- **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 02-01-2026)**: **below normal(-1.6°C to -3.0°C)** at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Gangetic West Bengal and Bihar; at isolated places over Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir/Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Madhya Maharashtra, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and South Interior Karnataka. **appreciably below normal(-5.0°C to -3.1°C)** at few places over Himachal Pradesh; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Bihar, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Chhattisgarh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe. **markedly below normal(< -5.0°C)** at many places over Himachal Pradesh; at few places over Assam & Meghalaya, Gangetic West Bengal, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh and Gujarat Region; at isolated places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, Jharkhand, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema, North Interior Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 4.5°C is reported at NARNAUL (HARYANA) over the Plains of India.




Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0830 hours IST)

- The **Western disturbance** as an **upper air cyclonic circulation** over north Pakistan & adjoining Punjab now seen over northwest Uttar Pradesh & neighbourhood at 3.1 km above mean sea level with a trough aloft in middle and upper tropospheric level with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level roughly along Long. 75°E to the north of Lat. 33°N.
- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over Northwest Bangladesh & adjoining Sub-Himalayan West Bengal at 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over northeast Assam & neighbourhood at 3.1 km above mean sea level.
- **Subtropical westerly Jet Stream** with core winds of the order of 115 knots at 12.6 km above mean sea level continues to prevail over north India.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over southwest Bay of Bengal off Sri Lanka coasts persists and now extends upto 3.1 km above mean sea level.
- A **trough** runs from the above **upper air cyclonic circulation** over southwest Bay of Bengal off Sri Lanka coast to interior Tamilnadu across north Sri Lanka & coastal Tamil Nadu at 0.9 km above mean sea level.
- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over Coastal Karnataka at 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- The induced **upper air cyclonic circulation** over Punjab & neighbourhood extending upto 1.5 km above mean sea level has become less marked.
- The **trough** from Lakshadweep to Comorin area at 3.1 km above mean sea level has become less marked.

Weather Outlook for subsequent 3 days

- Scattered to fairly widespread rainfall activity over Tamil Nadu and Nicobar islands.




Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-01-01








Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-01-02

Impact and Actions

Impact expected due to dense/very dense fog in the night/morning hours:

Dense to Very dense fog conditions very likely to continue during night/morning hours at many/some places over Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh till 07th; West Uttar Pradesh till 05th; East Uttar Pradesh till 05th & during 08th & 09th; Odisha till 06th January, 2026.

Dense fog conditions also likely during night/morning hours in isolated pockets Jammu division, north Madhya Pradesh till 06th; Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura till 07th; Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh on 08th & 09th; West Uttar Pradesh during 06th-09th; East Uttar Pradesh on 06th & 07th; Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, West Bengal & Sikkim on 03rd & 04th; Jharkhand till 05th; Odisha on 07th; Arunachal Pradesh till 03rd and Bihar till 08th January 2026.

Transport and Aviation:

- May affect some airports, highways and railway routes in the areas of met- sub-division.
- Difficult driving conditions with slower journey times.
- Unless taken precautionary measures, it may lead to some road traffic collisions.

Power Sector:

- Chances of Tripping of Power lines in the very dense fog routes.

Human Health:

- Lung related health impacts: Dense fog contains particulate matter and other pollutants and in case exposed it gets lodged in the lungs, clogging them and decreasing their functional capacity which increases episodes of wheezing, coughing and shortness of breath.
- Impact on people having asthma bronchitis: Long time exposure to dense fog may cause respiratory problem for people having asthma bronchitis and other lung related health problems.
- Eye Irritation: Dense fog contains pollutions of various types and these Pollutants in the air if exposed may tend to irritate the membranes of the eye causing various infections leading to redness or swelling of the eye.

Action suggested:

Transport and Aviation:

- Be careful while driving or outing through any transport.
- Use fog lights during driving.
- Be in touch with airlines, railways and state transport for schedule of your journey.

Power Sector:

- To keep ready Maintenance Team.
- Human Health: To avoid outing until unless emergency and to cover the face.

- Eat vitamin-C rich fruits & vegetable and drink sufficient fluids preferably warm fluids to maintain adequate immunity.
- Avoid or limit outdoor activities.
- Keep dry, if wet, change cloths immediately to prevent loss of body heat. Wear insulated/waterproof shoes.
- Warm the affected area of the body slowly with lukewarm water; do not rub the skin vigorously.
- If the affected skin area turns black, immediately consult a doctor.
- Maintain ventilation while using Heaters to avoid inhaling toxic fumes.
- Take safety measures while using electrical and gas heating devices.
- Extreme care needed for vulnerable people.
- Seek medical attention as soon as possible for someone suffering from frostbite/ Hypothermia.
- Protect livestock from cold weather.

- Avoid or limit outdoor activities.
- Keep dry, if wet, change cloths immediately to prevent loss of body heat. Wear insulated/waterproof shoes.
- Warm the affected area of the body slowly with lukewarm water; do not rub the skin vigorously.
- If the affected skin area turns black, immediately consult a doctor.
- Maintain ventilation while using Heaters to avoid inhaling toxic fumes.
- Take safety measures while using electrical and gas heating devices.
- Extreme care needed for vulnerable people.
- Seek medical attention as soon as possible for someone suffering from frostbite/ Hypothermia.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Cold Waves / Low Temperatures

- In **Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Haryana** and **Meghalaya** apply light and frequent irrigation to the standing crops in the evening to protect the crops from low temperature stress or cold injuries. Use mulching and cover vegetable nurseries and young fruit plants with straw / polythene sheets to maintain optimum soil temperature.
- In **Tamil Nadu**, drain out excess water from standing crop fields and vegetables.

Livestock / Poultry

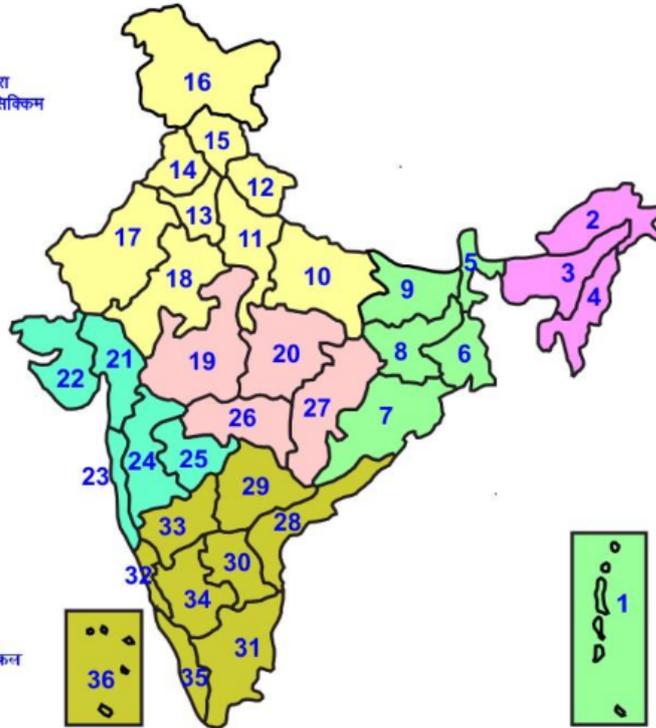
- Keep cattle inside the sheds during night and provide dry bedding to protect them from cold.
- Keep the chicks warm by providing artificial light in the poultry sheds.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.
