ALL INDIA WEATHER SUMMARY AND FORECAST BULLETIN

Significant Weather Features

Weather Systems, Forecast and Warnings

- Light rainfall/snowfall at isolated places over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad on 14th & 15th and over Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand on 14th and over Arunachal Pradesh during 15th -17th December.
- **Thunderstorm and lightning with gusty winds with speed reaching upto 30-40 kmph** very likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 14th - 18th December.

Forecast of minimum temperatures:

- Gradual fall in minimum temperature likely by about 2°C over Northwest India during next 3 days and thereafter rise by about 2°C during subsequent 4 days.
- No significant change in minimum temperature very likely over Gujarat during next 3 days and thereafter rise by 2-3°C during subsequent 4 days.
- No significant change in minimum temperature over rest parts of the India during next 7 days.

Dense Fog & Cold wave warning Warnings:

- **Cold wave conditions** very likely to prevail at isolated places over Telangana and Interior Karnataka on 15th and 16th with **severe cold wave conditions** likely to prevail over North Interior Karnataka on 15th December.
- **Dense fog conditions** very likely to prevail during early hours/morning hours in isolated pockets of Northeast India during 15th-19th, Himachal Pradesh during 15th-17th, Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh, northeast Madhya Pradesh on 15th & 16th December.
- **Dense fog conditions** very likely to prevail during early hours/morning hours in isolated pockets of Uttar Pradesh on 15th & 16th with **very dense fog** over Uttar Pradesh on 15th December.

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Main Weather Observations:

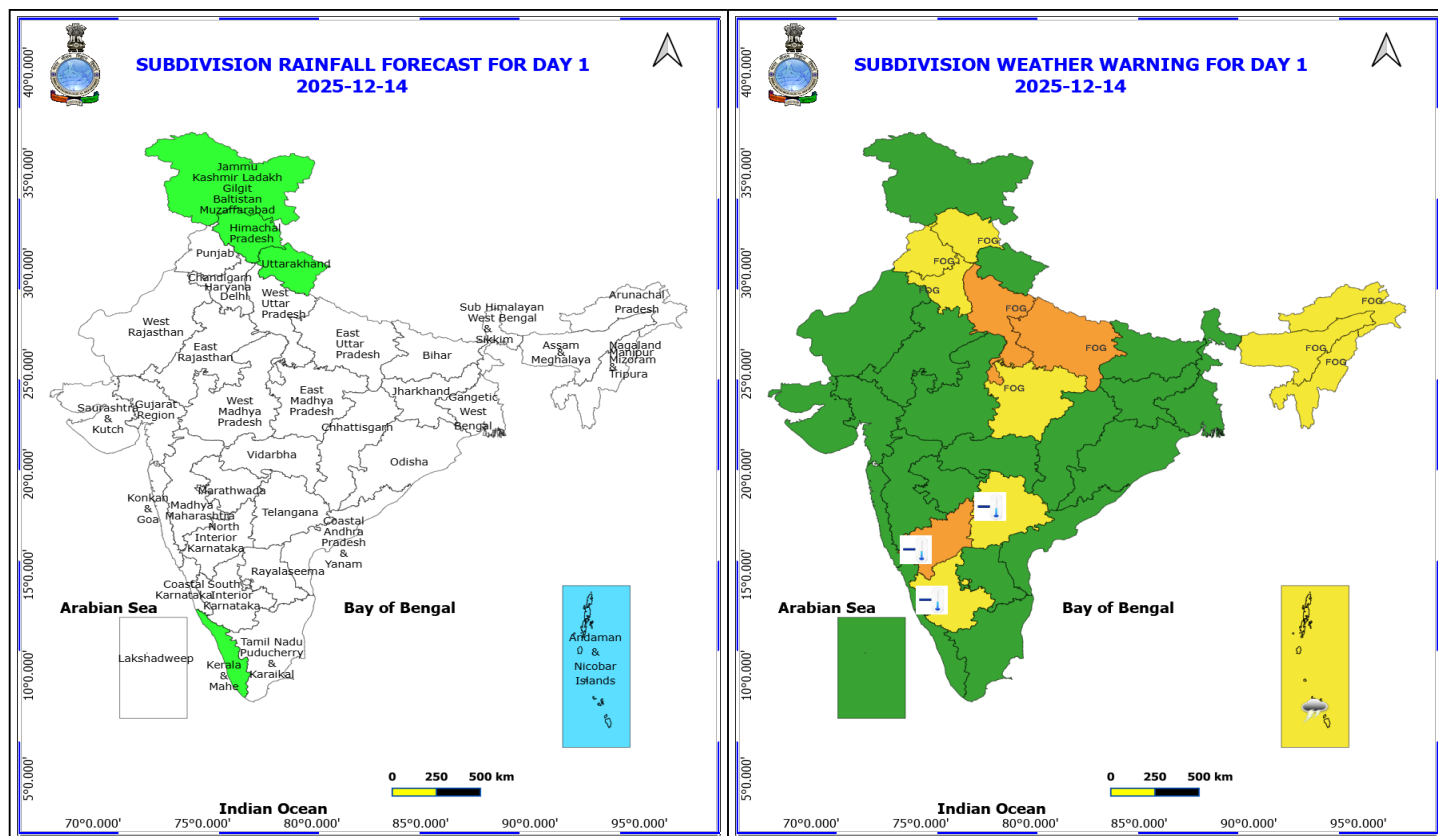
- **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today): at most places over Andaman & Nicobar island and **Light to moderate rainfall/snowfall** occurred over Higher reaches of Kashmir, Ladakh and Himachal Pradesh. **Dry** over rest of the country.
- **Heavy rainfall** has been recorded at isolated places over Andaman Islands.
- **Significant rainfall recorded (in cm) (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today):** Andaman & Nicobar Islands: Long Island (dist North & Middle Andaman) 7, Maya Bandar (dist North & Middle Andaman) 3, Hut Bay (dist South Andaman) 3, Port Blair (dist South Andaman) 2
- **Fog Condition Observed (at 0830 hours of today):**
- **Very dense to dense fog (visibility <50 m)** prevailed at isolated pockets of Uttar Pradesh in the morning hours; **dense fog (visibility 50-199 m):** reported in isolated pockets of Meghalaya, Himachal Pradesh, Haryana, Northeast Madhya Pradesh; **moderate to dense fog** also prevailed over Delhi-NCR :**Moderate fog conditions:** at isolated places over Punjab
 - ❖ **Visibility reported (?200 m): West Uttar Pradesh:** Agra IAF-00 m, Agra (Taj)-20 m, Aligarh-30 m, Moradabad-50 m, Aligarh-150 m; **East Uttar Pradesh:** Prayagraj IAF-00 m, Prayagraj-20 m, Varanasi Airport, Ballia & Churk-50 m Each, **East Madhya Pradesh:** Rewa 50 m; **Meghalaya:** Barapani 100 m; **Himachal Pradesh:** Bilaspur-100 m; **Haryana:** Hisar 40 m; **Delhi:** Safdarjung: 200 m.:
- **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 14-12-2025): below normal (-1.6°C to -3.0°C)** at most places over Karnataka, Vidarbha at many places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Marathwada, at few places over Madhya Maharashtra, Konkan & Goa, at isolated places over East Madhya Pradesh, Kerala & Mahe, Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Andaman & Nicobar Islands. **appreciably below normal (-5.0°C to -3.1°C)** at isolated places over Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, Odisha, Rayalaseema, West Madhya Pradesh; at few places over Telangana, Chhattisgarh. **The lowest minimum temperature of 5.6 °C is reported at Rajgarh, (West Madhya Pradesh) & Ambikapur (Chhattisgarh) over the plains of India.**
 - ❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 13-12-2025):** The highest maximum temperature of 36.6°C is reported at KARWAR (KARNATAKA).

Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0830 hours IST)

- The **Western Disturbance** as an upper air cyclonic circulation over north Pakistan & neighbourhood at 3.1 km above mean sea level persists.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a **trough** in middle tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level now runs roughly along Long. 55°E to the north of Lat. 30°N.
- **Subtropical westerly Jet Stream** with core winds of the order upto 95 knots at 12.6 km above mean sea level continues to prevail over West adjoining Northwest India.
- An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over southeast Arabian sea adjoining Lakshadweep at 0.9 km above mean sea level.
- A fresh feeble **Western Disturbance** is likely to affect western Himalayan region from the night of 17th December 2025.

Weather Outlook for subsequent 3 days

- Isolated to Scattered rainfall activity over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Hiamchal Pradesh, Kerala, Tamil Nadu and Islands.



14 December (Day 1)

- **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
- **Cold wave conditions** very likely at isolated places over Interior Karnataka and Telangana.
- **Dense to very Dense Fog** very likely at isolated pockets over Uttar Pradesh.
- **Dense Fog** very likely at isolated pockets over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Northeast Madhya Pradesh, Haryana, Chandigarh , Himachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Punjab .

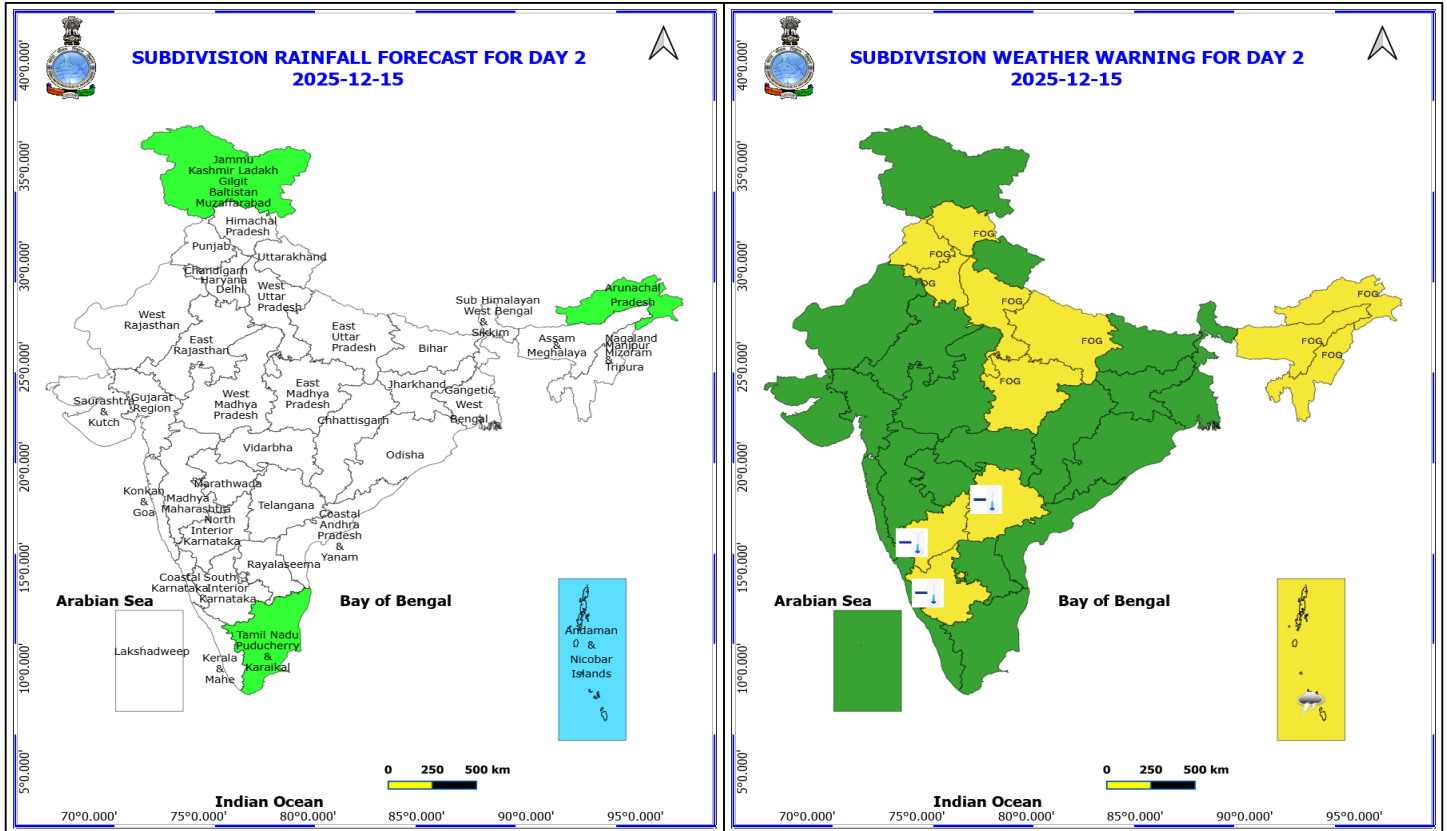

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Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2025-12-13

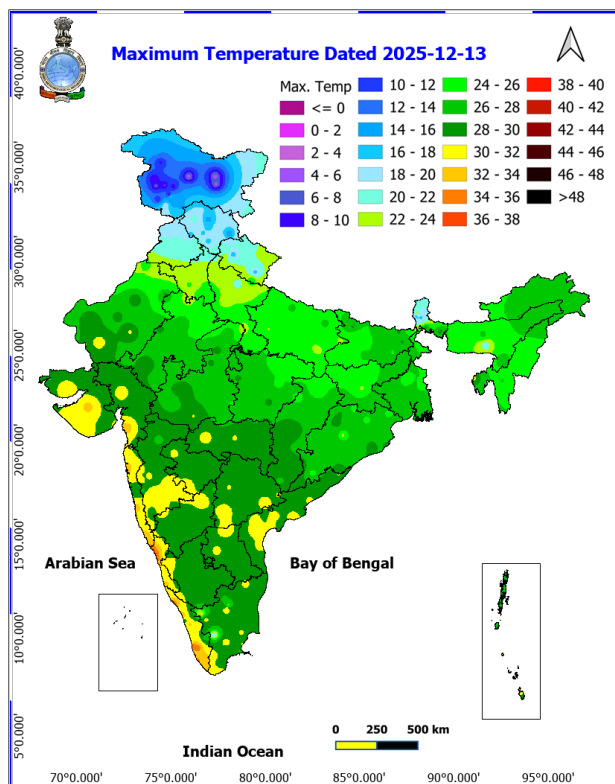


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2025-12-13

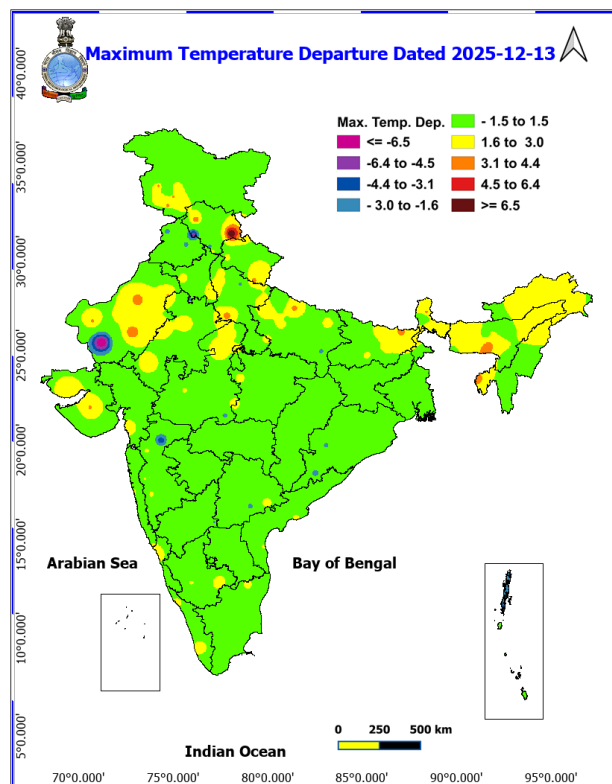


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2025-12-14

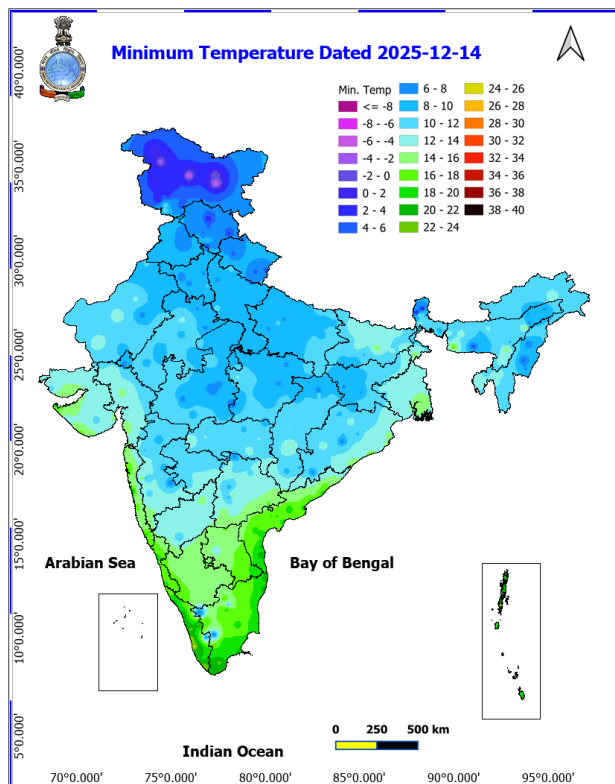
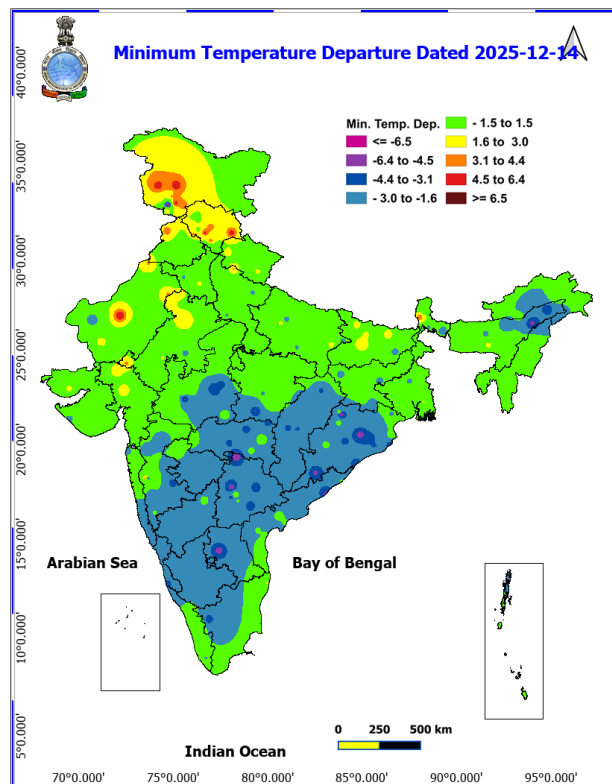
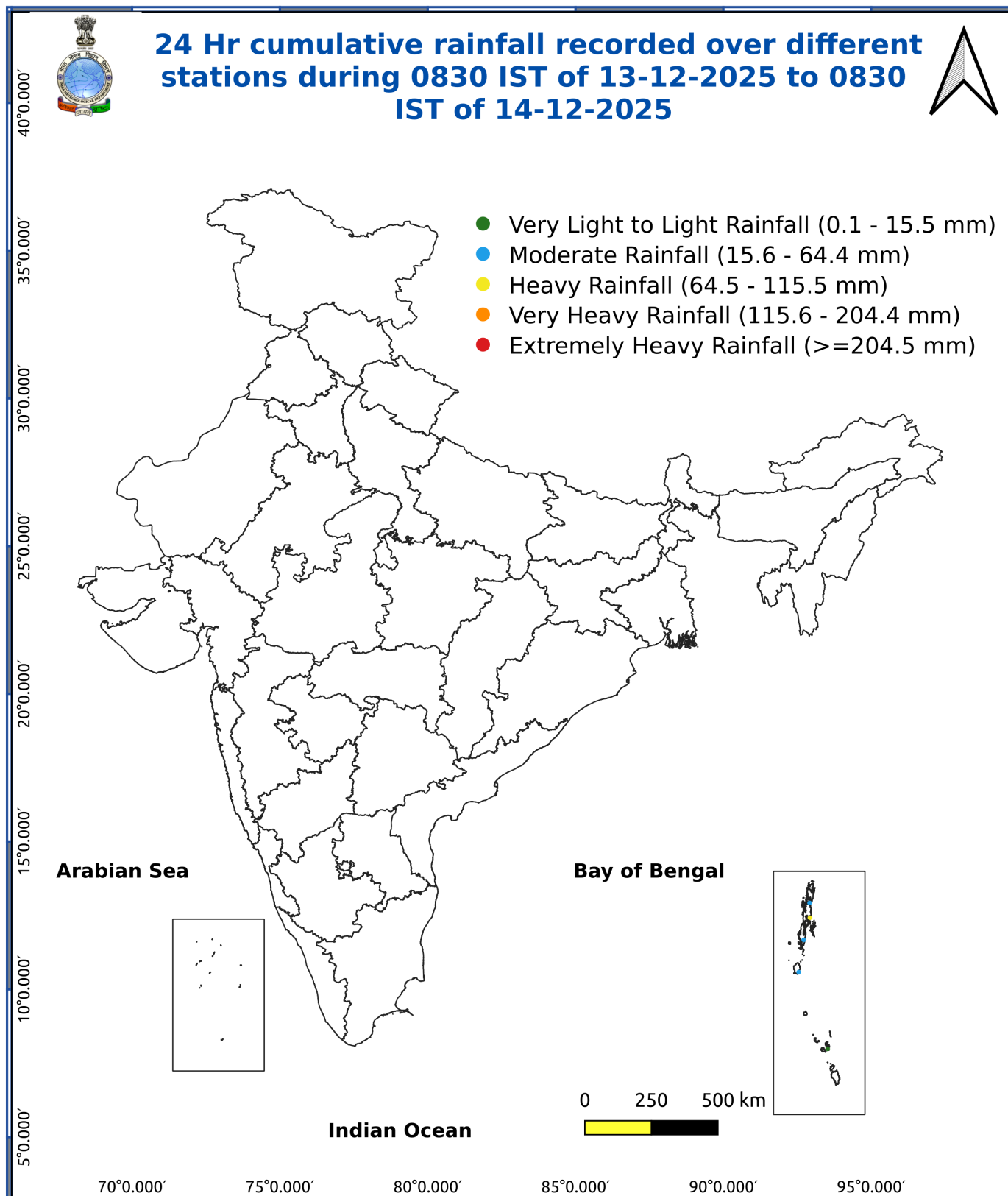


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2025-12-14





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Impact and Actions

Impact expected due to dense/very dense fog in the early hours/morning hours: likely to prevail during morning hours in isolated pockets Northeast India during 15th-19th, Himachal Pradesh during 15th-17th, Punjab, Haryana Chandigarh & Delhi, northeast Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh on 15th & 16th December.

❖Transport and Aviation:

- May affect some airports, highways and railway routes in the areas of met- sub-division.
- Difficult driving conditions with slower journey times.
- Unless taken precautionary measures, it may lead to some road traffic collisions.

Power Sector:

- Chances of Tripping of Power lines in the very dense fog routes.

Human Health:

- Lung related health impacts: Dense fog contains particulate matter and other pollutants and in case exposed it gets lodged in the lungs, clogging them and decreasing their functional capacity which increases episodes of wheezing, coughing and shortness of breath.
- Impact on people having asthma bronchitis: Long time exposure to dense fog may cause respiratory problem for people having asthma bronchitis and other lung related health problems.
- Eye Irritation: Dense fog contains pollutions of various types and these Pollutants in the air if exposed may tend to irritate the membranes of the eye causing various infections leading to redness or swelling of the eye.

Action suggested:

❖ Transport and Aviation:

- Be careful while driving or outing through any transport.
- Use fog lights during driving.
- Be in touch with airlines, railways and state transport for schedule of your journey.

❖ Power Sector:

- To keep ready Maintenance Team.
- Human Health: To avoid outing until unless emergency and to cover the face.

Impact expected due to Cold Wave/severe cold wave conditions likely to prevail at isolated places over Telangana and Interior Karnataka on 15th & 16th December.

- An increased likelihood of various illnesses like flu, running/ stuffy nose or nosebleed, which usually set in or get aggravated due to prolonged exposure to cold.
- Do not ignore shivering. It is the first sign that the body is losing heat. Get Indoors.
- Frostbite can occur due to prolonged exposure to cold. The skin turns pale, hard and numb and eventually black blisters appear on exposed body parts such as fingers, toes, nose and or earlobes. Severe frostbite needs immediate medical attention and treatment.
- Impact on agriculture, crop, livestock, water supply, transport and power sector at some places.

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Action suggested:

- Wear several layers of loose fitting, light weight; warm woollen clothing.
- Cover your head, neck, hands and toes adequately as majority of heat loss occurs through these body parts. Wear several layers of loose fitting, light weight; warm woollen clothing rather than one layer of heavy cloth.
- Eat vitamin-C rich fruits & vegetable and drink sufficient fluids preferably warm fluids to maintain adequate immunity.
- Avoid or limit outdoor activities.
- Keep dry, if wet, change cloths immediately to prevent loss of body heat. Wear insulated/waterproof shoes.
- Warm the affected area of the body slowly with lukewarm water; do not rub the skin vigorously.
- If the affected skin area turns black, immediately consult a doctor.
- Maintain ventilation while using Heaters to avoid inhaling toxic fumes.
- Take safety measures while using electrical and gas heating devices.
- Extreme care needed for vulnerable people.
- Seek medical attention as soon as possible for someone suffering from frostbite/ Hypothermia.
- Protect livestock from cold weather.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Cold Waves / Low Temperatures

- In **Interior Karnataka** and **Telangana**, apply light and frequent irrigation to the standing crops in the evening to protect the crops from low temperature stress. Use mulching and cover vegetable nurseries and young fruit plants with straw / polythene sheets to maintain optimum soil temperature.

Livestock / Poultry

- Keep cattle inside the sheds during night and provide dry bedding to protect them from cold.
- Keep the chicks warm by providing artificial light in the poultry sheds.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Sudden electrical discharges manifested by a flash of light (Lightning) and a sharp rumbling sound (thunder)



An ensemble of particles of dust or sand energetically lifted to great heights by a strong and turbulent wind.



Ice deposits on ground

Air temperature $\leq 4^{\circ}\text{C}$ (over Plains)



A strong wind that rises suddenly, lasts for at least 1 minute.

Moderate: Wind speed 52-61 kmph
Severe: Wind speed 62-87 kmph
Very Severe: Wind speed > 87 kmph



Effect of various waves in the sea over specific area

Rough to very rough: Wind speed 41-62 kmph (22-33 knots) & Wave height 2.5-6 metre
High to very high: Wind speed 63-117 kmph (34-63 knots) & Wave height 6-14 metre
Phenomenal: Wind speed > 117 kmph (> 63 knots) & Wave height > 14 metre



Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 62-87 kmph (34-47 knots)

Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 88-117 kmph (48-63 knots)
Very Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 118-165 kmph (64-89 knots)
