- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Gangetic West Bengal on 6th September; Jharkhand during 3rd-7th September; Bihar on 3rd September and during 6th-8th September; Odisha during 3rd-9th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Bihar and Jharkhand during 3rd-9th September; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 3rd-5th September.

- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 5th-8th September; Assam & Meghalaya during 3rd-4th September and during 6th-8th September; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 3rd-9th September.
- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 5th-7th September; Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 3rd-7th September.
- Isolated **heavy rainfall** likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 4th-9th September; Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 3rd-9th September with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Arunachal Pradesh on 3rd September.

West India:

- Isolated **thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Madhya Maharashtra during 3rd-4th September; Marathawada on 3rd September.

South Peninsular India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Kerala & Mahe, North Interior Karnataka, Rayalaseema, South Interior Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Telangana during 3rd-9th September; Lakshadweep during 4th-7th September.
- **Fairly Widespread to Widespread** rainfall likely over Lakshadweep on 3rd September and during 8th-9th September; Coastal Karnataka during 3rd-9th September.

❖ **Heavy Rainfall observed** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today): **Heavy to very heavy rain** at isolated places over East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh and East Madhya Pradesh. **Heavy rain** at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, Bihar, Uttarakhand, West Madhya Pradesh, Madhya Maharashtra and Chhattisgarh.

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 03-09-2026):** **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh and West Madhya Pradesh. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over West Rajasthan and Saurashtra & Kutch; at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gangetic West Bengal, East Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Madhya Maharashtra, Rayalaseema and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at few places over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad; at isolated places over Odisha, Jharkhand, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, Gujarat Region, Marathwada, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Kerala & Mahe. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at most places over Arunachal Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, Vidarbha, Telangana, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Lakshadweep; at few places over Chhattisgarh. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 17.0°C was reported at HALFLONG (ASSAM) over the Plains of India.

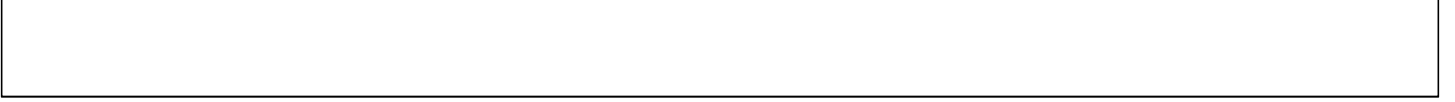
❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 02-09-2026):** **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at most places over Himachal Pradesh; at few places over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at few places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam. **The highest maximum temperature** of 40.6°C was reported at PALAYAMKOTTAI (TAMIL NADU).

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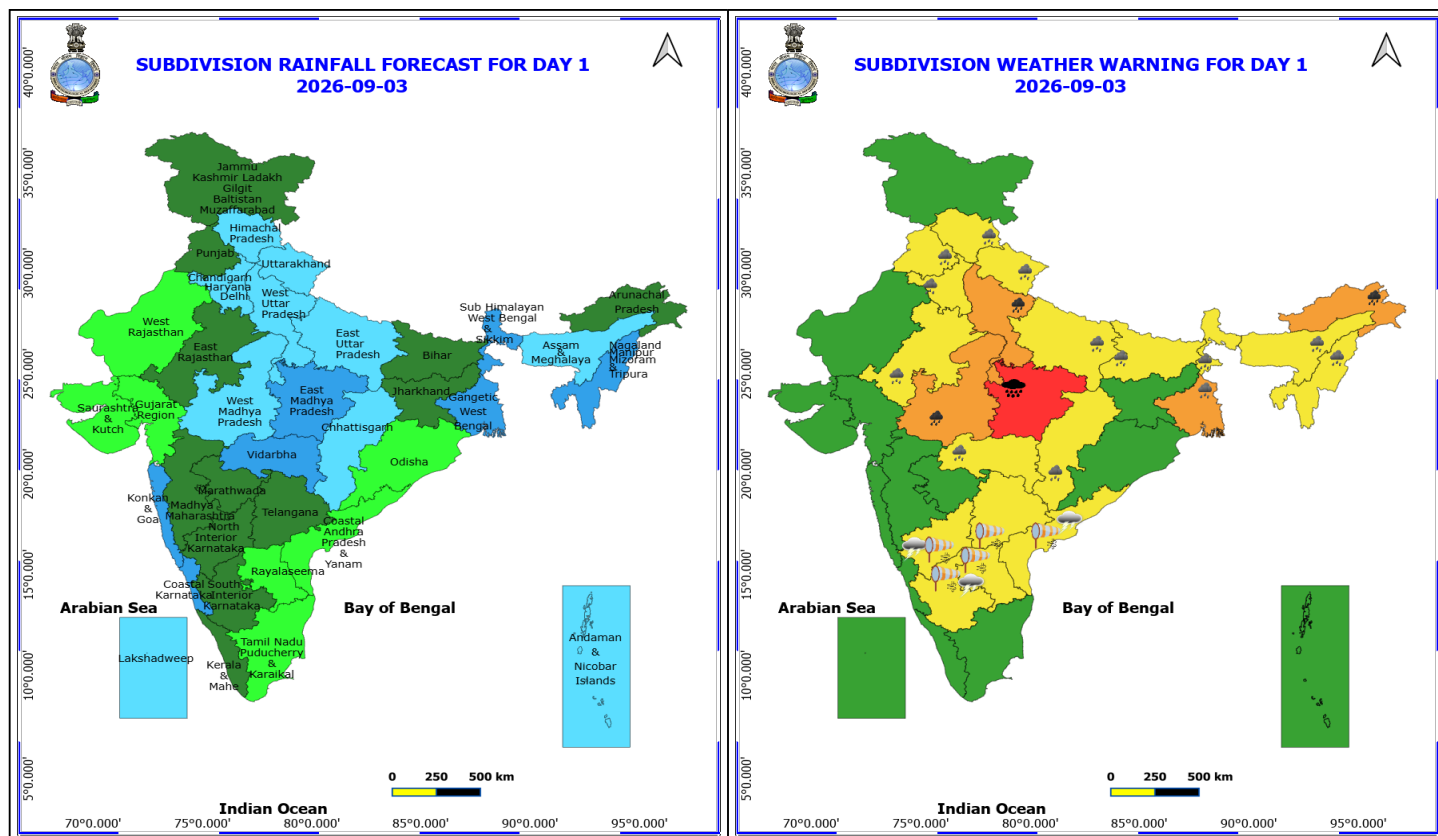
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Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0830 hours IST)

- The **Well Marked low pressure area** over northeast Madhya Pradesh & neighbourhood persisted over the same region at 0830 IST of today, the 03rd September 2026. The associated cyclonic circulation extends upto 7.6 km above mean sea level tilting southwards with height. It is likely to move west-northwestwards across south Uttar Pradesh and adjoining north Madhya Pradesh during next 24 hours.
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- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now passes through Sri Ganganagar, Rohtak, Fatehgarh, centre of **Well Marked low pressure area** over northeast Madhya Pradesh & neighbourhood, Daltonganj, Digha and thence east-southeastwards to northeast Bay of Bengal.
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- The **trough** from the **cyclonic circulation** over northeast Arabian Sea & adjoining Saurashtra to the cyclonic circulation associated with **Well Marked low pressure area** over northeast Madhya Pradesh & neighbourhood across south Gujarat and West Madhya Pradesh between 3.1 & 4.5 Km above mean sea level persists.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a trough in middle tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level now runs roughly along Long. 75°E to the north of Lat. 32°N.
- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over North Haryana & neighbourhood at 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over southwest Bangladesh & neighbourhood and extends upto 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over northeast Assam & neighbourhood at 3.1 km above mean sea level.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over northeast Arabian Sea & adjoining Saurashtra has become less marked.
- The **trough** from northwest Uttar Pradesh to Bangladesh has become less marked.

- ❖ **Heavy Rainfall** likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Odisha and Uttarakhand.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Bihar and Jharkhand.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** likely at isolated places over Uttarakhand.

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Flash Flood Warnings

Flash Flood Risk (FFR) till 1130 IST of 04-09-2026:

Low to Moderate flash flood risk likely over few watersheds & neighbourhoods of following Met Sub-divisions during next 24 hours.

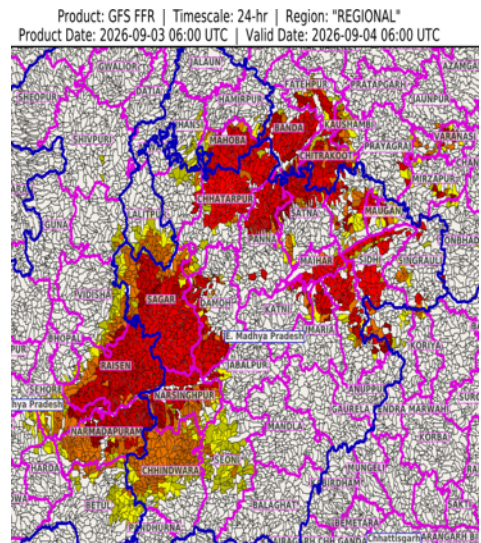

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-02

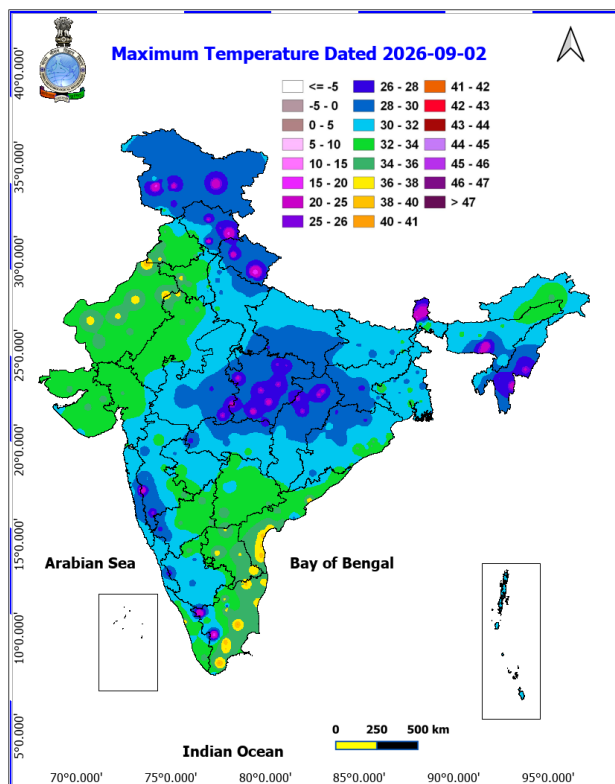


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-09-02

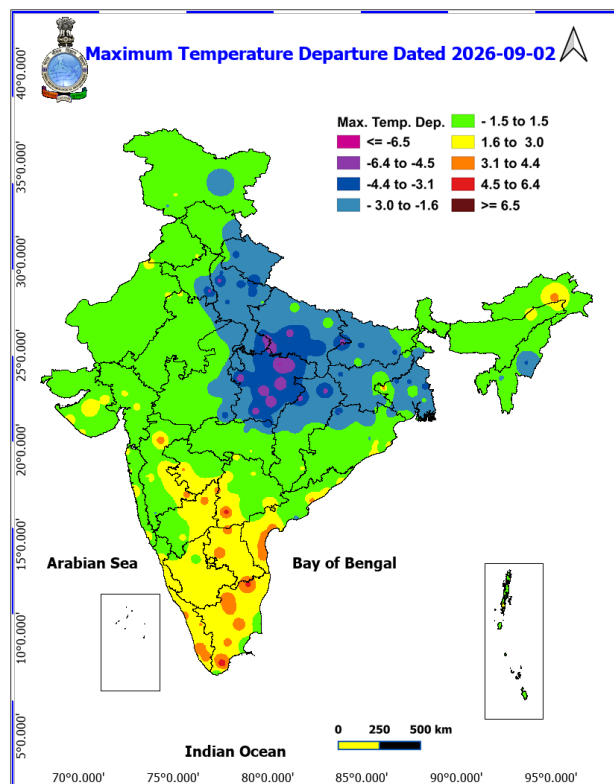


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-09-03

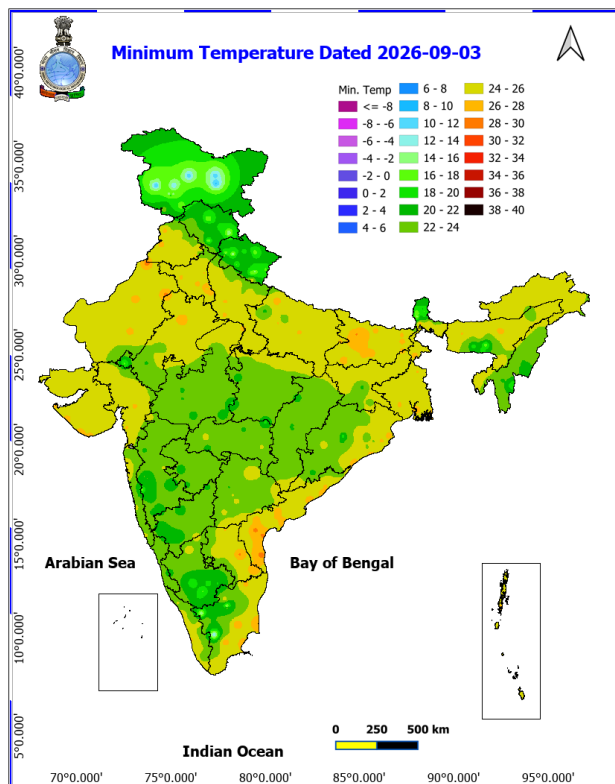
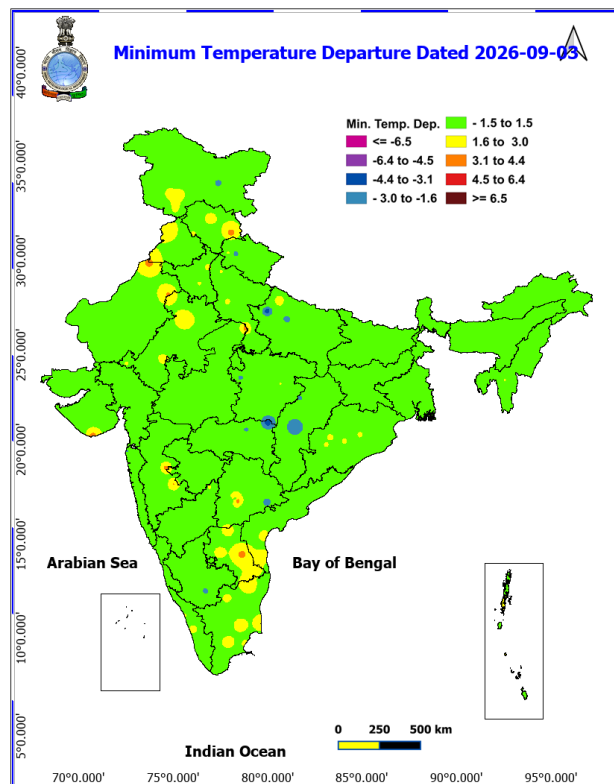
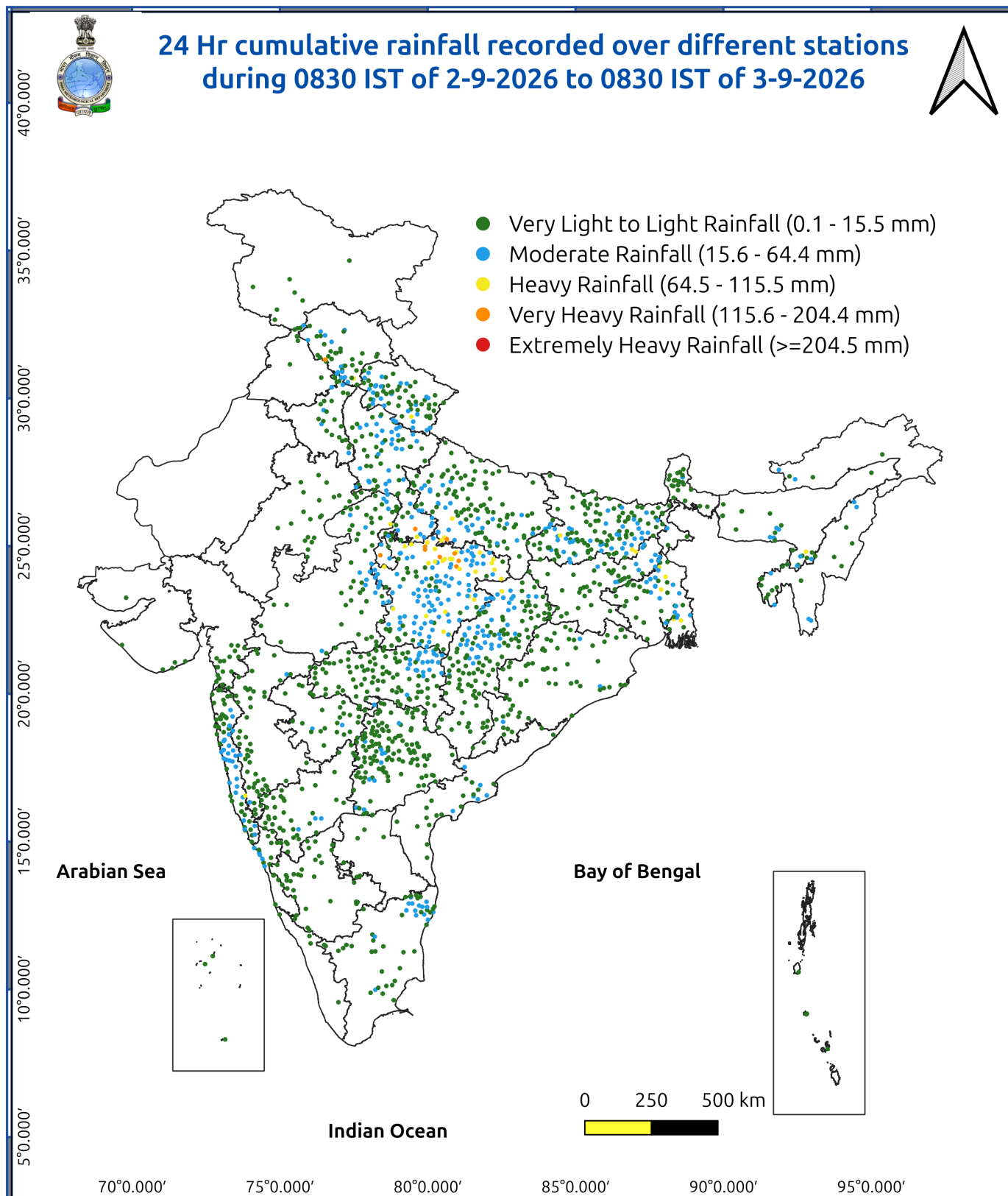


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-09-03





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to very heavy/extremely heavy rainfall:

- **Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to very heavy/extremely heavy rainfall:**
- **Isolated extremely heavy rainfall likely over East Madhya Pradesh on 03rd September.**
- **Isolated heavy to very heavy rainfall very likely over West Madhya Pradesh during 03rd -05th; East Madhya Pradesh on 04th & 05th September.**
- **Moderate to severe lightning over Gangetic West Bengal on 03rd September.**

Impact expected:

- Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of small trees like banana, papaya, drum sticks. Strong wind and rain may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds and rain.
- Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls, huts and roads due to heavy rain.
- Loose objects may fly.
- Small ships, trawlers and boats may be affected.
- Road and rail traffic may be affected due to heavy rain and squally winds.
- There could be localised landslides, mudslides, landslips, water logging, inundation and flooding over low lying areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Helicopter services may get affected.

Action suggested:

- People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees, as there could be lightning.
- In case of expected lightning, unplug electrical/ electronic appliances, immediately, get out of water bodies and keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.
- Tourism and recreational activities to be regulated.
- Onshore and offshore activities to be judiciously regulated.
- Helicopter services to be regulated.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, maintain proper drainage in rice, maize, finger millet, soybean, cowpea, vegetables and orchards to remove excess water. Keep millet fields well drained during panicle initiation and flowering and monitor crops for pest and disease incidence.
- In **Assam** and **Meghalaya**, maintain proper drainage in crop fields and postpone fertilizer and plant-protection applications during rainfall. Continue sowing of pigeon pea, green gram and sesame only where field conditions are suitable and harvest jute at the small-pod stage.
- In **Nagaland**, maintain 3-5 cm water level in wet rice fields and harvest mature maize cobs during suitable weather.
- In **Manipur**, harvest colocasia and mature ginger during rain-free periods and ensure proper drainage in ginger fields.
- In **Mizoram**, prepare fields for sowing black gram, green gram, soybean, sesame and lentil after maize harvest. Ensure drainage in ginger fields and prevent water stagnation to minimise soft-rot and rhizome-rot incidence.
- In **Tripura**, maintain adequate soil moisture in Aus rice during panicle initiation and booting, while ensuring drainage in low-lying groundnut fields to prevent stagnation.
- In **Bihar**, maintain proper drainage in standing crops and avoid field operations under excessively wet conditions. Maintain appropriate standing water in transplanted rice while avoiding prolonged stagnation.

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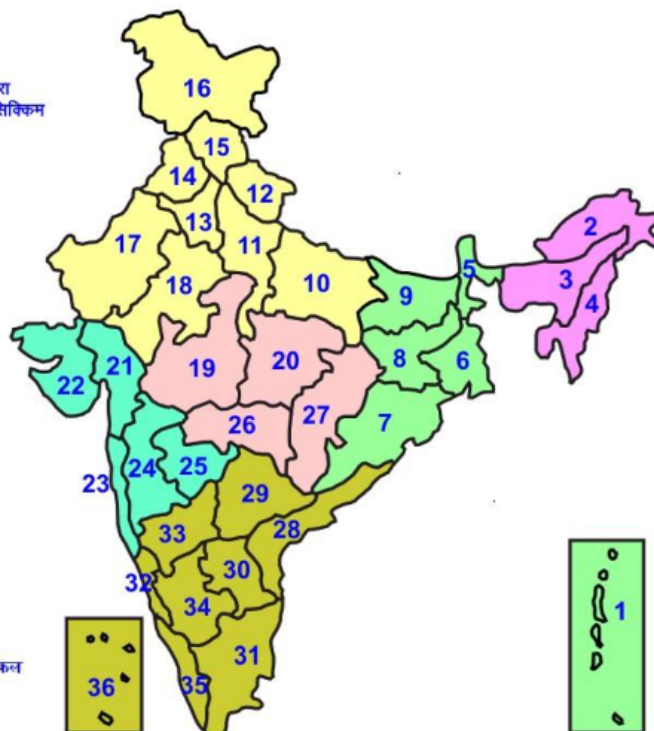
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- In **West Bengal**, keep drainage channels clear in rice, vegetable fields, orchards and nurseries. Protect vegetable seedlings from heavy rain, improve drainage around cucurbits and avoid nitrogen application during wet conditions.
- In **Himachal Pradesh**, keep drainage channels in ginger and turmeric fields clear and functional and ensure prompt removal of excess rainwater from maize fields. Harvest mature vegetables such as cucumber, bottle gourd, bitter gourd, snake gourd, ridge gourd and sponge gourd wherever field conditions permit and keep harvested produce in a safe place.
- In **Punjab** and **Haryana**, maintain proper drainage in standing crop fields and promptly remove excess rainwater from low-lying areas.
- In **Uttarakhand**, avoid irrigation in rice where rainfall is adequate and maintain proper drainage in sugarcane and maize fields. Keep drainage channels clear and provide support to tall crops and vegetables to prevent lodging.
- In **Uttar Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in standing crop fields and postpone irrigation, intercultural operations, fertilizer and plant-protection applications during wet conditions. Provide staking/support to young plants, vegetables and horticultural crops.
- In **East Rajasthan**, Maintain proper drainage in the field to avoid water-logging. Do not spray pesticides during rain. Harvest ripe and marketable fruits of tomato, chilli and brinjal regularly and maintain proper drainage in fields to avoid water logging. To control downy mildew and blast disease in bajra, spray Mancozeb (0.2%) or Metalaxyl especially in Flood Prone Zone.
- In **Madhya Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in soybean, cotton, maize and sugarcane fields to prevent waterlogging; postpone vegetable transplanting and provide support to young fruit plants. Undertake propping in sugarcane to minimise lodging.
- In **Chhattisgarh**, ensure continuous and effective drainage in rice, maize, groundnut, minor millets, pulses and vegetable fields to prevent water stagnation. Clean drainage channels in low-lying maize, ginger, turmeric and vegetable fields and provide staking/support to cucurbits, tomato and capsicum.
- In **Vidarbha**, maintain proper drainage in soybean, cotton, maize and other standing crop fields and remove excess rainwater promptly. Postpone fertilizer, plant protection and intercultural operations until the soil becomes workable and provide support to young vegetables and other vulnerable crops against lodging.
- **Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds**
- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.
- **Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries**
- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.
