ALL INDIA WEATHER SUMMARY AND FORECAST BULLETIN

Significant Weather Features

Weather Forecast and Warnings

- Scattered to widespread light/moderate rainfall/snowfall very likely over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and isolated to scattered rainfall/snowfall over Himachal Pradesh & Uttarakhand during next 3 days.
- Heavy rainfall/snowfall accompanied with snowstorm with wind speed reaching 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph along with reduced visibility (<400m) due to falling snow likely at isolated places over higher reaches of Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh, northeast Himachal Pradesh during next 24 hours.
- Isolated Thunderstorm, lightning, with Gusty Wind speed (30-40 kmph) likely to prevail over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad on 22nd and with Thunderstorm, lightning over Himachal Pradesh on 21st December.

Forecast of minimum temperatures:

- No significant change in minimum temperature very likely over Northwest India except Uttar Pradesh for next 2 days and thereafter gradual fall in minimum temperature by 3-5°C for subsequent 3 days.
- Gradual rise in minimum temperatures by 2-3°C over Uttar Pradesh for next 3 days and thereafter fall by 3-5 °C during subsequent 4 days.
- No significant change in minimum temperature very likely over East India for next 3 days and thereafter gradual fall in minimum temperature by 2-3°C for subsequent 4 days.
- Gradual rise in minimum temperatures by 2°C over Central for next 2 days and thereafter fall by 2-3 °C during subsequent 4 days.
- Gradual rise in minimum temperatures by 2-3°C over Maharashtra for next 2 days and thereafter no significant change in minimum temperatures.
- No significant change in minimum temperatures over Gujarat Region during next 2 days and gradual fall by 2-3°C during subsequent 3 days and thereafter no significant change in minimum temperatures.
- No significant change in minimum temperature over rest parts of the country during next 7days.

Dense Fog & Cold wave Warnings:

- Dense to very dense fog conditions during night/morning hours very likely East Uttar Pradesh till 23rd,
 Punjab, Haryana Chandigarh during 25th-28th, West Uttar Pradesh during 26th-28th with Dense fog
 conditions during night/morning hours very likely in isolated pockets of Punjab, Haryana Chandigarh, Uttar
 Pradesh till 22nd and during 24th-28th December.
- **Dense fog conditions** during night/morning hours very likely in isolated/some parts of Bihar till 24th and over Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand till 26th December.
- Dense fog conditions during night/morning hours very likely in isolated pockets of northeast India till morning hours of 24th; north Rajasthan, West Bengal & Sikkim till 22nd, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Odisha till 23rd December.
- Cold wave conditions very likely in isolated pockets of North Interior Karnataka and Telangana on 22nd & 23rd December.
- **Cold day conditions** very likely in isolated pockets of Uttarakhand, Jharkhand on 22nd; Punjab, Haryana Chandigarh, Bihar, Uttar Pradesh on 22nd & 23rd December.



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Main Weather Observations:

- ❖ Rainfall distribution (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today): at a few places over Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad; **Dry** over rest of the country.
- ❖ Significant rainfall recorded(in cm) (from 0830 hours IST of yesterday to 0830 hours IST of today): Jammu-KashmirLadakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad: Nowgam (dist Kupwara) 1.
- ♦ Fog Condition Observed (at 0830 hours of today): Dense to very Dense fog prevailed in some parts of Uttar Pradesh; in isolated pockets of interior Odisha, Madhya Pradesh; dense fog:reported in isolated pockets of Assam & Meghalaya, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal, Bihar, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Haryana, Northwest Rajasthan, North Madhya Pradesh.
- ♦ Visibility reported (at 0830 hours of today): West Uttar Pradesh: Agra(laf) & Aligarh Ams-00 Each; East Uttar Pradesh: Barabanki-00, Bahraich-50; Kanpur City-50, Shrawasti(Ap), Ayodhaya, Fursatganj-100 Each; East Madhya Pradesh: Rewa Satna, Khajuraho 00; West Madhya Pradesh: Datia, Gwalior 00m each; Odisha: Rourkela (25); Assam & Meghalaya: Barapani=50, Jorhat=100; Sub-Himalayan West Bengal: Coochbehar (100); Bihar:Gaya (50); Himachal Pradesh: Bilaspur 50, And Una 100; Uttarakhand: Pantnagar (100), Khatima, Haridwar, Kashipur; Punjab: Amritsar(50m); Halwara; Gurdaspur; Haryana: Hisar(100), Sirsa; West Rajasthan: Ganganagar 100 .
 - **Cold day to severe cold day conditions** observed in some pockets of Uttar Pradesh, in isolated pockets of Uttarakhand; **cold day conditions** in isolated pockets of Punjab, Haryana, Delhi and Madhya Pradesh.
 - Cold wave to severe cold wave conditions observed in isolated pockets of North Interior Karnataka and cold wave conditions in isolated pockets of Telangana.
- ♦ Minimum Temperature Departures (as on 21-12-2025): markedly below normal (<-5.0°C) at a few places over North Interior Karnataka; appreciably below normal (-5.0°C to -3.1°C) at a few places over Tamil Nadu, Madhya Maharashtra, Telangana; at isolated places over West Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Odisha and below normal (-1.6°C to -3.0°C) at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, Assam & Meghalaya, South Interior Karnataka.The lowest minimum temperature of 4.6°C was observed over Bareilly (IAF) (West Uttar Pradesh) and Ambikapur (Chhattisgarh) over the plains of India.
- ♦ Maximum Temperature Departures (as on 20-12-2025): below normal(-1.6°C to -3.0°C) at few places over Punjab. appreciably below normal(-5.0°C to -3.1°C) at isolated places over Bihar. The highest maximum temperature of 36.3°C is reported at RAJKOT (A) (GUJARAT).



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
Meteorological Analysis (Based on 0830 hours IST)

- The **Western Disturbance** lay as a trough in middle and upper tropospheric westerlies levels with its axis at 5.8 km above mean sea level roughly along Long. 62°E to the north of Lat. 27°N.
- Subtropical westerly Jet Stream with core winds of the order of 120 knots at 12.6 km above mean sea level continues to prevail over Northwest India.
- A cyclonic circulation lay over Equatorial Indian ocean & adjoining southwest Bay of Bengal at 1.5 km above mean sea level.






21 December (Day 1)

- Heavy Rainfall very likely at isolated places over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad.
- ♦ Heavy Snowfall very likely at isolated places over Northeast Himachal Pradesh and Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad.
- **♦ Thundersquall/Snowstorm with wind speed reaching(50-60kmph)** very likely at isolated places over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad and Himachal Pradesh.
- Cold wave conditions very likely at isolated places over North Interior Karnataka and Telangana.
- ♦ Cold Day conditions very likely at isolated places over Bihar, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Jharkhand, Punjab, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand.
- ♦ **Dense Fog** very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Odisha, Punjab, Rajasthan, Uttarakhand, West Bengal & Sikkim and West Uttar Pradesh.
- Dense to Very Dense Fog very likely at isolated places over East Uttar Pradesh.
- ♦ Squally winds with speeds reaching 45 kmph to 55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail along and off south Oman & adjoining Yemen coasts, adjoining and some parts of westcentral Arabian Sea, along and off Somalia coast, adjoining sea areas, over Gulf of Mannar & adjoining Comorin area.






22 December (Day 2)

- **Cold wave conditions** very likely at isolated places over North Interior Karnataka and Telangana.
- ♦ Cold Day conditions very likely at isolated places over Bihar, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Punjab and Uttar Pradesh.
- ♦ Dense Fog very likely at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Himachal Pradesh, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, Odisha and Uttarakhand.
- ♦ Dense to Very Dense Fog very likely at isolated places over East Uttar Pradesh.
- ♦ Squally winds with speeds reaching 45 kmph to 55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to over Gulf of Mannar & adjoining Comorin area.



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

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

- Dense to Very Dense Fog likely at isolated places over Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi and Punjab.



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




Fig. 1: Maximum Temperatures Dated 2025-12-20




Fig. 3: Minimum Temperatures Dated 2025-12-21




Fig. 2: Departure of Maximum Temp. Dated 2025-12-20






Fig. 4: Departure of Minimum Temp. Dated 2025-12-21









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Impact expected due to

Dense/ very dense fog in the night/ morning hours:

- Dense to very dense fog conditions during night/morning hours very likely East Uttar Pradesh till 23rd,
 Punjab, Haryana Chandigarh during 25th-28th, West Uttar Pradesh during 26th-28th with Dense fog
 conditions during night/morning hours very likely in isolated pockets of Punjab, Haryana Chandigarh, Uttar
 Pradesh till 22nd and during 24th-28th December.
- Dense fog conditions during night/morning hours very likely in isolated/some parts of Bihar till 24th and over Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand till 26th December.
- Dense fog conditions during night/morning hours very likely in isolated pockets of northeast India till morning hours of 24th; north Rajasthan, West Bengal & Sikkim till 22nd, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Odisha till 23rd December.

♦Transport and Aviation:

May affect some airports, highways and railway routes in the areas of met-sub-division.

Difficult driving conditions with slower journey times.

Unless taken precautionary measures, it may lead to some road traffic collisions.

Power Sector:

Chances of Tripping of Power lines in the very dense fog routes

Human Health:

Lung related health impacts: Dense fog contains particulate matter and other pollutants and in case exposed it gets lodged in the lungs, clogging them and decreasing their functional capacity which increases episodes of wheezing, coughing and shortness of breath.

Impact on people having asthma bronchitis: Long time exposure to dense fog may cause respiratory problem for people having asthma bronchitis and other lung related health problems.

Eye Irritation: Dense fog contains pollutions of various types and these Pollutants in the air if exposed may tend to irritate the membranes of the eye causing various infections leading to redness or swelling of the eye.

Action suggested:

❖ Transport and Aviation:

Be careful while driving or outing through any transport.

Use fog lights during driving.

Be in touch with airlines, railways and state transport for schedule of your journey.

❖ Power Sector:

To keep ready Maintenance Team.

Human Health: To avoid outing until unless emergency and to cover the face.



Impact expected due to

- **Cold Day conditions:** in isolated pockets of Uttarakhand, Jharkhand on 22nd; Punjab, Haryana Chandigarh, Bihar, Uttar Pradesh on 22nd & 23rd December.
- Cold Wave conditions in isolated pockets of North Interior Karnataka and Telangana on 22nd & 23rd
 December.
- An increased likelihood of various illnesses like flu, running/ stuffy nose or nosebleed, which usually set in or get aggravated due to prolonged exposure to cold.
- Do not ignore shivering. It is the first sign that the body is losing heat. Get Indoors.
- Frostbite can occur due to prolonged exposure to cold. The skin turns pale, hard and numb and eventually black blisters appear on exposed body parts such as fingers, toes, nose and or earlobes. Severe frostbite needs immediate medical attention and treatment.
- Impact on agriculture, crop, livestock, water supply, transport and power sector at some places.

Action suggested:

- · Wear several layers of loose fitting, light weight; warm woollen clothing.
- Cover your head, neck, hands and toes adequately as majority of heat loss occurs through these body parts. Wear several layers of loose fitting, light weight; warm woollen clothing rather than one layer of heavy cloth.
- Eat vitamin-C rich fruits & vegetable and drink sufficient fluids preferably warm fluids to maintain adequate immunity.
- · Avoid or limit outdoor activities.
- Keep dry, if wet, change cloths immediately to prevent loss of body heat. Wear insulated/waterproof shoes.
- Warm the affected area of the body slowly with lukewarm water; do not rub the skin vigorously.
- If the affected skin area turns black, immediately consult a doctor.
- Maintain ventilation while using Heaters to avoid inhaling toxic fumes.
- Take safety measures while using electrical and gas heating devices.
- Extreme care needed for vulnerable people.
- Seek medical attention as soon as possible for someone suffering from frostbite/ Hypothermia.
- Protect livestock from cold weather.

Agromet advisories for various parts of the country

Agromet advisories for likely impact of Cold Waves / Low Temperatures

• In Vidarbha, North Interior Karnataka and Telangana, apply light and frequent irrigation to the standing crops in the evening to protect the crops from low temperature stress. Use mulching and cover vegetable nurseries and young fruit plants with straw / polythene sheets to maintain optimum soil temperature.

Livestock / Poultry

- Keep cattle inside the sheds during night and provide dry bedding to protect them from cold.
- Keep the chicks warm by providing artificial light in the poultry sheds.

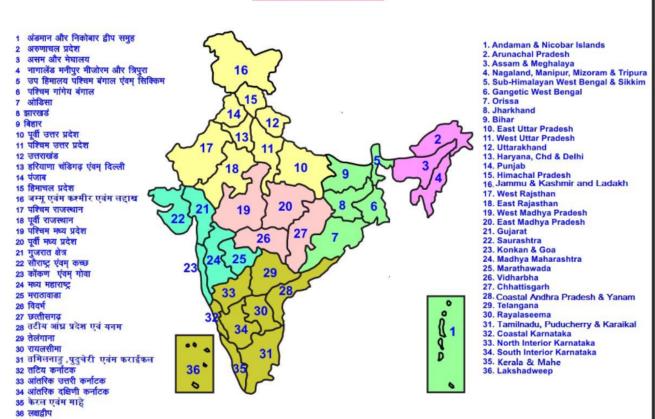
