## ALL INDIA WEATHER SUMMARY AND FORECAST BULLETIN

### Significant Weather Features

#### Weather Forecast and Warnings

- Scattered to fairly widespread rainfall/snowfall with **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds speed reaching (30-40 gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad during 31<sup>st</sup> January-02<sup>nd</sup> February, Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh on 01<sup>st</sup> February, Uttarakhand during 01<sup>st</sup>-03<sup>rd</sup>, West Uttar Pradesh on 01<sup>st</sup> & 02<sup>nd</sup>; Rajasthan on 31<sup>st</sup> January-01<sup>st</sup> February.
- **Isolated** light rainfall with **thunderstorm, lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh on 30<sup>th</sup> January, East Uttar Pradesh on 02<sup>nd</sup>; East Madhya Pradesh on 02<sup>nd</sup> & 03<sup>rd</sup> February.
- **Isolated Hailstorm activity also likely** over West Rajasthan on 31<sup>st</sup> January and over East Rajasthan on 31<sup>st</sup> January & 01<sup>st</sup> February, 2026.

#### Forecast of minimum temperatures:

- No significant change likely over Northwest India during next 24 hours; gradual rise by 3-5°C during subsequent 3 days and gradual fall by 2-4°C during subsequent 3 days thereafter.
- Gradual rise in minimum temperatures by 2-3°C likely over Central India and Maharashtra during next 48 hours and no significant change thereafter.
- Rise in minimum temperatures by 2-3°C likely over Gujarat during next 24 hours; gradual fall by 3-5°C during subsequent 3 days and rise by 2-3°C during subsequent 3 days thereafter.
- No significant change in minimum temperatures likely over rest parts of the country.

#### Dense Fog, Cold day Warnings:

- **Dense to very dense fog** conditions likely during morning/night hours in some/isolated pockets over Uttar Pradesh till 31<sup>st</sup> morning and **dense fog conditions** isolated places over East Uttar Pradesh till 01<sup>st</sup> February.
- **Dense fog conditions** likely over isolated places over Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Haryana Chandigarh, East Rajasthan, Assam & Meghalaya, Chhattisgarh till 31<sup>st</sup> January, north Madhya Pradesh, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, Odisha till 01<sup>st</sup> February.
- **Cold day** conditions likely in isolated pockets over Madhya Pradesh on 30<sup>th</sup> January.



- ❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today): **at a few places** over Arunachal Pradesh; **at isolated places** over Assam & Meghalaya and Kerala & Mahe; **Dry** over rest of the country.
- ❖ **Significant rainfall recorded(in cm)** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today): **Arunachal Pradesh**: Anini AWS (dist Dibang Valley), Tuting (dist Upper Siang) 2 Each.
  - ◆ **Dense to very Dense fog(visibility <50 m) conditions** prevailed at a few places over West Uttar Pradesh; in isolated pockets of Uttarakhand, and **dense fog (visibility 50-199 m)conditions** in isolated pockets over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, Himachal Pradesh, Haryana, East Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh.
  - ◆ **Visibility Reported (In Meters ?200 m): Uttarakhand**: Khatima(<50 m), Pantnagar(>50 m); **West Uttar Pradesh**: Bareilly laf, Sarsawa(laf) & Agra laf-00 m Each, Bareilly-20 m, **Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim**: Jalpaiguri (50 m) , Bagdogra(100 m); **Odisha**: Chhatrapur (50 m) , Paradip (50-199 m);**Himachal Pradesh**: Una (50 m), Sundernagar(100 m); Agra Taj & Aligarh-30 m Each, Ams Aligarh & Najibabad-50 m Each, Etawah-100 m; **East Uttar Pradesh**: Bahraich-80 m; **East Madhya Pradesh**: Satna (50 m); **Chhattisgarh**: Ambikapur 50; **East Rajasthan**: Kota 50; **Haryana**: Ambala (150 m), Karnal (60 m).
- ❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 30-01-2026)**: The lowest minimum temperature of 3.0°C is reported at RAJGARH (MADHYA PRADESH) over the Plains of India.
- ❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 29-01-2026)**: below normal(-1.6°C to -3.0°C) at few places over East Rajasthan. The highest maximum temperature of 35.4°C is reported at KOCHI (CIAL) (KERALA).

### Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0830 hours IST)

- ♦ The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over northeast Assam at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.
- ♦ The **Western Disturbance** as a **cyclonic circulation** over northeast Iran between 4.5 & 5.8 km above mean sea level persists.
- ♦ **Subtropical westerly Jet Stream** with core winds of the order of 110 knots at 12.6 km above mean sea level prevails over Northwest India.
- ♦ The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over southeast Arabian sea and adjoining south Kerala coast now lies over south Kerala coast at 0.9 km above mean sea level persists.
- ♦ An **upper air cyclonic circulation** lies over Comorin area & neighbourhood at 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- ♦ A fresh **western disturbance** is likely to affect northwest India from the night of 02<sup>nd</sup> February 2026.
- ♦ Another fresh **western disturbance** is likely to affect northwest India from the 05<sup>th</sup> February 2026.

### Weather Outlook for subsequent 3 days

- ♦ Isolated/Scattered rainfall/snowfall activity likely over Western Himalayan Region.
- ♦ Isolated/Scattered rainfall activity likely over Punjab, Uttar Pradesh, Tamil Nadu and Madhya Pradesh.



- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh.

- ❖ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning & gusty winds(30-40kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffargarh and Rajasthan.
- ❖ **Dense Fog** very likely at isolated places over Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Odisha and Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim.
- ❖ **Squally wind with speed reaching 45 to 55 kmph gusting up to 65 kmph** is likely to prevail over many parts of Comorin area & adjoining Gulf of Mannar.



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


- ❖ Thunderstorm accompanied with Lightning likely at isolated places over East Madhya Prdaesh & Uttar Pradesh.




Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-01-29








Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-01-30

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## Impact and Actions:

### Impact expected and action suggested due to isolated thunderstorm with lightning/ gusty winds and hailstorm over

- ❖ Scattered to fairly widespread rainfall/snowfall with **thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds speed reaching (30-40 gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad during 31<sup>st</sup> January-02<sup>nd</sup> February, Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh on 01<sup>st</sup> February, Uttarakhand during 01<sup>st</sup>-03<sup>rd</sup>, West Uttar Pradesh on 01<sup>st</sup> & 02<sup>nd</sup>; Rajasthan on 31<sup>st</sup> January-01<sup>st</sup> February.
- ❖ **Isolated** light rainfall with **thunderstorm, lightning** likely over Arunachal Pradesh on 30<sup>th</sup> January, East Uttar Pradesh on 02<sup>nd</sup>; East Madhya Pradesh on 02<sup>nd</sup> & 03<sup>rd</sup> February.
- ❖ **Isolated Hailstorm activity also likely** over West Rajasthan on 31<sup>st</sup> January and over East Rajasthan on 31<sup>st</sup> January & 01<sup>st</sup> February, 2026.

#### Impact expected:

- Breaking of tree branches, uprooting of large avenue trees. Large dead limbs blown from trees. Damage to Standing crops.
- Minor to Major damage to banana and papaya trees.
- Minor to major damage to power and communication lines due to breaking of branches.
- Strong wind/hail may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- Hail may injure people and cattle at open places.
- Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds.
- Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls and huts.
- Loose objects may fly.

#### Action suggested:

- People are advised to keep a watch on the weather for worsening conditions and be ready to move to safer places accordingly.
- Stay indoors, close windows & doors and avoid travel if possible.
- Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees.
- Do not lie on concrete floors and do not lean against concrete walls.
- Unplug electrical/ electronic appliances.
- Immediately get out of water bodies.
- Keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.

### Impact expected due to dense fog in the morning/night hours:

- ❖ **Dense to very dense fog** conditions likely during morning/night hours in some/isolated pockets over Uttar Pradesh till 31<sup>st</sup> and **dense fog conditions** likely over isolated places over Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Haryana Chandigarh, East Rajasthan, Assam & Meghalaya, Chhattisgarh till 31<sup>st</sup> January, East Uttar Pradesh, north Madhya Pradesh, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, Odisha till 01<sup>st</sup> February.

#### ❖ Transport and Aviation:

- May affect some airports, highways and railway routes in the areas of met- sub-division.
- Difficult driving conditions with slower journey times.
- Unless taken precautionary measures, it may lead to some road traffic collisions.

#### ❖ Power Sector:

- Chances of Tripping of Power lines in the very dense fog routes.

#### ❖ Human Health:

- Lung related health impacts: Dense fog contains particulate matter and other pollutants and in case exposed it gets lodged in the lungs, clogging them and decreasing their functional capacity which increases episodes of wheezing, coughing and shortness of breath.
- Impact on people having asthma bronchitis: Long time exposure to dense fog may cause respiratory problem for people having asthma bronchitis and other lung related health problems.
- Eye Irritation: Dense fog contains pollutions of various types and these Pollutants in the air if exposed may tend to irritate the membranes of the eye causing various infections leading to redness or swelling of the eye.

### Impact expected due to Cold Wave/ Severe Cold wave conditions:

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**Cold day** conditions likely in isolated pockets over Madhya Pradesh on 30<sup>th</sup> January.

- ❖ An increased likelihood of various illnesses like flu, running/ stuffy nose or nosebleed, which usually set in or get aggravated due to prolonged exposure to cold.
- ❖ Do not ignore shivering. It is the first sign that the body is losing heat. Get Indoors.
- ❖ Frostbite can occur due to prolonged exposure to cold. The skin turns pale, hard and numb and eventually black blisters appear on exposed body parts such as fingers, toes, nose and or earlobes. Severe frostbite needs immediate medical attention and treatment.
- ❖ Impact on agriculture, crop, livestock, water supply, transport and power sector at some places.

**Action suggested:**

- ❖ Wear several layers of loose fitting, light weight; warm woollen clothing.
- ❖ Cover your head, neck, hands and toes adequately as majority of heat loss occurs through these body parts. Wear several layers of loose fitting, light weight; warm woollen clothing rather than one layer of heavy cloth.
- ❖ Eat vitamin-C rich fruits & vegetable and drink sufficient fluids preferably warm fluids to maintain adequate immunity.
- ❖ Avoid or limit outdoor activities.
- ❖ Keep dry, if wet, change cloths immediately to prevent loss of body heat. Wear insulated/waterproof shoes.
- ❖ Warm the affected area of the body slowly with lukewarm water; do not rub the skin vigorously.
- ❖ If the affected skin area turns black, immediately consult a doctor.
- ❖ Maintain ventilation while using Heaters to avoid inhaling toxic fumes.
- ❖ Take safety measures while using electrical and gas heating devices.
- ❖ Extreme care needed for vulnerable people.
- ❖ Seek medical attention as soon as possible for someone suffering from frostbite/ Hypothermia.
- ❖ Protect livestock from cold weather.

**Agromet advisories for likely impact of Hailstorm**

- Use hail nets to protect orchards and vegetable plants in Rajasthan.

**Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds**

- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

**Livestock**

- Keep the animals inside the shed during Hailstorm period and provide them balanced feed. Store feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.



Heavy: 64.5 to 115.5 mm/cm \*  
Very Heavy: 115.6 to 204.4 mm/cm\*  
Extremely Heavy: > 204.4 mm/cm \*



When maximum temperature of a station reaches  $\geq 40^\circ\text{C}$  for plains and  $\geq 30^\circ\text{C}$  for hilly regions  
(a) Based on Departure from normal

Heat Wave: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal  $4.5^\circ\text{C}$  to  $6.4^\circ\text{C}$ .  
Severe Heat Wave: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal  $\geq 6.5^\circ\text{C}$

(b). Based on Actual maximum temperature

Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature  $\geq 45^\circ\text{C}$ .  
Severe Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature  $\geq 47^\circ\text{C}$

(c). Criteria for heat wave for coastal stations

When maximum temperature departure is  $> 4.5^\circ\text{C}$  from normal. Heat Wave may be described provided maximum temperature  $\geq 37^\circ\text{C}$



When maximum temperature remains  $40^\circ\text{C}$

Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure  $4.5^\circ\text{C}$  to  $6.4^\circ\text{C}$ .  
Severe Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure  $> 6.4^\circ\text{C}$ .



When minimum temperature of a station  $\leq 10^\circ\text{C}$  for plains and  $\leq 0^\circ\text{C}$  for hilly regions.  
(a). Based on departure

Cold Wave: Minimum Temperature Departure from normal  $-4.5^\circ\text{C}$  to  $-6.4^\circ\text{C}$ .  
Severe Cold Wave: Minimum Temperature Departure from normal  $\leq -6.5^\circ\text{C}$

(b) Based on actual Minimum Temperature (for Plains only)

Cold Wave : When Minimum Temperature is  $\leq 4.0^\circ\text{C}$   
Severe Cold Wave: When Minimum Temperature is  $\leq 2.0^\circ\text{C}$

(c) For Coastal Stations

When Minimum Temperature departure is  $\leq -4.5^\circ\text{C}$  & actual Minimum Temperature is  $\leq 15^\circ\text{C}$



When minimum temperature of a station  $\leq 10^\circ\text{C}$  for plains and  $\leq 0^\circ\text{C}$  for hilly regions  
Based on departure

Cold Day: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal  $-4.5^\circ\text{C}$  to  $-6.4^\circ\text{C}$ .  
Severe Cold Day: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal  $\leq -6.5^\circ\text{C}$



Phenomenon of small droplets suspended in air and the horizontal visibility  $< 1\text{km}$

Moderate Fog: When the visibility between 500-200 metres  
Dense Fog: when the visibility between 50- 200 metres  
Very Dense Fog: when the visibility  $< 50$  metres



Sudden electrical discharges manifested by a flash of light (Lightning) and a sharp rumbling sound (thunder)



An ensemble of particles of dust or sand energetically lifted to great heights by a strong and turbulent wind.



Ice deposits on ground

Air temperature  $\leq 4^\circ\text{C}$  ( over Plains)



A strong wind that rises suddenly, lasts for atleast 1 minute.

Moderate: Wind speed 52-61 kmph  
Severe: Wind speed 62-87 kmph  
Very Severe: Wind speed  $> 87$  kmph



Effect of various waves in the sea over specific area

Rough to very rough: Wind speed 41-62 kmph (22-33 knots) & Wave height 2.5-6 metre  
High to very high: Wind speed 63-117 kmph ( 34-63 knots) & Wave height 6-14 metre  
Phenomenal: Wind speed  $> 117$  kmph ( $> 63$  knots) & Wave height  $> 14$  metre



Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 62-87 kmph (34-47 knots)

Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 88-117 kmph (48-63 knots)

Very Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 118-165 kmph (64 - 89 knots)

Extremely Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 166-220 kmph (90 -119 knots)

Super Cyclone Storm: Wind speed  $> 220$  kmph ( $> 119$  knots)
