ALL INDIA WEATHER SUMMARY AND FORECAST BULLETIN

Significant Weather Features

Weather Systems, Forecast and Warnings

- **Isolated** rainfall/snowfall likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad during 17th -19th and over Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand on 17th & 18th February.
- **Isolated** rainfall with **thunderstorm, lightning** likely over Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan on 17th & 18th; over Madhya Pradesh on 18th & 19th with **thunderstorm, lightning (30-40 kmph)** likely over Nicobar Islands on 16th & 17th and over Andaman & Nicobar Islands on 18th & 19th February.

Forecast of minimum temperatures:

- Gradual rise in minimum temperatures by 2-3°C during next 3 days & fall by 2-3 °C thereafter likely over Northwest India.
- No significant change in minimum temperatures for next 24 hours & gradual rise by 2-3°C thereafter likely over Western India.
- No significant change in minimum temperatures likely over rest parts of the country.

Forecast of maximum temperatures:

- No significant change in maximum temperatures during the next 5 days & gradual rise by 2-3°C thereafter likely over Maharashtra.

Hot and Humid Warnings:

- **Hot and Humid conditions** likely over Coastal Karnataka during 15th-17th and over Konkan & Goa on 15th & 16th February.

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Main Weather Observations:

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today): **at isolated places** over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim and Kerala & Mahe; **Dry** over rest of the country.

- **Dense fog (visibility 50-199 m)** conditions prevailed at isolated pockets over Odisha.
- **Visibility Reported (In Meters <200 m):** Odisha: Chandbali (50m).

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 15-02-2026):** **below normal (-1.6°C to -3.0°C)** over south peninsular India & East India except Bihar, and **above normal (1.6°C to 3.1°C)** at few places over western Himalayan Region, West Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Rajasthan, Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh, Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland and **near normal** over rest parts of the country. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 6.0°C is reported at PANTNAGAR (UTTARAKHAND) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 14-02-2026):** **The highest maximum temperature** of 37.6°C is reported at KARWAR (KARNATAKA).




Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0830 hours IST)

- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over east Equatorial Indian Ocean and adjoining southeast Bay of Bengal extending upto 5.8 km above mean sea level persisted over the same region at 0830 hrs IST of today, the 15th February 2026. Under its influence, a low pressure area is likely to form over central parts of south Bay of Bengal and adjoining Equatorial Indian Ocean during next 48 hours.
- A **fresh Western Disturbance** seen as a trough in middle level tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level runs roughly along Long. 50°E to the north of Lat. 30°N.
- **Subtropical westerly Jet Stream** with core winds of the order of 140 knots at 12.6 km above mean sea level continues to prevail over North India.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over northeast Assam & neighbourhood at 1.5 km above mean sea level has become less marked.

Weather Outlook for subsequent 3 days


- Isolated/Scattered rainfall activity likely over Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Lakshadweep and Nicobar islands.



15 February (Day 1)

- ❖ **Hot and Humid weather** very likely at isolated places over Coastal Karnataka and Konkan & Goa.
- ❖ **Squally weather with wind speed 35 to 45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph** likely to prevail over some parts of southeast & adjoining southwest Bay of Bengal adjoining to east Equatorial Indian Ocean.


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16 February (Day 2)

- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
- ❖ **Hot and Humid weather** very likely at isolated places over Coastal Karnataka and Konkan & Goa.
- ❖ **Squally weather with wind speed 35 to 45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph** likely to prevail over some parts of southwest & adjoining southeast Bay of Bengal and adjoining east Equatorial Indian Ocean.


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17 February (Day 3)

- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
- ❖ **Hot and Humid weather** very likely at isolated places over Coastal Karnataka.
- ❖ **Squally weather with wind speed 40 to 50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph** likely to prevail over some parts of southwest Bay of Bengal adjoining to east Equatorial Indian Ocean, along and off south Sri Lanka coast.

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18 February (Day 4)


- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands.

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19 February (Day 5)


- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph) likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands.**

When maximum temperature of a station reaches $\geq 40^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\geq 30^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions
(a) Based on Departure from normal

Heat Wave: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal 4.5°C to 6.4°C .
Severe Heat Wave: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal $\geq 6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$

(b). Based on Actual maximum temperature

Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature $\geq 45^{\circ}\text{C}$.
Severe Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature $\geq 47^{\circ}\text{C}$

(c). Criteria for heat wave for coastal stations

When maximum temperature departure is $> 4.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ from normal. Heat Wave may be described provided maximum temperature $\geq 37^{\circ}\text{C}$



When maximum temperature remains 40°C

Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure 4.5°C to 6.4°C .
Severe Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure $> 6.4^{\circ}\text{C}$.



When minimum temperature of a station $\leq 10^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\leq 0^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions.

(a). Based on departure

Cold Wave: Minimum Temperature Departure from normal -4.5°C to -6.4°C .
Severe Cold Wave: Minimum Temperature Departure from normal $\leq -6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$

(b) Based on actual Minimum Temperature (for Plains only)

Cold Wave : When Minimum Temperature is $\leq 4.0^{\circ}\text{C}$
Severe Cold Wave: When Minimum Temperature is $\leq 2.0^{\circ}\text{C}$

(c) For Coastal Stations

When Minimum Temperature departure is $\leq -4.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ & actual Minimum Temperature is $\leq 15^{\circ}\text{C}$



When minimum temperature of a station $\leq 10^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\leq 0^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions
Based on departure

Cold Day: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal -4.5°C to -6.4°C .
Severe Cold Day: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal $\leq -6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$



Phenomenon of small droplets suspended in air and the horizontal visibility $< 1\text{km}$

Moderate Fog: When the visibility between 500-200 metres
Dense Fog: when the visibility between 50- 200 metres
Very Dense Fog: when the visibility < 50 metres



Sudden electrical discharges manifested by a flash of light (Lightning) and a sharp rumbling sound (thunder)



An ensemble of particles of dust or sand energetically lifted to great heights by a strong and turbulent wind.



Ice deposits on ground

Air temperature $\leq 4^{\circ}\text{C}$ (over Plains)



A strong wind that rises suddenly, lasts for atleast 1 minute.

Moderate: Wind speed 52-61 kmph
Severe: Wind speed 62-87 kmph
Very Severe: Wind speed > 87 kmph



Effect of various waves in the sea over specific area

Rough to very rough: Wind speed 41-62 kmph (22-33 knots) & Wave height 2.5-6 metre
High to very high: Wind speed 63-117 kmph (34-63 knots) & Wave height 6-14 metre
Phenomenal: Wind speed > 117 kmph (> 63 knots) & Wave height > 14 metre



Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 62-87 kmph (34-47 knots)
Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 88-117 kmph (48-63 knots)
Very Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 118-165 kmph (64 - 89 knots)
Extremely Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 166-220 kmph (90 -119 knots)
Super Cyclone Storm: Wind speed > 220 kmph (> 119 knots)

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
