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to 50 kmph) likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Bihar during 19th-24th July; Gangetic West Bengal during 19th-21st July; Jharkhand during 19th-22nd July; Odisha during 20th-22nd July.

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Arunachal Pradesh during 21st-23rd July; Assam & Meghalaya during 21st-22nd July.

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at most places** over Assam & Meghalaya, Uttarakhand, Arunachal Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Gangetic West Bengal, Sub-himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, East Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Chhattisgarh, Telangana, Coastal Karnataka and North Interior Karnataka; **at many places** over West Madhya Pradesh, East Uttar Pradesh, Jharkhand, Odisha, Saurashtra & Kutch, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, Bihar, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Kerala & Mahe, Rayalaseema, Gujarat Region, Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal, South Interior Karnataka and Lakshadweep; **Dry** over rest of the country.

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 18-07-2026)**: **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at few places over East Rajasthan; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Punjab, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and East Madhya Pradesh; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Bihar and Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Gangetic West Bengal, West Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Vidarbha, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Coastal Karnataka; at isolated places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, East Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, Coastal Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh, Jharkhand, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Chhattisgarh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana, Rayalaseema, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Lakshadweep; at few places over Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Konkan & Goa and Vidarbha; at isolated places over Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, West Rajasthan and East Rajasthan. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 18.5°C was reported at HALFLONG (ASSAM) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 18-07-2026)**: **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Punjab, East Rajasthan and West Madhya Pradesh; at isolated places over Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, Vidarbha, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, East Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Coastal Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, Uttarakhand, Gujarat Region, Madhya Maharashtra and Chhattisgarh. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Assam & Meghalaya, Marathwada, Telangana, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka; at most places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura and Jharkhand; at few places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar and Rayalaseema. **The highest maximum temperature** of 42.5°C was reported at SRIGANGANAGAR (RAJASTHAN).

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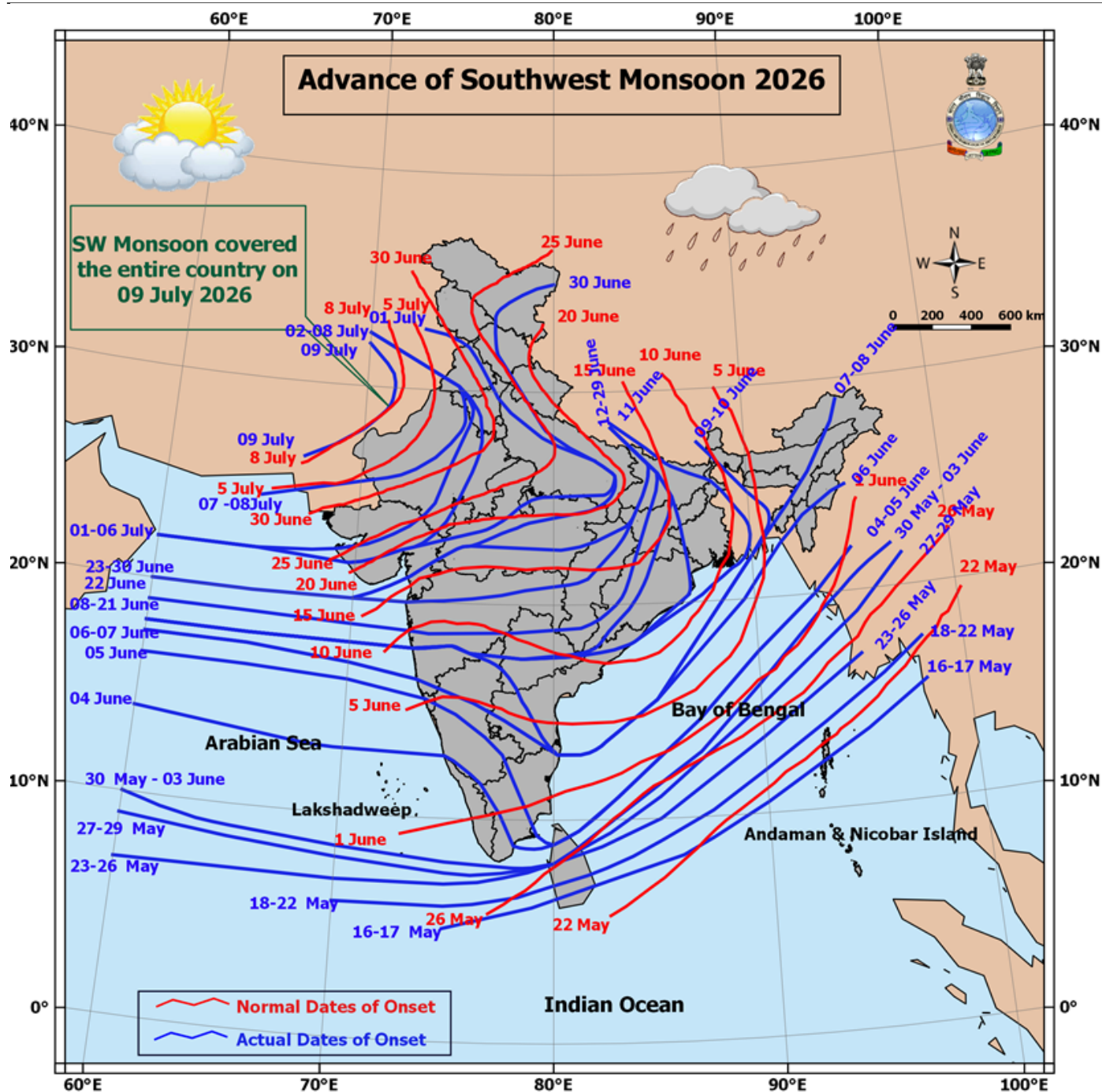
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Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level continues to pass through Amritsar, Karnal, Muzaffarnagar, Varanasi, Dehri, Jamshedpur, Digha and thence southeastwards towards Northwest Bay of Bengal and extends upto 0.9 km above mean sea level.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Western parts of Gangetic West Bengal & adjoining north Jharkhand persists and extends upto 3.1 km above mean sea level.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over north Haryana & neighbourhood extending upto 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over East Uttar Pradesh & neighbourhood between 1.5 & 3.1 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **trough** from North Bihar to Northwest Bay of Bengal across Jharkhand and Gangetic west Bengal between 1.5 & 3.1 Km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Southwest Madhya Pradesh & neighbourhood at 3.1 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over South Odisha & neighbourhood at 5.8 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Northeast Assam & neighbourhood persists and extends upto 3.1 km above mean sea level.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Gulf of Mannar adjoining south Tamil Nadu between 5.8 & 7.6 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a trough in upper level westerlies with its axis at 7.6 km above mean sea level roughly along Long. 70°E to the north of Lat. 30°N persists.

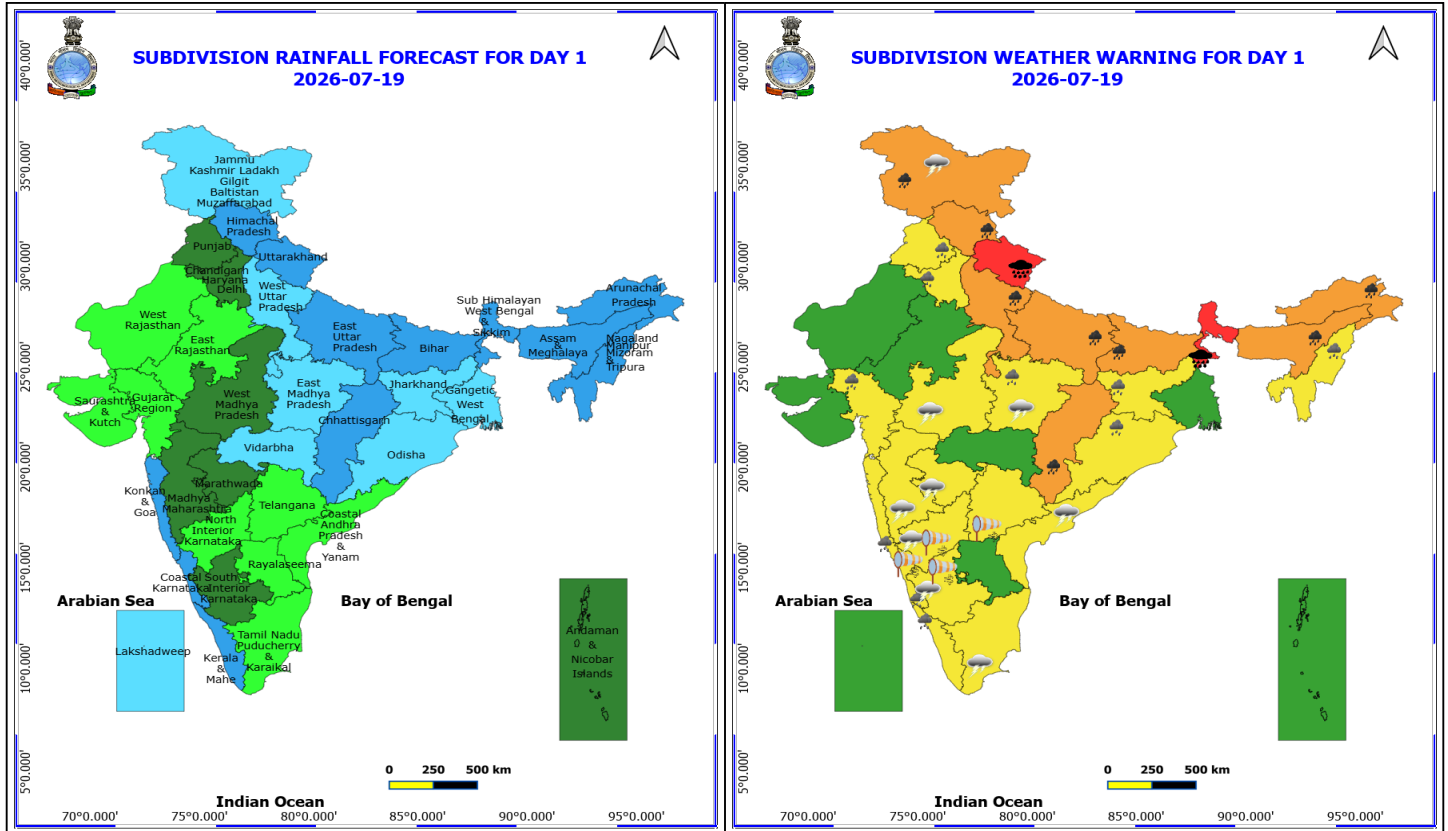


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19 July (Day 1)

- ❖ **Heavy to Very Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and Uttar Pradesh.
- ❖ **Heavy Rainfall** very likely at isolated places over Coastal Karnataka, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Jharkhand, Kerala & Mahe, Konkani & Goa, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Odisha and Punjab.

- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Bihar, Coastal Karnataka, East Rajasthan, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Kerala & Mahe, Rayalaseema and Telangana.
- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Chhattisgarh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand and Vidarbha.
- ❖ **Strong Surface Winds** very likely at isolated places over Karnataka and Telangana.
- ❖ **Arabian Sea:** Squally wind with speed 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail over most parts of west central adjoining few parts of east central and some parts of north and south west Arabian Sea and, along and off

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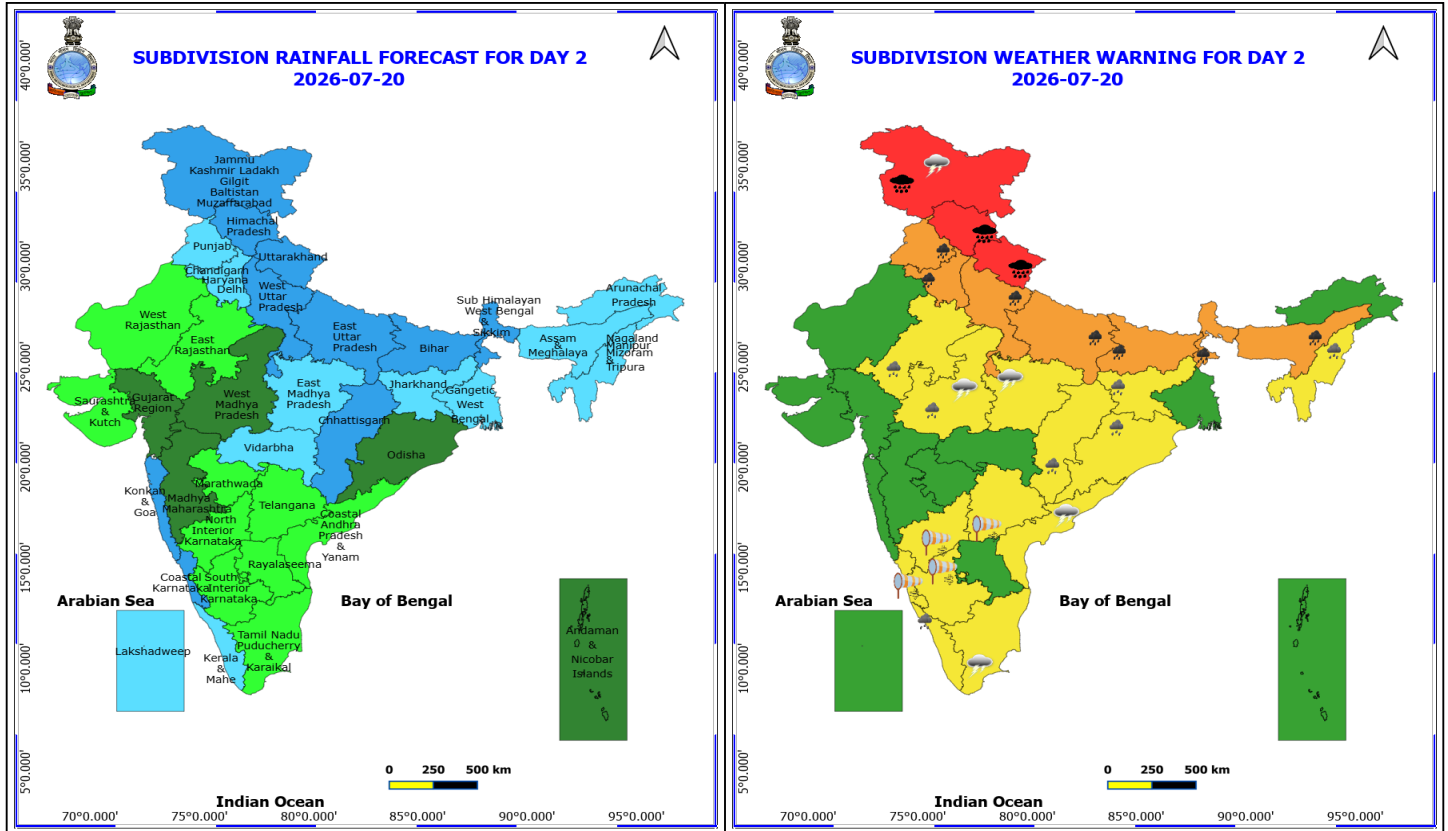
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Somalia, Oman and North Gujarat Coasts.

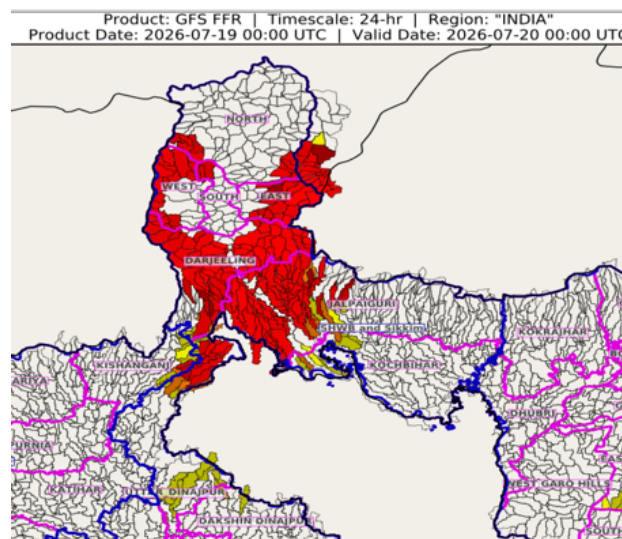

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-07-18

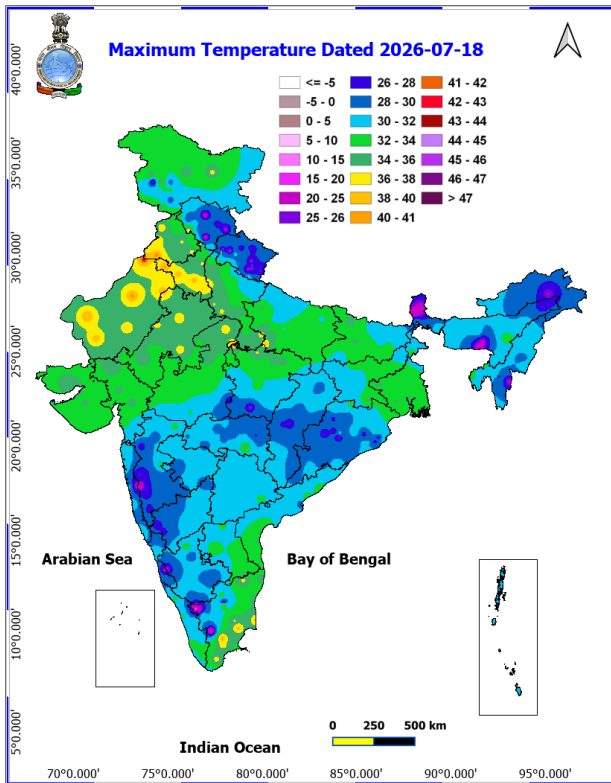


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-07-18

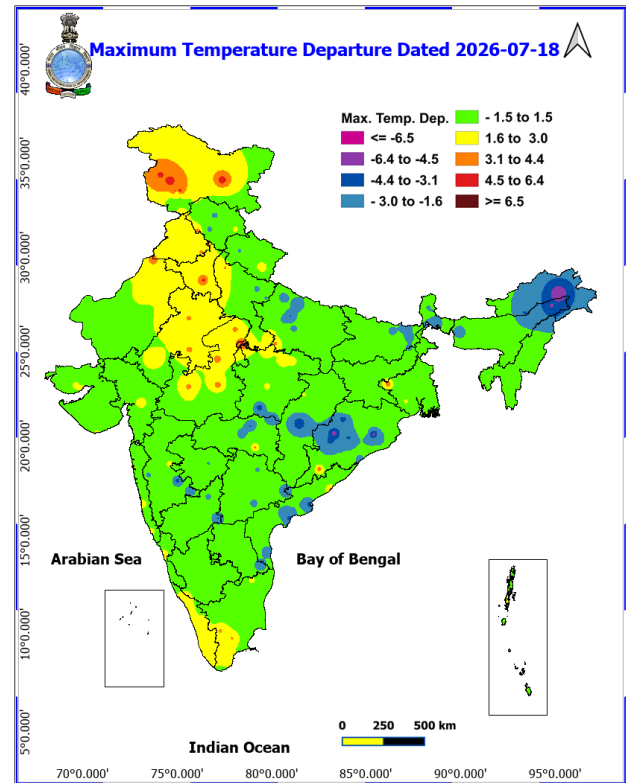


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-07-18

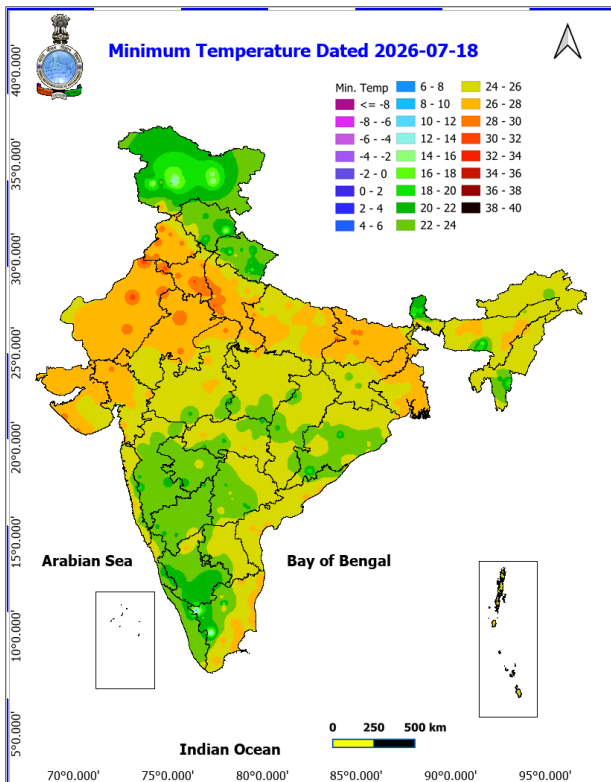
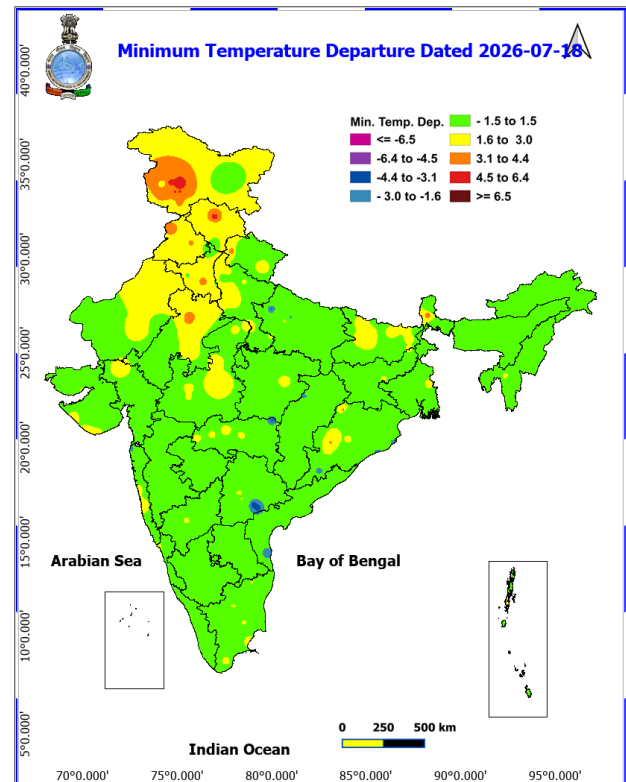
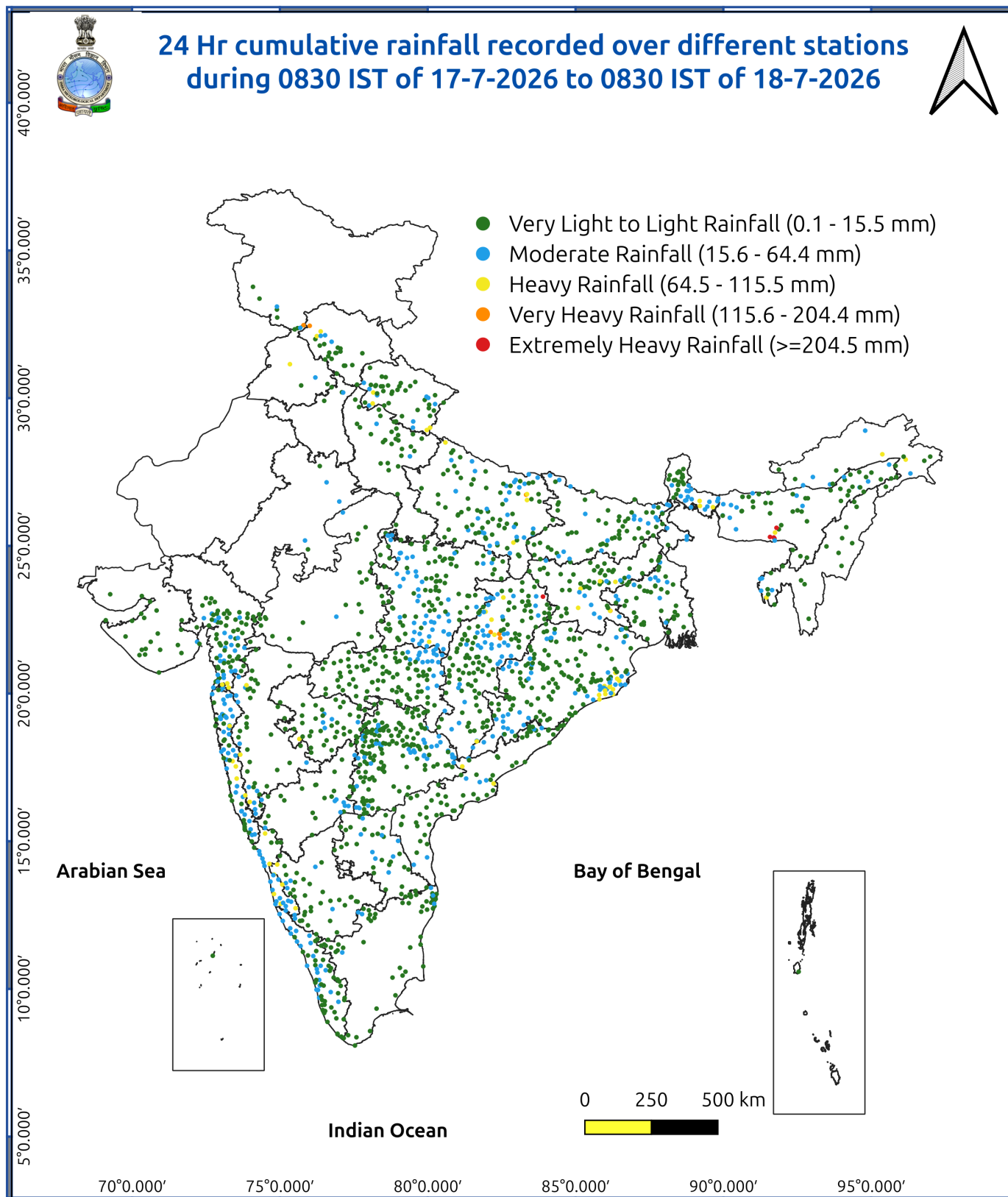


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-07-18





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Impact and Actions

Impact Expected & Action Suggested due to heavy/very heavy/extremely heavy rainfall

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall likely over parts of northwest, east and northeast India during next 6-7 days with heavy to very heavy rainfall at few places with extremely heavy rainfall likely at isolated places over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and Himachal Pradesh on 20th & 21st; over Uttarakhand on 19th & 20th; over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 19th.**

Impact Expected

- Localized Flooding of roads, water logging in low lying areas and closure of underpasses mainly in urban areas.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Disruption of traffic in major cities due to water logging in roads leading to increased travel time.
- Minor damage to kutcha roads.
- Possibilities of damage to vulnerable structure.
- Localized Landslides/Mudslides/landslips/mudslips/landsinks/mudsinks.
- Damage to horticulture and standing crops in some areas due to inundation.
- It may lead to riverine flooding in some river catchments (for riverine flooding please visit Web page of CWC)

Action Suggested

- Check for traffic congestion on your route before leaving for your destination.
- Follow any traffic advisories that are issued in this regard.
- Avoid going to areas that face the water logging problems often.
- Avoid staying in vulnerable structure.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall

- In **Assam**, maintain continuous and effective drainage of excess rainwater from sugarcane, soybean, pigeon pea, jute, sesame fields and fruit orchards to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Harvest mature crops wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Meghalaya**, maintain effective drainage in rice nursery beds and fields of maize, cowpea, okra and ginger. Strengthen nursery bunds and field channels to prevent runoff, seedling washout and waterlogging.
- In **Chhattisgarh**, maintain continuous drainage in rice nurseries and standing fields of maize, soybean, pigeon pea and minor millets to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.
- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, ensure continuous drainage of excess rainwater from rice, maize, soybean and finger millet fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging.
- In **Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura** ensure continuous and effective drainage and remove any accumulated rainwater from soybean, black gram, ginger, turmeric, cole crop and vegetable fields to prevent residual waterlogging.
- In **Sikkim**, ensure proper drainage in rice nurseries and standing crop fields to prevent waterlogging.
- In **Sub Himalayan West Bengal**, ensure continuous and effective drainage in rice nurseries, jute, ginger and vegetable fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Inspect and strengthen bunds around rice nurseries and harvest mature tea leaves and vegetables wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Jharkhand**, ensure proper drainage in standing crop fields to prevent waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.
- In **Bihar**, ensure continuous drainage in rice, maize, sesame and pigeon pea fields to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.
- In **Odisha**, maintain continuous drainage and keep field channels clear to prevent prolonged waterlogging in rice, maize, pulses, oilseed and vegetable fields. Strengthen field bunds and postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions become suitable.

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- In **Uttarakhand**, postpone sowing of groundnut, soybean and maize. Ensure proper drainage in rice, tomato and chilli fields to prevent waterlogging. Harvest mature tomato only during rain-free periods and continue rice transplanting wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Himachal Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in maize, finger millet, cucurbit, tomato and capsicum fields to prevent waterlogging. Harvest mature crops wherever field conditions permit.
- In **Uttar Pradesh**, ensure proper drainage in rice, maize, sesame and pigeon pea fields to prevent waterlogging. Postpone irrigation, fertilizer and plant protection operations until field conditions improve.
- In **Keralam**, provide adequate drainage facilities in banana, coconut, cardamom, ginger, black pepper and vegetables. Provide staking support in banana plants and strengthen the pandals of vegetable crops. Avoid transplanting of rice during heavy rain.
- In **Interior part of Karnataka**, ensure proper drainage in rice seedbeds, rice fields and fruit orchards fields of maize and ginger and plantations of arecanut and coconut to prevent water stagnation.
- In the regions expecting heavy rainfall, including **Jammu & Kashmir, Punjab, Haryana Konkan & Goa and Madhya Maharashtra** withhold irrigation in standing crops, make necessary arrangements to remove excess rain water from the crop fields.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

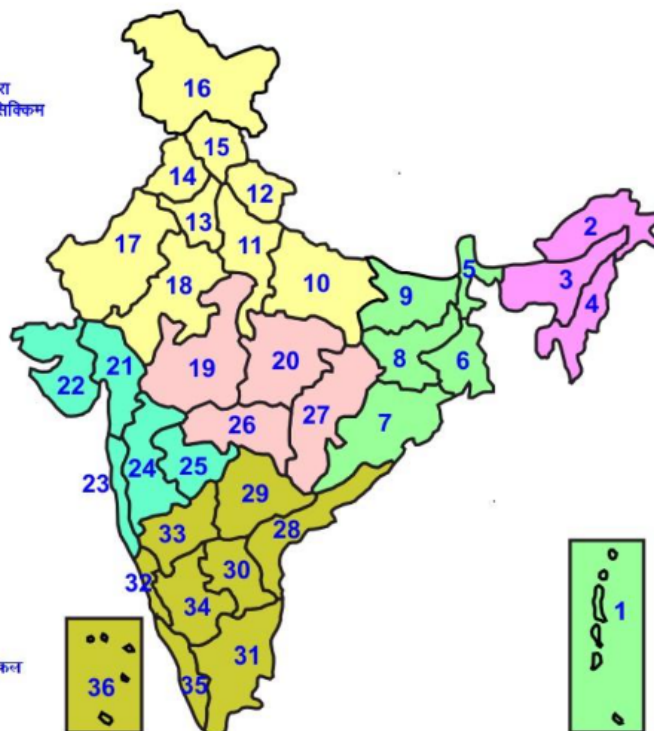
- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- In regions with high temperatures and heat wave conditions, provide clean, cool drinking water to animals, and cover the roofs of poultry sheds with grass to reduce the adverse effects of heat.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.
