Significant Weather Features

- **Isolated thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 14th-16th July; Gangetic West Bengal on 14th July.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 14th-18th July; Gangetic West Bengal and Odisha during 14th-15th July and on 17th July; Jharkhand during 14th-17th July; Bihar during 16th-20th July with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 19th-20th July; Gangetic West Bengal and Odisha on 16th July; Bihar during 14th-15th July.
- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall at few places with extremely heavy rainfall likely at isolated places over Odisha on 14th & 15th July.**

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Northeast India:

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 14th-20th July.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 14th-15th July; Assam & Meghalaya during 14th-18th July; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 14th-17th July.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh and Assam & Meghalaya during 14th-20th July; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 15th-18th July with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura on 14th July.

West India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Konkan & Goa during 14th-16th July; Gujarat Region, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada and Saurashtra & Kutch during 14th-20th July.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Konkan & Goa during 17th-20th July.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Konkan & Goa during 14th-15th July; Madhya Maharashtra during 15th-16th July.
- with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Marathwada during 15th-16th July.

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Rayalaseema, South Interior Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Telangana during 14th-20th July; Kerala & Mahe during 14th-17th July; Lakshadweep during 17th-18th July; Coastal Karnataka during 14th-16th July; North Interior Karnataka during 16th-20th July; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam during 15th-20th July.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Kerala & Mahe during 18th-20th July; Lakshadweep during 19th-20th July; Coastal Karnataka during 17th-20th July.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Kerala & Mahe during 14th-15th July; Coastal Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Telangana during 14th-20th July; North Interior Karnataka during 16th-20th July; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam during 15th-18th July; Rayalaseema during 14th-18th July.
- Strong Surface Winds likely over Kerala & Mahe during 14th-15th July; Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Telangana during 14th-20th July; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema during 14th-18th July.

Heat Wave, Hot & Humid weather and Warm Night conditions warning:

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today): at **most places** over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim; at **many places** over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Gangetic West Bengal, Bihar; at a **few places** over Arunachal Pradesh, Odisha; at **isolated places** over Jharkhand, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh, West Rajasthan, Konkan & Goa, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh, Punjab, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Kerala & Mahe, Coastal Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka; **Dry** over rest of the country.

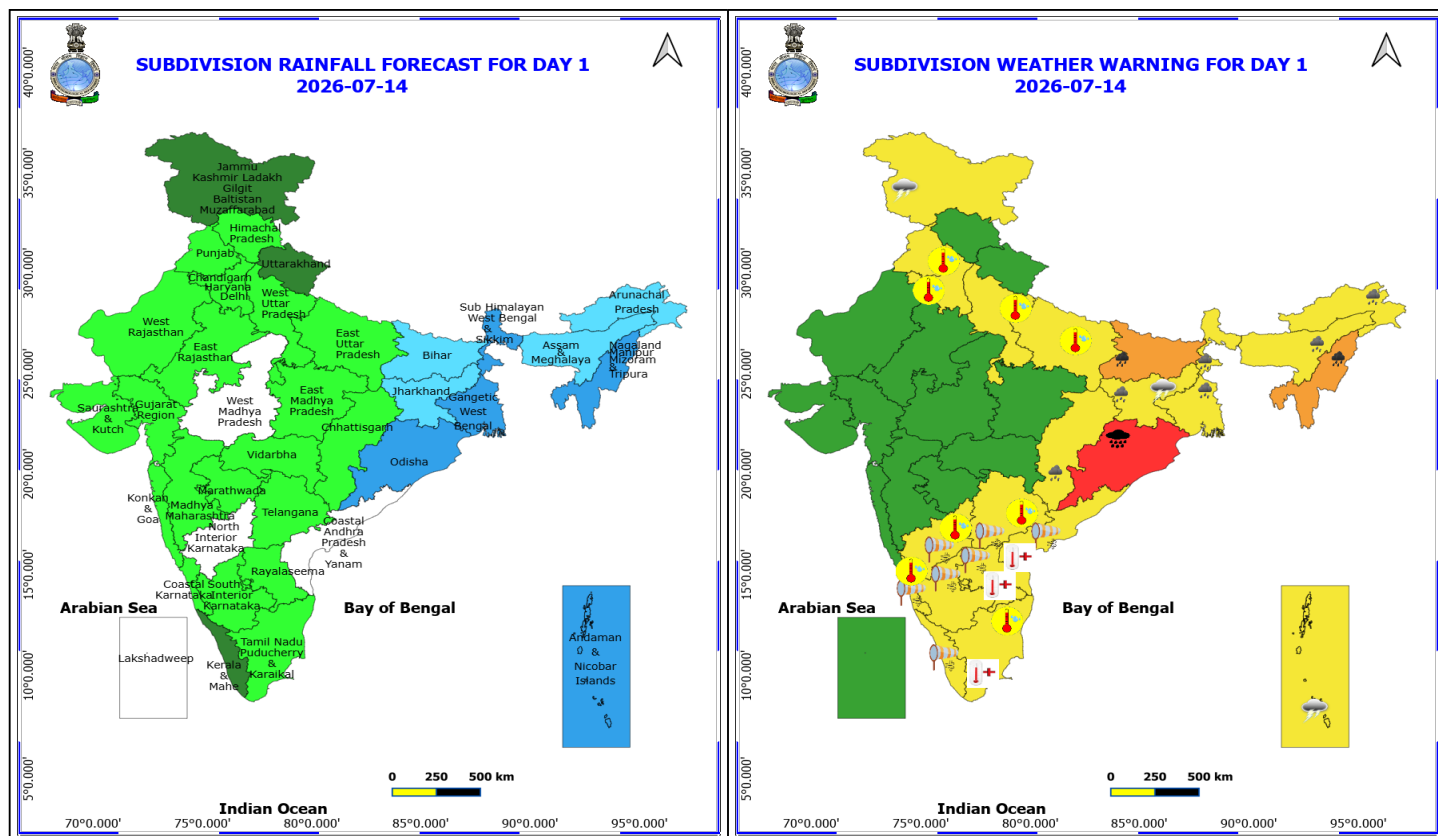
❖ **Heavy rainfall recorded** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today): **Very Heavy rainfall (12-20 cm)** has been recorded over Odisha, Bihar; **Heavy rainfall (7-11 cm)** has been recorded over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, East Uttar Pradesh, Assam, Nagaland, Gangetic West Bengal.

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 14-07-2026)**: **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at few places over East Madhya Pradesh; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh and Saurashtra & Kutch. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at many places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Gujarat Region, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Konkan & Goa; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh and Lakshadweep; at few places over Jharkhand, Uttarakhand, Telangana, Coastal Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at isolated places over Punjab, West Rajasthan and Madhya Maharashtra. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Gangetic West Bengal and Bihar; at most places over Marathwada, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka; at few places over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 24.2°C was reported at Hisar (Haryana) and Ridge (Delhi) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 13-07-2026)**: **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at few places over Marathwada and North Interior Karnataka; at isolated places over Odisha, Uttarakhand, West Madhya Pradesh, Madhya Maharashtra, Vidarbha, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at many places over Konkan & Goa and Coastal Karnataka; at most places over Chhattisgarh and South Interior Karnataka; at few places over Arunachal Pradesh, Gujarat Region and Kerala & Mahe; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Himachal Pradesh and Saurashtra & Kutch. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Jharkhand and Punjab; at few places over Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, Bihar, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan and East Madhya Pradesh. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura and Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad; at most places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim. **The highest maximum temperature** of 42.1°C was reported at BAPATLA (ANDHRA PRADESH).

Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0830 hours IST)

- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now passes through Jammu, Dehradun, Barabanki, Patna, Bankura, Canning and thence southeastwards towards Eastcentral Bay of Bengal.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over North Bay of Bengal & neighbourhood lay over North Bay of Bengal & adjoining South Bangladesh and extends upto 7.6 km above mean sea level tilting southwestwards with height. Under its influence, a Low Pressure Area is likely to form over north Bay of Bengal & adjoining west Bengal-Bangladesh coasts during next 24 hours.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over north Gujarat & adjoining southwest Rajasthan at 5.8 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **Western Disturbance now seen** as a cyclonic circulation over North Pakistan & adjoining Jammu at 5.8 km above mean sea level.
- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over Southwest Uttar Pradesh & neighbourhood at 5.8 km above mean sea level.



14 July (Day 1)

- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Chhattisgarh, East Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Konkan & Goa, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Uttarakhand, Vidarbha and West Bengal & Sikkim.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe and Telangana.
- ❖ **Heat Wave conditions** very likely at isolated places over Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu Puducherry & Karaikal.
- ❖ **Hot and Humid weather** very likely at isolated places over Coastal Karnataka, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, North Interior Karnataka, Punjab, Tamil Nadu Puducherry & Karaikal, Telangana and Uttar Pradesh.

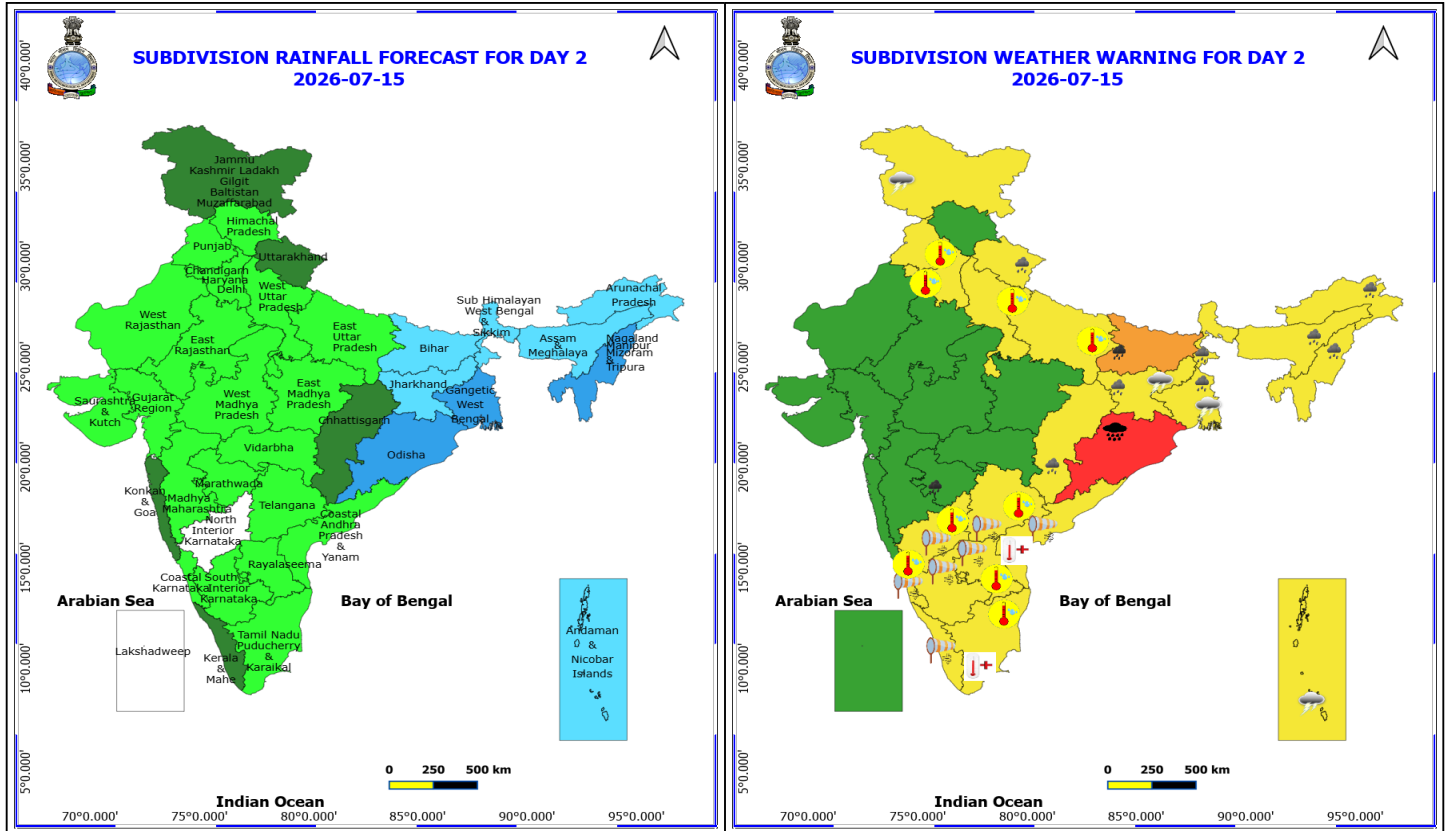

- ❖ Bay of Bengal: Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail over Gulf of Mannar, south Sri Lanka adjoining few parts of south adjoining eastcentral Bay of Bengal
- ❖ Squally Weather with wind speed 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph is likely to prevail along and off Odisha, Gangetic West Bengal, over Andaman Sea.

- ❖ **Hot and Humid weather** very likely at isolated places over Coastal Karnataka, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi,

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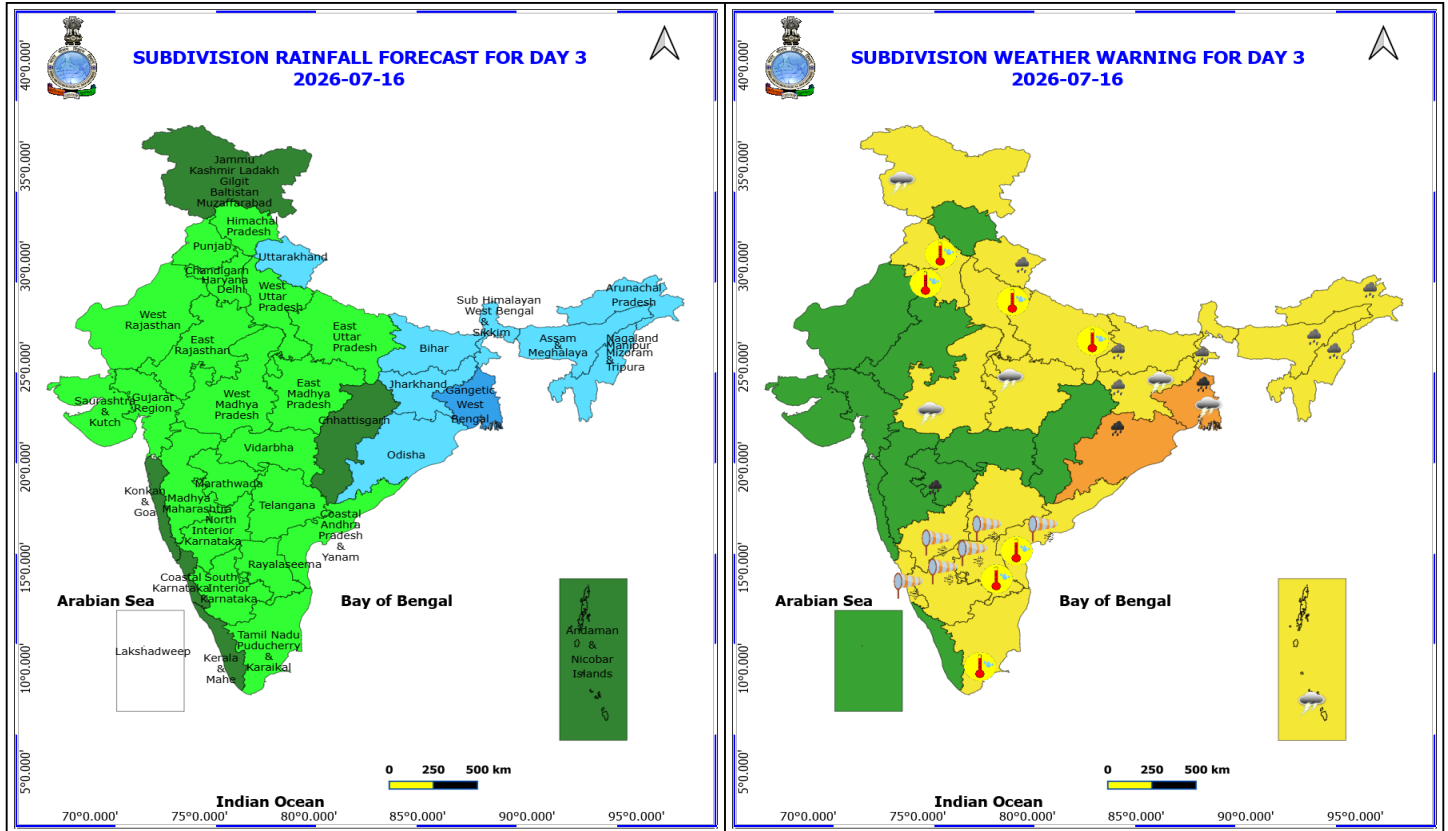

- ❖ **Heavy Rainfall** likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Punjab, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(40-50kmph)** likely at isolated places over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Bihar, Karnataka and Telangana.

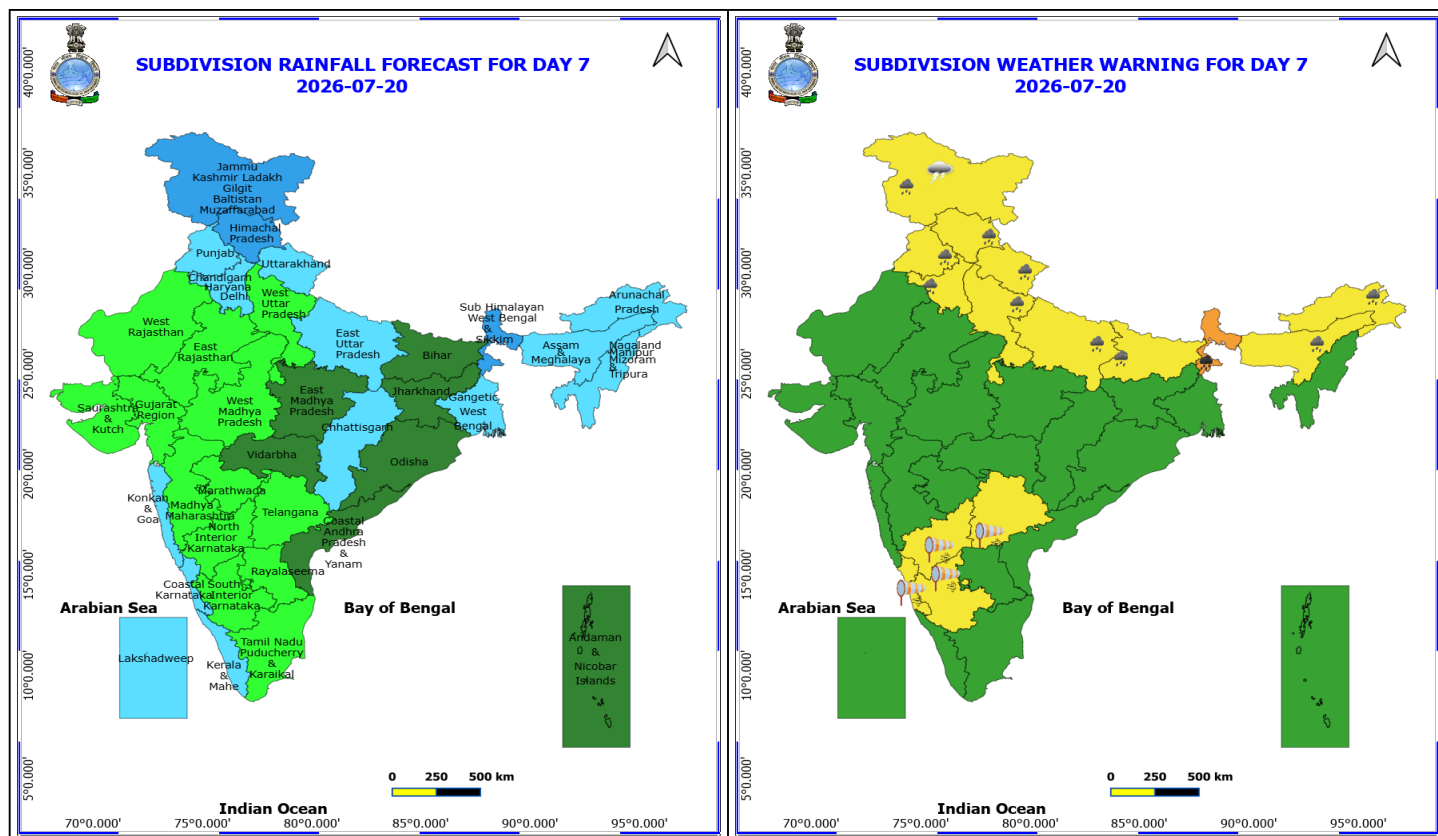

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-07-13

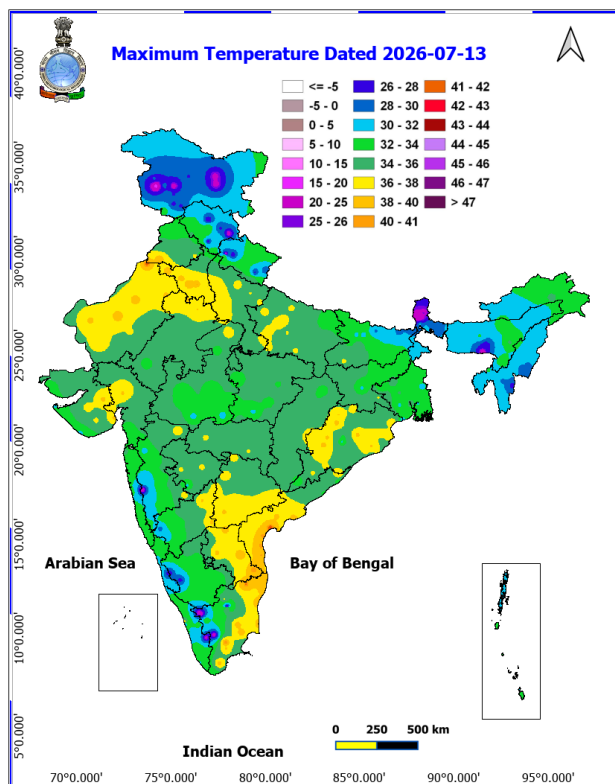


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-07-13

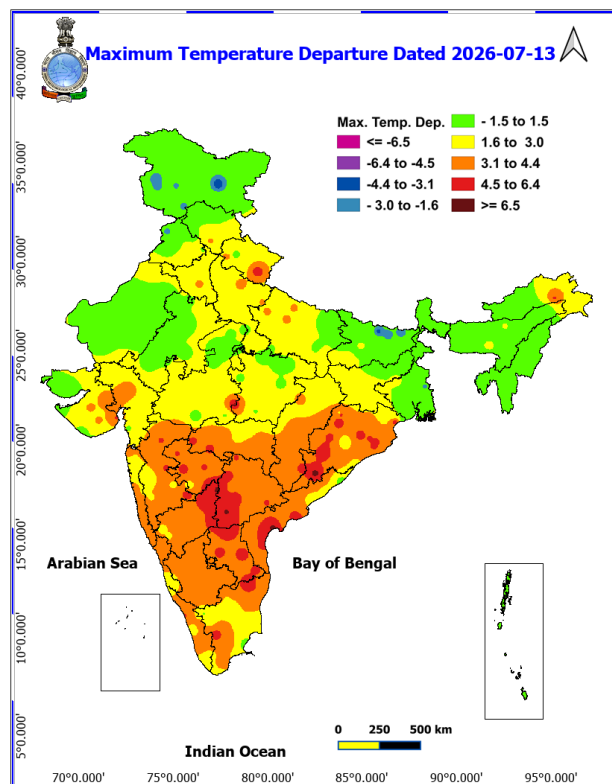


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-07-14

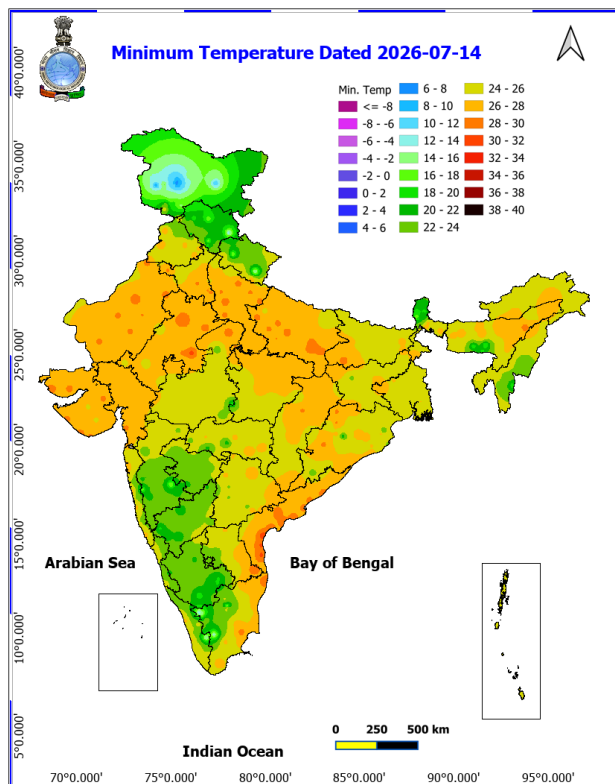
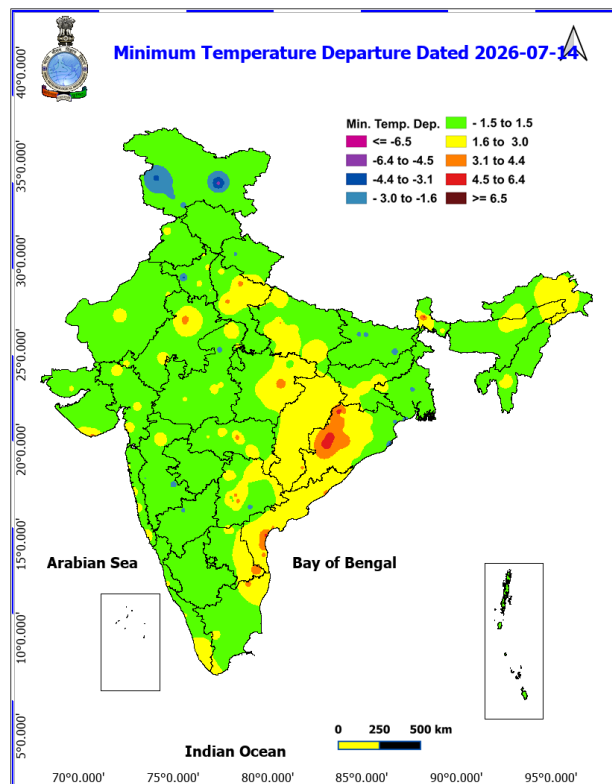
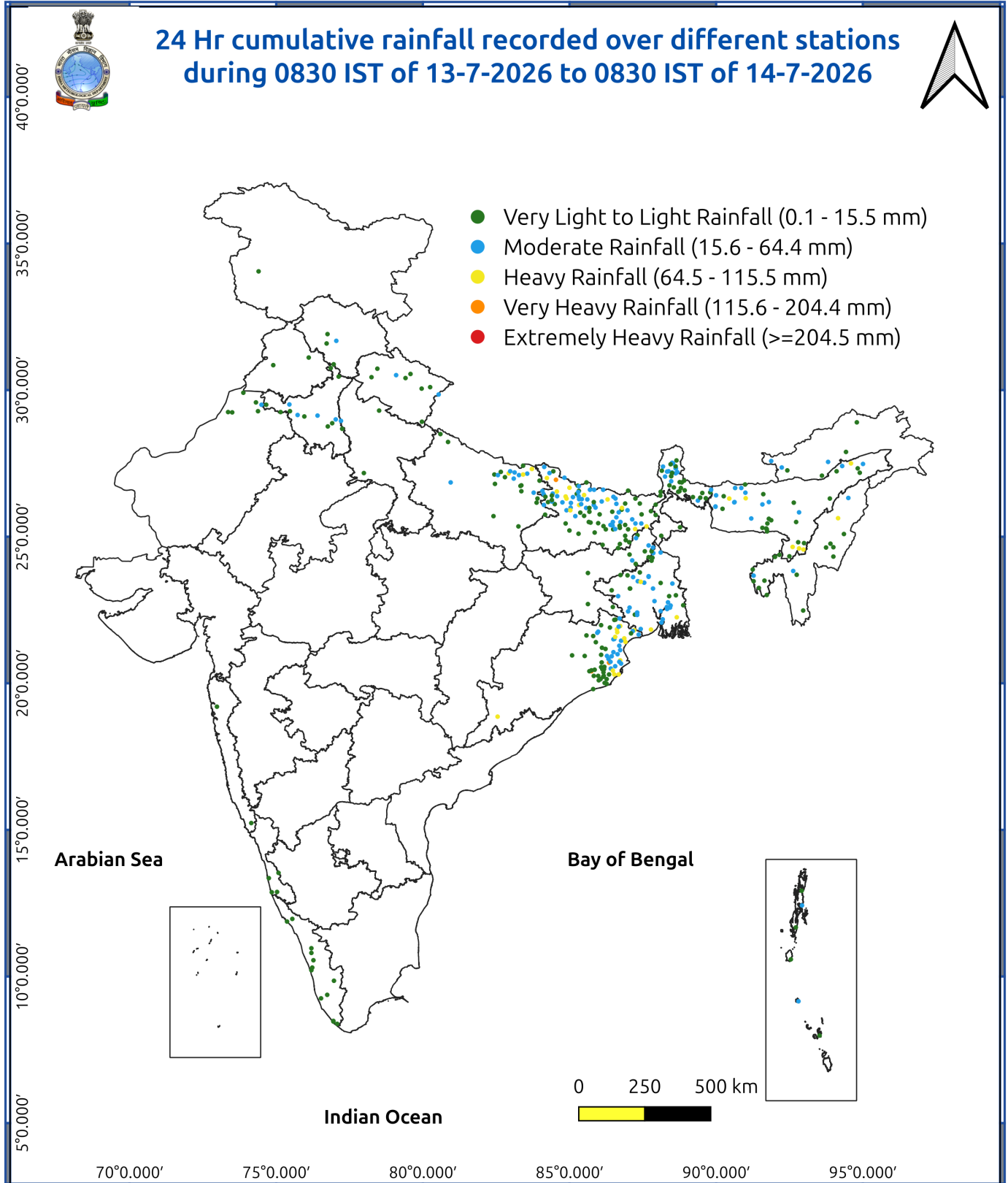


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-07-14





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected & Action Suggested due to heavy/very heavy/extremely heavy rainfall

Heavy to very heavy rainfall at few places with extremely heavy rainfall likely at isolated places over Odisha on 14th & 15th July.

Impact Expected

- Localized Flooding of roads, water logging in low lying areas and closure of underpasses mainly in urban areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Disruption of traffic in major cities due to water logging in roads leading to increased travel time.
- Minor damage to kutcha roads.
- Possibilities of damage to vulnerable structure.
- Localized Landslides/Mudslides/landslips/mudslips/landsinks/mudsinks.
- Damage to horticulture and standing crops in some areas due to inundation.
- It may lead to riverine flooding in some river catchments (for riverine flooding please visit Web page of CWC)

Action Suggested

- Check for traffic congestion on your route before leaving for your destination.
- Follow any traffic advisories that are issued in this regard.
- Avoid going to areas that face the water logging problems often.
- Avoid staying in vulnerable structure.

Impact expected and action suggested due to Heat wave conditions:

Heat wave conditions very likely in isolated pockets over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal during 14th-15th July; Rayalaseema on 14th July.

Alert Areas

- High temperature & increased likelihood of heat illness symptoms in people who are either exposed to sun for a prolonged period or doing heavy work.
- High health concern for vulnerable people e.g. infants, elderly, people with chronic diseases.
- Avoid heat exposure— keep cool. Avoid dehydration.
- Drink sufficient water- even if not thirsty.
- Use ORS, homemade drinks like lassi, torani (rice water), lemon water, buttermilk, etc. to keep yourself hydrated.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In **Odisha**, ensure continuous and effective drainage of excess rainwater from rice, maize, pulses, oilseed and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Strengthen field bunds and drain excess water from low-lying crop fields. Postpone sowing, transplanting, irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.
- In **Bihar**, ensure continuous drainage in rice, maize, sesame and pigeon pea fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.
- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, ensure continuous drainage of excess rainwater from rice, maize, soybean and finger millet fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging.

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- In **Assam**, ensure continuous and effective drainage of excess rainwater from sugarcane, soybean, pigeon pea, jute, sesame fields and fruit orchards to prevent prolonged waterlogging.
- In **Meghalaya**, ensure proper drainage in rice nursery beds and fields of maize, cowpea, okra and ginger. Strengthen nursery bunds to prevent runoff and seedling washout.
- In **West Bengal**, ensure continuous and effective drainage in rice nurseries, jute, ginger and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Inspect and strengthen bunds around rice nurseries and harvest mature tea leaves and vegetables wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura** ensure proper drainage and remove any accumulated rainwater from soybean, black gram, ginger, turmeric, cole crop and vegetable fields to prevent residual waterlogging.
- In **Sikkim**, ensure proper drainage in rice nurseries and standing crop fields to prevent waterlogging.
- In **Jharkhand**, ensure proper drainage in standing crop fields to prevent waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.
- In **Chhattisgarh**, ensure proper drainage in rice nurseries and standing fields of maize, soybean, pigeon pea and minor millets to prevent prolonged waterlogging.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of High temperatures/ Heat Waves

- In **Tamil Nadu, Coastal Andhra Pradesh, and Rayalaseema** provide light irrigation to maintain adequate moisture in standing crops

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

- In **Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Meghalaya, West Bengal and Odisha** post-pone fertilizer application and other field activities.
- In **Telangana and Rayalaseema** provide staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.
- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- In regions with high temperatures and heat wave conditions, provide clean, cool drinking water to animals, and cover the roofs of poultry sheds with grass to reduce the adverse effects of heat.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.

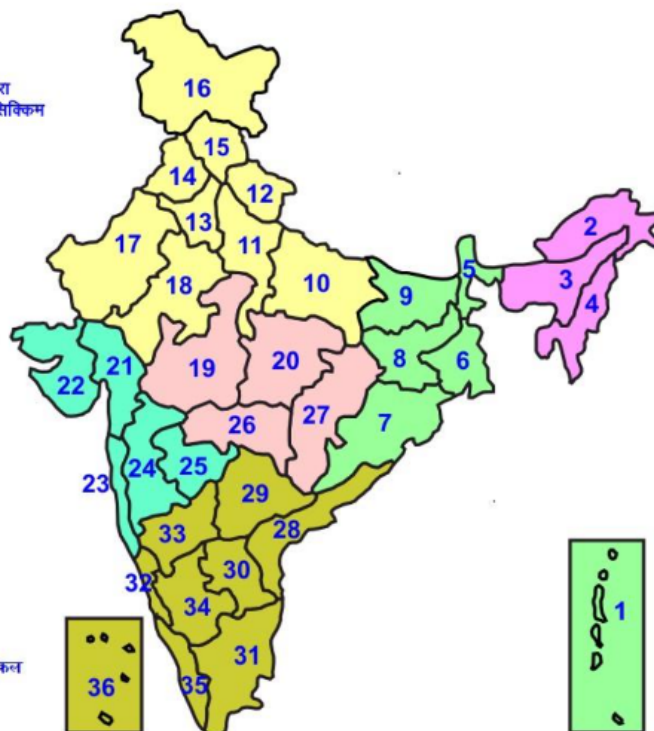
