ALL INDIA WEATHER SUMMARY AND FORECAST BULLETIN

Significant Weather Features

Weather Forecast and Warnings

- Isolated to scattered light/moderate rainfall/snowfall very likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad during 27th -30th and over Himachal Pradesh on 28th & 30th & over Uttarakhand on 29th & 30th December.
- Isolated Thunderstorm and lightning** with gusty wind speed (30-40kmph) likely to prevail over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 27th -29th December.

Forecast of minimum temperatures:

- Gradual fall in minimum temperature by 2-4°C very likely over Northwest for next 2 days and no significant change thereafter for subsequent 5 days.
- Gradual fall in minimum temperature by 2-3°C very likely over East India for next 3 days and no significant change thereafter for subsequent 4 days.
- No significant change in minimum temperature over northeast India for next 2 days and thereafter gradual fall by 3-4°C for subsequent 5 days.
- No significant change in minimum temperature over remaining parts of the country during next 7 days.

Dense Fog & Cold wave Warnings:

- Dense to very dense fog conditions** during night/morning hours very likely in many parts of East Uttar Pradesh till 28th; in some parts of East Uttar Pradesh during 29th -31st; West Uttar Pradesh till 28th; Punjab till 27th; in isolated pockets of Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad till 28th; Himachal Pradesh till 29th; Uttarakhand till 29th; Punjab and Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi during 27th -29th; Uttar Pradesh on 28th & 29th with **Dense fog conditions** during night/morning hours very likely in some pocket of Bihar till 25th and isolated pockets over East Madhya Pradesh and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim till 26th; over Gangetic West Bengal till 25th; over Odisha till 29th; Assam & Meghalaya till 29th; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura till 27th; Bihar during 25th -29th; West Uttar Pradesh, Punjab and Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi during 29th -31st December.
- Cold wave conditions** very likely in isolated pockets of Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand and Rajasthan during 25th -27th December.
- Cold day to severe cold day conditions** very likely in isolated pockets of Uttarakhand during 24th -27th **Cold day conditions** very likely in some parts of East Uttar Pradesh during 24th -26th; isolated pockets of Bihar 24th -28th December.

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Main Weather Observations:

- ❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today): **at isolated places** over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya and Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad; **Dry** over rest of the country.
- ❖ **Significant rainfall recorded(in cm)** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today): **Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad**: Rajouri ARG (dist Rajouri), Sonemarg Dual AWS (dist Ganderbal), Gulmarg AWS (dist Baramula) 1 Each.
- ❖ **Fog Condition Observed (at 0830 hours of today)**: **Dense to very Dense fog** prevailed in some/many parts of Uttar Pradesh; in isolated pockets of Odisha, Himachal Pradesh; **dense fog**:reported in isolated pockets of Tripura, West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh and Madhya Pradesh.
- ❖ **Visibility reported (at 0830 hours of today)**: **Visibility in meter reported**: **Gangetic West Bengal**:Durgapur, Sriniketan (50m) each; **Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim**:Coochbehar (100m); **Odisha**: Sambalpur, Rourkela (0-49m) each; Jharsuguda, Hirakud (50-199m) each; **Bihar**:Gaya (50m); Bhagalpur (50-199m); **Himachal Pradesh**: Bilaspur (20 m) & Sundernagar (70 m); **Uttarakhand**: Pantnagar (200 m), Khatima (60m); **Punjab**:Adampur IAF(0m), Pathankot IAF(100m) ; **Haryana and Chandigarh**: Chandigarh (100 M); Ambala (150M); **West Uttar Pradesh**:Sarsawa (IAF) & Bareilly(IAF)-00 each, Etawah-40, Bareilly(O)-50, Najibabad-(80m) ; **East Uttar Pradesh**:Prayagraj(IAF) & Kanpur(IAF)-00 Each, Kanpur(City)-10, Prayagraj & Bahraich-20 Each, Fursatganj, Ayodhya, Churk & Varanasi(AP)-50 Each, Fatehgarh & Hardoi-80 Each, Sultanpur, Lucknow(AP) & Barabanki-100 Each; **Tripura**: Agartala-(100m).
- **Cold day to severe cold day conditions** observed at isolated places over Uttarakhand and East Uttar Pradesh; **cold day conditions** in isolated pockets of West Uttar Pradesh.
- ❖ **Minimum Temperatures departures were markedly below normal (<-5.1°C)** at a isolated places Chhattisgarh;appreciably below normal (-5.0°C to -3.1°C) at few places over North Interior Karnataka and Telangana; at isolated places over Marathawada, Vidarbha, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal & Andaman & Nicobar Islands and below normal (-1.6°C to -3.0°C) at a few places over Kerala & Mahe, Coastal Karnataka and South Interior Karnataka ; at isolated places over Madhya Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, Odisha, Bihar, Gangetic West Bengal, Assam and Lakshadweep.**The lowest minimum temperature of 5.0 was observed over Sikar (East Rajasthan) over the plains of India.**
- ❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 23-12-2025)**: **below normal(-1.6°C to -3.0°C)** at isolated places over Bihar. **The highest maximum temperature** of 35.0°C is reported at PUNALUR (KERALA).

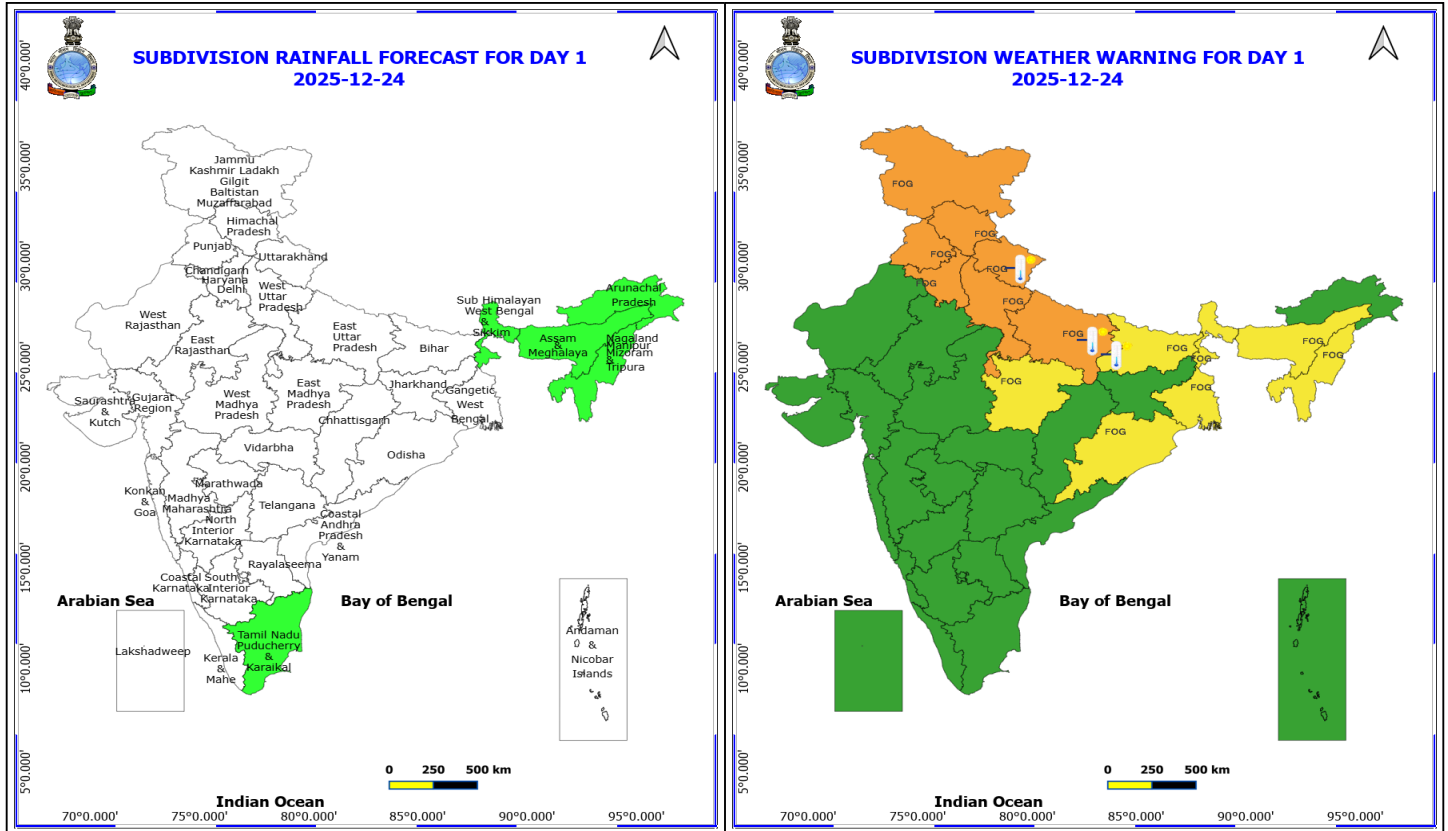


Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0830 hours IST)

- **Subtropical westerly Jet Stream** with core winds of the order of 130 knots at 12.6 km above mean sea level prevails over Northeast India.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over south east Arabian sea adjoining south Kerala extending upto 1.5 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a trough in middle and upper tropospheric levels with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level roughly along Long. 74°E to the north of Lat. 32°N has moved away in east-northeastwards direction.
- A **fresh feeble Western Disturbance** is likely to affect Western Himalayan Region from 27th December, 2025.

Weather Outlook for subsequent 3 days

- Isolated to Scattered rainfall activity over Western Himalayana Region, Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Karnataka and Islands.

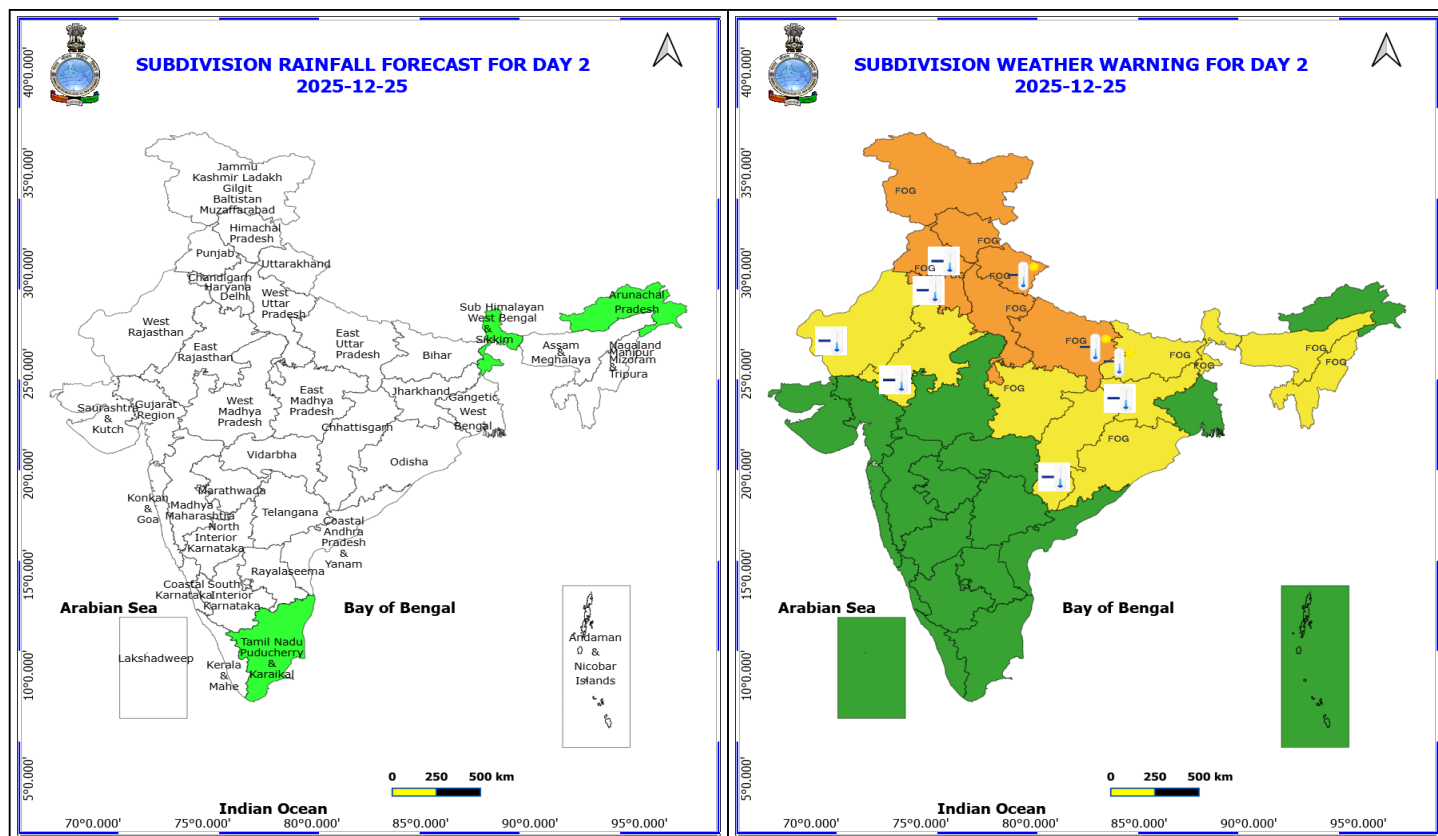
- ❖ **Cold Day conditions** very likely at isolated places over Bihar and East Uttar Pradesh.
- ❖ **Cold Day to Severe Cold Day conditions** very likely at isolated places over Uttarakhand.
- ❖ **Dense Fog** very likely at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, East Madhya Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Odisha and West Bengal & Sikkim.
- ❖ **Dense to Very Dense Fog** very likely at isolated places over Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Punjab, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand.
- ❖ **Squally winds with speeds reaching 45 kmph to 55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph** is likely to prevail along and off Somalia coast, adjoining sea area, over Comorin area & adjoining, some parts of Gulf of Mannar.

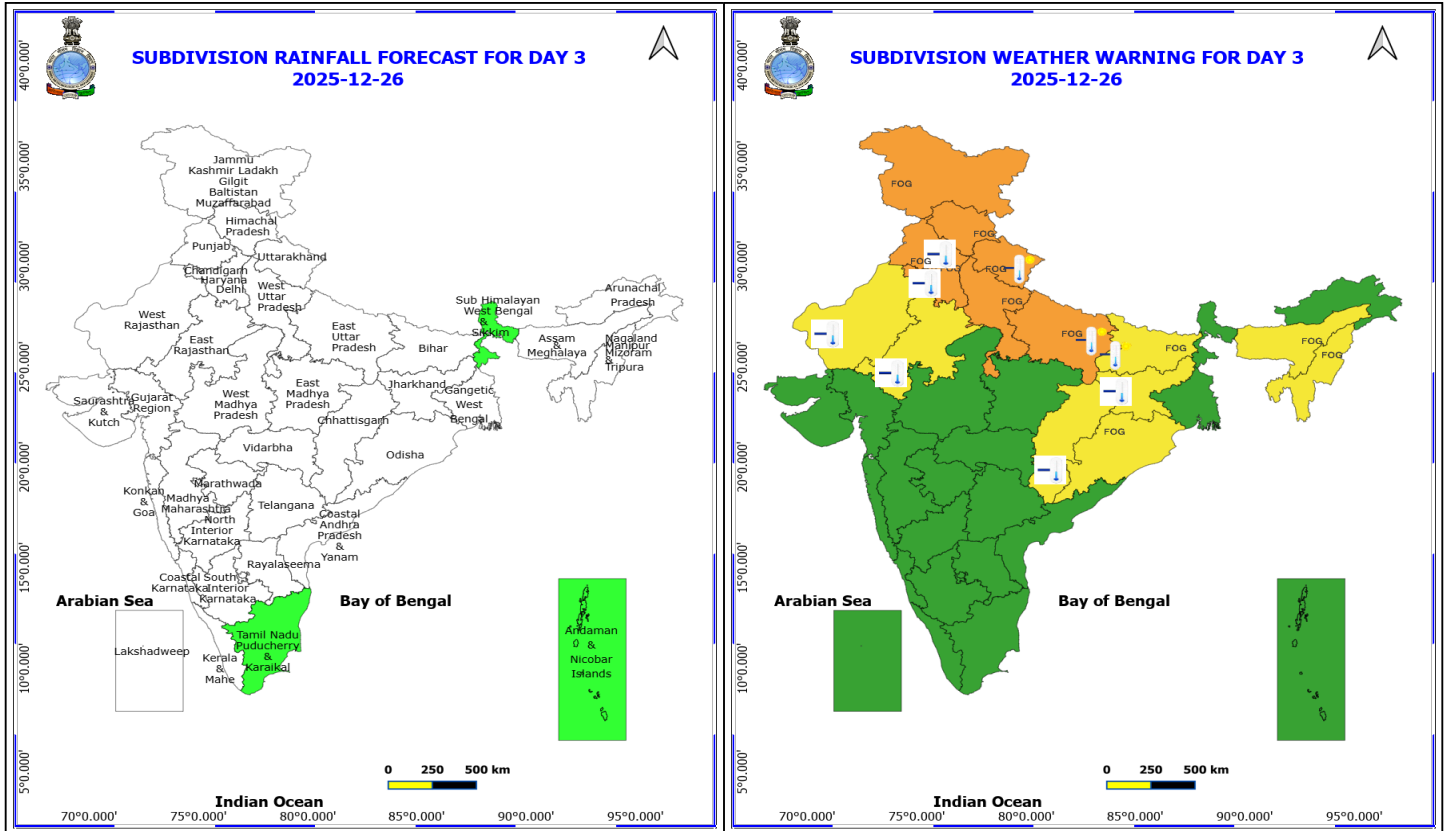

- ❖ **Cold Day to Severe Cold Day conditions** very likely at isolated places over Uttarakhand.

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2025-12-23

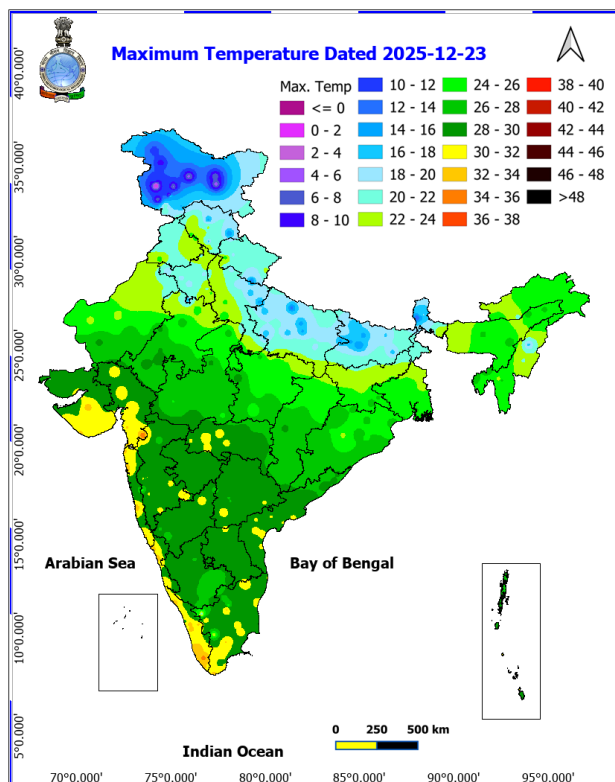


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2025-12-23

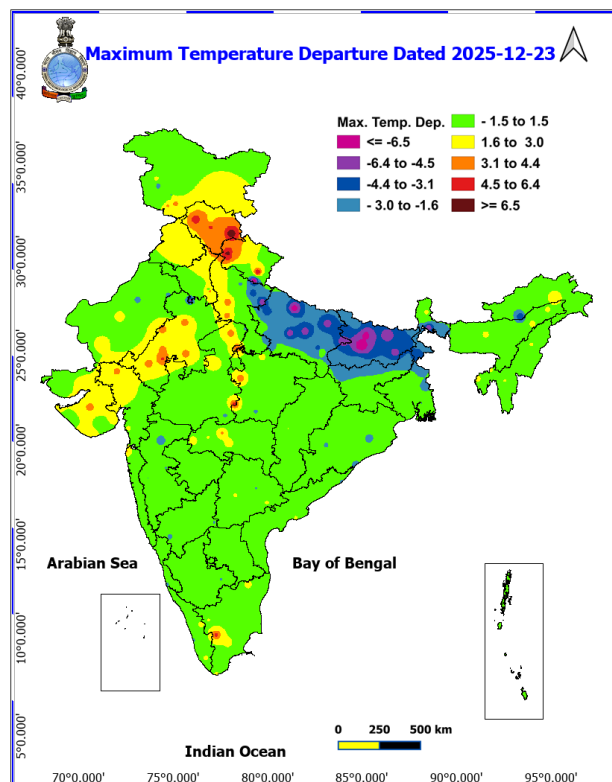


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2025-12-24

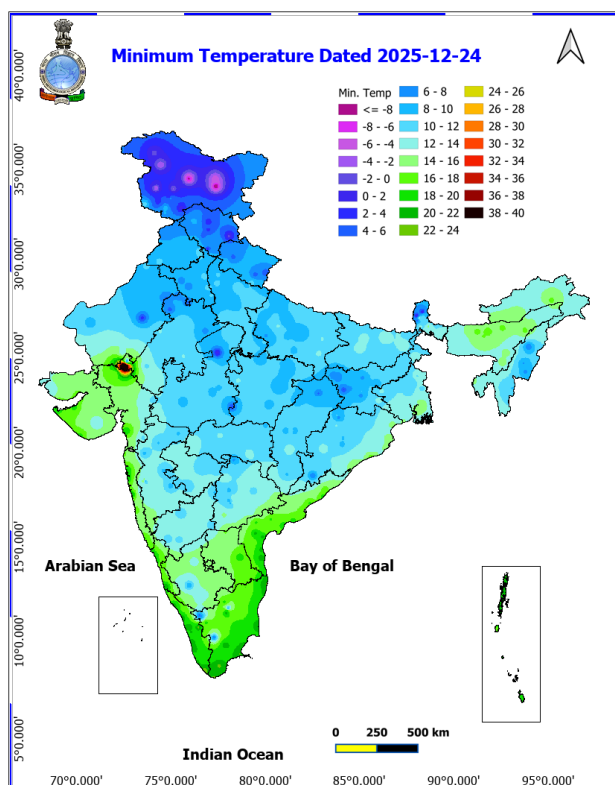
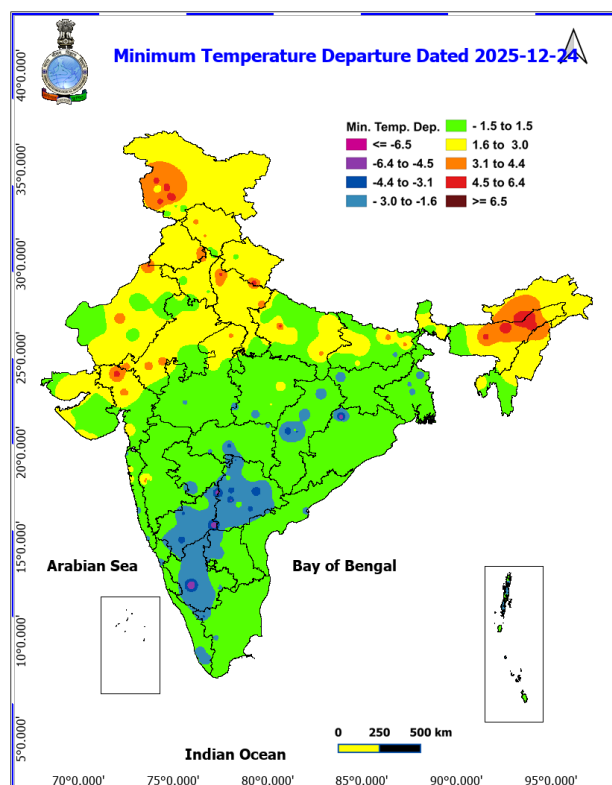
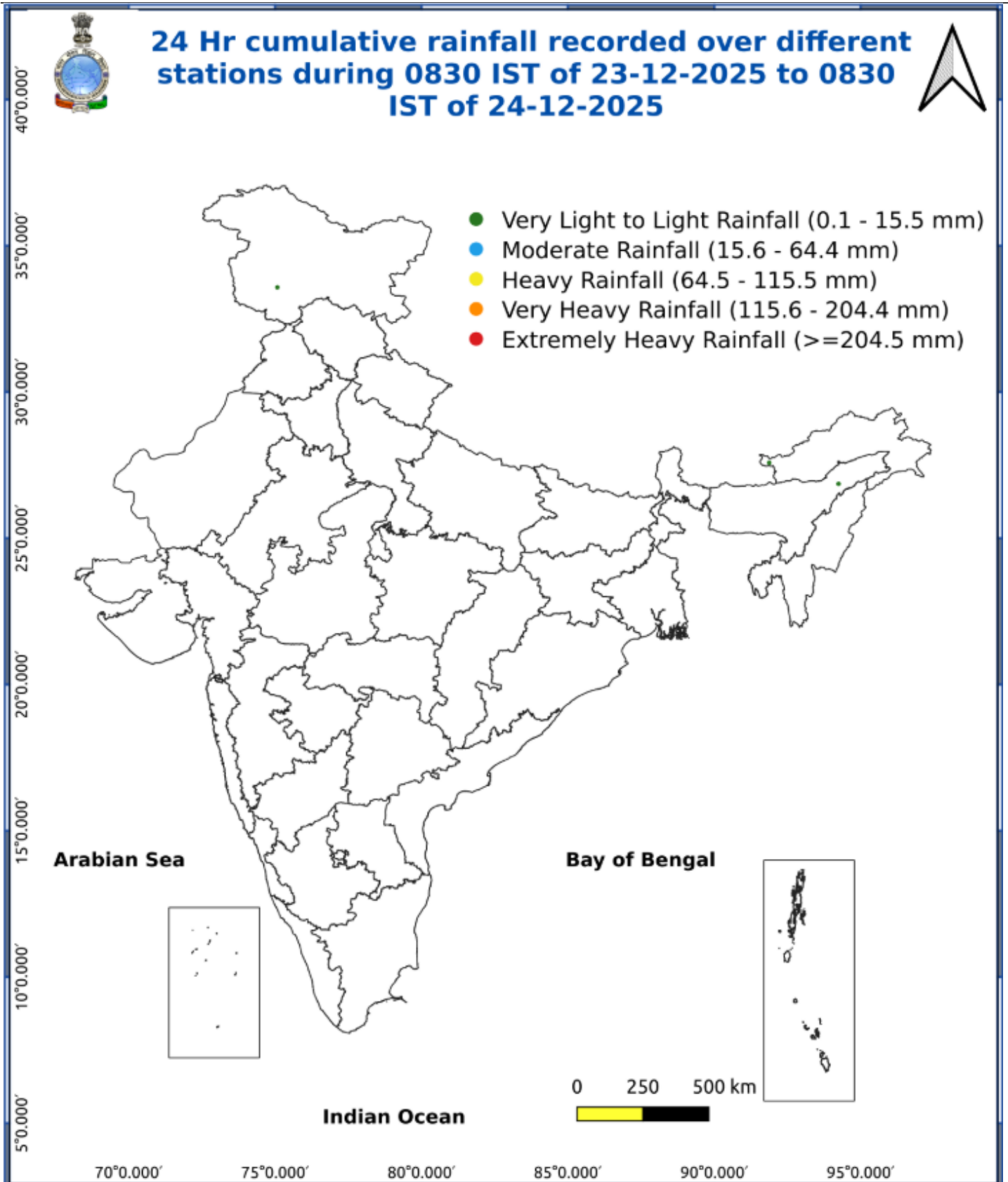


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2025-12-24





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Impact and Actions

Impact expected due to dense/very dense fog in the night/morning hours:

- **Dense to very dense fog conditions** during night/morning hours very likely in many parts of East Uttar Pradesh till 28th ; in some parts of East Uttar Pradesh during 29th -31st ; West Uttar Pradesh till 28th ; Punjab till 27th ; in isolated pockets of Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad till 28th; Himachal Pradesh till 29th; Uttarakhand till 29th ; Punjab and Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi during 27th -29th; Uttar Pradesh on 28th & 29th with **Dense fog conditions** during night/morning hours very likely in some pocket of Bihar till 25th and isolated pockets over East Madhya Pradesh and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim till 26th; over Gangetic West Bengal till 25th ; over Odisha till 29th ; Assam & Meghalaya till 29th ; Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura till 27th ; Bihar during 25th -29th; West Uttar Pradesh, Punjab and Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi during 29th -31st December.

❖ Transport and Aviation:

- May affect some airports, highways and railway routes in the areas of met- sub-division.
- Difficult driving conditions with slower journey times.
- Unless taken precautionary measures, it may lead to some road traffic collisions.

❖ Power Sector:

- Chances of Tripping of Power lines in the very dense fog routes.

❖ Human Health:

- Lung related health impacts: Dense fog contains particulate matter and other pollutants and in case exposed it gets lodged in the lungs, clogging them and decreasing their functional capacity which increases episodes of wheezing, coughing and shortness of breath.
- Impact on people having asthma bronchitis: Long time exposure to dense fog may cause respiratory problem for people having asthma bronchitis and other lung related health problems.
- Eye Irritation: Dense fog contains pollutions of various types and these Pollutants in the air if exposed may tend to irritate the membranes of the eye causing various infections leading to redness or swelling of the eye.

Action suggested:

❖ Transport and Aviation:

- Be careful while driving or outing through any transport.
- Use fog lights during driving.
- Be in touch with airlines, railways and state transport for schedule of your journey.

❖ Power Sector:

- To keep ready Maintenance Team.
- Human Health: To avoid outing until unless emergency and to cover the face.

Impact expected due to

- **Cold Wave conditions** very likely in isolated pockets of Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand and Rajasthan during 25th -27th December

Impact expected due to

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- **Cold day to severe cold day conditions** very likely in isolated pockets of Uttarakhand during 24th -27th **Cold day conditions** very likely in some parts of East Uttar Pradesh during 24th -26th; isolated pockets of Bihar 24th -28th December.

- An increased likelihood of various illnesses like flu, running/ stuffy nose or nosebleed, which usually set in or get aggravated due to prolonged exposure to cold.
- Do not ignore shivering. It is the first sign that the body is losing heat. Get Indoors.
- Frostbite can occur due to prolonged exposure to cold. The skin turns pale, hard and numb and eventually black blisters appear on exposed body parts such as fingers, toes, nose and or earlobes. Severe frostbite needs immediate medical attention and treatment.
- Impact on agriculture, crop, livestock, water supply, transport and power sector at some places.

Action suggested:

- Wear several layers of loose fitting, light weight; warm woollen clothing.
- Cover your head, neck, hands and toes adequately as majority of heat loss occurs through these body parts. Wear several layers of loose fitting, light weight; warm Woolen clothing rather than one layer of heavy cloth.
- Eat vitamin-C rich fruits & vegetable and drink sufficient fluids preferably warm fluids to maintain adequate immunity.
- Avoid or limit outdoor activities.
- Keep dry, if wet, change cloths immediately to prevent loss of body heat. Wear insulated/waterproof shoes.
- Warm the affected area of the body slowly with lukewarm water; do not rub the skin vigorously.
- If the affected skin area turns black, immediately consult a doctor.
- Maintain ventilation while using Heaters to avoid inhaling toxic fumes.
- Take safety measures while using electrical and gas heating devices.
- Extreme care needed for vulnerable people.
- Seek medical attention as soon as possible for someone suffering from frostbite/ Hypothermia.
- Protect livestock from cold weather.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Cold Waves / below normal Temperatures

- In **Punjab, Haryana, North Rajasthan, Jharkhand** and **Chhattisgarh**, apply light and frequent irrigation to the standing crops in the evening to protect the crops from low temperature stress. Use mulching and cover vegetable nurseries and young fruit plants with straw / polythene sheets to maintain optimum soil temperature.

Livestock / Poultry

- Keep cattle inside the sheds during night and provide dry bedding to protect them from cold.
- Keep the chicks warm by providing artificial light in the poultry sheds.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds for Andaman & Nicobar Islands

- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.



Heavy: 64.5 to 115.5 mm/cm *
Very Heavy: 115.6 to 204.4 mm/cm *
Extremely Heavy: > 204.4 mm/cm *



When maximum temperature of a station reaches $\geq 40^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\geq 30^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions
(a) Based on Departure from normal

Heat Wave: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal 4.5°C to 6.4°C .
Severe Heat Wave: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal $\geq 6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$

(b). Based on Actual maximum temperature

Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature $\geq 45^{\circ}\text{C}$.
Severe Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature $\geq 47^{\circ}\text{C}$

(c). Criteria for heat wave for coastal stations

When maximum temperature departure is $> 4.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ from normal. Heat Wave may be described provided maximum temperature $\geq 37^{\circ}\text{C}$



When maximum temperature remains 40°C

Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure 4.5°C to 6.4°C .
Severe Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure $> 6.4^{\circ}\text{C}$.



When minimum temperature of a station $\leq 10^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\leq 0^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions.

(a). Based on departure

Cold Wave: Minimum Temperature Departure from normal -4.5°C to -6.4°C .
Severe Cold Wave: Minimum Temperature Departure from normal $\leq -6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$

(b) Based on actual Minimum Temperature (for Plains only)

Cold Wave: When Minimum Temperature is $\leq 4.0^{\circ}\text{C}$
Severe Cold Wave: When Minimum Temperature is $\leq 2.0^{\circ}\text{C}$

(c) For Coastal Stations

When Minimum Temperature departure is $\leq -4.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ & actual Minimum Temperature is $\leq 15^{\circ}\text{C}$



When minimum temperature of a station $\leq 10^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\leq 0^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions
Based on departure

Cold Day: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal -4.5°C to -6.4°C .
Severe Cold Day: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal $\leq -6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$



Phenomenon of small droplets suspended in air and the horizontal visibility $< 1\text{km}$

Moderate Fog: When the visibility between 500-200 metres
Dense Fog: when the visibility between 50-200 metres
Very Dense Fog: when the visibility < 50 metres



Sudden electrical discharges manifested by a flash of light (Lightning) and a sharp rumbling sound (thunder)



An ensemble of particles of dust or sand energetically lifted to great heights by a strong and turbulent wind.



Ice deposits on ground

Air temperature $\leq 4^{\circ}\text{C}$ (over Plains)



A strong wind that rises suddenly, lasts for at least 1 minute.

Moderate: Wind speed 52-61 kmph
Severe: Wind speed 62-87 kmph
Very Severe: Wind speed > 87 kmph



Effect of various waves in the sea over specific area

Rough to very rough: Wind speed 41-62 kmph (22-33 knots) & Wave height 2.5-6 metre
High to very high: Wind speed 63-117 kmph (34-63 knots) & Wave height 6-14 metre
Phenomenal: Wind speed > 117 kmph (> 63 knots) & Wave height > 14 metre



Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 62-87 kmph (34-47 knots)

Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 88-117 kmph (48-63 knots)
Very Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 118-165 kmph (64-89 knots)
Extremely Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 166-220 kmph (90-119 knots)
Super Cyclone Storm: Wind speed > 220 kmph (> 119 knots)
