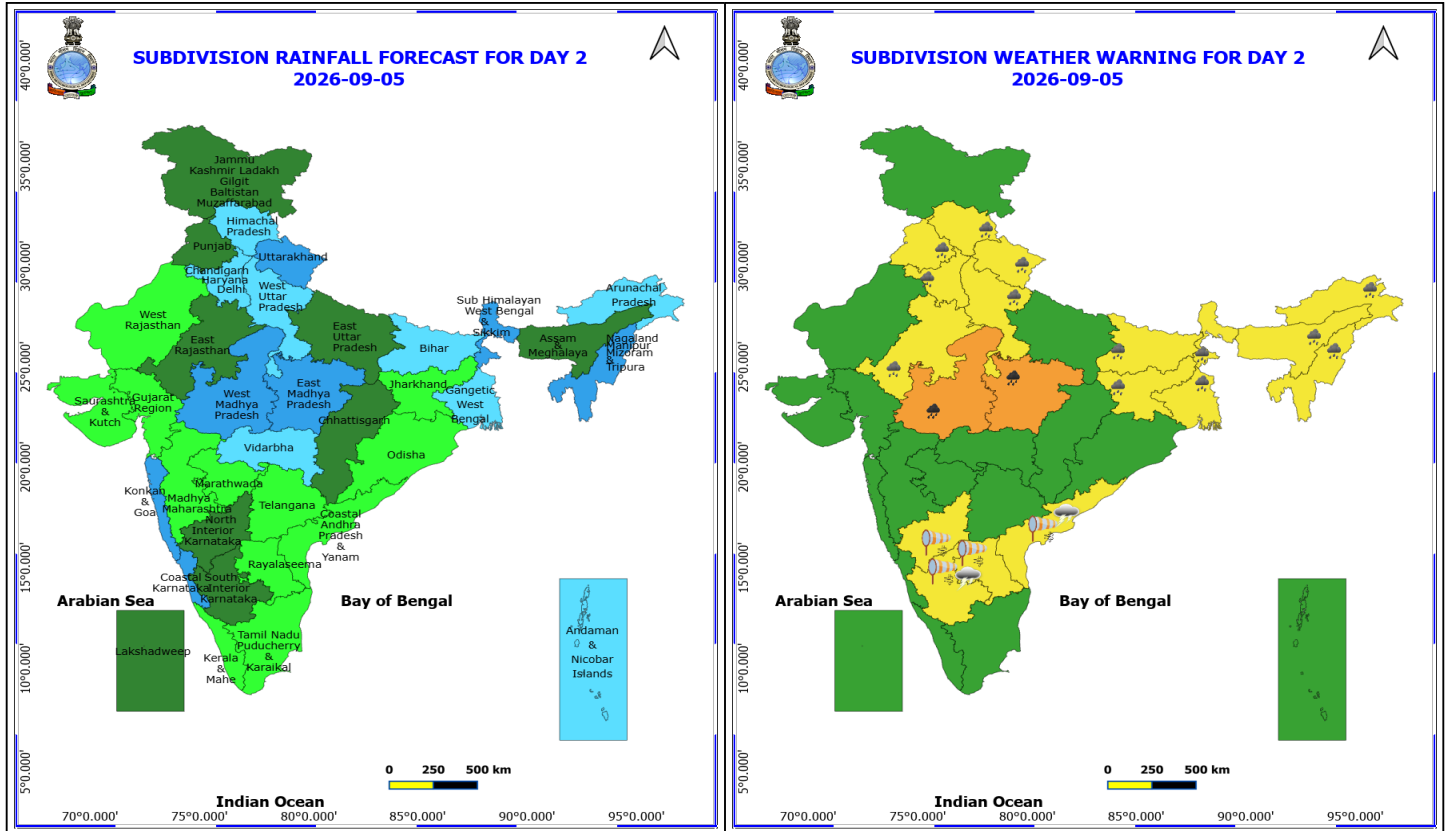

- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Chhattisgarh, Gangetic West Bengal, Madhya Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Uttarakhand and Vidarbha.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, Interior Karnataka and Telangana.
- ❖ **Arabian Sea: Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph** is likely to prevail along and off Somalia coasts adjoining some parts of westcentral & southwest Arabian Sea.

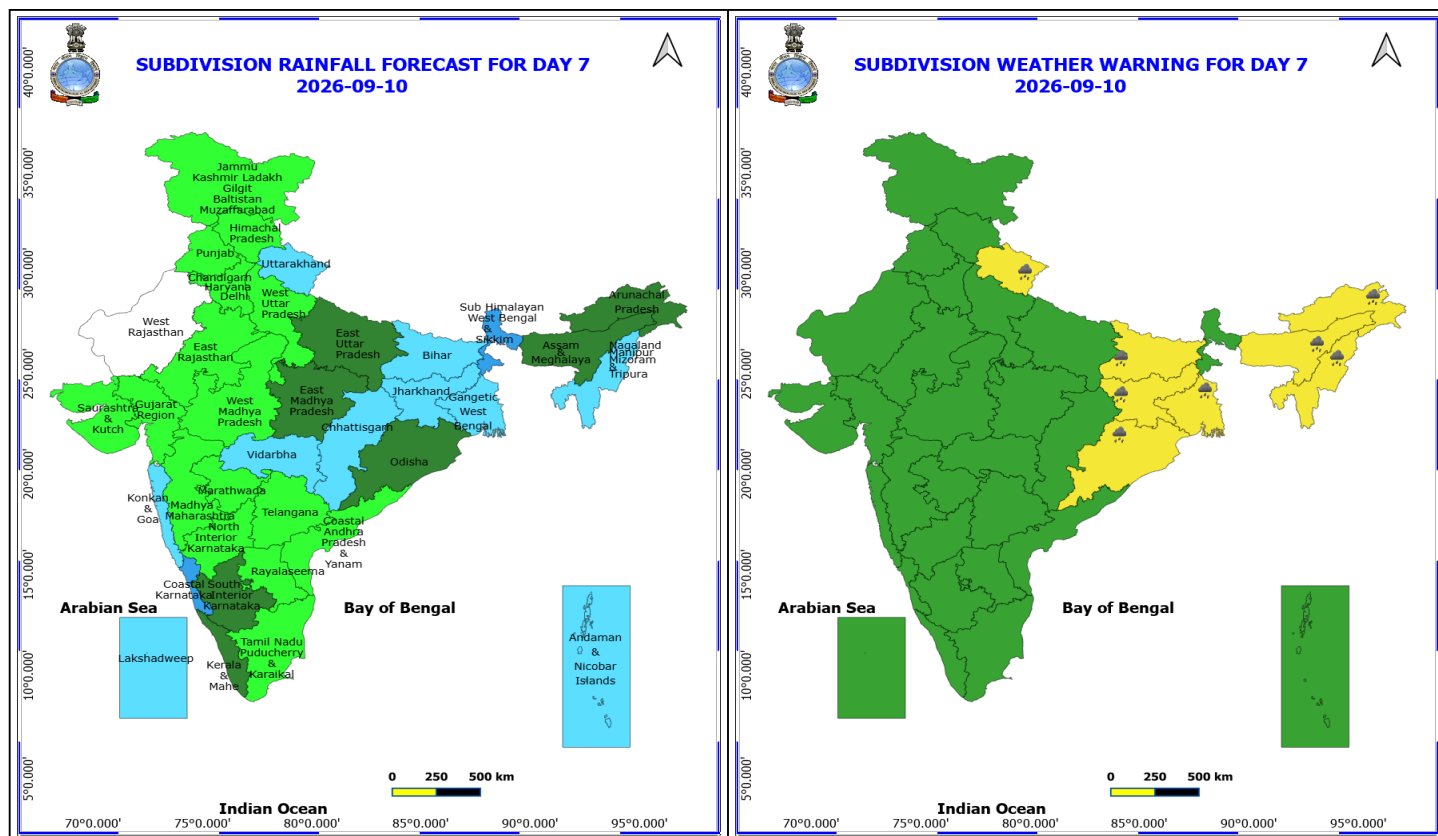

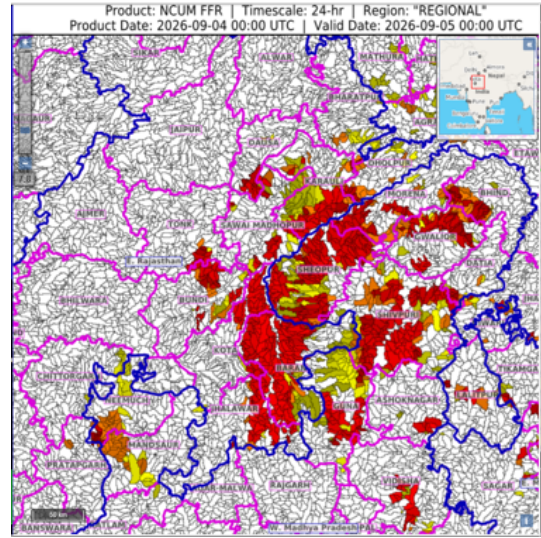

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-03

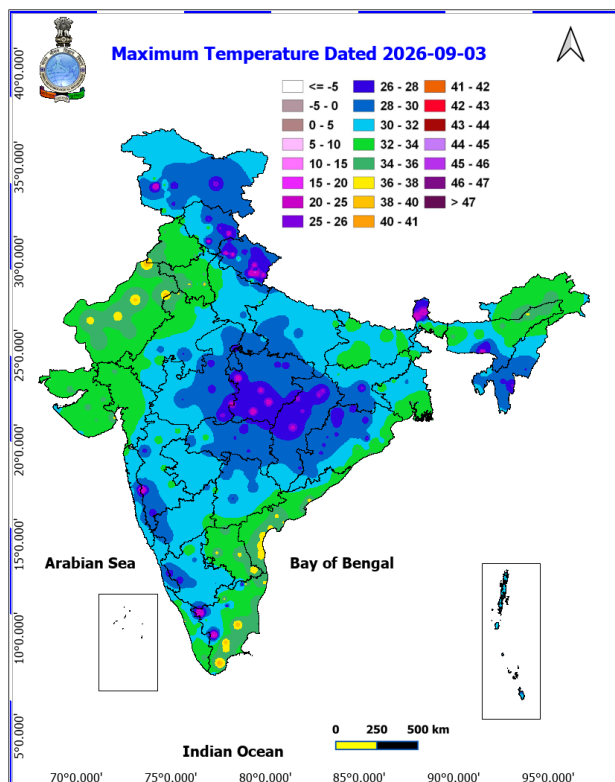


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-09-03

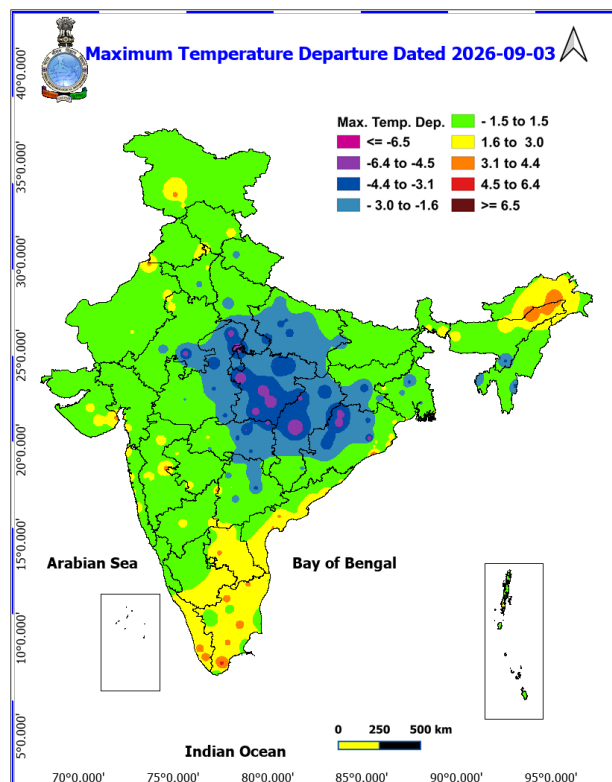


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-03

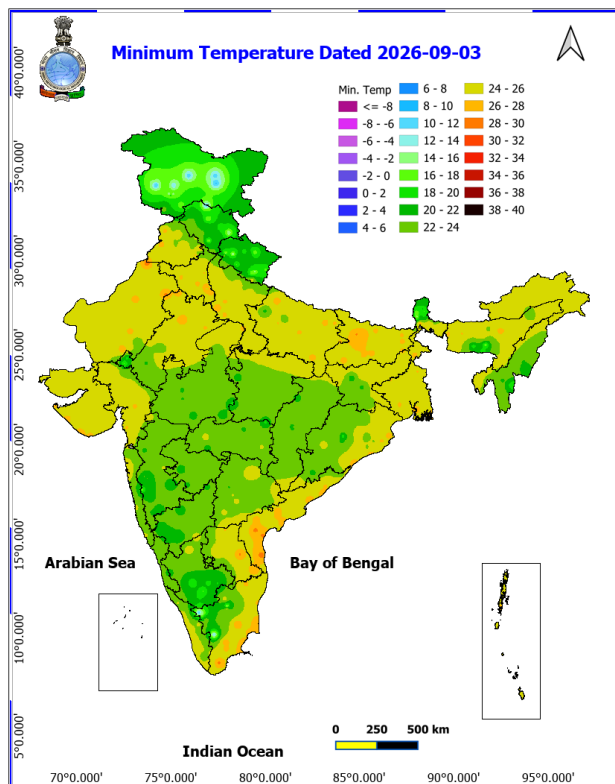
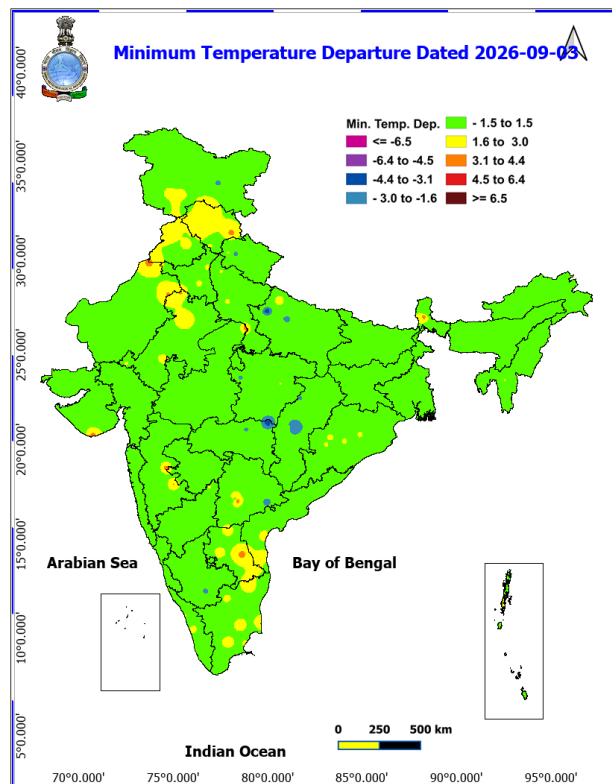
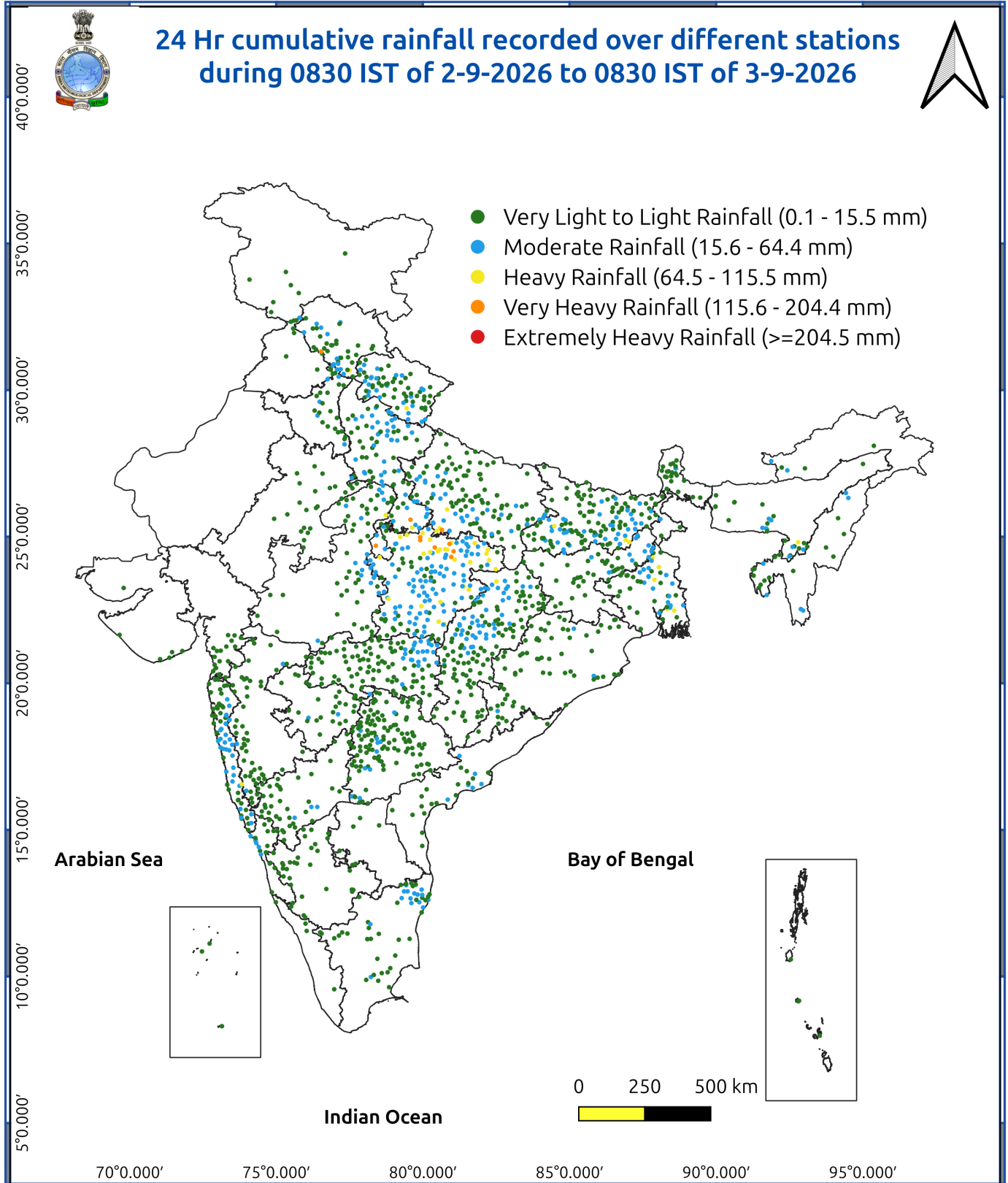


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-09-03





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to very heavy/extremely heavy rainfall:

- Isolated heavy to very heavy rainfall very likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 04th -05th; East Madhya Pradesh on 04th & 05th September.

Impact expected:

- Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of small trees like banana, papaya, drum sticks. Strong wind and rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds and rain.
- Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to heavy rain.
- Loose objects may fly.
- Small ships, trawlers and boats may be affected.
- Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain and squally winds.
- There could be localised landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Helicopter services may get affected.

Action suggested:

- People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- Onshore and offshore activities to be judiciously regulated.
- Helicopter services to be regulated.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, maintain proper drainage in rice, maize, finger millet, soybean, cowpea, vegetables and orchards to remove excess water. Keep millet fields well drained during panicle initiation and flowering and monitor crops for pest and disease incidence.
- In **Assam** and **Meghalaya**, maintain proper drainage in crop fields and postpone fertilizer and plant-protection applications during rainfall. Continue sowing of pigeon pea, green gram and sesame only where field conditions are suitable and harvest jute at the small-pod stage.
- In **Nagaland**, maintain 3-5 cm water level in wet rice fields and harvest mature maize cobs during suitable weather.
- In **Manipur**, harvest colocasia and mature ginger during rain-free periods and ensure proper drainage in ginger fields.
- In **Mizoram**, prepare fields for sowing black gram, green gram, soybean, sesame and lentil after maize harvest. Ensure drainage in ginger fields and prevent water stagnation to minimise soft-rot and rhizome-rot incidence.
- In **Tripura**, maintain adequate soil moisture in Aus rice during panicle initiation and booting, while ensuring drainage in low-lying groundnut fields to prevent stagnation.
- In **Bihar**, maintain proper drainage in standing crops and avoid field operations under excessively wet conditions. Maintain appropriate standing water in transplanted rice while avoiding prolonged stagnation.
- In **West Bengal**, keep drainage channels clear in rice, vegetable fields, orchards and nurseries. Protect vegetable seedlings from heavy rain, improve drainage around cucurbits and avoid nitrogen application during wet conditions.

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- In **Himachal Pradesh**, keep drainage channels in ginger and turmeric fields clear and functional and ensure prompt removal of excess rainwater from maize fields. Harvest mature vegetables such as cucumber, bottle gourd, bitter gourd, snake gourd, ridge gourd and sponge gourd wherever field conditions permit and keep harvested produce in a safe place.
- In **Punjab** and **Haryana**, maintain proper drainage in standing crop fields and promptly remove excess rainwater from low-lying areas.
- In **Uttarakhand**, avoid irrigation in rice where rainfall is adequate and maintain proper drainage in sugarcane and maize fields. Keep drainage channels clear and provide support to tall crops and vegetables to prevent lodging.
- In **Uttar Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in standing crop fields and postpone irrigation, intercultural operations, fertilizer and plant-protection applications during wet conditions. Provide staking/support to young plants, vegetables and horticultural crops.
- In **East Rajasthan**, Maintain proper drainage in the field to avoid water-logging. Do not spray pesticides during rain. Harvest ripe and marketable fruits of tomato, chilli and brinjal regularly and maintain proper drainage in fields to avoid water logging. To control downy mildew and blast disease in bajra, spray Mancozeb (0.2%) or Metalaxyl especially in Flood Prone Zone.
- In **Madhya Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in soybean, cotton, maize and sugarcane fields to prevent waterlogging; postpone vegetable transplanting and provide support to young fruit plants. Undertake propping in sugarcane to minimise lodging.
- In **Chhattisgarh**, ensure continuous and effective drainage in rice, maize, groundnut, minor millets, pulses and vegetable fields to prevent water stagnation. Clean drainage channels in low-lying maize, ginger, turmeric and vegetable fields and provide staking/support to cucurbits, tomato and capsicum.
- In **Vidarbha**, maintain proper drainage in soybean, cotton, maize and other standing crop fields and remove excess rainwater promptly. Postpone fertilizer, plant protection and intercultural operations until the soil becomes workable and provide support to young vegetables and other vulnerable crops against lodging.
- **Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds**
- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.
- **Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries**
- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.

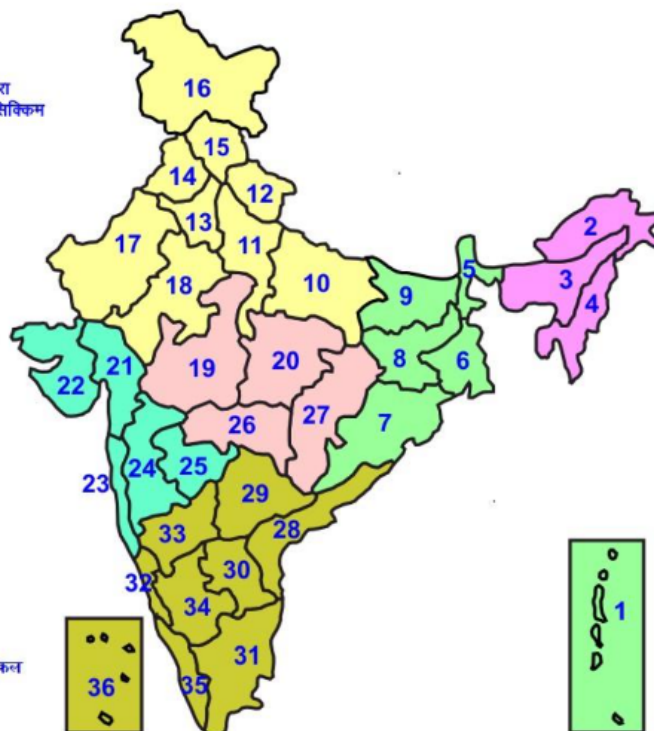
