Significant Weather Features

- **Isolated thunderstorm & lightning** likely over Vidarbha during 13th-16th August; Chhattisgarh during 13th-16th August.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over West Madhya Pradesh on 13th August and during 16th-17th August; East Madhya Pradesh on 14th and 17th August; Vidarbha during 13th-17th August; Chhattisgarh during 15th-17th August with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over East Madhya Pradesh during 15th-16th August; Chhattisgarh during 13th-14th August.

East India:

- **Isolated to Scattered** rainfall likely over Bihar on 13th August; Odisha during 16th-19th August.
- **Isolated thunderstorm, lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** likely over Gangetic West Bengal during 13th-14th August, **with gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph gusting to 50 kmph)** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 13th-19th August; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 13th-14th August; Jharkhand during 13th-17th August.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands during 13th-14th August; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during 13th-15th August and during 17th-19th August; Gangetic West Bengal on 13th and 15th August; Jharkhand on 13th August and during 15th-16th August; Bihar during 14th-17th August; Odisha during 13th-16th August with isolated **very heavy rainfall** also likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim on 16th August; Gangetic West Bengal and Jharkhand on 14th August.

❖ **Rainfall distribution** (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0530 hours IST of today): **at most places** over Gangetic West Bengal, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, East Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha, West Rajasthan, Konkan & Goa, Marathwada, Telangana, Gujarat Region, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Lakshadweep; **at many places** over West Uttar Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, Jharkhand, Odisha, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Assam & Meghalaya, Saurashtra & Kutch, West Madhya Pradesh, East Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Maharashtra, Kerala & Mahe, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema and Tamilnadu Puducherry & Karaikal; **Dry** over rest of the country.

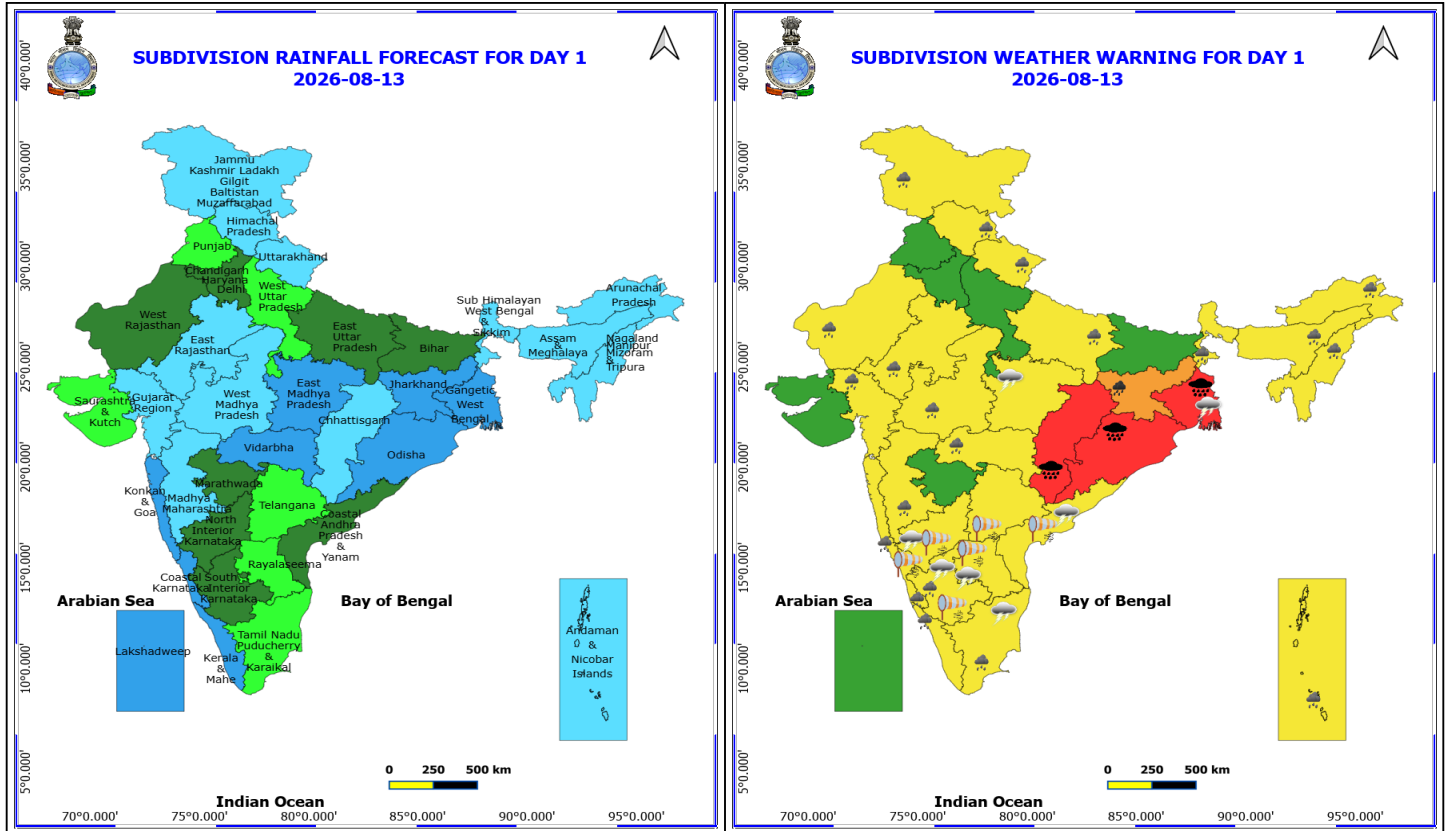

❖ **Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 12-08-2026)**: **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh and Saurashtra & Kutch. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim; at isolated places over Odisha, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, West Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Assam & Meghalaya, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, East Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and Lakshadweep; at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Vidarbha, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and Kerala & Mahe. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Odisha, Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat Region, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Marathwada, Vidarbha and Lakshadweep; at most places over Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Punjab, West Rajasthan, East Rajasthan, Madhya Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, Coastal Karnataka, North Interior Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at few places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, East Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, East Madhya Pradesh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema; at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya. **The lowest minimum temperature** of 17.4°C was reported at KHARGONE-OBS (MADHYA PRADESH) over the Plains of India.

❖ **Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 12-08-2026)**: **markedly above normal(> 5.1°C)** at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya, East Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh. **appreciably above normal(3.1°C to 5.0°C)** at few places over Arunachal Pradesh, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Rayalaseema; at isolated places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, West Uttar Pradesh, Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, East Madhya Pradesh, Telangana and Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal. **above normal(1.6°C to 3.0°C)** at many places over Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi and Punjab; at few places over Jharkhand, Coastal Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala & Mahe; at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, West Madhya Pradesh, Saurashtra & Kutch, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra and Vidarbha. **near normal(-1.5°C to 1.5°C)** at many places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, West Rajasthan and Gujarat Region; at most places over East Rajasthan, Marathwada, North Interior Karnataka and Lakshadweep. **The highest maximum temperature** of 39.8°C was reported at TIRUCHIRAPALLI (A) (TAMIL NADU).

Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0530 hours IST)

- The **Well marked low pressure area** over North Bay of Bengal & adjoining Bangladesh - West Bengal coasts moved northwestwards and lay over coastal West Bengal and adjoining areas of Bangladesh & Northwest Bay of Bengal at 0530 hrs IST of today, the 13th August 2026. The associated cyclonic circulation extends upto 9.4 km above mean sea level. It is likely to continue to move northwestwards across Gangetic West Bengal towards Jharkhand and may concentrate into a **depression** during next 12 hours.
- The **Low Pressure Area** over northwest Madhya Pradesh & neighbourhood has become less marked. However, the associated upper air cyclonic circulation persisted over the same region, extending upto 5.8 km above mean sea level and tilting southwards with height.
- The **Monsoon trough** at mean sea level now passes through Sri Ganganagar, Bareilly, Lucknow, Ranchi, centre of **well marked low pressure area** over coastal West Bengal and adjoining areas of Bangladesh & Northwest Bay of Bengal and extends upto 1.5 km above mean sea level.
- The **Shear Zone** roughly along Lat. 22°N across central & adjoining north Peninsular India between 3.1 & 7.6 km above mean sea level tilting southwards with height persists.
- The **Western Disturbance** as a trough in middle and upper tropospheric westerlies with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level roughly along Long. 68°E to the north of Lat. 30°N persists.
- The **upper air cyclonic circulation** over South Haryana & neighbourhood at 1.5 km above mean sea level has become less marked.

Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2026-08-12

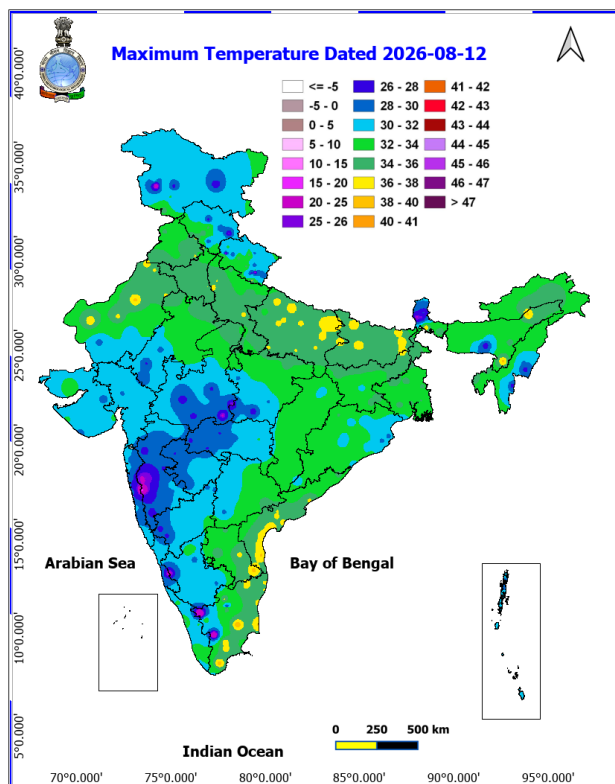


Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2026-08-12

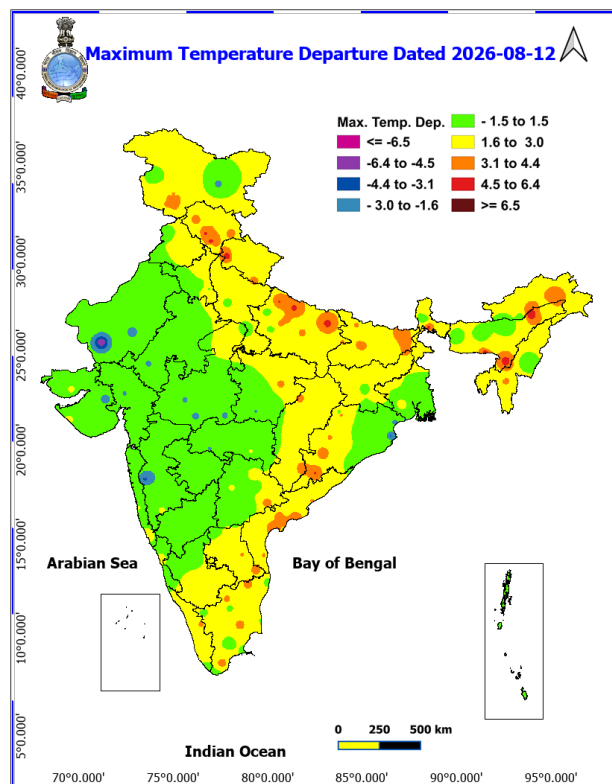


Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2026-08-12

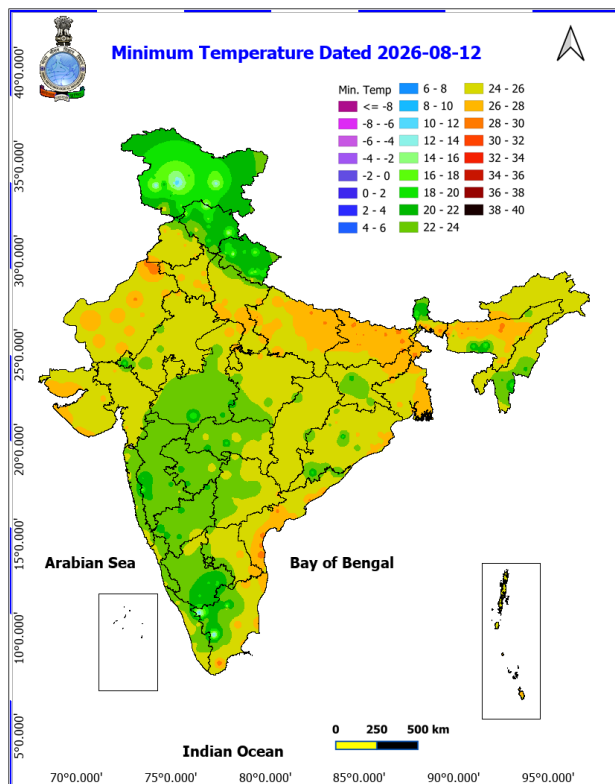
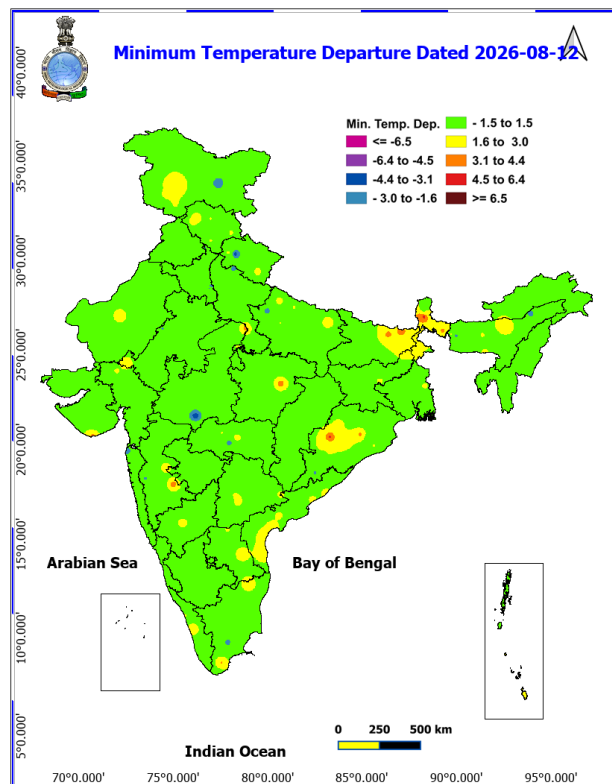
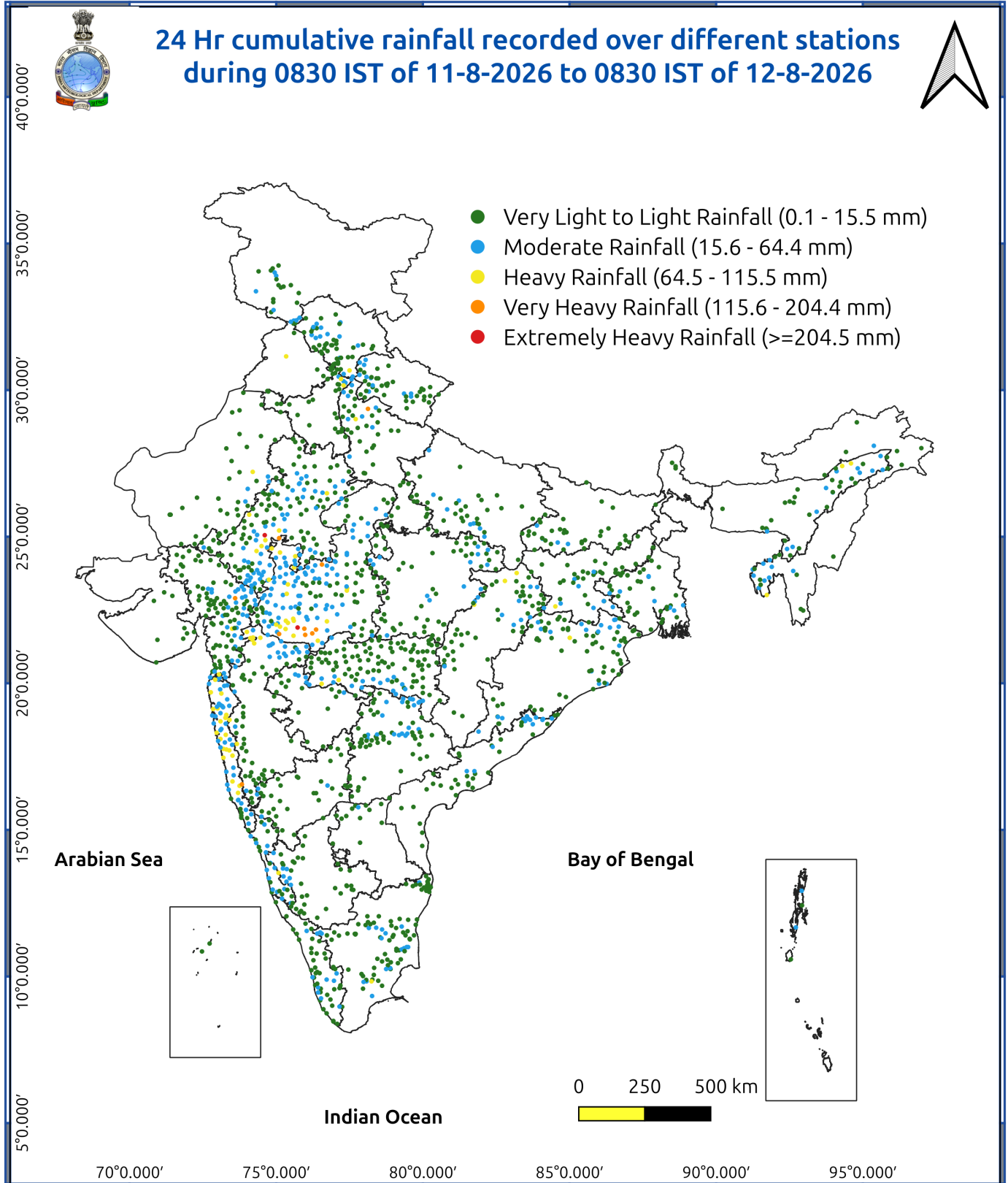


Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2026-08-12

Impact and Actions

Impact Expected and Action Suggested due to very heavy rainfall:

- Heavy to very heavy rainfall with extremely heavy rainfall at isolated places over north Chhattisgarh, Odisha and Gangetic West Bengal on 13th August.

Impact Expected

- ❖ Localized Flooding of roads, water logging in low lying areas and closure of underpasses mainly in urban areas of the above region.
- ❖ Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- ❖ Disruption of traffic in major cities due to water logging in roads leading to increased travel time.
- ❖ Minor damage to kutcha roads.
- ❖ Possibilities of damage to vulnerable structure.
- ❖ Localized Landslides/Mudslides.
- ❖ Damage to horticulture and standing crops in some areas due to inundation.
- ❖ It may lead to riverine flooding in some river catchments (for riverine flooding please visit Web page of CWC).

Action Suggested

- ❖ Check for traffic congestion on your route before leaving for your destination.
- ❖ Follow any traffic advisories that are issued in this regard.
- ❖ Avoid going to areas that face the water logging problems often.
- ❖ Avoid staying in vulnerable structure.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Heavy Rainfall:

- In **Odisha**, ensure continuous and effective drainage of excess water from kharif rice, maize, pulses, cotton, red gram, banana, vegetable fields and nursery beds. Keep field drains, outlets and bunds clear and functional throughout the rainfall period. In flooded areas, postpone sowing/re-sowing of maize and green gram and avoid water stagnation in pearl millet. Provide staking to vegetables, propping to banana, papaya and young horticultural plants. In transplanted rice, maintain emergency outlets to prevent prolonged submergence of seedlings.
- In **West Bengal**, ensure continuous drainage in transplanted Aman paddy, jute and vegetable fields and promptly remove excess water from low-lying areas. Strengthen bunds around rice nurseries and maintain field channels to prevent prolonged waterlogging. Avoid fertilizer and pesticide application during rainy periods and harvest mature crops wherever field conditions permits, store the harvested produce in a safe and dry place.
- In **Chhattisgarh**, maintain effective drainage in rice, maize, soybean, pigeon pea, black gram, green gram, finger millet, little millet, kodo millet and vegetable fields, particularly in low-lying areas. Strengthen field bunds and drainage channels. Continue rice transplanting and sowing of kharif crops only where field conditions permit, and provide staking to tomato, chilli and other vegetable crops and support to papaya and other fruit plants.
- In **Gujarat**, keep field channels open and free from blockage and drain excess rainwater promptly from rice, cotton, pearl millet, groundnut, sesame, maize, pulses, soybean and vegetable fields. Avoid sowing, transplanting, fertilizer application and plant protection operations until field conditions improve. Provide support to banana, papaya and vegetable crops.
- In **Madhya Maharashtra**, in *Ghat* areas, drain out excess rainwater from rice, finger millet and vegetable fields and keep drainage channels clear to prevent water stagnation. Postpone intercultural operations, fertilizer application and plant protection measures until field conditions become suitable.
- In **Arunachal Pradesh**, drain out excess water from rice, maize, soybean and finger millet fields and remove mud and debris from affected crops. Maintain proper drainage in vegetables and orchards. Harvest mature maize cobs, cucumbers, bottle gourds and other cucurbits wherever possible and provide propping to banana plants to prevent lodging.
- In **Assam**, maintain proper drainage in rice, sugarcane, soybean, jute, sesame and vegetable fields. Drain

excess water from low-lying rice fields and avoid water stagnation in sugarcane. Complete rice transplanting only where field conditions permit and postpone sowing of sesame, green gram and black gram until field conditions improve.

- In **Meghalaya**, avoid transplanting rice and maintain proper drainage in rice, maize, cowpea, okra and ginger fields. Keep drainage channels open and prevent standing water around crop root zones. Harvest mature banana fruits and provide support to heavily laden plants to prevent lodging.
- In **Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura**, maintain proper drainage in standing crop fields and prevent water stagnation in rice, soybean, black gram, ginger, turmeric, cole crops and vegetables. Postpone field operations, fertilizer application and plant protection measures during wet conditions and provide staking/support to vulnerable crops wherever required.
- In **Jharkhand**, ensure proper drainage of excess water from crop fields and postpone fertilizer and pesticide application during wet conditions. Continue sowing of pigeon pea and kharif maize and nursery sowing/transplanting of rice and finger millet only where field drainage and soil conditions are suitable.
- In **Uttarakhand**, maintain proper drainage in rice, soybean, maize, red gram, ginger, garlic, barnyard millet, finger millet, tomato and other standing crop fields. Continue rice transplanting only where field conditions permit and delay sowing of groundnut, soybean and maize until conditions become suitable. Harvest mature tomato, French bean and potato and keep the produce in a safe, dry place.
- In **Rajasthan**, maintain proper drainage in soybean, maize and other standing crop fields, particularly in low-lying areas. Keep drainage gates open in rice nurseries and postpone paddy transplanting during heavy rainfall. Undertake sowing of pearl millet, cluster bean, green gram, moth bean and other kharif crops only when adequate soil moisture and suitable field conditions prevail.
- In **Konkan and Goa**, drain out excess rainwater from rice, finger millet, turmeric, groundnut, vegetable fields and orchards to prevent water stagnation. Keep field drainage channels clear and undertake rice transplanting only where field conditions permit.
- In **West Madhya Pradesh**, maintain proper drainage in soybean, maize, transplanted paddy, brinjal, chilli, tomato and okra fields to prevent water stagnation. Postpone irrigation, intercultural operations, fertilizer application and plant protection measures until field conditions become suitable. Provide support to banana, papaya and vegetable crops and undertake propping in sugarcane wherever required.
- In **Vidarbha**, drain out excess water from already sown soybean, cotton, pigeon pea, sorghum, maize, rice and vegetable nurseries and orchards. Continue gap filling and thinning only where field conditions permit and transplant rice and vegetable seedlings after excess water has drained and soil conditions become suitable.
- In **Tamil Nadu**, maintain proper drainage in rice nurseries and young cotton fields to prevent water stagnation. Undertake rice transplanting and sowing of maize and cucurbits where field conditions permit, and harvest mature paddy wherever ready. Provide firm support to banana plants and other vulnerable crops against lodging.
- In **Karnataka**, maintain proper drainage in paddy fields, arecanut plantations, orchards, maize and ginger fields to prevent waterlogging. Delay rice transplanting in areas receiving heavy rainfall and undertake sowing of maize and other kharif crops only when field conditions permit. Provide staking/support to banana and other vulnerable crops where required.

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Thunderstorm / Gusty Winds

- Shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Tie the harvested crops securely and cover them to minimize the risk of displacement from strong surface winds.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking or support to vegetables and young fruit plants / fruit-bearing plants to avoid lodging due to strong winds.

Livestock / Poultry / Fisheries

- Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall and provide them balanced feed.
- Store the feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in the event of overflow.

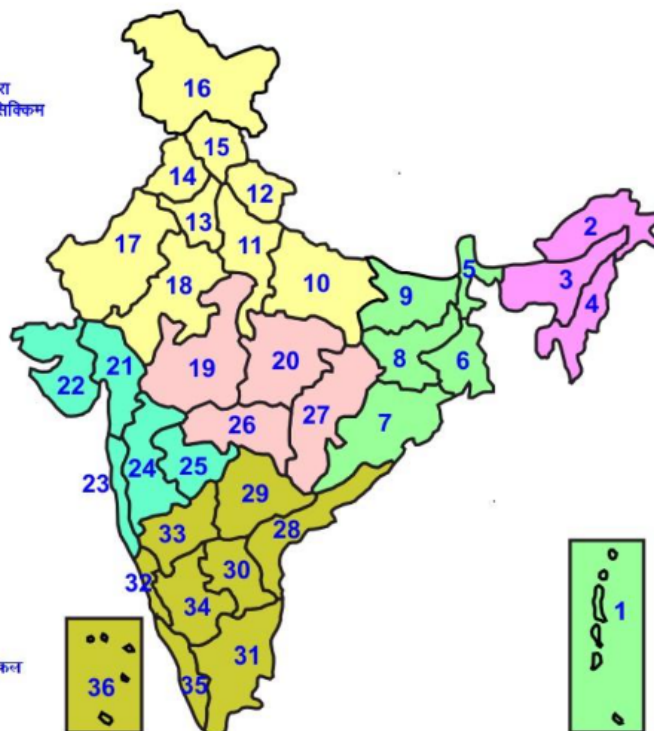

Very Heavy: 115.6 to 204.4 mm/cm *
Extremely Heavy: > 204.4 mm/cm *



When maximum temperature of a station reaches $\geq 40^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\geq 30^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions
(a) Based on Departure from normal

Heat Wave: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal 4.5°C to 6.4°C .
Severe Heat Wave: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal $\geq 6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$

(b). Based on Actual maximum temperature

Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature $\geq 45^{\circ}\text{C}$.
Severe Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature $\geq 47^{\circ}\text{C}$

(c). Criteria for heat wave for coastal stations

When maximum temperature departure is $> 4.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ from normal. Heat Wave may be described provided maximum temperature $\geq 37^{\circ}\text{C}$



When maximum temperature remains 40°C

Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure 4.5°C to 6.4°C .
Severe Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure $> 6.4^{\circ}\text{C}$.



When minimum temperature of a station $\leq 10^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\leq 0^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions.

(a). Based on departure

Cold Wave: Minimum Temperature Departure from normal -4.5°C to -6.4°C .
Severe Cold Wave: Minimum Temperature Departure from normal $\leq -6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$

(b) Based on actual Minimum Temperature (for Plains only)

Cold Wave: When Minimum Temperature is $\leq 4.0^{\circ}\text{C}$
Severe Cold Wave: When Minimum Temperature is $\leq 2.0^{\circ}\text{C}$

(c) For Coastal Stations

When Minimum Temperature departure is $\leq -4.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ & actual Minimum Temperature is $\leq 15^{\circ}\text{C}$



When minimum temperature of a station $\leq 10^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\leq 0^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions
Based on departure

Cold Day: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal -4.5°C to -6.4°C .
Severe Cold Day: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal $\leq -6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$



Phenomenon of small droplets suspended in air and the horizontal visibility $< 1\text{km}$

Moderate Fog: When the visibility between 500-200 metres
Dense Fog: when the visibility between 50-200 metres
Very Dense Fog: when the visibility < 50 metres



Sudden electrical discharges manifested by a flash of light (Lightning) and a sharp rumbling sound (thunder)



An ensemble of particles of dust or sand energetically lifted to great heights by a strong and turbulent wind.



Ice deposits on ground

Air temperature $\leq 4^{\circ}\text{C}$ (over Plains)



A strong wind that rises suddenly, lasts for at least 1 minute.

Moderate: Wind speed 52-61 kmph
Severe: Wind speed 62-87 kmph
Very Severe: Wind speed > 87 kmph



Effect of various waves in the sea over specific area

Rough to very rough: Wind speed 41-62 kmph (22-33 knots) & Wave height 2.5-6 metre
High to very high: Wind speed 63-117 kmph (34-63 knots) & Wave height 6-14 metre
Phenomenal: Wind speed > 117 kmph (> 63 knots) & Wave height > 14 metre



Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 62-87 kmph (34-47 knots)

Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 88-117 kmph (48-63 knots)
Very Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 118-165 kmph (64-89 knots)
Extremely Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 166-220 kmph (90-119 knots)
Super Cyclone Storm: Wind speed > 220 kmph (> 119 knots)
